

Did you Know.....

Many people often ask the Club the question, why is player rotation so important at the Knights?

The answer is always a simple one......to give all age groups from U12 & below the opportunity to play in multple positions during the the early football development years. Interestingly, one of our Club Stalwarts has now analysed this principal with stats. In short, not only does the Knights promote participation and rotation but that the Knights are successful at the MSJFL Davison 1 level.

If you say that grading really starts from U13 and goes to U16 before school football interferes then only the Knights and East Brighton have teams in Div 1 at all age groups from U13 to U16. There are two clubs that have three Div 1 teams being Hampton and Ajax while East Sandringham and Cheltenham have two teams each in Div 1.

If you were then to rank the overall success of these clubs based on each teams current position on the U13 to U16 ladders, then the Knights is easily the most successful club at the half way mark of the season with all four teams in the top four of each ladder. The next most successful clubs are East Brighton and Hampton which only have two teams each in the top four. Interesting statistic for rotation.





The pre-match atmosphere was as good as any game this year. The coaching staff had worked during the week on a high intensity, fast handball game plan, which was drilled into the Blues at Friday night's session. Quarter 4 -:



Before the game




