This weekend we enter the second half of the Peter Jackson Melbourne VFL season.

ONE of the great things about football is that it never runs to script, not that anyone would really want it to.

As we click over to the second half of the VFL season, it's worth reflecting on what has transpired in the first 11 rounds.

Possibly it will provide an insight into what the next 11 rounds may hold, but you would not want to stake your life on it.

History tells us there is still so much to play out before the identity of the two clubs who will fight out the 2011 VFL Grand Final will be known.

Logistically, Port Melbourne, which has hosted finals on a regular basis for many years, suits, but it has drainage issues and other venues such as Box Hill and Highgate Reserve, Craigieburn, come under consideration.

Such a decision on the other venues in the first week of the finals will be made after the composition of the final eight is decided and various machinations regarding ground suitability, ladder position, supporter base, requirements of aligned AFL clubs, etc. are factored.

Certainly, the introduction of the Foxtel Cup has allowed three VFL clubs to showcase their individual brand as well as provide exposure for their club and players to a national audience.

Williamstown has progressed to next month's Foxtel Cup Semi Final. We wish them well in their bid to win the inaugural Foxtel Cup.

What we have witnessed so far this season in the VFL is an escalation again of the standard of football as this unique



competition capitalises on the weekly inclusion of so many AFL listed and rookie players. There's little doubt that competing against such talent takes those VFL listed players to a new level and that it is the proverbial win/win result – a healthy, vibrant, competitive league where players are challenging themselves each and every week.

Already, we have seen many VFL players – Ahmed Saad, Tyson Thomas and Tom Sundberg – impress before the increased scrutiny of AFL talent scouts. Many more will before the season is over.

Port Melbourne, celebrating its 125th anniversary in the competition, has been the trendsetter with a remarkable 9-0 start to the season. Just how far the club is able to extend its winning streak will be just one of many second half of season stories.

Like all football fans we can't wait for them to be told.

Where has the season gone?

With 11 rounds of the 2011 season now completed, clubs now have 11 rounds left to shape their year.



HERE we are at the half way mark of the season. I am not sure if it is just me, but where have the first 11 rounds of the season gone? It is not so long ago that predictions were being made for the 2011 season, with Williamstown and North Ballarat the early teams being spoken about regarding this year's premiership.

It has been a huge season so far. We have an undefeated side sitting on top of the ladder in Port Melbourne. It has been a few vears - despite having the bye that a team has not suffered their first defeat in the early stages of the season. Williamstown have been travelling well at their temporary home this season, liking Avalon Airport Oval and Torquay, much better than they do Keilor which they travelled to last week. The top four changes on a weekly basis, but the top eight has remained constant over recent weeks, and the teams outside the eight - as we will read in our half season review in today's Record - will have to find some consistent form to try and

eject one of the current sides. It is also pleasing that all sides have recorded at least one win for the season, with all of those sides. who brought up their first win in the last month (Frankston, Coburg then Geelong) all spending some time in bottom spot on the ladder. As we look at the form of sides at the half way mark of the year, that magical word 'finals' starts to be bandied around a lot more. Terminology like 'finals chances'. 'run home', and 'mathematical possibility' start to creep into the vernacular in the final 11 rounds of the season

Apart from the clubs battling for spots on the ladder, there are a number of individuals battling for positions on a ladder of another kind – the goalkicking ladder. The new recruits are dominating the top of the goalkicking ladder this year, with Patrick Rose (38 goals), Matthew Little (31), Tory Dickson (27) and Dean Galea (26) battling it out in the upper echelons of the ladder in the first half of the season. Rose, Little and Dickson have quickly found their feet at their respective new clubs this year (Port Melbourne and Bendigo Bombers). Last year both Rose and Galea failed to make it to the half century mark, but this year as a forward combination they are both likely to reach that mark, and kick over 100 goals between them. Add to their fire power Chris Cain and Myles Pitt, and Port have plenty of forward depth.

Little and Dickson are forming a similar combination at Bendigo, and in recent weeks have added Justin Maddern to the mix – with Maddern kicking 10 goals in two games. Little is enjoying less pressure to be the main focal point this year, and will enjoy the challenge of chasing his former Williamstown teammate (Rose) in the race for back to back Frosty Miller Medals.

A big second half of the season ensues, which is sure to bring plenty of excitement as we count down to finals football in 2011.

Bullants bundled out

THE NORTHERN Bullants were bundled out of the Foxtel Cup following a lack lustre display against Claremont at the Gold Coast's Metricon Stadium last Saturday.

The Bullants were effectively given a football lesson by a more committed, cleaner and crisper Claremont who advanced to the Foxtel Cup Semi Final with a clinical 46-point win, 13.12 (90) to 7.2 (44).

Claremont were so effective and efficient with their ball movement and use that that match was virtually in their keeping at half time.

After Ash Arrowsmith kicked the opening goal of the match for the Bullants, Claremont took control with former Carlton player Luke Blackwell, who collected a match-high 20 possessions and laid five tackles, dominating through the midfield.

Blackwell is well known to the Bullants as he played with the VFL club during his time with the Blues. He's since won two best and fairests for Claremont since returning to the west.

Claremont kicked the next four goals of the quarter to set up a 21-point lead at quarter time, but worse was in store for the Bullants during a match defining second quarter.

Tom Lee kicked his second goal of the match as Claremont increased its lead to 29-points before the Bullants answered through goals to Rohan Kerr and Wayde Twomey which seemed to signal the Bullants were about to march back into the match.

But, it was Claremont that switched into overdrive. Claremont's Matt Orzel, playing his 100th match and Fremantle Docker Byron Schramer started an unanswered five goal burst with back-to-back goals.

It was to get a whole lot worse for Northern Bullants in the final 90 seconds of the second term when Claremont kicked three goals to effectively signal the end of the Foxtel Cup for the Bullants.

Northern Bullants lifted their work rate and commitment in the second half as they outscored Claremont 4.1 to 3.6, but the damage had well and truly been done.

Carlton's Ryan Houlihan was the Bullants top possession winner with 19, just in front of best and fairest winner Jarrod McCorkell with Kerr next best with 17 while Robert Warnock won 24 hit outs.

Claremont effectively shut down Bullants' prime over Brock McLean, who was restricted to five possessions, and leading goal kicker Ahmed Saad, who had six possessions, most of them coming after half time.

The Bullants had no match for Claremont's running power through the lines and could not stop its slick ball control and finding players in space.

Conversely, Northern Bullants could not get any systematic entry into its forward 50 and when it did, it could not find anyone to take charge.

Claremont will now play the winner of this weekend's North Adelaide/Port Adelaide match with Williamstown facing East Perth in the other Semi Final on July 9.

VFL Mid Season Review

COULD 2011 finally be the season where Port Melbourne ends its longest premiership drought in club history? Adrian Dunn looks at the season so far in the VFL.

There's still much to play out before the VFL Grand Final is decided at Etihad Stadium on Sunday, September 25, but all the early indicators clearly suggest that Port Melbourne has as great a chance as any club.

Port Melbourne has been the standout club in the first half of the season, setting the foundation for its first flag since 1982.

While the Borough demolished arch rival Williamstown in its round 7 meeting, the Seagulls have swept past everyone else giving rise to the prospect of the competition's most traditional rivals going headto-head for the VFL Grand Final.

Port Melbourne/Williamstown Grand Finals were a staple of the 1950s when the clubs met in three successive Grand Finals – Williamstown won all three.

These two great clubs last meet in a VFL Grand Final in 1964 where the Borough triumphed.

But, it's too early in the season to be locking in that mouth-watering prospect. Certainly, Northern Bullants, Casey Scorpions and Bendigo Bombers would like their chances of advancing to the Grand Final. And, then there's North Ballarat, seeking a competition equalling fourth successive premiership. While the Roosters started slowly, they're building momentum and loom as a definite danger.

As for the fight for the eight, it would appear those clubs currently outside the eight have a considerable challenge to force their way into it, but nothing in football is ever that straight forward.

It's not as simple or as straight forward as that and that's why the second half of the season is even more intriguing than the start of the season.

Here is a mid-season report on each club, what's gone right, what hasn't, the outlook and our verdict on what might unfold.

BENDIGO BOMBERS

2011 Position: 5th 6-3 2010 Position: 7th 5-4

Goalkickers: Matthew Little (31), Tory Dickson (27), Justin Maddern (10), Travis Colyer (10)

Season so far: Bendigo's mid-season review seems straight forward – they've beaten up on all the teams below them on the ladder and lost to all those above them. After losing the season-opener to Northern Bullants by a whopping 76-points, the VFL Bombers then staked revenge by defeating North Ballarat, Frankston, Collingwood and Werribee. Bendigo's winning margin range spread from 27-80 points in those four wins. In all four wins they kicked 120 plus points while holding the opposition to under 100. Casey stopped the winning spree when they inflicted a 27-point defeat and then Bendigo, like everyone else, was no match for Port Melbourne The VEL Bombers jumped Port early and held a 7-point lead at half time, but were outscored 15-7 goals in the second half. As has been their want, Bendigo then belted Geelong by seven goals on the rebound and then travelled to Sandringham where their three-pronged attack of Messrs Little. Dickson and Maddern proved dominant. Little and Dickson have proved key focal points in attack, co-captains Ben Duscher and Trent Shinners have been solid contributors and the Bombers' AFL listed players seemingly have all bought into Shannon Grant's program.

Outlook: Two byes punctuate the last 10 weeks of the home and away season, but apart from that they also face a tough run home. They play Port Melbourne (away) and Williamstown (home) as well as an away trip to Werribee. Bendigo finishes the season hosting the improving North Ballarat. Interspersed in the fixture are games against Box Hill Hawks, Coburg Tigers, Geelong and Collingwood, where they'll start warm favourites.

Verdict: Bendigo would have

to endure a massive melt down to miss making the finals, especially with a few of their remaining games at the QE Oval. If the Bombers want to make a serious assault on the premiership they will need to show they're capable of beating a team above them. They certainly get that opportunity against Port Melbourne and Williamstown and would need to win at least one if not both games to secure a top four finish at the end of the home and away season.

BOX HILL HAWKS

2011 Position: 9th 3-6

2010 Position: 8th 4-5

Goalkickers: Jordan Lisle (20), Jayden Hoegel (11), Derick Wanganeen (10)

Season so far: Frustrating best sums up the VFL Hawks season. Others may prefer a more colourful term. but Box Hill Hawks start has certainly been laced with a large dollop of what might have been Box Hill Hawks have lost four games by 19-points or less and they were clearly in a position to win three of those games. The Hawks led Williamstown by 20-points at half time, but were overrun in the second half to lose by 11-points and they were in an even stronger position against Northern Bullants when they led by four goals at half time, but capitulated with a 5 to 10 goal second half. And, it was even worse against the previously win-less Geelong, whom they led by sevenpoints at three-quarter time. but were run-over by the Cats in the last term. Box Hill Hawks took an eternity to shake off a persistent Frankston to mathematically keep alive

their flickering finals hopes. Admittedly, Box Hill Hawks have been hit by key injuries to senior VFL players - Beau Muston and Shaun Pollard as well as to the Hawthorn list and star recruit Adam Pattison missed two games through suspension. Box Hill Hawks has won one close match. however, against Sandringham and they were competitive against Port Melbourne, succumbing by only four goals in the season opener. One of Box Hill Hawks biggest concerns is applying enough scoreboard pressure. Only once – against Coburg Tigers - have they kicked a century scoreline with 10-12 goals its season average.

Outlook: While Muston and Pollard will play in the second half and Pattison is getting better every week, Box Hill Hawks season looks

consigned to the 'what if' books. Those narrow losses look set to come back to haunt the club as its run home shapes as extremely tough.

Verdict: Given the heartache endured in the first half of the season. Box Hill has dug a considerable hole for themselves. If they are to somehow find a way out they will have to start winning on a consistent basis. For the Hawks to make the finals they will need to win seven of their remaining nine games. That's a particularly tough assignment given they finish off the season against Port Melbourne and Williamstown as well as playing against Casey, Northern Bullants and North Ballarat.

CASEY SCORPIONS

2011 Position: 4th 6-3

2010 Position: 1st 8-1

Goalkickers: Brendan Fevola (16), Matthew Bate (16), Michael Newton (13)

Season so far: No shortage of headlines not all of them wanted, courtesy of the signing of Brendan Fevola and all his tribulations along the way. While 'Fev' has unintentionally hogged the spotlight, Casey has gone about its business of shoring up a finals berth and possibly a top four finish. The Scorpions haven't relied solely on 'Fey' to kick all its goals - Demons Matthew Bate and Michael Newton have complimented the former Carlton/Brisbane star in that regard - and there have been plenty of other contributors. Casey's defence has been frugal. Only Port

Melbourne, Williamstown and Collingwood have posted century scorelines against Casey, who took the 'big two' clubs down to the wire in both games with the Borough and the Seagulls winning by 10 and 20-points respectively. In fact, Casey outscored Port 12-5 goals in the second half. Northern Bullants is the only other club to defeat the Scorpions and, again, that match was in the balance until the final siren. The Scorpions have dealt with all those others teams around them - Bendigo (27-points), North Ballarat (56 and that was at North Ballarat) and Sandringham (10 and that was at the Trevor Barker Oval). Captain James Wall has been good, Michael Stockdale is starting to regain the form he showed last season when a VFL representative player and Melbourne has run a number of its talented young players through Casey in a bid to play them into form.

Outlook: Casey has done enough to suggest it will again be a finalist and the club is certainly well placed to make a push for a top four finish. Obviously, Fevola will be a key player as he regains match fitness. There is little doubt that he is a top quality player and he will prove a handful as the finals approach. Melbourne's depth is such that the Scorpions will have plenty of talent at their disposal. The Scorpions have also been aided by a fabulous draw they don't play Port Melbourne and Williamstown again and its game against Northern Bullants is at Casev Fields

 and they play the current five bottom clubs - Frankston, Coburg Tigers, Geelong, Collingwood and Box Hill Hawks – in the run home.

Verdict: Lock Casey Scorpions in for their fifth successive finals campaign. The Scorpions have proved they're not too far off Port Melbourne and Williamstown and if 'Fev' gets it altogether then the Scorpions could be making headlines for all the right reasons.

COBURG TIGERS

2011 Position: 11th 1-7

2010 Position: 11th 3-6

Goalkickers: Nick Carnell (15), Dylan Murphy (9), Ben Nason (6)

Season so far: Disappointing is the only way to describe Coburg Tigers season. While the club has been a victim of having three byes in the first 10 rounds, which curtailed momentum and consistency. there's no denving the club has under-performed. Admittedly, it could have been a different season if Coburg Tigers had not lost against Sandringham and Northern Bullants by three and seven points respectively in the first two games they played. From there on it's got pretty ugly. Box Hill Hawks. Williamstown and North Ballarat all defeated Coburg by 50-plus points and then Frankston snapped a 22-game losing streak when they made the long trek to Craigieburn and came from a quarter-time deficit to surge clear to post a 19-point win. It sent the club to rock bottom. but to the players credit they re-grouped to defeat Collingwood comfortably for their first win of the season. Certainly, it was overdue. Port Melbourne provided an insight of just how far off the pace Coburg Tigers are with a 104-point victory. Injuries have played a part with Justin Kahlefeldt and Sam Power missing games, but injuries, regrettably, comes with the territory. And, there have been plenty of Richmond players with AFL talent playing on a regular basis. Unfortunately

for Coburg Tigers it hasn't amounted to anywhere near enough wins. What has been the real positive has been the emergence of several young players Willie Wheeler, Dylan Murphy and Glen Grgic.

Outlook: The good news is that Coburg Tigers don't have to worry about Port Melbourne and Williamstown for the rest of the season. The other positive is there will be some continuity with Coburg Tigers plaving 10 games in a row before the season ends with a bye in the final round of the home and away season. At least first-vear coach Adam Potter can get some momentum going and hopefully this can produce better results.

Verdict: With finals virtually out of the equation, Coburg Tigers must view the second half as building for 2012 by blooding young players and discovering which ones can help it going forward. Coburg Tigers haven't played finals for the past two seasons and it must gain some core VFL players.

COLLINGWOOD

2011 Position: 10th 3-7 2010 Position: 5th 6-3

Goalkickers: Brett Eddy (18), Brad Dick (12), Jack Peckham (10)

Season so far: Mixed bag – inspiring victories and demoralising losses with more of the latter than the former for the Collingwood faithful's liking. It opened with a 74-point shellacking of Frankston, but then there was a spate of similar sized losses – Werribee (90-points) and Bendigo Bombers (80), but to the VFL Magpies credit they literally climbed off the canvas to defeat reigning premier North Ballarat by one point following a five to one goal last quarter. Collingwood clung to a four-point victory against Geelong after jumping to a six goal to zero goal opening term. The VFL Magpies proved competitive against Williamstown, but they were never really in the losses against Coburg Tigers (39-points),



Collingwood caused an upset in round 5 by defeating North Ballarat.

Casey Scorpions (42) and Northern Bullants (46). As the season has progressed, Collingwood has been forced to call up more and more top up players as injury hits its AFL list. Interestingly, top up players Tom Sundberg and captain Kris Pendlebury have been among their best each week with Sundberg enjoying a career season, putting himself right in contention for VFL Team Of The Year selection.

Outlook: Challenging run home for the Magpies as they encounter Port Melbourne and Williamstown (in back-toback weeks) and two games against Sandringham, but they have return games against Frankston and Geelong and an away trip to Box Hill Hawks.

Verdict: It is hard to imagine that Collingwood will win enough games to climb into the eight, but then against that's not a key focus for the club. If the Magpies can overcome their injury concerns and field their best team then, as they've shown at times this season, they will prove formidable opponents in the run into the finals.

FRANKSTON

2011 Position: 13th 1-8

2010 Position: 14th 1-8

Goalkickers: Luke Clark (17), Bob McCallum (8), Shane Hockey (6)

Season so far: For the first eight rounds it must have seemed like Groundhog Day for the Dolphins. Season 2011 started just as last season ended – defeat followed defeat, some of them stinging. While Frankston was competitive against arch rival Sandringham, they were on the receiving end of some frightful hidings from Collingwood (74-points). Bendigo Bombers (52) and Casey (76), but it was their biggest defeat - a 20goal mauling against Port Melbourne, which proved a line in the sand. After that uncompetitive display, the Dolphin players met and decided they never wanted to endure such collective embarrassment again. Talk may be cheap, the Frankston rebounded with some action. They tested Northern Bullants for much of the day, falling 16-points short then travelled to Craigieburn where they overcame a tardy start to upset Coburg Tigers to post their first victory in 23 matches. Ironically, Frankston's last victory was against Coburg Tigers last season. Reigning premiers North Ballarat were made to work overtime for its 28-point win and they took Box Hill Hawks down to the wire. Forward Luke Clark has proved a focal point in attack. Russ Gabriel has toiled against bigger, stronger ruckmen, Toby Thoolen has enjoyed a consistently good season and Mark Baquely has cut out opposition prime movers while winning plenty of the ball himself

Outlook: Coach Simon Goosey is committed to turning over his young list in a bid to find players who can cut it at the VFL level. Already, Goosey has discovered youngsters like Emilo Bitters, Daniel Uzarevic, Gavin Marusic, Andrew Douglas and Rob Clements who have all displayed enough to say they could develop into fine VFL players.

Verdict: If Frankston players remain true to their pact after the Port Melbourne humbling then they will have a far more eniovable second half of the season. Certainly, the signs have been encouraging so far. While they won't make a march on the finals. Frankston can continue to make improvement in the second half of the season. The likely inclusion of experienced Clint Proctor and Paul Rogash, who've missed large chunks of the season through injury, will only help.

GEELONG

2011 Position: 12th 1-8

2010 Position: 10th 3-6

Goalkickers: Mitchell Brown (17), Nathan Vardy (11), Jordan Schroder (10)

Season so far: Geelong's season hasn't scaled any areat heights. In fact, the VFL Cats were the last club to post its first win for the season and even that round 10 match was anything but convincing as they scraped home by a solitary point against Box Hill Hawks. Geelong was certainly in the contest against Collingwood, a match they lost by four-points, back in round 7. And, they were competitive in the season-opener against Casey Scorpions, which they lost by 17-points, but, for the most part Geelong has struggled to gain any real traction. Geelong has lost five games in the 28-45 point range. Significantly, only once - against Williamstown, back in round 4 - have Geelong posted a century scoreline. Conversely, they've allowed four hundred plus scorelines and that differential is telling in many respects. Mature age VFL recruit Andrew McLean has been outstanding in defence, positioning himself well for VFL Team Of The Year honours. Captain Matthew Firman and former Brisbane Lion Troy Selwood have been solid contributors, but Geelong's young list has taken time to adjust to the VFL tempo.

Outlook: With Northern Bullants and Port Melbourne on the horizon, Geelong faces another couple of testing weeks. The VFL Cats will like their chances against Frankston, Coburg Tigers and Collingwood, but it shapes as slim pickings for Geelong.

Verdict: Unless there is a stunning form reversal, Geelong will miss the VFL finals for the third time in the past four years. The VFL Cats appear a fair way off the mark in comparison to ladder leader Port Melbourne who are bursting with seasoned VFL players most with 50 plus games behind them.

NORTH BALLARAT

2011 Position: 6th 6-3

2010 Position: 3rd 7-2

Goalkickers: Aaron Edwards (18), Derick Micallef (14), Aaron Black (10)

Season so far: It appeared after its first four matches that North Ballarat's world had fallen apart - three losses, including a head-spinning one point loss against Collingwood when they led by a big enough margin to win the Melbourne to Warrnambool bike race! And, two of those losses were at North Ballarat's Eureka Stadium where they have been nigh on invincible in recent seasons. But, that was the Rooster's lot early in the season as they struggled to come to terms without all their premiership stars over recent seasons - former captain Shaune Moloney, Liston Trophy winner Stephen Clifton, exciting Isaac Smith as well as North Melbourne players Corey Jones, Josh Smith and David Hale. North Ballarat's sole win during this

period was a 17-point win against Werribee Tigers, who literally kicked themselves out of the contest. Anyway, North Ballarat has rebounded from that poor start to post comfortable wins against Geelong, Coburg Tigers, Box Hill Hawks, Frankston and Williamstown. The latest win against the Seagulls carried more than just the four points. It was a statement that the Roosters are very much in the flag equation. There has been some outstanding cameos from Aaron Edwards. who booted 10 goals against Geelong and young rookie defender Luke Delaney. One pleasing aspects has been the return from injury of premiership forward Billy Driscoll, which has added some bite to a Rooster's attack that when Edwards is not there looks pedestrian. Just four times have North Ballarat kicked a century scoreline and only one of those -Williamstown - was against clubs anywhere near the eight.

Outlook: Full credit to Gerard FitzGerald for getting North Ballarat back in the race, so to speak, but it also must be noted the draw has been extremely kind to the reigning premiers, North Ballarat, thanks to the vagaries of the draw, have not played against two of the top three clubs, but Port Melbourne and Northern Bullants await in the next two weeks with Sandringham right on that pair's tail. Williamstown travels to North Ballarat at the end of next month and Bendigo Bombers, which the Roosters have owned in recent years, host them in the second last home and away match.

Verdict: While it would be folly to dismiss North Ballarat from the premiership equation there is no doubting they are not anywhere near as strong as they've been in the past three seasons. The next month will paint a clearer picture as to where North Ballarat sits. There's little doubt that North Ballarat will play finals for the sixth successive season, but many, many things need to fall into place if they're to make it four in a row.

NORTHERN BULLANTS

2011 Position: 3rd 7-2

2010 Position: 6th 5-4

Goalkickers: Ahmed Saad (21), Lachlan Henderson (12), Wayde Twomey (9)

Season so far: After the disappointment of losing the past two Grand Finals. Northern Bullants have put itself right in the mix for the 2011 VFL premiership. The Bullants have dropped just two matches - one against the unbeaten Port Melbourne and the other an inexplicable seven goal defeat against Werribee in what can only be described as a goal binge - a total of 39 were kicked for the match. The Bullants have won three matches decided by under 10-points. Lucky, or is it a sign of a good club knowing what's needed to win under the blowtorch pressure? If you win enough of the close games it's only fair and reasonable to be categorised as the latter. Importantly, one of those wins was against Casey Scorpions, a club

they'll come up against in the finals. Some of those wins were not pretty - the 16-point victory against Frankston was a scrappy affair from the get-go. Northern Bullants kept pace with Port for much of the match, but the Borough were always able to kick an extra goal when needed and this saw the end of an enthralling game blow out to 24-points. Exciting young forward Ahmed Saad started the season explosively with an eight-goal haul, but he's been reeled in as the season has progressed and opposition teams identify him as a prime mover and assign their best negator to him. Veterans, captain Adam lacobucci and best and fairest winner Jarrod McCorkell have again led the way, but one of the most pleasing aspects for the Bullants is the emergence of youngsters Adam Marcon, son of club legend, Adrian; Tim Lincoln and the continued improvement of Toby Thomas and Nick Meese

Outlook: Testing second half of the season for the Bullants, who again have to face Port Melbourne at the North Port Oval, but they play host to North Ballarat and Williamstown. Such is the draw, Northern Bullants play Geelong twice in the second half of the season and end the home and away season with a trip to Casey.

Verdict: The last two games may well determine whereabouts in the eight the Bullants finish. There's little doubt they'll play finals and if they can win as many games as they did in the first half of the season then they'll finish in the top four and give themselves every chance to launch an attack on the flag.

PORT MELBOURNE


Season so far: It's been a start of the season to take those Port Melbourne faithful back to the club's halcyon days of the mid 1970s and early 1980s. Port Melbourne has looked by far the best team in the competition as its record

would suggest. The Borough has answered every challenge and plenty have been thrown at them. They won the two close games - Casey Scorpions (10-points) and Sandringham (16) and, most significantly, they belted arch rivals and nemesis Williamstown by 51-points. Admittedly, it was a filthy day, but that's what football can throw up at you. They easily accounted for Bendigo Bombers (seven goals), Box Hill Hawks (four goals) and Werribee (19-points). Port's aggressive and selective recruiting drive has already paid handsome dividends. Patrick Rose has fitted in at Port Melbourne as if he's played there all his life. Rose has always been a quality player, this year he's taken his game to a new level. He's worked in tandem with his close mate Dean Galea to give the Borough a lethal one-two punch. Only twice have Port failed to kick a 100-point plus

scoreline and both those times they kicked 97-points. They relentlessly apply scoreboard pressure. Wayde Skipper is an accomplished player who many believe could still be playing in the AFL. The big, mobile ruckman has been in good touch and then there are all the usual suspects - Sam Pleming, Adam Bentick, John Baird, Corey McGrath, Chris Cain, Sam Dwyer, Nathan Batsanis and Ryan McMahon - all playing well. The list is endless and that's the key to Port Melbourne's success - the depth of its players. Consider that earlier in the

month Messrs Nixon, Brewer, DeLuca, Sinclair, Fanning and Keely all played in the reserves – they would all be walk up starts at any other club. And, Liston Trophy winner Shane Valenti is likely to return later in the season after injuring an ankle.

Outlook: Can Port Melbourne maintain and sustain its momentum? No reason why not. They've got the above mentioned depth and that keeps the pressure on everyone on the list. Positions will only go to those guys in form and everyone knows it. Port plays Williamstown and

Northern Bullants, the two teams most likely to trouble it come finals, in the second half of the season. The Borough also venture to Eureka Stadium to play reigning premiers North Ballarat, but have five games at home and on available evidence that doesn't bode well for opposing clubs.

Verdict: Well what is certain is that Port Melbourne has given itself its best chance in a long time to end its premiership drought. What Garv Avres will be mindful about is that no one hands out premiership medallions in June. There is still half the season remaining. including finals. Port Melbourne will definitely finish in the top four, most likely the top two. If it can maintain its form and not suffer any long term injuries the Borough is verv much the team the others have to beat.

SANDRINGHAM

Season so far: It's hard to gain an accurate read on just where Sandringham sits in the season 2011 puzzle. At their best the Zebras look a legitimate top four club, but other times they've scuffled and you are left wondering if they'll in fact make the finals. Sandringham started the season well under new coach Brett Lovett with wins against Coburg Tigers and Frankston, but both were hard fought affairs and given the respective standings of the teams maybe Zebra fans were lured into false hope. Sandringham certainly tested Port Melbourne. but the Borough prevailed by 16-points. Wins and losses were traded against Williamstown and Geelong then Box Hill Hawks inflicted a five-point defeat, a game that saw the Zebras stand up the home team far too big a lead. It seemed Sandringham was staring another defeat in the face when they travelled to Werribee and trailed by three goals at half time, but the Zebras produced its finest half of the season with a 15 to 5 goal second half to post a 43-point win. Many thought it may be the spark the club required. It wasn't the case as Casey deflated Sandringham with a 10-point win at the Trevor Barker Oval. And. they lost another home game against Bendigo Bombers who simply were too good. Injuries have certainly made it tough going for the Zebras with star recruit Marcus Marigliani vet to play a game, captain David Gallagher suffering an eye injury and forward Brett Dore and Daniel Sands enduring knee injuries.

Outlook: Tough run home for Sandringham as they play every team above them on the ladder with the exception of Williamstown. What makes that equation even tougher is that they play Port Melbourne, North Ballarat and Casey Scorpions away. The upside is that Messrs Marigliani, Gallagher and Dore should be back playing. Verdict: Jury still out with Sandringham. One feels they need all their VFL guns playing and for St Kilda players to make a presence felt. The Zebras can make the finals, but just how far they progress depends upon many variables.


WERRIBEE TIGERS

Werribee's closest games are two 19-point affairs, both of which they lost to North Ballarat and Port Melbourne. Dreadful kicking cost them against North Ballarat and they were forever playing catch-up against the Borough. Williamstown belted them by 51-points in the season opener, Bendigo Bombers trounced them by 11-goals and they coughed up a three goal lead against Sandringham to lose by 43-points. When Werribee has

been on they've been as dominating as any team. Accuracy stopped the 28-point win against Geelong being double that margin and they demolished Collingwood and Box Hill Hawks by 90 and 47-points respectively. But, Werribee's most impressive performance was its seven goal win against Northern Bullants, which included Carlton's Matthew Kreuzer. Lachlan Henderson, Rvan Houlihan and Shaun Hampson and all the Bullants' top VFL players. Former West Coast Eagle Ben McKinley has proved a focal point in attack, Robbie Castello is forever dangerous around goal and captain Dominic Gleeson could be heading towards another best and fairest. Ben Sharp is enjoying a career year and Majak Daw is an exciting talent.

Outlook: As infuriating as Werribee has been for its supporters the road into the finals looks just as treacherous as they have two games against Casey Scorpions, host Williamstown, travel to North Ballarat and venture to the Trevor Barker Oval None of those can be confidently ticked off as a win so for Werribee to lock away a finals berth they must defeat all the clubs below them on the ladder, effectively silencing all would-be challengers.

Verdict: Hard to know what to expect from Werribee given their form card so far. What works in Werribee's favour is there doesn't appear to be too many, if any, legitimate challengers below them on the ladder. If, and it's a big if, Werribee reproduced its form against Northern Bullants form on a consistent basis then it would not only make the eight, but shoot up the ladder.

Season so far: Williamstown started the season as flag favourites and up until they played Port Melbourne and North Ballarat it appeared as if the odds-makers assessment was on the money. As has been its custom in the first half of seasons over the past three to four years, the Seagulls literally flew the gates. beating up on all and sundry. Werribee copped a 51-point hiding, Geelong was dealt a 31-point defeat, Coburg Tigers and Sandringham were dispatched with by 52 and 35-point losses respectively. It set up what many believed to be a Grand Final preview when they ventured to Port Melbourne for a top-of-thetable clash. It proved a fizzer as the Borough spanked the Seagulls by 51-points in what can only be described as an uncharacteristic performance. Admittedly, the conditions favoured Port Melbourne, but the Borough was clearly the better team. Williamstown rebounded by comfortable wins against Collingwood and Casey and they advanced to the Foxtel Cup Semi-Finals. But, North Ballarat, which has owned Williamstown, served a

telling reminder that the 2011 flag is anything but a two club race.

Outlook: Interesting draw for Williamstown who again play North Ballarat, Northern Bullants, Bendgio Bombers and Werribee, but the match that will hold the most interest in the run into the finals is the return match against Port Melbourne at Chirnside Park in round 20. It will give Peter German a much greater insight into whether the Seagulls are a legitimate premiership contender.

Verdict: Williamstown struck pay dirt with Western Bulldogs mature age rookies Mitch Hahn and Ed Barlow, who have proved invaluable week in, week out. Its VFL list headed by captain Brett Johnson, Ben Jolley, Brett Davies, Brett Goodes and David Stretton is as strong as ever, but can they beat Port?

Bombers accurate win



BENDIGO has surged into top four contention after overcoming a wasteful Sandringham outfit by 26 points at the Trevor Barker Beach Oval on Sunday as James Hunter Smith reports. Led by electric forwards Matthew Little (five goals), Tory Dickson (four) and Justin Maddern (four), the Bombers crucified their inaccurate opponents, storming home 17.7 (109) to 11.17 (83). Kyle Reimers had a day out, providing plenty of run through the midfield while Brent Prismall and Irish rookie Michael Quinn were also strong. For the Zebras. Will Johnson was outstanding with five goals while James Magner (35 touches), Tom Lynch (35) and Andrew McQualter (33) found

plenty of the ball. The win boosts Bendigo into fifth place on the Peter Jackson VFL ladder at the halfway point of the season while Sandringham sit just inside the top eight, Box Hill and Collingwood hot on their tail.

Bendigo coach Shannon Grant said he was delighted with his troops' overall performance.

"I was really proud of the group today. I was really proud to be their coach," he said.

"They way they continued to go about their business and fight and scrap and play the game out I was really pleased with." Grant made particular note of his forwards, lauding their consistent efforts and even contributions throughout the season.

"They're all sharing the workload at the moment," he said. "They're all pretty dangerous forwards when the ball's coming in. For the small amount of football they've played together they're doing it really well." The Bombers got away to a dream start with Dickson kicking the first three majors of the game, outmuscling his opponents with relative ease. While Sandringham was on top of the clearance count-13 to 4 for the guarter-Bendigo converted more of their opportunities in front of goal, entering the first break with a nine-point lead.

Justin Maddern was superb in the second term, kicking three majors and worked hard around the ground, helping his side go into the main break with a 32-point lead.

The Zebras could have been in a better position at the half if not for wasted opportunities, with forwards Michael Lourey and Chris Irving missing crucial set shots only 25 meters out. Turnovers plagued Sandringham in the third term, as Bendigo stretched their lead even further with the help of Kyle Reimers who seemed to find the ball no matter where he was. The Zebras were winning out of the middle but Bendigo was harder at the ball. leading the tackle count 53 to 25 and inside fifties 45 to 31

Will Johnson booted a goal with only minutes remaining in the term, but any chance of a Sandringham fight back was immediately halted after Matthew Little slotted two late goals in the remaining 60 seconds.

The Zebras dominated possession for most of the final quarter with Johnson booting another four majors in the space of 20 minutes, but it was too little too late as Bendigo ran out comfortable 26-point winners. Sandringham coach Brett Lovett said he was frustrated with the lack of effort many of his players demonstrated.

"We had some really goods players, and then we had probably half a dozen guys who just really had no impact," he said.

"It's pretty hard when that happens, we need to have a bit more of an even contribution." Lovett said his team are capable of improving their poor win/loss record in the second half of the season, but need to capitalise on more of their chances. "I truly believe we're better than that." he said

"I think we've got the group here...we just haven't been able to step up when the opportunities [have] arisen. "Until we can actually win these games against sides that are above us on the ladder everyone's going to be doubting us."

This week Bendigo will hope to consolidate their position in the top four as they take on Box Hill at Windy Hill, while Sandringham get the week off with a bye.



Hawks claim comeback win

BOX Hill Hawks recorded their third win of the season last weekend against Frankston, but as has been the norm so far this season, they did not have the game all their own way.

The Hawks failed to kick a major in the first term as Frankston stunned their opponents by opening up a 23 point lead at quarter time. But unlike some of their other close encounters so far this season, the Hawks were able to dig deep, and grind out a 28 point win.



"They dug in deep the boys. Frankston were a very competitive side, and we were under the pump even 15 minutes into the last quarter, it could have gone either way, so it was a challenge for us, but we got over the line and that was terrific," Box Hill Hawks coach Damian Carroll said.

"We have had an interesting month with a couple of narrow defeats and the boys were starting to drop their heads a bit in terms of the win/loss record, so to get that win was really important for us which was great."

At quarter time Carroll tried to stress the positives to his side, that despite being down on the scoreboard, the Hawks were ahead on the stats sheet. Despite the positives, there was still some disappointment at the Hawks start to the game.

"There was a lot of frustration – we had 30 more possessions but we were not making an impact on the scoreboard at all. Full credit to Frankston they rolled back pretty well and started a lot of their attacks from the back 50, rebounded well and were clean inside 50," Carroll said.

"We wanted to emphasise that we were getting our hands on the ball but had to be cleaner, and there was still plenty of time to make up the difference.

"We had to have a better second quarter, we pulled back a couple of goals and then the third quarter was one of our best for the year. Thankfully we were able to hold on in the last."

The injuries at AFL aligned club Hawthorn have not helped the Hawks, especially in the talls department. David Hale was a late withdrawal from the Box Hill side last weekend, and leading goal kicker Jordan Lisle is in line, along with Hale, to be a ready replacement for injured Hawk Jarryd Roughead.

"It does put pressure on us at Box Hill level, but injuries bring opportunities for others, and certainly a number of those Box Hill listed players are getting that opportunity which is pleasing to see as they work hard on their footy," Carroll said.

Two Box Hill listed players that would fit into the Hawks best lineup, but have also been struck down by injury this season, are Shaun Pollard and Beau Muston.

"Polly (Pollard) is getting better week by week (4 games back in the reserves) and is more confident in his knee, and Musto is still three or four weeks away but he is back running now which is a real positive for us.

"Both are great footballers, but great leaders as well, and we have probably lacked that with the number of first and second year players in the seniors that we have had playing with us this year .. we have lacked one or two leaders sometimes to help us get over the line."

24 year old Nat Edwards cut her teeth in the media at a local level, helping cover the VFL for 3WBC. During the week we spent 5 minutes with Nat, to discover her favourite stories and the role of females in the media.

What was your big break? I think I'm still finding my way in the industry and still searching for my "big break" but to date I've had so many awesome opportunities to refine my skills as a reporter and broadcaster. Straight out of university, I was lucky enough to score a job with afl.com.au producing and hosting my own video news show called AFL Today.

Reporting on footy at an AFL level was always a dream of mine, and I was fortunate enough to land a job in that field straight away, and I'm still there today- three years later. For me though, a lot of it started back when I volunteered with the EFL media team as a boundary reporter and around the grounds reporter. Then from there more opportunities at VFL level with 3WBC opened up, and then the AFL so there was a lot of hard work to get to this point.

Is it more difficult for women to break into the media? I think it has become easier for women to break into the sports media industry thanks to a few pioneers like Caroline Wilson and the like. I believe that a lot of news services are seeing the importance of having diversity in the news room and even though some of us ladies may not have played the game (I played Auskick), we still have a lot to offer in terms of analysis, opinion and our views on the game. As a woman, if you're passionate about football, tennis, whatever it may be, you just have to put yourself out there and back yourself. I don't see myself as a lady in a bloke's world- I'm just another reporter who loves the game.

Has there been anyone in the media that you look up to at all? In terms of a female role model. Angel Pippos is the one for me. She had a great way of presenting the news and has a terrific broadcast voice and Lam so lucky to have worked with someone like her on AFL Today in my first year out of uni. 

One quarter wins it for Roosters

A dominant first term by North Ballarat set up a confidence boosting win for the Roosters against Williamstown out at Keilor last weekend.

North Ballarat kicked seven goals to one in the first term. and despite it being the only quarter the Roosters won for the afternoon, they were able to hold on for a 13 point win. More importantly for Gerard FitzGerald's men, it was their first win against a top four side, and is sure to give them plenty of self-belief as they face a huge fortnight, entering the second half of the season with matches against Port Melbourne and the Northern Bullants

"We set this particular phase of games as being able to find out what degree of improvement we have made over the last few weeks.

"It will also show us what we need to do to re-establish this young group," FitzGerald said.

"Earlier in the year we were not at that level, and we knew that, so we had to try and fast track our teaching and our development and examine all that we do.

"Now we are hopefully showing signs of developing, but this phase we play the top three sides, so we will learn a lot about our boys."

The win over Williamstown on the weekend has helped North Ballarat take their first major step back into finals calculations. A disappointing 1-3 (win/loss) start to the year has been converted to a 6-3 half year standing, with the Roosters having won their last five games on the trot.

North Ballarat got off to the best possible start against the Seagulls, setting up a 37 point quarter time lead.

"I was really pleased with the quality ball use and our pressure (in the first term).... we won the ball back three or four times, and kicked goals from turnovers," FitzGerald said.

"They are the things we have been working on since the couple of beltings earlier in the year."

After quarter time, Williamstown fought back and continued to eat into the Roosters lead. FitzGerald never felt North Ballarat at any stage had the game in the bag.

"Willi got 60 or 70 more possessions than us, and they won the ball fairly heavily in the third and fourth quarters, as they are a fit side that keep running.

"(the difference was) we were more efficient in the forward 50 and in front of goal."

One player that is no stranger to the Roosters, and has been staking his claim for a return to North Melbourne with great VFL form is Cam Richardson.

"He has been playing well for us ... but what we look for more than anything is just the effort ... what I admire allot about our North Melbourne boys is that they roll up their sleeves and have a go – it is just a great part of North Melbourne's culture," FitzGerald said.

"It fits in well and it is a terrific relationship between North Ballarat and North Melbourne. With Richo now – he is under the control of the North Melbourne coaching group, and he will have received his feedback and now knows what he needs to do.

"Hopefully we can play a role in getting the outcomes he is looking for and what North are looking for."

Another player that has made a positive return to the senior side is Billy Driscoll. But FitzGerald knows the lively forwards stay in the Roosters side will be short.

"His last few weeks have been very good, but he is heading overseas," FitzGerald said.

"I often say we need to play a practice game against my guys overseas, it would be a good game."

Driscoll will join fellow Roosters of the likes of Searl, Dinnell, Feery and McHugh who have all ventured overseas in recent times.

But despite the class of players that maybe overseas, FitzGerald will continue to concentrate on the talent at his disposal, as his side faces a big fortnight, that could define where his club finishes on the ladder come seasons end.

"We are going to find out a lot against the best, and that is where you learn the most."



Mirra answering the challenge



DAVID Mirra is one of those unassuming young players with poise beyond his age. At 20 years old, he has emerged in season 2011 as one of the better back men for the Box Hill Hawks.

Recruited from the Eastern Ranges where David was runner-up in the Best & Fairest as well as playing rep football with Vic Metro, the man known affectionately as "Mirradonna" has now cemented his spot in the seniors at Box Hill.

It's a great testimony to his work ethic where he now keeps AFL listed players out of the Box Hill Hawks senior side. His attack on the ball is excellent, but his ability to work under pressure often "minding" more experienced opponents is top quality.

Recruitment Manager at the Box Hill Hawks, Dale Bleach describes Mirra as a player who shows genuine strength in his game that could see him progress to an AFL list.

"David's closing speed and maturity for his age when under pressure has really improved and he's developing into an important player for the Hawks", Bleach said.

"We see him as a player who could play in any position, but he's been good in the backline so far this year.

Mirra has played 10 senior games this year after playing 18 reserve games in 2010 including the VFL Reserves Premiership which he lists as a career highlight.

"There's a fantastic opportunity to learn and develop your game at Box Hill. All the coaches are willing to take time out for you and give you tips on how to improve. This comes back to having a great culture and Box Hill has certainly established that", said Mirra

"It's a really professional club and the facilities are good with a nice ground. The staff and volunteers alike are all fantastic people who invest time into each other", he added. David's aim in the short term is to continue to learn and play consistent football for the Box Hill Hawks. He, of course, would love to play finals footy.

Off the field, David is studying Exercise and Sport Science / Sport Management as part of his Commerce degree at Deakin University.

David is level-headed and mature beyond his years. He is simply enjoying his football and his football environment at Box Hill, and dismisses any talk of an AFL career at this point. He is happy to learn, improve and be consistent for the Box Hill Hawks.

I, like many, think that there will be interest in Mirra from AFL clubs. All he has to do is keep doing what he is doing – playing no fuss football and showing passion for the game.

Casey consolidate in top four

CASEY have asserted themselves as a top-flight side, comfortably beating a hardworking Collingwood 22.10.142 to 15.10.100 at Casey Fields as Anna Harrington reports. Ricky Petterd was a clear beston-ground for the Scorpions, racking up 39 possessions and sticking 10 tackles, while tall forwards Lynden Dunn, Lucas Cook and Brendan Fevola shared the load up forward. For the Magpies, VFL-listed players Tom Sundberg and Tom Couch were solid in the midfield while Brett Eddy snared three goals against a gritty Casey defence.

Scorpions coach Brad Gotch said while it was disappointing to see the second half turn into a shootout, he was still pleased with his team's ability to kick a high score.

"Look, it's good to get the four points," Gotch said.

"I suppose I was expecting us to maybe restrict their score line a little bit more in the second half, I think it was ten goals each which is not exactly what I was looking for.

"But look we ran out of numbers a bit... [and] we kicked 22 goals so I suppose that's not the worst thing going around."

Casey struck early, Dunn weaving through congestion and snapping his side's first after barely a minute.

While the Scorpions largely dominated the middle, they were ably assisted by a Collingwood team struggling to hit the scoreboard, the visitors only managing three behinds in response to Casey's trio of majors.

Collingwood captain Kris Pendlebury kept Fevola relatively



subdued but Dunn and fellow forward Cook stepped up and dominated the Magpies' defence with their height and athleticism. The Magpies finally got off the mark through Eddy, but two quick goals to Casey ensured the home side went into guarter time ahead 5.1.31 to 1.3.9, The second guarter opened much as the previous had finished, with a Casey goal. Collingwood's midfield grew more influential throughout the quarter but it was largely to no avail, with a Casey defence led by Matthew Warnock and Tom McDonald repelling all attacks. The Scorpions consistently responded with force to Collingwood's forward thrusts and when Fevola kicked his first major for the day, the home side kicked out to a dominant ninegoal lead.

Two late goals to Brad Dick and Sundberg pulled Collingwood back into contention but it seemed the Magpies couldn't get any luck, with Dick stretchered off the field with an apparent knee injury shortly before halftime, his side down 5.6.36 to 12.5.77.

The third quarter proved to be somewhat of a Collingwood fightback, the visitors taking it up to Casey in the midfield and receiving their rewards, kicking five goals to four.

But Casey maintained their own offensive pressure, continuing to kick goals despite Collingwood's attacking blitz, a major to Tom McNamara steadying the home side before two goals to the Magpies pulled the margin back to 34 at the final break. After Casey kicked the first three goals to extend the lead to an insurmountable 53 points, the guarter turned into somewhat of a shootout. Dunn and Cook kicked their fifth and fourth goals respectively while Collingwood continued to press through their small forwards and midfielders. While the Collingwood forwardline worked hard, the tenacity of the Scorpions' defence was epitomised by a courageous mark from Warnock late in the quarter, the defender willingly contesting despite the game being well and truly decided.

Despite a courageous effort from the Magpies, it was Maric who closed the game, a 50-metre penalty handing him his third goal from the square and ensuring his side ran out 42-point winners.

This week, Casey will remain at home for their game against cellar-dwellers Coburg while the Magpies have the bye.

Brandon Ellis

ROHAN Welsh's message was as simple as it was straight forward, but it struck a chord with Brandon Ellis before Vic Metro opened its AFL Under 18 National Championship carnival against NSW/ACT.

Welsh's theme was that the team must come before the individual if there was to be success. He said it was a nonnegotiable and the message resonated with Ellis.

"The big emphasis was to go out, play as a team, do the team things and if we do that the individual things will look after themselves," Ellis said.

"I made sure I did the team things first and that was the case with everyone else."

And, that's exactly what Vic Metro did as they issued an early statement about their intent for the Championships.

Ellis noted the bond between the group was palpable thanks to the camp before the Championships and the time the group spent together before the opening match.

"It played a big part. We all felt like we were teammates and we helped each other out," Ellis said.

Outside the lead-up to last year's TAC Cup Grand Final, Ellis said his nerves scaled new heights before the match against NSW/ACT.

Ellis said he was unsure what to expect from the Championships, but as soon as the game started, he just went about it as he would normally.

He was one of the key drivers in Metro's 80-point win as he collected a team-high 29-possessions, including 11 contested possessions in the 21.15 (141) to 9.7 (61) win.

It's been an amazing 12-months for Ellis, who broke into the Calder Cannons team about this time last year, played in the premiership and now finds himself a key member of the Metro team.

Ellis can vividly remember badgering the Cannons coaches as to what he needed to do to improve so he could gain a TAC Cup game.

"It's been a huge 12 months. Not playing for the Cannons at the start of last year was frustrating," he recalled.


"I was forever at the coaches about when am I going to get a game, what do I have to do. I kept nagging the coaches about what I had to improve on."

For Ellis selection in the Metro squad was the culmination of an arduous pre-season as the strove towards a long-held target.

"At the start of the year we had to nominate goals we wanted to achieve during the season – playing for Vic Metro was one of them," Ellis said.

"I worked really hard over preseason to give myself the best opportunity to make it."

Ellis also took on board the advice from his Cannons'



coaches on areas he needed to improve and set about addressing them.

One area was kicking efficiency. "I was told that if I wanted to play for Vic Metro I needed to be really efficient with my skills," Ellis said.

Another area was ensuring his skill level below his knees was crisp and clean. The end result was that Ellis noticed a considerable improvement and from there his confidence soared as did his performances.

"All my hard work began to pay off," he said.

Now, Ellis is looking at another goal. He said there is a sense within the group that if they stick to the team first philosophy they can make a telling impact before the Championships is over.

"It's not just going to happen, we have to make it happen," he said.

Metro big second half

JONATHON Patton made a significant statement as he headlined Vic Metro's crushing win against Queensland in last week's second NAB AFL Under 18 Championship match.

After being held to a solitary goal in the match against NSW/ACT, Patton, considered one of the best forward prospects in the TAC Cup, proved unstoppable as he literally spearheaded Vic Metro's 85-point win 17.17 (119) to 5.4 (34).

Patton took a matchhigh 11 marks, collected 19-possessions and capped his strong display with six goals as he reaffirmed his status as a likely priority for Greater Western Sydney in the AFL National Draft.

He provided Vic Metro a key aerial and mobile target in a standout performance.

Vic Metro coach Rohan Welsh said his side paid the price in the first half of being second to the football and not doing the team orientated things that prevailed in the carnival opener win again NSW/ACT.

He said the inadequacies were noted during the half time break and a far more focused team took the field in the second half.

Welsh added Metro didn't spread well and Queensland caught them in transition during the first half.

With Patton providing a focal point in attack and the team's work rate soaring, Metro took

charge to snuff out any hope of Queensland posting a stunning victory.

So dominant were Vic Metro in the second half that they added 11.9 while holding Queensland to just two points and the northern visitors did not score in the final term.

"A few things were said at half time – and their one percenters – tackles, blocks - lifted after half time and that showed on the scoreboard," Welsh said.

While Patton ended with six goals from full forward, Welsh said he believes he's more suited to playing at centre half forward.

Welsh said with Queensland opting to play man-on-man, it was decided to push Patton deep into attack.

"We thought if we created a bit of space for him, he might do all right," Welsh said.

Ruckman Billy Longer, with 13 possessions, seven marks and 13 hit-outs, was outstanding not only at the stoppages, but with the way he got to as many contests as possible. "He was great, he gave us first use of the football," Welsh said.

Toby Greene gathered a team-high 24 possessions, one more than Michael Bussey with Hal Hunter (20) and Liam Sumner (20) also reaching the 20 possession mark.

Oakleigh Chargers midfielder Dom Tyson again impressed



with his ball use as he collected 19 possessions.

Metro made 12 changes to the team that defeated NSW/ ACT with Welsh forecasting a further six would be likely for the match against West Australia at Patersons Stadium on Sunday.

Welsh said the format of the competition allowed the flexibility to play players and give them the experience of playing at such a high level.

"It's good to give other kids a go," Welsh said.

"We'll probably pick our strongest squad of 28 and then refine it from there to 25."

Clay Smith

THE opening weekend in June created a series of firsts for Clay Smith.

Not only was he selected in his first representative squad, but he experienced his first plane trip and, most importantly, played a telling role in Vic Country's success against Tasmania.

Smith, runner-up in Gippsland's best and fairest

count last season behind Dyson Heppell, was a pivotal player in the win as his hard work around the stoppages ensured his teammates received first use of the ball.

He collected 18-possessions, laid four tackles and did plenty of hard work in and under the packs.

Smith said coach Robert Hyde warned them that Tasmania would not die wondering and that they would come at Country hard in the last quarter.

"'Hydey' was really happy with our first three quarters, he thought we played really good footy and he said the last quarter was a really good learning lesson for us," Smith said.

"When they came back, we had to battle against them and the wind. We need to learn and build on that, but I think we will as it was our first real game together as a team."

Smith admitted the experience, especially the lead into the game, was nerve wracking.

He said his first tackle and first possession saw his nerves disappear and he went about his game as he would in the TAC Cup.

But, Smith noted that the pace and intensity of the Championships was far greater to anything he had experienced in the TAC Cup.

"It's another step up, the quality of play is better and it's

more physical," he said.

Smith was pleased that his kicking efficiency, an area that he's worked overtime on, was good against Tasmania.

But, he added there was still room for plenty of improvement from himself and his Country teammates.

Smith said the addition of Geelong Falcons Devon Smith, who played in last year's triumphant Country team, and Bendigo's Sam Kerridge would only strengthen the team.

"With the list that we have if we can all gel together we can only improve and do pretty well," he said.

"It's going to be a good experience."



Devon's exciting start

SCOUTS around the country are pretty much full bottle on Devon Smith, the extremely gifted Geelong Falcon midfielder.

For those who weren't entirely sure what to make of him, the 18-year-old provided a timely reminder as he made his NAB AFL Under 18 Championship debut for Vic Country. Smith produced a highlight tape bursting with all the qualities that saw him a member of the AIS/AFL Academy.

He was totally dominant as Vic Country posted a 33-point win against Northern Territory, 14.14 (98) to 9.11 (65) at Visy Park.

Smith amassed a teamhigh 27 possession, laid five tackles and put an exclamation mark next to his performance with six goals.

It was a stunning display from Smith who also featured prominently on the stats sheet for clearances (seven) and inside 50s (seven).

What made the performance even more impressive is that Smith only resumed playing late last month after a hip injury.

Country coach Rob Hyde described Smith as a "special' player who "don't come along all that often" and added he was always dangerous whether he was on the ball or resting in attack.

"He's super smart, clever and skilled. He was great considering he's had to comeback from a reasonable injury," Hyde said.

"Devon just knows it's going to be plus he's a beautiful kick. He rarely misses targets with his left or right foot. "He's just a special kid." Hyde noted it should not be undersold just how hard it was for a midfielder to kick six goals in any game let alone an AFL Under 18 Championship match.
