

Occupation outside of football?: Retired; formerly a painter. Length of time with Sydney Uni? 17 Years

**Position held at Sydney Uni**: welfare officer, property steward, number one ticket holder, photographer, club historian and even club psychologist, however, whenever Sydney Uni team sheets are filled out, in any grade, you are certain to see "Trainer: H Gordon".

How did you start out at Sydney Uni?: Harv first appeared at the club in the season of 1990. Harvey had been a long time trainer (19years) at the now defunct Newtown Football Club in a time when the Sydney League was quite professional and strong. However, the club folded in the 1980's and for a time

Harv was lost to footy. He was asked to come down to help out by former Sydney Uni Vice-President, Peter Ramus, who had known Harv from his time playing at Newtown (Peter would coach Uni on Saturday in the Second Division and play for Newtown on Sunday in the First). What is it about the club that I admire?: The guys and girls who volunteer so much time so the club can continue to be a great place to play and watch footy.

Why Sydney Uni nominated: From his arrival at the club Harv distinguished himself with his endless resources of energy and enthusiasm for all things associated with grass roots footy. Harv straps players, organises the water bottles, minds the player's valuables and picks up after the absent minded young players. He will busily attend to any of the many requests of the players. Usually about ¾ time in the seniors he can relax a little as he has handed out the oranges/ watermelon and prepared the post match cordial. After the match he attends to the packing up of the kit, long after most people have left, before he makes his way to the post match presentations to present one of his wonderful bottles of wine for his best player in each match. 


