# Chairman's Report 2010

## Overview of 2010

2010 was a year of working hard to consistently deliver basketball to the region despite working with less external funding assistance.

On the representative front we managed to continue to lift the number of national championships achieved along with offering the development to help 16 young athletes progress to national representation or development tours.

At the end of 2010 we successfully agreed to merge our organisation with West Auckland Basketball.

## Leagues and development activities

The league revenues remained similar to 2009 however tighter debt collection and the introduction of a portable Eftpos machine resulted in minimal bad debt for the year.

The Superleague programme introduced remained an excellent avenue to allow summer competition and coaching collaboration. This programme has become an important opportunity to allow a much greater number of young athletes within the region to participate in rep level training.

There remain significant challenges that we are still seeking solutions to as we attempt to grow our schools competitions:

- Most local schools lack the support and coaching to offer widespread participation let alone development in basketball
- Primary and intermediate schools struggled for co-ordinators to organise their teams and skilled/enthusiastic volunteers to organise the players courtside
- Kiwisport initiatives to provide 'activitators' to improve linkages from primary age schools to sports has resulted in greater demand but needs to be matched with additional programmes to assist in addressing the issues identified above

## Representation

Our representative program fielded teams into nearly every level of competition offered by BBNZ and dedication to development activities ensured that we achieved our greatest number of national championships yet – winning U13 Boys, U15 Girls and U17 Girls.

National representation continued to increase with 9 girls and 7 boys representing in Basketball New Zealand programmes touring overseas.

## Funding and Finances

Congratulations are due to the operations team for tight management of the finances against the significant changes in grant funding available. We continued to receive some external support for programmes but the base support we received for operational salaries was significantly lower than in previous years.

Our part time administration staff allowed us to more tightly manage the club finances and many thanks are due to Grant Shand for his assistance of Dianne Segedin in the management of the accounts. Early signs at the beginning of 2011 are appreciable growth in junior leagues which we hope will continue into future years.

## Staff and Volunteers

I would like to offer my thanks to the team who deliver the operational activities in the BWC office - Nicky Fuaivaa (Leagues Manager, part time), Dianne Segedin (Accounts, part time) and Tina Vao (Referee Co-ordinator).

Much of the effort that fuels our representative activity comes from volunteers –managing, coaching and providing overall organisation. Without the efforts of the volunteers we would have had a small fraction of the success we have enjoyed over the past few years.

Finally thanks are also due to Aik Ho for providing overall leadership to the organisation – covering both development activities and league operations.

## Community, Stakeholders and the Auckland region

In December 2010 Basketball Waitakere City and West Auckland Basketball agreed to start the process of merging their operations.

It is collectively felt that combining resources will:

- Provide better opportunities for training and development of athletes, coaches and officials
- Improve our ability to offer continued quality competition and development to athlete age groups and programmes which would struggle for sufficient numbers if divided
- Avoid duplication of effort in administration and governance activities
- Improve the ability of basketball to financially sustain itself through increased participation, reduced duplication of effort
- Provide a singular voice for the region to important stakeholders including facilities providers, schools, funding organisations and the wider basketball community
- The ability to host more tournament and major basketball events with 8 courts
- Allow for better co-ordination and delivery of In-Schools coaching to increase participation levels and grow our club members at all levels of competition and representation.

## Looking ahead to 2011

In the year ahead we will be working to progress

- Work with the Kiwisport initiative to provide support to primary and intermediate basketball to attract more young players to the sport
- Build our leagues through stronger relationships with Western Zone Secondary schools and encourage more parents, teachers and volunteers to become involved in managing and coaching
- Continue to strengthen our on court performance in representation and offer the platform for more young players to progress to national representation

In 2010, Basketball Waitakere City established our mark as the best junior association in New Zealand. We were the only association to win three national age group championships.

Some other highlight to mention in 2010:

1. Merger of West Auckland and Basketball Waitakere City
2. Top Junior Club in New Zealand

The success was achieved through hard work from all our members, families, sponsors and community. I would like to THANK, the passionate people who are the very backbone of this basketball community. There is no doubt that we have the people who are capable of doing a fantastic job.

In 2010, BWC fielded 16 representative teams to compete at every age group tournament. We also established a strong coaching community with 23 coaches in our representative programme. Our representative programme most definitely stamped marks on the representative calendar in 2010. Our girls' programme is now regarded as the best in New Zealand.

The focus for 2011 will be to continue the strength in our women programme but also to develop and establish similar achievements in the men's programme. We must continue to attract new members to the sport to ensure we have a strong foundation to select and develop our future elite officials, athletes and teams.

The growth of the leagues and club was assisted and supported by vital staff - Accounts manager (Dianne Segedin), Leagues Manager (Nicky Fuaivaa), Referee Co-ordinator (Tina Vao).

In 2010, our leagues improved and developed in quality and numbers however there is always more we can do to improved and establish leagues and tournaments as the best in New Zealand. Our Western Zone Secondary school League has the biggest entry to date with growth expected in 2011.

In 2011, we look to develop and improve on all aspects of our association. Focusing on these two themes:

1. WEST is BEST - You must develop to WIN! Player centred, Everyone WINS!
2. Referee & Coach development = Player development = Game Development

With the merger of West Auckland Basketball Association and Basketball Waitakere City in late 2010, basketball in West Auckland now has one voice and one association working together to deliver the best programmes to our community.

Our club still has plenty to implement and develop consistently in order to become a sustainable non profit organisation. In order to achieve our goal of being the best, we will have to work together and develop a strong culture within our club and with all its varied stakeholders. This merger will definitely provide us with the opportunity to become a sustainable association in the future.

Establishing a strong schools programme focusing on participation and development will provide the foundation for our new club to deliver at pinnacle events in the future. In order to achieve this goal we are working with schools and Sports Waitakere to assist with developing the game within schools and encouraging more parents, teachers and volunteers to assist with the coaching and management of their programmes and teams. 2011 will be a very busy and challenging year as we expand.
