Morningside coach hasn't hit the panic button yet despite going down to Zillmere and Broadbeach in consecutive weeks in both grades.


In a see sawing battle in both

CATS JUMP PANTHERS

It was a far closer contest in the other match of the round, where Broadbeach jumped Morningside in the opening term and stood firm to register a morale-boosting 15.13 (103) to12.11 (83) triumph.

It was the second week in a row that Morningside paid a heavy price for one poor quarter, having conceded nine goals to two in the final term in a loss to Zillmere in Round 10.

The Panthers trailed 1.3 to 6.4 after the opening term at Broadbeach, and despite clawing back to within three goals at halftime, they could not peg back the lost ground.

Broadbeach welcomed back goalkicking ace Korey Fulton with open arms after he missed the side's gritty 16-point loss to the Southport the previous week due to a 10-year premiership reunion in Warrnambool.

Fulton booted five goals and was a constant threat. He was complemented perfectly by big man David Round, who proved a handful in the air and contributed four goals.

The victory was also built around the work of former state defender James Drake, Beau Tanton, and last year's state representative Brent Rynehart.

For the Panthers, tall forward Kent Abey provided a target with four goals, while Queensland under 21 captain Andrew Browning worked tirelessly with support from Tyson Upton and Damien Bonney.



MATCH DAY FOCUS REDLANDS VS MORNINGSIDE

The dogfight involving the top five teams fighting for a double chance berth at finals time will ensure Morningside will arrive at Victoria Point with plenty of intensity.

Percentage could play a key part at finals time, and the Panthers will be looking to maximise theirs against a Redland outfit that has shown signs of improvement over the past month.

Redland will be heartened by the fact that their rivals have lost their last two games and three of their last five.

They will, however, be wary of starting more tenaciously than their first meeting this season, when the Panthers blasted 12.4-0.1 in a dynamite opening term.

The Panthers have the option of bringing back All-Australian under 18 selection David Armitage and his Queensland teammate Gavin Urghart back into the seniors this week.

There was an extra day's rest between the three games at the national under 18 championships last week, and most players have come out of their title-winning experience in good shape.

Armitage shone in an onball role after being eased through the lead-up games, and he will give the Panthers plenty of bite when he does return.

Redland coach Gary Odgers has given his young squad some direction and focus since assuming the coaching role with the Bombers in Round 6, which happened to be the first clash against the Panthers and resulted in a 193-point loss.

The Bombers were good for two of the four quarters against Labrador last week, but will need to be on their mettle for the full game to limit a Panthers outfit looking to make the most out of the final meeting between the two clubs this season
