# <u>National Basketball Development Officer Report</u> <u>October – December 09</u>

### **Introduction**

This report will contain the progressive report from the period Sept – Dec 09 which have been carried out at three main areas. The program was first conducted with 11 primary schools in South Tarawa and Betio. These areas would include the following:

### <u>Aim</u>

To train primary school students, communities, associations and clubs and increases the participation in the country and to be able to play basketball at the national level and at regional and international level in future years.

# Oct – Area 1



**Young Players Participation** 

The first program took place in area 1 from the period Sept - Oct. There are 3 schools in area 1 where students were introduced with basketball basic skills.

# Program – SCHOOL CAMP

The two weeks School holiday Camp took place in the beginning of September where students from the above named schools were taken to the gym where they were given basic skills on basketball. On Saturday which was the last day of this program a competition was held between these 3 schools followed by a small closing to mark the completion of this two weeks school camp program. The closing ceremony was comprised of KNOC staff and officials from the Betio communities. The same program was carried at the other 2 areas, Central South Tarawa and Bonriki.

# **Training Venue**

Betio Sport Complex was a comfortable place to run the program.

# **Equipments**

KNOC is currently securing equipment in conjunction with FIBA Oceania assistance in offering free training equipment to the KBF. There are 20 basketballs with 10 of them have been used for the development training program in schools.

# <u>Meetings</u>

The meeting was held at the Tarawa Urban Council office at Teaoraereke, 17<sup>th</sup> August 09, which was all members from National Federations were invited to attend meeting only from the TUC association such as:-

- Oreano
- TUC Football

# **Purposes**

The purpose of the meeting was to determine the NF's major responsibilities as applied within their associations individually and collectively as well as other concerns and needs including:-

- Competitions
- Meetings
- Budget
- Equipment

It was found that all the NFs successfully performed their responsibilities in these areas except for 'equipment' and the annual 'budget' which was one of the associations' vulnerable requirements. Ideas and request have been raised by the NFs if the committee could assist to provide more equipment for some activity runs.

# <u>Nov – Area 2</u>

School visit clinic runs in area 2 within the central south Tarawa with four Primary Schools.

The program first started with a visit to the schools, informing them about the program with follow up by presenting letters, time frame arrangement to set everything before the program commenced.

# **Training Venue**

Bairiki Court is currently the main venue for training only for Taken Bairiki Pr. School and Rurubao Pr. School as the court was located close to them and the players could manage to walk from their classrooms and then back to school. Abaunamou Pr. School already has a court. Tebanimaneka uses the Adventist church's court which is adjacent to their school.

### **Teacher's code of Behavior**

The programs were carried out within each of the schools in close cooperation and involvement of the teachers during coaching clinic performances within their schools. There were some teachers who were interested and agreed to work with the program. Therefore, each school gave great efforts to assist in conjunction with the program.

The above table emphasizes the appropriate schedule within schools. Each school has insufficient number of courts to run the program. As stated above, during week days of school visit clinics the players had to perform on courts that were not suitable for performing proper drills. Every Saturday was the day for a school combined training clinics in the two main courts at Bikenibeu Parish court and Nawerewere Hospital court.

### School Camp

After the completion of week six, the two weeks school camp was the next program to run for area 3. All schools in area 3 have been informed about the program. Before the program starts, all posters have been dispatched informing interested students who could attend the camping clinics.

### **Participants**

A total of 50 students are the number of participants who are expected to register their names together with a total fee of \$2.00 per week. Before the program starts 40 students have been registered and ready to learn basketball basic skills.

This program will continue in the beginning of January 2010.

# Xmas Tournament

The Xmas Tournament recently starts during mid of December. The ongoing competition still be running and hopefully the third round of the game will start this week. The Knock out games will be on next week. The grand final will be expected to start in the following week.

# Team participation

There are 14 teams for men and 6 teams for women who are willing to play the game. All teams are expected to pay a game fee of \$50.00 of a total of 20 teams. This tournament will be the opening game for men and women.

### **Publicity**

The Broadcasting Publication & Authority has confirmed that every Monday was the day for interviews and follow up advertising will occur in the evening. BPA has just carried out an interview with KBF Xmas tournament last Monday.

### FIBA Oceania level 1 Coaching Training Course

**Arrival of Zone Development Officer** – The ZDO was arriving Tarawa on the 03<sup>rd</sup> November, Tuesday afternoon. Following preparation for ZDO transportation, KBF president Tenoa Betene was picking ZDO to KNOC office that has been arranged as for his main base office to prepare training programme materials for printing, photocopying, network and binding. The training course commences on Wednesday 04/11/09 starting at 5pm to 9pm only on theory session. In the following days a court session practically performs in such types of drills containing ball handling, dribbling, shooting, passing, offense and defense. The on court session was started from 5pm and finished at 9pm.

### Participation of the Course

There are 18 people from different Basketball associations who are enthusiastic to attend the FIBA Oceania level 1 Coaching Course including 6 females and 12 males.

# Accredited Coaches

In completion of the course there are 6 people identifies to get a FIBA Oceania level 1 coaching certificate and 10 of them became the level 0 certifying coaches. In conclusion, 2 people who did not pass the course. Therefore, these people were being recognized as the Kiribati Basketball Federation qualifies coaches. The KBF believes also and assure that these people could conduct coaching clinics within their associations and in fact they will be the KBF volunteers in the future.

# **ZDO Meetings**

There are four different arrangement of meeting venues for ZDO including:

- I. Kiribati National Basketball Federation Discussion and reviewing of strategic plans, facilities and NBDO training.
- II. Australian High Commission Discussion on financial support in terms of funding to support live development program.
- III. Ministry of Sport seeking support from sport division to help developed the sport in Kiribati.
- IV. KNOC executives Seeking KNOC support for KBF financial budget and together with NBDO travelling allowances, printing, internet access, a room to secure equipments etc.

### **Course Conclusion**

The course was successfully concluded on Saturday 08/11/09 by following with ZDO word of thanks for the great effort and performances to people who have been working hard and spending their own time and adhering to the course.

### ZDO next Visit

FIBA Oceania have already confirms the visit preparation for ZDO next visit to Kiribati in 2010. KBF now have receiving the ZDO visit preparation manual. This will be discussed in the upcoming AGM this (January) month.

- Venue insufficient sites of play grounds for mini court to be established to accommodate the need of grown up kids
