## FROM BEHIND THE DESK

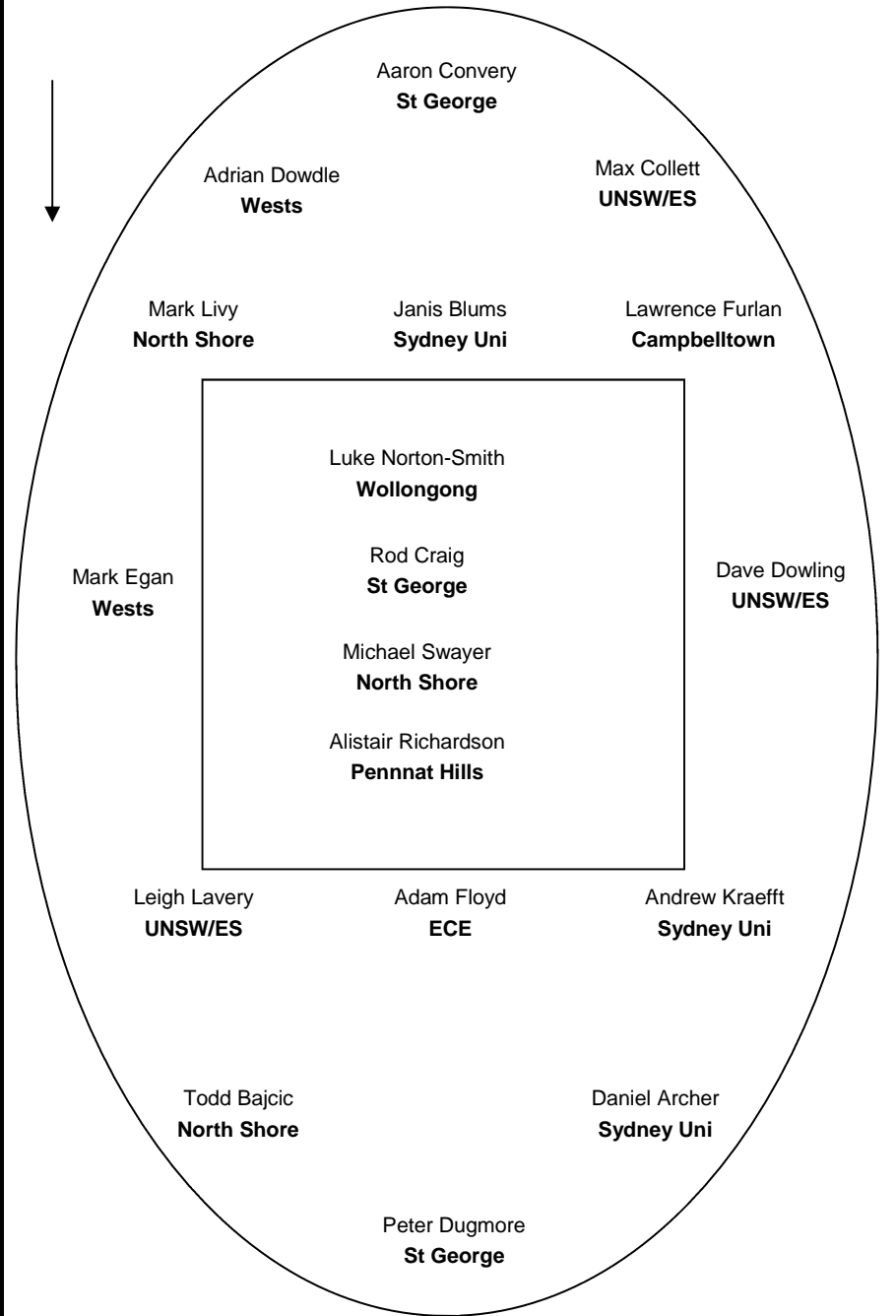

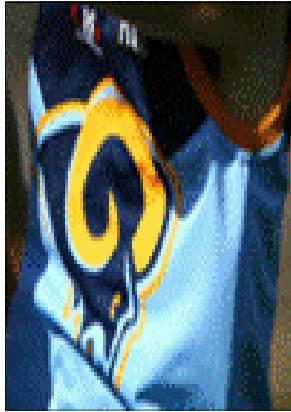

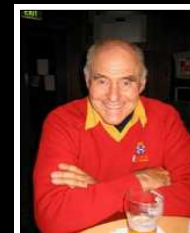

**Occupation outside of football?:** Retired; formerly a painter.

**Length of time with Sydney Uni?** 17 Years

**Position held at Sydney Uni:** welfare officer, property steward, number one ticket holder, photographer, club historian and even club psychologist, however, whenever Sydney Uni team sheets are filled out, in any grade, you are certain to see "Trainer : H Gordon".

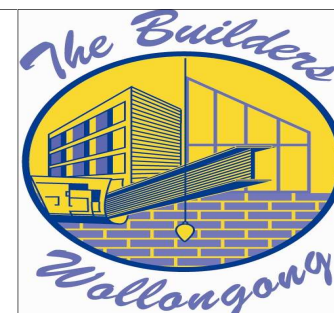

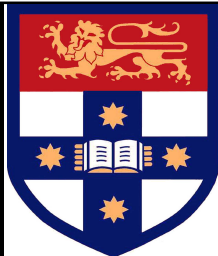
