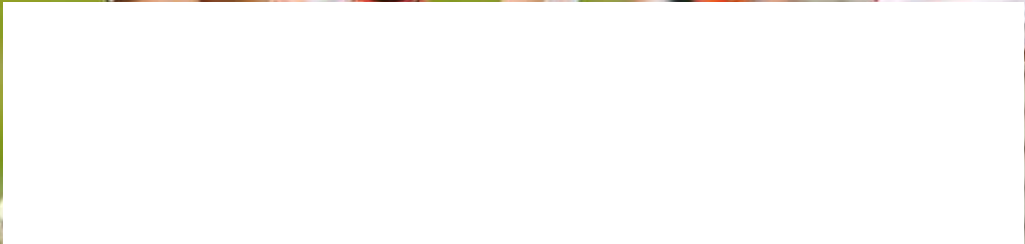

ONE LAST SHOT

TEAMS THIS WEEKEND WON'T GO DOWN WITHOUT A FIGHT

Only three teams remain in the Premier Division Competitions, whilst this weekend will see the culmination of the Lower Division Competitions for 2010.

It will be a repeat of the Premier Division Qualifying Final with Western Suburbs and East Coast Eagles clashing for the right to take on Sydney University in the Grand Final. The Magpies got the points a fortnight ago and will enter the game with plenty of confidence, despite their loss to the Sydney University last Saturday. The Eagles on the otherhand will not give up their crown easily and this contest is expected to go down to the wire.

Sydney University will be awaiting the winner of the Division One Preliminary Final between minor premiers UTS and Manly Warringah. Manly Warringah will enter the game on a high after eliminating Macquarie University with a goal after the siren. UTS on the other hand will be smarting from their defeat at the hands of the Students and will be keen to earn another shot at them.

The seasons two best teams in Division Two will play off in the decider when Southern Power and UTS do battle. There has been very little between these two sides this year however Power have current bragging rights having one two of the three contests.

In Division Three, Moorebank Sports will do battle with Penrith. Moorebank Sports were Minor Premiers however Penrith will enter the game on a high having already eliminated Southern Power and UTS.

Auburn will be looking to finish their first season on a high by claiming the Division Four title. The Tigers have had an unbeaten season to date however their opponents Moorebank Sports have come the closest to lowering their colours in Round 17.

In the Under 18's Premier Cup Preliminary Finals Minor Premiers St George and reigning premiers North Shore will both be looking to advance to the Grand Final and a shot at Sydney University.

In the Under 18's Challenge Cup Grand Final Penrith and Holroyd Parramatta will do battle. Penrith have been the dominant team all year and will be looking to become unbeaten Premiers however the Goannas will be keen to cause the upset.

MAGPIES EAST COAST NOR-WEST

On a wet and windy day at Bruce Purser Reserve, Western Suburbs came oh so close to gaining direct entry into this year's Grand Final. Against top team Sydney University the Magpies had to contend with difficult conditions. Kicking against the breeze in the first quarter the Magpies responded well to an early Uni goal and actually had the better of the quarter. They went in at quarter time 3 points down but inaccurate kicking was just the first of the little things that beset them during the match.

A strong second quarter with the breeze saw them go in at half time with a 15 lead and the Magpie supporters gave them a rousing cheer off the ground. Matt Eurell was dangerous in front of goal and Eid Kassem and Darryn Cresswell were also giving the Students plenty to think about. Dave Linsen put in another tremendous display winning the ball time and time again out of the centre. He and Medair Kassem along with Dwain Watkins gave the side every opportunity to win in a centre square clearance that was fit only for mud wrestling. After an early goal to Uni the Magpies turned up the pressure putting on three goals to grab a 21 point lead by the halfway point of the quarter and things looked very rosy. However the boys failed to land the killer blow and let the Students kick 4 goals to go in to the last change 2 points in front. They had given the Students a sniff of victory and some momentum but with the breeze in the last quarter were confident of prevailing. When Ben Absolum goaled from the boundary line to put the side in front Magpies fortunes were again on the rise but despite having the ball down their end the boys couldn't put the Students away and they scored 2 breakaway goals to break Magpie spirits.

The loss was certainly a major disappointment but there was a lot of positives to take out of the game and certainly no reason to be too disheartened. The side has earned its second chance this year and must steel itself not to let the disappointment of defeat affect its goals for the rest of the finals. Last year the boys failed to rebound in the Preliminary Final and missed out on the chance to win the flag. This will be foremost in their minds as they again tackle last years' premiers East Coast Eagles for the chance to again take on Sydney University in the Grand Final.

It was a weekend of mixed fortunes for the Eagles in week 2 of the Finals series. The under 18's were looking to book a spot in the big dance but fell short to the Students whilst the Premier Division dug deep to score a glorious victory over the Demons. Huge congratulations should go to the Sydney University football club on the fantastic effort of getting three teams through to the main event.

Both Eagles teams will take to the field this weekend for one last crack at the Grand Final. The under 18s will look to regain some form in the game against North Shore. In Round 7, the Bombers recorded a 7 point victory over the Eagles and again in round 15, the Bombers took the points with a 25 point victory. It will take a big effort but the Eagles will be primed for the challenge.

And it is another do or die game for the PD Eagles. Whilst last week's game was a cliff hanger, for the boys to get through in the manner they did shows a determination that is required in finals football. The boys will hold bitter memories of the sub standard effort they showed against the Magpies two weeks ago and will go into this game with a renewed confidence. The Eagles have struggled throughout 2010 with a string of injuries but a number of players are finding fitness at the right end of the season.

Mark Johnston has done a tremendous job with the team over the last two years, and their spot on the biggest stage has been well earned. With a number of these players moving into senior footy next year, the club's future is in good hands.

The boys earned their place in the grand final with a hard fought win over Southern Power in tough conditions at Gipps Road. In a low scoring affair, the boys made a slow start, and were behind at each of the first two breaks, but well within touch. The third quarter is known as the premierships quarter, and the Goannas showed why, blitzing the Power to take the lead, and then holding on in a tense last quarter to record a fantastic win

Missing from the previous week were key players Marty Ingham and Sam Makins, as well as key position player Andrew Travers, but welcomed back centre bison Johno Dowl and playmaker Josh Howe, fresh from a 6 week day spa out in the field. With overnight rain turning the pristine Gipps Road surface into a Dead 6 at best, this was shaping as a battle of attrition between 2nd and 4th.

The first quarter started as expected, with both sides settling into the pace of the game, and nervous energy and a wet ball making for plenty of mistakes. UTS showed their depth and flexed their muscle in the second term, and if not for the swirling conditions, may have put the result out of the Jets' hands. Coach Bull asked his players to dig deeper in the all important premierships quarter, and knew a huge turn around was needed to bring the game back to a level surface. The Jets added an early goal, but UTS were punishing Nor-West with their costly turnovers. With a massive 43 point gap at the last break, and with the wind advantage in the last, Bull and Hillier threw caution to the wind, and changed Webster and Pascoe out of the ruck. In the end it wasn't enough, UTS 14.14-98 to Nor-West 6.7-43.

The Jets have had an incredible 2010, making the Division 2 preliminary after contesting the Division 3 prelim in 2009, and 10 wins for their Division 4 team, and can look forward to 2011 with great confidence. The Jets farewell Joel Bunce and Chris Graf, as well as Club co-captain Jack Pascoe, and all-time leading goalkicker and dual premierships player Luke Ayling, and thank all four players for their services to the club, and wish them all the best in their future endeavours.

PENRITH

The IGA Penrith Rams have qualified for their first senior grand final in 17 years after a 23 point victory over UTS in the Preliminary Final on Saturday at Gipps Rd Oval. After going down to the Bats in their previous two meetings this year, Penrith went in as underdogs, however, they bounced out of the blocks to boot the first three goals of the match to eventually take a 13 point lead at the first break, with nippy rover Ben Robinson booting three goals in the slippery conditions. The second term was an even affair with both teams trading goals, before a long range effort right on half time by Max McNamara saw the Rams extend their lead to 19 points at the long break. The match was won in the third term as Penrith, with the scent of a grand final berth in their nostrils, raced away to boot five goals to one and take an unassailable 47 point three quarter time lead.
