



Corkys

A corky (also known as a muscle contusion) occurs after a direct blow by a blunt object to a muscle. A corky causes numerous micro tears to the muscle causing bleeding within it. As the bleeding increases within the muscle it can cause an increase in pressure, restricting blood flow to the surrounding muscle tissue. This can result in secondary muscle damage. Bruising may occur around the injury site with localized swelling and tenderness. Often bruising may be found lower to the injury due to gravity pooling the blood.



Treatment:

A corky can be thought of for simplistic purposes to be similar to multiple miniature muscle tears. For this reason they should be treated with a similar approach. The RICE principles (Rest, Ice, Compression, Elevation) should be applied to the area as soon as possible. This allows for a reduction in further bleeding and inflammation, and reduces the chance of further injury. No heat or anti-inflammatories should be applied during this early stage (approx. 72 hours), and massage on the area should only be conducted to assist with swelling management. When possible, movement should be restored to the muscle and surrounding joints by some gentle stretches. Stretches should not cause pain. Once you can walk normally pain free, one can trial running, and then returning to training. Only once completing a training session should one return to a game situation.

Corkys are a common injury in AFL and should be treated with care. Often players will be able to play the following week, but in severe cases it can take weeks to recover. If not treated properly they can result in longer delay from sport, or can cause bone growth within the muscle. A physiotherapist can help you in the assessment and management of a corky to get you on the field quicker. If prone to corkys one may also consider wearing thigh pads to reduce repetitive injury.


