STONNINGTON Mayor Melina Sehr had the curse that normally stops politicians — a hoarse throat.

But with eight barely audible words, "Send that to me, I'll look after that", the mayor just about bowled over a string of burly football officials at Lucas Oval on Saturday morning.

Cr Sehr was asking for a letter requesting the renovation of the ground's Dunlop Pavilion, built in the mid-1980s.

It came after a professionally conducted tour of the Malvern District Auskick, which had hundreds of children and adults across two ovals, to demonstrate its collaboration with East Malvern Juniors and Tooronga Malvern (senior) football clubs.

In attendance were AFL Victoria's chairman Peter Jackson and CEO Grant Williams, federal member Kelly O'Dwyer, SFL board members Garry Cranny and Marc Gauci (also from EMJFC) and the omnipresent sponsor Peter Norman, from the Bendigo Bank.

Collaborative Pathways, where the three tiers of footy clubs share resources, is being promoted by AFL Victoria. Williams said this was one of the best examples.

At the end, when EMJFC president Lewis Bearman

said the participation rate of females was on the rise, particularly as umpires, and there were no changing facilities for them, the ears of the VIPs opened.

Female participation in football, it was explained, was one of the AFL's platforms.

Williams said the AFL was about to start a second fiveyear Facilities Development Reserve.

The FDR stimulates funding to grassroots clubs to get local, state and federal governments to combine to build assets for football.

In just over an hour, what can sometimes take years of negotiating, agreement was reached.

Now that's collaborating.






