Celebrating women's round

Women play an important role at all levels of football.

LOOK around football today at all levels and it seems a misnomer that it was once considered an exclusive all male domain.

Women are as much stakeholders as men in our great game and that's one of football's intrinsic beauties: it's all inclusive. Everyone has an equal voice, an equal say and an equal part to play.

As football around the country this weekend celebrates and recognises women in football, it's worth reflecting on the important role women play in the game.

Inside this issue of the VFL/TAC Cup Record we highlight and examine the jobs done by Marg Richards, the North Ballarat Football Club Football Manager, Tina Bremert, the Frankston Football Club Football Operations Manager and Kate Gurney, the Northern Bullants Football Club Marketing Manager.

These three examples are a small sample, but are telling of how women occupy significant and meaningful roles and

display just as much passion, maybe more than many of their male counterparts.

Women hold positions in football from the AFL Commission to club presidents, board members, football managers to statisticians to physios, trainers, masseuses, time keepers, scoreboard attendants as well as all three categories of umpires.

And, then there's the ever increasing numbers playing the game.

AFL Victoria can proudly boast that female participation numbers from Auskick through primary school football to junior competitions to the Youth Girls community competition to the Victorian Women's Football League are all on a healthy upward spiral.

Many of those young girls and women are indebted to their family. Mums especially play a major role in taking them to training and games and, more than anything, are encouraging their football pursuit.

And, of course, let's not forget

all the female club members and supporters who make the weekly pilgrimage to matches to show their support.

AFL Victoria runs the successful 'Fair Game – Respect Matters' program, which focuses on making football club environments more conducive, inclusive and welcoming to women and the entire family.

'Fair Game – Respect Matters' Manager, Katrina Leason has initiated a pilot program in the Northern Football League and Essendon District Football League where the outcomes are extremely positive in embracing more women in club environments.

Significantly, there has been several telling spin offs with increased sponsorship and therefore greater revenue streams.

AFL Victoria joins the celebration of women in football, appreciative of their continued support and acknowledging their crucial role in the game.

A lesson we can all learn from

While the VFL each week celebrates a lot of highlights, last week we suffered a lowlight which gained plenty of mainstream media attention.



IN the VFL senior game against Port Melbourne at Port Melbourne last Saturday, North Melbourne rookie listed player Majak Daw was racially abused by a spectator in the first half while playing for his VFL affiliate club the Werribee Tigers.

Earlier this week AFL Victoria acted quickly, banning the spectator from entering VFL games unless he undertakes racial vilification awareness education in a move that reaffirms that racial vilification at any football game is totally unacceptable.

AFL Victoria will offer the spectator racial and religious vilification education. The spectator will be refused entry to any VFL game for the rest of the season and will not be welcome back unless he undertakes the required education process and provides a written apology to Majak Daw.

The AFL Victoria decision came

after discussions with both clubs involved – Port Melbourne and Werribee Tigers, Victoria Police and the North Melbourne Football Club where Majak is a rookie-listed player.

In a statement released by AFL Victoria, general manager Grant Williams said that behaviour of this nature was totally unacceptable at any football game.

"The public condemnation of the racial abuse towards Majak shows that as a society, we are not willing to accept this sort of behaviour, whether it is at the football, or in the general public.

"We do not want people who behave in this manner at our games. We have worked hard to ensure that all players from all cultures are welcome in our game and we will do whatever is required to ensure that they are free from any sort of on or off-field vilification," Williams said.

"While we can remove this spectator from VFL games, the

focus needs to be on educating not only the offender, but anyone attending our matches who thinks that it is okay to racially vilify players.

"It is not, and never will be, acceptable."

The positive to come out of this negative situation is that the general public does not want to tolerate this behaviour.

AFL Victoria works hard in the off season to ensure that all players and officials take part in the AFL's racial and religious vilification education program at the start of each year.

While players and officials are only one part of the football equation of a weekend, the way both clubs – Port Melbourne and Werribee Tigers - quickly responded to the incident on the weekend reflects that our education programs are having an impact.

Seagulls progress to Semi Final

WESTERN Bulldogs coach Rodney Eade did not have much of a day at Skilled Stadium last Saturday, but a State away there were some promising signs for Western Bulldogs fans.

Several young Bulldogs shone in its VFL affiliate Williamstown's strong performance in advancing to the Semi Finals of the inaugural Foxtel Cup with a clinical demolition of West Adelaide at AAMI Stadium last Saturday.

While the Seagulls were without captain Brett Johnson they were far too skilful for West Adelaide who were flattered by the final 15.6 (96) to 12.5 (77) scoreline.

West Adelaide gained some cheap, junk time goals to inflate the closeness of the contest, which was effectively one way traffic after an engrossing opening quarter.

Eade would have been encouraged by the form displayed by young Dogs Zephaniah Skinner, Luke Dahlhaus and Jason Tutt.

Skinner showcased his untapped talent with several spectacular marks and capped off his game with three goals.

Dahlhaus, a rookie listed player, continued his consistent season with another 20-possession game while Tutt highlighted his explosive bursts, which also netted him a couple of goals.

But, it wasn't only the young

pups who performed well. Old Dog Ben Hudson was dominant in the ruck winning 26 hit-outs to give his midfield teammates an armchair ride.

While Messrs Skinner, Dahlhaus, Tutt and Hudson were all telling contributors, there was no better player than Williamstown veteran Ben Jolley.

With Johnson missing, Jolley stepped up to show the way not only in possession winning, but also leadership.

Jolley collected a team-high 22 possessions, including 15 in the first half when the game was there to be won. He controlled play sweeping across half back and through the midfield.

Clearly, the Seagulls benefited from 11 Western Bulldogs players, but the contribution from the Williamstown players was just as effective.

After holding a slender four-point buffer at quarter time, Williamstown increased its intensity as they added 9.2 to 4.2 in the second and third quarters.

Within the space of 10-minutes in the second quarter, Williamstown broken open what was a four-point game.

Former Sydney Swan Patrick Veszpremi kicked the first of his two goals for the game, Tutt chipped in with another and Matthew Panos added a further two within three minutes.

Such was the precision of Williamstown's ball movement

that they had seven straight goals on the board before they registered their first point.

Former Morrish Medal winner Anton Woods and Tutt each added another goal as Williamstown effectively killed the game as a contest.

If there was any life left in the Andy Collins coached West Adelaide it was snuffed out when Veszpremi and Jordan Roughead kicked two of the first three goals to extend Williamstown's lead to 40-points.

Williamstown will now play East Perth in a Foxtel Cup Semi Final on Saturday, July 9 at a venue to be determined.

Women in Football

MUCH has been made about the outstanding success of the 23rd player rule that operates exclusively in the VFL, but North Ballarat premierships coach Gerard FitzGerald reckons the Roosters have an added advantage.

FitzGerald claims North Ballarat would be lost without its 24th player – Marg Richards, the club's Football Manager, an integral part in the club's historic three successive premierships.

So highly respected is Richards that FitzGerald added her to the State representative match official's roster last season as Team Manager.

"'Margie' is brilliantly equipped for that role. Her attention to detail is outstanding as is her ability to meet deadlines and follow up on anything," FitzGerald said.

"She has great respect and loyalty for the football club and AFL Victoria and North Melbourne. She is one of the most loyal people I've ever met.

"If you look at what makes a good manager she ticks a lot of boxes. And, she is also great in the way she deals with the players, she's unique.

"A lot of the boys are living away from home for the first time and the parents of the boys are regularly in contact with 'Margie' about how the boys are going, just those little lifestyle, motherly type issues.

"She is a great conduit

between the families of the boys and the boys themselves."

When North Ballarat first gained its licence in the VFL back in October 1995, Richards applied for a job in football administration. She has been with the club ever since and her role has developed to its current status.

Initially, Richards worked with both the Roosters and North Ballarat Rebels, the TAC Cup team, which operate from the same facility. She did marketing, sponsorship and then her duties evolved to assisting the football manager.

When the position of football manager became available at the end of the 2005 season, Richards put her hand up for the job.

There hasn't been a moment where Richards felt uncomfortable. "There has always been a lot of female involvement. When I started there was a female board member and we've had female statisticians, physios and trainers," she said.

"You do work in a male environment and you do have to adjust to a few things, but there hasn't been an issue. I thoroughly enjoy it."

FitzGerald said Richards role is anything but token. He said it extended to recruiting, list management, player welfare, player support, compliance with AFL Victoria rules and regulations, dealing with local clubs and establishing and

developing key relationships with all stakeholders.

He said Richards capacity to manage game day, including the interchange bench rotations, is extraordinary.

"She works with the medical and strength, conditioning people, the rehab people," he said.

"To me she is priceless and the football club values her highly."

FitzGerald said any barriers that may have existed when Richards first took on her role have been well and truly broken down.

"People just respect the fact that 'Margie' is the football manager and a darn good one."

As football celebrates women in football this weekend, Richards is a shining example of the growing number of women who play an important role in what was once considered the exclusive domain of men.

Victorian Women's Football League, established 30 years ago, continues to develop and expand with last season witnessing the biggest growth in the past five years in participation.

Young females now make up 7.2 percent of all NAB AFL Auckick participants and programs run through primary and junior community football.

AFL Victoria runs a Fair Game – Respect Matters program, a four-year pilot program that

makes club environments conducive to female involvement.

Fair Game – Respect Matters manager Katrina Leason said the genesis behind the programs, which runs in the Northern, Essendon District and a country league to be determined at the end of 2011 – is to create opportunities for women to be more included in the club at all levels.

Leason said the outcomes included greater relationships between netball and football, which brought with it increased council support and sponsorship opportunities and therefore increased revenue.

"It's about clubs making it more inclusive of women and girls, encouraging them to be more family friendly and more welcoming," Leason said.

"It might be increasing the

lighting around the ground, improving bathroom facilities and including nappy change tables in the toilets."

Leason said the objective was to have more women involved on and off the field, which in turn would lead to a decrease with inappropriate behaviour.

Frankston football operations manager is Tina Bremert, whose part-time role in 1999 has developed into an all-encompassing full time role.

Bremert works alongside club legend Bryan Mace, whose tenure with the Dolphins goes back to when he coached the club to its Division 2 premiership in 1978.

And, that role for Bremert includes looking after memberships, sponsors, advertising, functions, fund raising, web site and the transition of players to and

from local clubs and leagues.

"I absolutely love it," Bremert said. "Macey' is great. Once you win his trust he lets you run your own show.

"I wouldn't have stayed if it meant just staying in the back office doing the invoicing. With my background in advertising, my role has expanded greatly.

"It's pretty full on, but the time flies."

Northern Bullants appointed Kate Gurney in February 2010 as its marketing manager and she has made an impact in a tough environment.

Bullants general manager Garry O'Sullivan said Gurney had been a "wonderful acquisition" and her personality and work ethic had helped in marketing and promoting the club.

"She's doing a wonderful job for us," O'Sullivan said.

Geelong open their account

GEELONG broke its victory drought, defeating a stubborn Box Hill Hawks outfit in a nail-biting contest at Box Hill City Oval last Saturday as Kane Hunkin reports.

In an entertaining game where the margin rarely crept over a couple of goals, the two lowly ranked teams played a style of football which contradicted their respective ladder positions.

Geelong, boasting the inclusion of imposing forward Tom Hawkins and promising youngster Allen Christensen, made the play early, kicking to the Whitehorse Rd end in the first quarter. However, key set-shot misses and haphazard forward line delivery belied the Cats' early dominance.

The second term saw the favoured Box Hill team arrest back the momentum kicking six goals to two, resulting in a narrow seven point half-time lead.

The third term sent a scare through the Geelong camp when key position rookie Ryan Bathie remained on the ground, clutching his chest after an errant knee to the sternum encountered in a centre ruck duel.

The last quarter was a dramatic tussle, with the Hawks holding a slight lead throughout, only to be headed by the Cats in the last 90 seconds of play.

The game reached a thrilling conclusion when Box Hill's Tim Northe marked 45 metres out, with less than a minute to play. The left footer struck the kick solidly and accurately but the ball dropped late allowing Cat Casey Tutungi to smartly spoil the ball to the boundary line.



After the game, acting Geelong coach Matthew Egan affirmed the team's enthusiasm, hoping the win motivates the group for the rest of the season.

"We're pumped, the rooms are going off. It hasn't been like this all year, I hope they relish this feeling and [it] keeps us going for the rest of the year," Egan said.

Additionally, the coach highlighted the even contribution of his players, citing their ability to stand up in the match's tense moments.

"I thought our players really stood up when the game counted and that was Allen Christensen and I really liked Motlop's last 10 minutes, thought he was terrific. They [Box Hill] kept pumping the ball in and our backline players were terrific, best game Tommy Gillies' [played] for a while." Moreover, Geelong co-captain Troy Selwood echoed similar sentiments in the rooms.

"It's just rewarding for all the boys. The last couple of weeks they've played really well, their attitude's been fantastic. It's just good for them to get reward at the end of the day for all their hard work of the last

couple of weeks," Selwood said. The defender also highlighted the work of the back unit as a decisive factor.

"We just had to hang tight in the end. In the second quarter we sort of went away from the accountability side of things but after that we just had to beat them in the contest, one-on-one and I felt as though we did that."

Hawkins (two goals) provided a strong option up forward throughout the day, providing some solid marks at various stages. While Shannon Byrnes looked much better for his second run playing primarily in the midfield.

For the beaten Hawks, dangerous forwards Isaac Smith (two goals) and Derek Wanganeen (four goals) were among the best, with David Hale (two goals) performing a respectable role when rotating between the ruck and forward line.

Geelong will now look to post back-to-back wins when they take on Werribee on Sunday while Box Hill hosts Frankston.

WHAT do champion full forwards do when the stop playing?

It's a question that Nick Sautner, the VFL goal kicking

goliath of the 21st century, can't answer simply because he hasn't stopped playing. While the curtain has dropped on his VFL career, Sautner is still playing, albeit that injury has curtailed him in the first half of the season.

After Sautner's work commitments with Etihad Stadium - where he is one of Ian Collins' right hand men - made it impossible for him to meet the stringent training demands set by new coach Brett Lovett, the rising 34-year-old - he celebrates his birthday next weekend - decided to play with Collegians in the VAFA.

Sautner has played just the two games, but even in that cameo he has treated Amateur fans to a taste of his goal kicking prowess.

While held goalless in his debut for Collegians, Sautner rebounded to kick eight in his next match. He's hoping to return to the goal square for Collegians in the second half of the season.

Just last week, Sandringham honoured its five-time premiership player, who holds just about every imaginable record at the Trevor Barker Oval.

About 170 people attended the lunch with tributes to the goal kicking great coming from former premiership captain Chad Liddell, former teammates Tim Scott-Branagan and Mitch Grant with VFA legend Phil Cleary providing his own toast, or

should that be roast.

There's no doubt that Sautner wanted to continue playing with the Zebras this season, but work commitments and overseas travel were such that he was unable to meet Lovett's strict training rules.

As good as Sautner unquestionably was, Lovett could not afford to have a set of rules for all the players and another for Sautner.

Sautner's exit saw him finish his extraordinary career with 873 goals, which left him No 7 on the all-time VFA/VFL list. His 260 games, ironically, also left him at No 7 on the games list.

He may be gone from the Trevor Barker Oval, but not forgotten. Sandringham general manager John Mennie said a group of supporters placed a huge cut out of Sautner behind the Frankston end goals.

Mennie said the club currently has a sign it places behind the southern end goals that depicts the 'Sautner goals' just as former club legend Alf Beus was immortalised on can hill.

He said the club would give consideration to how they would honour its champion goal kicker. "We have our Neil Bencraft best and fairest, but we don't have an actual name for our goal kicking award," Mennie said.

"The next time we do our inductees to our Hall of Fame, Nick would be considered for that, as well as life membership. There's a lot of on-going things with Nick."

In the outer

EACH week at a VFL game we will catch up with a fan in the crowd.



Name: Robert Charles Reid, but I have been known as Charlie all my life.

Lives: Sandringham, I live in enemy territory.

VFL team you support: Port Melbourne, for 80 odd years.

How did you come to support Port Melbourne: Back in around 1922 or so, my father had a barber shop two doors into South Melbourne. I went to school at Nott St Port Melbourne, and that started my Port Melbourne connection. I can work it out that I have been loyal to them since about 1924, so for around 87 years. I claim a record, that I am probably one of the few people who has seen Port through two of their three wooden spoons, and 70 years apart.

How many Port premierships have you seen: 12 (of 15). They

were premiers in 1922 when they beat Footscray by a point but I did not know about Port at that stage. I do remember outside my fathers shop, on a Saturday afternoon, and a chap came by and my dad said 'how did they go?' and he said they had won (the premiership). I did not know what he was talking about at the time, but I soon would.

Favourite past player at Port Melbourne: I have seen some good players running around in my time. Joe Garbutt has been my favourite, he was a full back and wore number 9 on his back. Garbutt was one of the best players I have seen, but thinking more about it, I was only taking into account true Port Melbourne players. I think the best footballer I have ever seen is Austin Robertson – he only played a few games after he spent his time at South Melbourne. Garbutt could kick to the centre of TEAC Oval, he was full back, and he and a Fitzroy fellow used to win all the competitions for long kicking in those days. From memory one day he dashed off from full back – which he used to often do – dashed to almost the centre of the ground and kicked a behind from full back. I would like to say he kicked a goal, but it was only a behind.

Any memorable VFL moments: I was at the game when Tommy Lahiff gave a bit of cheek and they arrested him. Everyone was horrified as old Tom, although he was a funny man, he was Port Melbourne through

and through. He used to say you get red in one eye, and blue in the other.

The day Fred Cook was flattened was one of the most horrifying things I have ever seen because it was unprovoked. Cook was a very fair player and I never saw him do anything untoward. Except one day when one of the opposition kicked a Port player; that was enough to send the fairest player over the edge.

In 1925 when Hawthorn, Footscray and North Melbourne went into the league (VFL), I was disappointed Port was not one of them.

Lastly my favourite umpire was Bill Merrington, and as far as I know, he is the only umpire who has ever been clapped off a Port ground. And the VFL got him eventually. I am a bit sympathetic to umpires, as one eyed supporters only see their side, and the umpire can see things that the supporter can't see.

What do you enjoy about VFL football: Just that it is VFL football. I claim sympathy with Phil Cleary on that.

What is your favourite ground: TEAC Oval, is there any other. I look at this as a second home.

Favourite food at the footy: I have a pastie.

Grand final prediction: I think this is one of the best teams I have seen with Port. I thought last years was very good, but they just fell short. They should make it.

Box Hill Hawks Premiership reunion

PREMIERSHIP success is what every player strives for. Captaining the premiership win would make it even sweeter. But when you build yourself up for the big Grand Final match, you're captain, and your team wins – but you are injured in the first 120 seconds of the match - the game, and your memories of it, change.

Welcome to Matthew Brewer's memories of the Box Hill Hawks 2001 premiership.

"Personally I had been struggling all year with tendinitis in my achilles... I got the first kick of the game and that was about it for me," Brewer said, reflecting on the Box Hill Hawks VFL senior premiership in 2001.

"I tore the calf off the bone and sat down on the bench for the rest of the game and watched it ... watching them do their best work.

"It was very frustrating especially being the first premiership for Box Hill."

Despite injury, nothing was going to stop Brewer holding up the premiership cup at the end of the game.

"No one was going to hold me back, but I did cop it for several months afterwards for only playing for the two minutes."

10 years on, the Box Hill Hawks will celebrate their only VFL premiership with a reunion this weekend. Many of the team from 2001 will return to Box Hill City Oval to remember



the milestone day in the clubs history.

The premiership was significant for the club, as the competition had suffered a shakeup at the end of 1999, with the demise of the AFL reserves, and the beginning of AFL/VFL alignments. For a player like Brewer, it produced uncertainty.

"In 1999, I had just come back to Box Hill after being at the Bulldogs. I had an up and down year and I was not too sure what was going on with the whole situation, and there were a lot of blokes in the same boat who had been at Box Hill for 10 or so years.

"When it happened (AFL/VFL alignments) I asked Donald (Donald McDonald the new Box Hill Hawks coach for 2000) where did my future lie, and will I be playing or not. Hawthorn was bringing their listed players in so the likelihood of getting a game was pretty remote."

With the choice before him, Brewer stuck with Box Hill, like a number of his teammates. Despite it being challenging, Brewer believes it brought the best out of the players.

"It was a tough time, but in the end you have to knuckle down, and put your best foot forward, and get a good base in the preseason, and that is what I did (in 2000).

"It was a really good time to be around the club ... the gel of the Box Hill and Hawthorn guys was good," Brewer said.

"When we were doing our preseason, everyone put in 110% as no one was guaranteed a game. The whole preseason was good – we went up to Noosa for five days – and we set some big goals and we ticked them off as the season progressed. It was probably the hardest the guys had worked in my time there."

Brewer went on to win the best and fairest in the first

year of the Box Hill Hawks/Hawthorn relationship, and his elevation to captain in 2001 was due to his knowledge of the system, and his time spent at Box Hill.

"I think that is why I was made captain the following year, you needed to give the Box Hill guys an inkling of what happens in the AFL pass the knowledge onto them - that this is what you need to do to progress.

"It was a good chance for me (the captaincy), as I had not been in that role before, and Donald spoke to me that we had to bring the two alignments together - I enjoyed it and it was a great reward."

Brewer was part of a potent premiership side, which included the likes of current VFL players, Williamstown captain Brett Johnson and Port Melbourne captain John Baird. The side also unearthed some future premiership players for Hawthorn, with Sam Mitchell, Robert Campbell, Michael Osborne, Chance Bateman and Mark Williams all part of the drought breaking premiership win for Box Hill in 2001.



"It was good to see the young blokes come through. Seeing guys like Sam Mitchell, John Baird, Nick Ries, Nathan Lonie and these sort of guys coming through, it was good," Brewer said.

"Sam (Mitchell) had a ripper game (in the grand final) and he got drafted that year (to Hawthorn), along with John Baird and Michael Firrito (drafted to North Melbourne 2003).

"Chance Bateman, Michael Osborne, these guys have gone on ... there have been a few Box Hill guys recently who have gone on to have good AFL careers so it has been a really good feeder club for AFL sides."

Chelsea flies the flag for females

WHEN Chelsea Roffey swapped her clarinet for a set of flags 13 years ago, she never thought it would lead her onto the biggest stage in the country as Ewen McRae reports.

Answering the call for goal umpires at her school, Chelsea has followed her passion from suburban grounds to the MCG, where she plies her trade as the only female official at the top level.

"I did it cause I was just right into footy, loved being a part of the game, and saw it as an opportunity to just be involved, I never really thought ahead," Chelsea said.

Having moved from Brisbane to Melbourne in recent years she has officiated in several of the biggest games on the AFL calendar, including this year's Anzac Day clash, and was an emergency in both Grand Finals last year.

These three games stand out for Chelsea as not only career highlights but "probably

one of the most thrilling experiences of my life".

"You get shivers up your spine and then once the game gets going and the crowd gets into it, it's just a brilliant experience" she beams.

More and more women are taking up umpiring, with almost 10 per cent of community football umpires now female.

Chelsea may still be a rarity in the male dominated AFL world, but she can see the positive side of her position within the game.

"If guys are out on the paddock, swearing for instance, they'll quite often apologise or just be a little more conscious of the way they're behaving," she said.

"Which is actually really a lovely thing, I don't expect that."

Despite the task of juggling full time work with the demands of AFL umpiring, Chelsea says she's just

taking it 'one game at a time' and would love to see more women pushing through to join her in the umpiring ranks.

"It's fairly obvious that girls really love their footy, that's why I got involved in umpiring," she explains.

"If you do have a genuine passion then you shouldn't let anything get in your way, get in and have a go."



Women in umpiring

MORE women than ever are taking up football umpiring according to new figures released by the AFL.

Almost one in ten football umpires around the country is female, and the AFL is continuing to encourage women to become involved in all aspects of the game, particularly umpiring,

according to coaching and umpiring manager Lawrie Woodman.

"There's been a focus on getting women involved and supporting aussie rules at all levels, as players, umpires, coaches, administrators and volunteers," Mr Woodman said.

"This is another way in which people can participate and

illustrate their love of the game, and I guess it's a pathway that they can get to the top level."

According to AFL figures there are over 73,000 women involved in the game nationally, and umpiring director Jeff Gieschen says it's just a matter of time before we see female boundary and field umpires at the top level.

Williamstown retrospective

life membership

DURING last year's finals, Williamstown general manager Brendan Curry told captain Brett Johnson that he'd just played his 100th game for the club and therefore qualified for life membership.

While appreciative, Johnson said he didn't feel comfortable that he was afforded life membership when Matthew Cravino, who joined the club at the same time and had played the same duration, albeit mainly in the reserves, would not receive the same honor. The leadership group asked Curry if the Williamstown Football Club Board would look at re-assessing the qualification clause for life membership.

Curry put the proposal to the Board noting that given the landscape has changed dramatically with alignments and that players these days tended not to spend as long a period with the one club. The Board considered the proposal and it was agreed that if a player amasses a mix of 130 senior and reserves games since the VFL competition was revamped in 2000 they would be eligible for Williamstown Life Membership.

As an aside Johnson asked Curry if there had been any other player who had played 100 senior games that had not been presented with life membership.

It sparked Curry on a search through the club archives,

which unearthed a treasure trove of club greats who, for whatever reason, had not been recognised.

Curry discovered 25 players whose games tally reached the criteria of 100 games that qualified them for life membership.

Remarkably, it included some players indelibly linked with the Seagulls' finest moments.

Colin Wilcox, a member of the Seagulls' 1939,'45 and '49 premierships, a best and fairest winner and a veteran of 173 games – just two shy of VFA/VFL Life Membership – had never been awarded life membership.

Nor had Eddie Deller, a member of the '39 premiership who played 130 games with the club and the father of Bill, who umpired five VFL Grand Finals in the 1960s-70s.

"History is a great asset to the football club," Curry said.

"With alignments people can feel a little removed from a football club, but from our

point of view we think it is critical to bring the past players in even closer to the club."

Curry recently asked Deller if his late father had ever mentioned anything about life membership at Williamstown. "Bill said his dad was always dirty that he didn't get his life membership," Curry said.

Williamstown plans to honor all 25 players and has already bestowed life membership on John Fanning and Mark Fotheringham at the recent mid-season ball, which featured the 1976 and '86 premiership reunions.

Fanning, whose son David played with Williamstown while he was on Collingwood's list and now plays at Port Melbourne and last week played his 100th VFL game, was a great for the Seagulls for a decade.

He won a best and fairest (1974), played in a premiership ('76) and captain-coached the club ('78) as well as playing 130 games.

Fanning recalled he came to Point Gellibrand as a result of a player revolt in early 1970 at Essendon, where he played six games.

"The club (Essendon) was in a fairly unhappy state. There was a player strike and I decided to give it away. After about one month Williamstown contacted me," Fanning recalled.

"I didn't know a lot about Williamstown to be quite honest. I spoke to my dad and he said they were a great club and I went down there and it was the year they had come up from Second Division and when I got there they were second on the ladder.

"It was a really exciting year. We played off in the Grand Final, but unfortunately got beaten. I was captivated by the place, it was an incredibly colorful place and colorful personalities around every corner.

"It really appealed to me and I stayed there."

Even after a season at Brunswick late in his career, Fanning was lured back to the charismatic Williamstown where he played until was virtually unable to play at the standard any longer.

The club holds many great memories for Fanning who is still a regular on the terraces. "I was lucky enough to play in some very good sides and I played against some very good players. When I came to Williamstown I underestimated just how good the players were," Fanning said.

"I remember playing my first game at Sandringham against Darryl McKenzie. I was just surprised just how good these

guys were. I'd seen them on TV, but it wasn't until I was up against them that I realized how good they were, they were hard to beat."

Mark Fotheringham owns a special place in the VFA/VFL annals. He sits fourth on the all-time goal kicking list with 928 goals from 174 games. Fotheringham played 101 with the Seagulls and kicked 571 goals.

At Williamstown he made such an impact that he was named in the Team of The Century.

Fotheringham was a phenomenon at Division 2 club Yarraville, where he started his career. Not surprisingly Coburg and Werribee as well as Williamstown were keen to secure his services when he decided to upgrade his football.

It proved an inspired choice by Fotheringham in selecting Williamstown as he played in the club's 1986 premiership in a match where another VFA legend Phil Cleary was ordered from the field.

During his time at Williamstown, Fotheringham formed a bond with the great Barry Round, a teammate in 1986 and the pair would reunite when Round was coach in the 1990s and Fotheringham club general manager.

Fotheringham still laughs at how the team selection would take place in the comfort of the Hobson's Bay Hotel each Thursday night with a couple of refreshing drinks to sooth any selection dilemmas.

Battle of key forwards

PORT Melbourne kept their flawless season in tact in a match that became a battle of the key forwards, overcoming Werribee by 19 points at TEAC Stadium on Saturday, as Samantha Landy reports.

Dean Galea's stellar four-goal second quarter and Patrick Rose's inspired three-goal final term for the Boroughs were pitted against Ben McKinley's superb six-goal haul for the Tigers – four in the third term – to create an exciting contest of shifting momentum.

Eighth-placed Werribee exceeded expectations by soundly challenging the undefeated Port Melbourne, who only really looked in control when kicking into the wind in the second and fourth terms. The Tigers totally controlled the premiership quarter, at one stage hitting the front, but the Borough fought back to claim their eighth straight win.

Port Melbourne coach Gary Ayres acknowledged the importance of the victory, stating that “winning ugly” is always a good “reality check” for the players.

“I thought we were very good in the last quarter. When we made the right plays and the right decisions, executed them quickly and got it into our forward line, and Patty Rose had a superb second half, it showed on the scoreboard,” he said. Ayres praised Galea and Rose for bringing “class” when it counted in the match, but admitted he would have preferred more sustained efforts from his leading forwards.

“One had his game on after half time; the other had his on after quarter time,” he said. “But

you've gotta have that class, and I thought we got that in the last quarter.”

But the coach does not overrate this two-pronged attack, taking more pride today in his side's spread of eight goal kickers.

“Our effort to have 10, 11, 12 goal scorers puts a lot more pressure back on the opposition,” Ayres said. “They can go to Galea or they can go to Rose, and if they're laying off and making it two on one then we're gonna have someone free. Our midfielders can kick goals.”

Ayres conceded his side “looked really flat” in the first and third quarters and recognised Port's mandatory week off as contributing to this.

“I've always looked at [the bye] as not a positive. It might help you down the track...[but] I thought our players who are normally sharp and slick and skilful certainly took a while to get into it.”

The effects of the bye were not apparent at the start of the match, with Port Melbourne slotting the first three goals.

However the Tigers responded with two majors in as many minutes to youngster Tom Ruggles and McKinley and a miraculous soccer goal to Bradley Mangan right before the siren to draw level with the Boroughs at quarter time.

The first quarter was a fairly even contest, with both teams moving the ball fluidly through the midfield and playing strong defensive games.

Ayres predicted in the quarter time huddle that “every [Port] player can improve in the next 30 minutes”, and he was not proven wrong.

The ladder leaders piled on

six goals to two in the second term to advance to a 23-point lead, fronted by Galea who showed remarkable prowess at marking overhead for his height and booted four majors. Adam Bentick and Cory McGrath started to dominate in the midfield while Sam Fleming upped his game in defence. But Werribee came out firing after the major break, reducing the Boroughs lead to three points and turning the match into a “real winnable game” according to coach Paul Slattery.

McKinley dislodged Galea as the match's prominent forward, slotting four goals to bring his total to a game high six. Sam Wormald had a blistering third term, making an impact all over the ground. He was assisted in the midfield by his captain Dom Gleeson and ex-Hawk Travis Tuck, while Robbie Tarrant was solid in defence and Ben Ross started to make an impact at half forward.

But Port showed their premiership credentials by lifting in the final term to post a 19-point win over a brave Werribee. Rose was incredible, booting three goals to add to his two from the previous quarter, one of which resulted from a mercurial pick-up and around-the-body kick.

To think Port Melbourne can only get better – with Shane Valenti to return from injury, and a number of players pressing for selection from the reserves – has got to be an ominous prospect for the rest of the competition.

Northe's ready for tall challenge

WHEN you stand 176 cm - as Richmond forward Robin Nahas does - not too many footballers figuratively look up to you.

Not only does Nahas have five centimetres on Box Hill Hawks recruit Tim Northe, but the Gippsland Power graduate also uses the Tiger as his inspiration.

Northe hopes he can plot a similar path to the AFL as Nahas who spent three seasons with Port Melbourne before he was drafted by Richmond.

"The aim over the next couple of seasons is to put on a few kilos and hopefully move into the midfield at some stage over the next couple of years," Northe said.

"Seeing blokes like Robin Nahas and David Rodan, blokes around my height make it, especially Robin Nahas who was drafted from the VFL are good signs for me.

"If I can play well over the next two, three or four years then I'm still a chance."

Northe is also aware that Sam Mitchell, another ex-Box Hill Hawk, spent a season in the VFL before he was drafted by Hawthorn.

He noted that it can take just one really strong season for

AFL recruiters to take notice, but he knows that for someone of his stature it's going to take time.

"I'm a bit behind in that area, but over the next couple of years I'll build on that and see what happens."

After being an automatic selection throughout his junior career, Northe quickly discovered that the leap to senior football can be a quantum one.

Northe found the physicality coupled with the AFL-like strategy and tactics as the biggest eye-openers as he made the transition from TAC Cup to VFL.

"It's a lot tougher than I expected. It's been a slower start than I would have liked, but I've had a couple of games in the seniors and I've done alright. Hopefully, I can continue on and string a couple together," he said. "I need to improve my gut running, that's the biggest thing."

He spent a week at Essendon training for a spot on the Bombers' rookie list. Nothing eventuated, but Northe said the experience of training alongside players like Jobe Watson proved invaluable.

Northe, a member of Gippsland Power's Grand Final team as well as Vic Country's AFL U18 National Championship winning team, initially trained with Casey Scorpions.

He received a phone call from his old coach - Carroll

coached Northe the past two seasons in the TAC Cup - and invited him to train with the VFL Hawks.

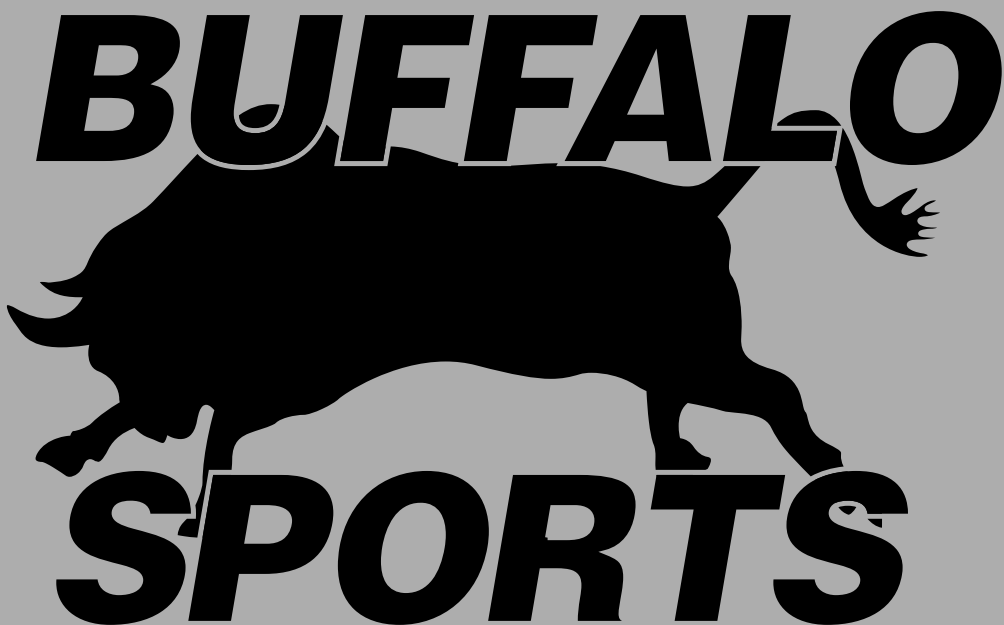
From the moment he arrived at the club, Northe loved it. "DC (Carroll) was probably the biggest reason for me going there, but I really enjoy it.

"We spoke about making a statement and Dylan played a big role in that," Potter said.

Murphy, one of 13 VFL Listed players to play for Coburg Tigers against Collingwood, responded to the challenge. Apart, if you can down grade six goals, from the goals, the 18-year-old also had 17 possessions, seven tackles, six clearances and six inside 50s.

Potter took advantage of the 23rd player rule to bring up Murphy and like his teammates, the significance of what the match meant was not lost on anybody.

"Dylan came in and played with the same confidence he's shown in the development squad (VFL reserves) the past four weeks," Potter said. Murphy at that stage led the goal kicking in the reserves.

"He positioned himself really well as a small forward, he got to the right spots and a couple of times he got lucky with chest marks inside 50, but at the same time most of his goals were as a result of his work rate and getting to the right spot.

"He gets separation from his opponent really well by reading the play and working hard."

Modestly, Murphy described his game as "a good start"

"I wasn't expecting to kick

goals, but I'll take it. I just played my role for the team and the result was good all around – we won and I managed to kick a couple," Murphy said.

"It was our first win for the season and my first game. I was lucky to be a part of it. All the boys were rapt. The theme for the day was to make a statement and we knew we had it in us.

"It took us six weeks to get going, but we finally had our first win and now we can go on with it. We've got a really big challenge coming up against Port Melbourne."

While he had been kicking goals in the reserves, Murphy understood that he had to bide his time until an opportunity presented itself and when it did, he had to take it to the bank, so to speak.

It was a statement that Coburg Tigers and Dylan Murphy had to make.

Falcons fly into top four

THE Geelong Falcons handed the Sandringham Dragons their third straight loss at Highgate Reserve in Craigieburn on Saturday, as Adem Saricaoglu reports.

Their 40-point win brought the Falcons into the top four, one spot below the Dragons on the ladder at the end of round eight.

Sandringham's forward press took effect from the first bounce and restricted much of Geelong's run throughout the first quarter.

The Dragons dominated possession in their forward half, but on the scoreboard could only kick one of their six scoring shots accurately, and led by only three points at quarter time.

Their wayward kicking continued into the second quarter, with Jackson Coleman getting nothing from his shot, but team mate Anthony Anastasio was able to convert minutes later to extend the lead to 10.

The Falcons lifted their intensity and slowly grabbed control of the game, which was rewarded with back-to-back goals to Jai Sheahan that put them in front. Geelong's increasing pressure on the ball carrier forced Sandringham into basic skill errors.

A clanger handball from Dragon Dylan Gabron-Uhe while being tackled gifted Jackson Merrett his first goal for the game, extending Geelong's lead to nine points, which was cut down to three by half time.

Geelong coach Aaron Greaves was pleased his side's second term resurgence after asking for more urgency at quarter time.

"We just weren't backing ourselves to run and carry through their press enough early on," Greaves said.

"We were just too stagnant; we needed more movement through it."

Sandringham coach Dale Tapping said wasted opportunities in front of goal hurt his side going into the main break.

"If you kick three or four of those it puts the opposition under a little more pressure because they kick one goal and their back in the game again," he said.

"I thought we pretty much, for the first 20 minutes, dominated general play."

The game's tempo lifted from what was a dogged first half in the third quarter, but most of the scoring went to the Falcons' end of the ground.

Back-to-back goals for Geelong midfielder Jordan Keras set the tone for the rest of day.

Geelong, less affected by the NAB AFL Under-18 Championships than the Dragons, looked and played more efficiently.

Anastasio's second goal pegged the margin back to 10 points 11 minutes in, but Matthew Higgins replied for the Falcons a minute later.

Sandringham fought hard to stay in the game and attacked the footy well, but another goal



from Sheahan at the 16-minute mark seemed to deflate their spirits.

Four goals to one in the third quarter had the Falcons up by 20 at the last change and the game wrapped up.

Geelong added another four goals to Sandringham's one in the final quarter.

Tapping said after the game that he was pleased with his side's effort to compete with Geelong's bigger bodies.

"If you look at it from a win perspective, yes it was disappointing, but I was quiet happy with the way the boys competed," he said.

"Given where the squad is at currently I thought we did pretty well."

Greaves said Geelong's work rate was impressive after their slow start.

"It probably took a little bit to get into the game," Greaves said.

"Once we did, I thought our second half was fantastic."
