# From the Office

Well done to all clubs who recognised umpires during last week's AFL sponsored 'Thanks Ump' round.

People's criticism of umpires and umpiring becomes a bit of a broken record at times, and more

often than not the criticism levelled at game day officials is reflective of the rules rather than the umpires' actual performance. It is most certainly true that the interpretation of the rules of AFL football varies between umpires, games and even leagues, however the very nature of the modern game and the constant alterations of the rules at the top level makes the job of umpiring a tough one.

# Historians

## MPNFL v O&M In Review

The Victorian Country Championships have been part of representative football in the state since 1954 giving the best players from regions to match themselves against each other with the ultimate prize being acknowledged as the best region of the state. MPNFL or Mornington District as it was known in the early days has had its ups and downs in the competition and at times participation has been questioned particularly in the 1960's when it was decided not to send a team to the competition at all, remarkable given the high importance of representing your code can give.

Since amalgamation of the leagues in 1987 the MPNFL have taken this championship challenge seriously rarely sending anything but their best teams, however their opponents this year Ovens and Murray have been somewhat of a large hurdle to conquer, only having played them on three occasions, 1994, 1999 & 2004, they have won all of the 3 contests. Today we look at these contests in some detail.

The first clash was in 1994 when the two teams met in the semi final of the Vic Health Country Championship at Wangaratta. ## WorkSafe Country Championships – SUPER SATURDAY APPROACHES

Next Saturday May 28th twenty WorkSafe VCFL affiliated leagues will do battle in the 2011 WorkSafe Country Championships.

The format for the WorkSafe Country Championships changed in 2010 whereby each Major League was ranked based upon previous performances in WorkSafe Country Championships and all District Leagues were invited to be ranked and to participate.

Previous formats, whereby teams competed in pools had become too costly and the difficulty in fixturing U18 and netball matches around these weekend became an expensive and logistical burden for most leagues.

The new format enables leagues to compete in one-off matches where winning leagues are promoted up the rankings and defeated teams demoted.

The format allows for 10 'blockbuster matches' between evenly ranked leagues across the state and scheduled on one day.

Next weekend will be our own Super Saturday of Country Footy across the WorkSafe VCFL.

In the current format U18 football and netball have been included if competing leagues agree.

Two sets of double headers next weekend will provide a feast for local footy fans able to see the best players from far flung parts of the state.

At Deakin Reserve in Shepparton, followers will be able to see the Hampden League take on the best of the Murray League and then witness the 1v2 clash between the GV and Ballarat under lights. In Donald the Bellarine plays Sunraysia before the local grudge match between the North Central and Mallee takes centre stage starting at 3pm.

The Maryborough Castlemaine League will take on the Loddon Valley Football League outside of the Super Saturday (Sat June 11) after both teams won their respective matches last year against Lexton and Ovens & King DFL respectively.

These two leagues, along with the Ovens & King will be ranked within the main WorkSafe Country Championships in 2012.

The WorkSafe VCFL is very keen to increase the number of competing Senior Leagues for future WorkSafe Country Championships and will be investigating ways in which other Senior Leagues can be encouraged to compete in the coming years.

Three WorkSafe Country Championship matches will be streamed live to web next Saturday 28th. The 1v2 match between GV and Ballarat going live at 7pm. The 3v4 match between O&M and MPNFL will go live at 12:30pm, with the Geelong v Bendigo match from Skilled Stadium starting at 2pm.

This provides a great opportunity for country fans that can't make it in person to the matches to watch their boys go at it, and country footy fans to watch the best country footballers in action in the comfort of their own homes.

Please go the competing leagues websites to get access to the streams complete with audio match commentary.

Next weekend presents a wonderful opportunity for all players representing their leagues to be viewed as potential WorkSafe VCFL representative players, as all team selectors and coaches will be attending every WorkSafe Country Championship match across the state in search of players considered good enough to be included in the respective state squads.

If you're keen on seeing the best against the best, get along to a Country Championship venue (or World Wide Web) on Super Saturday and enjoy the best WorkSafe VCFL players on show.

## Tight fight for position

There are more questions than answers in the Casey Cardinia League after four completed rounds of the 2011 season, however two things are clear after last weekend's results. Firstly Beaconsfield has slipped under the guard of the league's so-called experts to date and is a far better combination than first predicted. And secondly, Pakenham is far more vulnerable than first thought and prone to throwing in the towel when headed.

The battle for a top five spot will be fierce this year and only a brave or very stupid tipster would be willing to put his or her reputation on the line and declare any certainties except for top dogs Cranbourne. The other end of the table looks a lot more predictable with Keysborough already a short price for the wooden spoon and Devon Meadows not far behind them. Both have tough encounters against top quality opposition this weekend.

### Beaconsfield v Doveton

It is hard to know what to make of Beaconsfield this year but one thing the Eagles can be assured of is that their opponents, Doveton, are back on track as a finals contender.

So it's up to Beaconsfield to prove their claim to the same mantle with another win. While there has been a significant change in personnel at the Perc Allison Oval, the quality of the new, younger faces is undeniable. Led manfully by captain Daniel Mislicki, players like Troy McDermott, James Alexander, Jayden Gee and Bill Cousins have quickly become the go-to men for coach Austinn Jones.

The Doves also are a young and improving side and that will make for a great contest. John Atwell has starred for the Doves to date this season and has been well supported by Simon Black, Scott Dinsdale, Trent Day and Aaron Henwood. This game will be the battle of the emerging sides and threatens to be a nail-biter with the home ground advantage giving the Eagles a very slight edge.

### Hampton Park v ROC

The Redbacks are back and ROC makes its way to the Robert Booth Reserve this weekend to find out just how far back they have come.

Clint Evans is proving the perfect coach for Hampton Park. His no-nonsense nature and relatively simple outlook on football has gone down well and experienced players like Leigh Morse, Brett Armitage, Dean Jamieson, Kevin McLean and Steve Watson have reacted well to the new regime. Not only that, but the Redbacks are now a goal kicking side thanks to the return of Kerem and Kain Baskaya.

ROC fell short in a low-scoring affair against Beaconsfield last week, but were competitive just the same. The best news was the return to form of Andrew Logan assisted by Phil Nanfra, Daniel Johnson and James Canty among others. The trick for the Kangaroos is now to beat a genuine contender and Hampton Park looks to be just that at present. At Starling Road maybe, but that will not happen at the spider web.

### Pakenham v Cranbourne

On paper this will be a good game. In reality it could be a whitewash and, if so, the lid will be well and truly off for Cranbourne supporters.

Coming off the bye the Eagles will be fresh and raring to go and that is not a proposition that any side would be looking forward to this year. Their last outing resulted in a comprehensive victory over reigning premiers Narre Warren and it was the side's stars that led the way. Justin Berry is clearly the most influential player in the Casey Cardinia League at present and has super back-up in Curtis Barker, Mat Fletcher, Marc Holt, Caleb Tiller and star recruit Lawrence Angwin.

The Lions on the other hand, have been hot and cold to date this year and last weekend they were very cold. Had it not been for the efforts of talented play makers Russell Lehman, Dean Blake and Robbie Elston, together with veteran Tom O'Loughlin, an even bigger loss would have been suffered. Suffice to say Cranbourne will triumph with plenty in reserve.

## Keysborough v Narre Warren

Every effort was made to give Keysborough players the incentive to open their 2011 account last week but, alas, the Burra remains at the bottom of the table yet to sing their song. To make things worse they run up against an in-form Narre Warren side and, again, it could get ugly.

There is no doubting Keysborough players' commitment and desire but, apart from the form of Luke McGuinness, Tyson King, Michael Downie and Corey Wilkinson, there is little for the club's fans to get excited about at present. One positive for Keysborough is the home ground advantage but will that be enough?

The Magpies are primed for a big game. ## What you see on TV doesn't always apply to Country Football

Each and every Friday night around 8.30pm or 7.30pm if the broadcaster wants to show the game live we get comfortable in our chair to watch what is the first game of the round in the Australian Football League (AFL).

We get fully involved in the telecast as it was a Saturday afternoon and you're watching your local football team; you yell at the TV, question the umpire's decisions, clap the great marks and either feel great cause your team won or throw your hands up in the air cause they let the game slip.

Travel forward 12 or more hours and you're all fired up watching your local footy team when the same things happen on the field as you saw on TV last night, the umpires either pay a free kick or let the game continue. Week in week out the umpires are asked a number of question during the game or in the social rooms after the game to clarify a decision for a player or supporter only to be advised that the rule only applies in the AFL and has not been introduced into the Victorian Country Football League (VCFL). It was only last week I was asked by a supporter after the game "are we paying that stupid Advantage Rule like they do in the AFL", yes was the reply and the supporter then said when you got that decision right....

Which begs the question what rules are different?



VCFL has been granted exemptions to the Following AFL Rules.

Counting of players, Order off Rule, Suspended Playing Coaches, Free Kicks - Deliberate Rushed Behind, Free Kicks - Hands in the Back and any player listed on the team sheet must be at the ground, dressed in football playing attire and ready to take the field if called upon.

## We stand as one

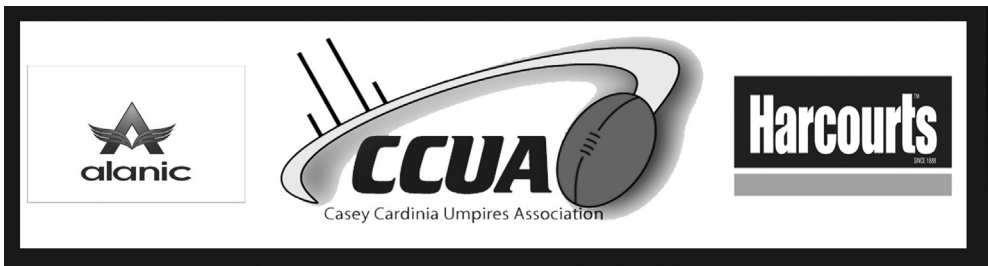
