

Codes of Conduct



Basketball Australia has developed Codes of Conduct to guide the behaviour of all people involved in the sport and ensure that basketball remains a safe, inclusive and enjoyable activity.

Player's Code of Conduct

- Understand and play by the rules.
- Never argue with an official.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, or deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent is not acceptable or permitted.
- Work equally hard for yourself and for your team. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.
- Be a good sport. Acknowledge all good plays whether they be by your team or the other team.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- Cooperate with your coach, officials, team mates and opponents. Without them, there is no game.
- Play for the fun of it and not just to please parents and coaches.
- Respect the rights of others and avoid the use of derogatory language based on gender, race or impairment.
- Be prepared to lose sometimes. Be a fair winner & a good loser.
- Listen to the advice of your coach and try to apply it at practice and in games.
- Always use the facilities and equipment provided with respect.
