Your questions answered



In the Record today, we try and answer the questions that are often asked in the outer of a weekend at matches.

ONE of the things that has become quickly apparent since I took on the post as AFL Victoria General Manager is that football followers have an insatiable appetite for information about the VFL.

And, that's great. It shows a genuine interest and passion for the competition as well as a care for its continued well-being and sustained future.

Inside this edition of the AFL Victoria Record, many of the questions that have been canvassed on the terraces on a Saturday or Sunday afternoon are answered.

With so much speculation generated through the media in the seemingly never ending discussion on the relative merits of a stand-alone versus aligned club situation, it's only natural that questions are raised about the VFL's composition and its future.

We recognise the uncertainty and instability to the competition and its clubs that is fuelled by these on-going discussions.

There is a need for a strategic plan for the future of the VFL competition, this is a priority for AFL Victoria at the moment.

What should not be lost in these headline grabbing 'debates' is that there are numerous examples of strong alignment relationships that have and continue to produce mutual benefits for both parties.

Also, what can't be overlooked is that VFL clubs and their community partners, sponsors, members, players, facilities, volunteers, fans and supportive local Councils are an important segment of the Victorian football environment and economy that needs to be protected.

Over the coming months AFL Victoria will be in a better position to outline a definitive plan for the VFL competition and its clubs. Naturally, the future direction will be articulated fully in this publication as well as on our web site at a later date.

It's pleasing to note that over the last few weeks there has been a positive conclusion to

the racial vilification incident involving North Melbourne listed player Majak Daw at the Port Melbourne/Werribee match earlier in the month.

The offending person voluntarily agreed to complete the education session we offered and formally apologised to Majak.

The way the people at the game – the officials from both clubs, the players and the fans – responded and the ensuing public comment sent a very clear message that such behaviour is totally inappropriate, unacceptable, intolerable and has no place at a football match or in society.

Many more questions will arise over the course of the second half of the season. It's an intrinsic part of any vibrant competition and it's something that AFL Victoria encourages and we'll address those issues again in the AFL Victoria Record before the season is over.

Football from another perspective



Where is your favourite spot to watch the football?

LAST weekend I ventured down to Skilled Stadium, the first time I had made the trek down the Princess Hwy to the home of the Cats.

I must say I was impressed by the venue, and can see why AFL Geelong holds such a home ground advantage when they play there. That home ground advantage almost paid off for the VFL Cats last week, as they went oh so close to causing what would have been two upset results for the weekend (with Coburg defeating Casey).

Being an AFL venue, I watched with interest as the siren sounded for quarter time in the Geelong versus Northern Bullants game, with people wondering whether they could venture out onto the ground and listen to the coaches at the break. As soon as the first person hesitantly made their way on to the ground, a steady stream of people continued to follow, enjoying the practice that makes the VFL and its coaches and players so accessible. But I digress.

The one thing I enjoyed about the game last week, apart from visiting a new stadium, was sitting next to the Northern Bullants coaches box, and watching the game

unfold on the sidelines, as well as out on the field. In the tense final term, when the Bullants trailed by 23 points, I was enthralled by the changes being made on the bench, and the constant rotations. Yes, I know rotations are part of the game now, but the clockwork by which the players knew when they were coming to the bench, and who they were replacing fascinated me.

There were moments of confusion when a particular player was not ready on the bench, was receiving treatment, or the player they were meant to be interchanging with was on the other side of the ground, but this is when the runner was quickly on the phone receiving instructions from the coaches box. There was also plenty of yelling out to players on the field as well, to tell them to head to the bench.

The changes were constant even in the dying moments of the game, and you could feel the tension from the bench as they decided whether they should watch or look away as Cam Mooney had a shot at goal to tie the scores with less than two minutes left in the game. Admittedly I am usually the guy sitting up in the stand to grab the birds eye view of the game, but I

will definitely reconsider where I watch the footy if I know the show on the sidelines will be just as good as it was last weekend.

AFL Victoria General Manager Grant Williams goes head to head with the VFL Record

After nearly three months in the job as general manager, the Record puts the hard questions to Grant Williams about the season so far in the VFL.

VFL Record: How do you reflect on the first half of the VFL season?

Grant Williams: There's little doubt the standard of this unique competition, which embraces VFL listed players as well as AFL Listed and Rookie players, continues to provide an increasingly high quality of football. It's a competition that challenges all players to perform to the best of their ability and as we have seen already it is a legitimate pathway for players aspiring to play AFL. So far we have seen Isaac Smith (North Ballarat to Hawthorn), Michael Hibberd (Frankston/Essendon), Cam Pederson (Box Hill Hawks/ North Melbourne), Ed Curnow (Box Hill Hawks/Carlton), Cam Richardson (North Ballarat/ North Melbourne) make seamless transitions. Sam Iles, drafted by Gold Coast Suns from Box Hill Hawks in 2010, is another to play AFL this season. And, Lucas Markovic (Box Hill Hawks/Western Bulldogs) and Will Johnson (Sandringham/St Kilda) drafted two seasons ago also made their AFL debuts. It's a credit not only to the players, but the environment created by the VFL.



VFLR: What have been the highlights?

GW: Obviously, the great start by Port Melbourne to the season, the relative evenness of the competition where any team on any given day can win. There's been some splendid individual performances: Majak Daw's great running goal for Werribee against Collingwood; Aaron Edwards 10-goal haul for North Ballarat against Geelong; North Ballarat and Casey Scorpion coaches Gerard FitzGerald and Brad Gotch reaching their 250th games as VFL coaches.

VFLR: ARE football fans/clubs witnessing yet the benefits of the decision that saw the advent of AFL Victoria?

GW: AFL Victoria needs to

develop an overall strategic plan for Victorian football, which obviously includes the VFL. Already, I've met with each individual VFL club as well as many community clubs to gain a feel for how they're travelling and how we can help and support them. It is something that is going to take between six to 12 months to formulate.

VFLR: What is your impression of the media coverage of the VFL?

GW: It would seem the VFL is generating plenty of interest across all mediums – newspapers, radio, television, internet, and the various social media networks - and that's pleasing. Certainly, the ABC coverage each Saturday afternoon is first class. It is a high quality, slick, sharp production that is a great advertisement for the competition and all the clubs and gives fans a great armchair vantage spot. We're most fortunate to have knowledgeable, professional anchorman in Peter Donegan along with his various co-commentators while Phil Cleary and Ross Booth provide the passion and insight that goes with their deep knowledge and love of

the competition. And, that's backed by the cameramen and all the behind-the-scenes guys.

VFLR: MUCH has been made of more AFL clubs seeking a stand-alone licence in 2012 and beyond. What is the reality of that happening and does AFL Victoria have a cap on the number of stand-alone AFL clubs fielding a team in the VFL?

GW: We recognise the uncertainty and instability that is created by constant discussions in media forums regarding stand-alone versus alignment scenarios and what AFL clubs may or may not do. We understand the need for a plan for the VFL competition in the future and that's a priority for AFL Victoria at the moment. Currently, alignment agreements rest between VFL clubs and AFL clubs and these can vary from two to five-year deals. What should not be overlooked is that

VFL clubs and their layer of sponsors, members, players, facilities and volunteers is a layer of the Victorian football economy that needs to be protected.

VFLR: HOW can the profile of VFL listed players be lifted?

GW: The overlay of the AFL competition on Victorian football is apparent given the concentration of AFL clubs based in Victoria. The important aspect from AFL Victoria's viewpoint is that the VFL competition remains as high a standard – and as we've mentioned earlier that's the prevailing situation – and one of the plans for the competition's future is how do we elevate the profile of the players and the undoubted great stories.

VFLR: WHAT are the lessons to be learned from the racial vilification incident at the Port Melbourne/Werribee match earlier in the month?

GW: The way the people at the game – the officials from both clubs, the players and the fans – responded and the ensuing public comment sent a very clear message that such behaviour is totally inappropriate, unacceptable, intolerable and has no place at a football match or in society. It's pleasing to note that the offending person has voluntarily agreed to undergo education.

VFLR: WHY has the introduction of the Foxtel Cup been a positive for the VFL?

GW: The Foxtel Cup has proved an ideal platform to promote, publicise and showcase second tier football around Australia. It brings a different audience and appreciation to the many talented players who play in the various State League competitions. It's important for the VFL and its clubs to take up such an opportunity.

VFLR: HOW many VFL clubs

will be involved in the Foxtel Cup next season? What is the criteria for selecting the clubs?

GW: The Foxtel Cup will be reviewed at the end of the season as a matter of course. It would be premature to speculate on what changes, if any, will occur or for that matter the format of inviting clubs to compete.

VFLR: WHAT areas do VFL clubs need to continue to work on to create greater awareness in the community?

GW: All VFL clubs are striving to be the best possible community conduit they can and engage with the community in a welcoming manner that appeals to all members. Clubs need to ensure that women and all family members feel welcome, safe and comfortable every time they attend a VFL match. It must be an inclusive environment.

VFLR: SHOULD all VFL matches be played on the one

day – Saturday or Sunday?

GW: It's a subject that hasn't been canvassed. Currently, we submit to all clubs a wish list of when they would like to play home games. The draw is structured to a large degree around that after factoring in all the various machinations – aligned AFL club considerations, ABC televised matches, availability of grounds, etc. That communication process with the clubs appears to be working well, but that is not to say we're not open to new initiatives.

VFLR: Should VFL clubs be taking more of their games to regional areas?

GW: AFL Victoria would be supportive of clubs taking games to regional and strategic locations, particularly growth areas. Obviously, a non-negotiable factor would be that the status and reputation of the competition would not be adversely

affected or compromised.

VFLR: THE 23rd player rule is another branch of this unique VFL competition. How has it been received?

GW: All the indicators and feedback we have received suggests it has been an overwhelming success. Any opportunity for another young TAC player or graduate to showcase his talent in such a high quality competition can only be viewed as a success.

VFLR: WHAT is the most pressing issue for the VFL competition in the second half of the season?

GW: Our challenge, as we head towards the finals, is to present VFL games in the best possible manner and that includes ensuring clubs provide the best possible playing surface possible so the available talent can play to the best of their ability and not be hindered by sub-standard playing conditions.

Coburg upset Casey



COBURG has pulled off a remarkable upset victory over the Scorpions by 10 points at Casey Fields on Sunday as James Hunter Smith reports.

The Tigers reinforced the cliché that a week's a long time in football as they put a 104-point belting from Port Melbourne behind them in round 11 to overcome a top-four Casey outfit 9.18 (72) to 8.14 (62).

David Gourdis continued his stellar form limiting Brendan Fevola to little impact on the game, while experienced Richmond midfielder Shane Tuck found plenty of the ball and was outstanding at the stoppages.

Willie Wheeler led the goal scoring for Coburg with 3 majors, while fellow youngster Dylan Murphy booted 2.

For Casey, Tim Mohr was outstanding playing both in defence and up forward (15 possessions, 2 goals), while Matthew Bate (28 possessions, 2 goals) and Melbourne-listed speedster Sam Bleasdale (27) were also prominent for the home side. The victory is Coburg's second

for the year, putting them in 11th place on the Peter Jackson VFL ladder, remarkably only two wins outside of the eight.

Casey on the other hand has dropped out of the top four as they now find themselves in fifth place, a game clear behind the in-form Bendigo Bombers.

Coburg coach Adam Potter lauded his side's competitiveness and hunger for the ball, and was delighted to come away with a win.

"I was really proud of the boys and the way they went about it today," he said.

"The ability to fight and compete probably got us over the line.

"After coming off a 104-point loss to Port Melbourne, then to come out against another quality side... to play the way we did and win the game, that's probably the most impressive thing for me."

Potter said he believes his side can be a serious threat to other top teams later in the season.

"I guess we've just got to try and build some consistency and hopefully shake up a few sides heading towards the end of the year."

The Scorpions benefited from a strong breeze in the first term and kept the ball in their forward half for most of the quarter, however were unable to apply enough scoreboard pressure as they kicked 3.7 to Coburg's 0.1.

The second term saw the roles reverse, as it was Coburg who couldn't kick straight with the gale force winds, booting 4.10 for the quarter but reduced the margin to only eight points at the half.

While most spectators assumed

Casey would kick away in the third quarter with the imposing wind, it was the Coburg defenders who asserted their authority led by David Gourdis, restricting the home team to only one goal.

Despite their respective ladder positions, Coburg appeared to be the more composed outfit as they played clean possession football to try and prevent Casey from surging forward with the breeze.

Only four points down at the final break, Coburg could sense an upset with coach Adam Potter urging them to keep pressing hard.

A scrappy arm-wrestle ensued for most of the final term before Nick Lynch and Willie Wheeler each slammed home majors to put the visiting team ahead 23 minutes into the quarter.

In an intense final few minutes, Coburg was able to suffocate the Casey midfielders keeping the ball inside their attacking fifty, eventually running away 10-point winners, 9.18 (72) to 8.14 (62).

Potter said he was delighted with the attitude and maturity of both his senior and younger players heading into the clash following the heavy loss the week before.

"'Tucky' (Shane Tuck) rang me on Tuesday and made sure he bought in for this week, so I'm really pleased with [players like] Tuck, White...I think Gourdis is in really good form as well so I'm really impressed with some of the Richmond guys and the way they've come back," he said.

"Young Willie Wheeler and Dylan Murphy, they're [also] really buying in and playing good footy as young kids."

Ferraro joins leaders at Zebras

DEBATE rages seemingly forever as to what is the 'right' VFL club to join – a stand-alone VFL, an aligned VFL club or stand-alone AFL club as a top-up player.

Opinions differ markedly as each VFL listed player has their own reason for selecting a club. Many players who've spent time on an AFL list prefer a stand-alone VFL club, others are quite happy to play in an AFL environment.

For Ricky Ferraro, the choice when he graduated from TAC Cup club Dandenong Stingrays at the end of the 2008 season was to join the bulk of his teammates and head to Frankston or go to Sandringham.

Ferraro chose the Zebras because he wanted to be training and playing with AFL listed and rookie players. He and Stingrays' teammate Matt Clark went to the Trevor Barker Oval for an interview.

While Clarke opted to head further down the Nepean Highway, Ferraro was more than comfortable staying at Sandringham.

Three years later, Ferraro has no regrets. Sure, he's spent time playing in Sandringham's

reserves, sometimes a victim of the number crunching exercise that goes with the territory of an aligned club.

But, the 21-year-old has embraced the club, culture and philosophy to such an extent that he was voted by his peers into the leadership group this season.

"I wanted to try my luck at an aligned club," Ferraro said.

"From the first day, I just fell in love with the place. They have a great history and I just thought that I would take my shot there.

"Matty went to the Dolphins, he chose a different path. He still lives around the corner, we're still good mates."

Ferraro noted that training and playing with AFL listed players would only enhance his development and gain the best from his game.

He said it's a viewpoint he still holds.

"Obviously, it is going to be a harder team to break into with positions limited depending on the available list from St Kilda," Ferraro said.

"I thought if I could break into the team it would only help the development of my game."

When the playing group voted Ferraro into the leadership group he viewed it as "a privilege" to have the trust of his peers.

Midway through the season, Sandringham continues to flirt with making a return to the



finals for the first time since 2007.

The Zebras have not helped their cause by losing two games by 10-points or less, but it hasn't swayed Ferraro's belief the club can make an impact at the business end of the season.

Ferraro noted that several "little things" had resulted in those losses, but the club would take on a different appearance with the pending return of captain David Gallagher and star recruit Marcus Marigliani.

"There are some games that we kicked ourselves out of the contest, but if we can fix those things up, and we're working on them all the time, we will be really pushing for the finals," Ferraro said.

"And, I don't think teams will want to play us come the finals."

Bullants deny Geelong upset result

A DOMINANT fourth quarter from the Northern Bullants denied Geelong a chance at a memorable upset, with the Bullants heading the Cats late to win by five points in a tight contest at Skilled Stadium last Saturday as Kane Hunkin reports.

No strangers to close finishes, Geelong again fought bravely against a more fancied opponent, however the Bullants overcame a significant three quarter time deficit to hand the Cats their second consecutive single figure defeat.

The two teams opposing form appeared significant and was compounded before the game, with Geelong key forward Tom Hawkins and co-captain Troy Selwood both missing due to slight injury concerns and impressive youngster Allen Christensen, sitting out due to AFL duties as first emergency.

The first quarter proved a stalemate with goals elusive. Additionally, the Bullants heightened matters, unable to convert on numerous forward deliveries, kicking six behinds before registering their first major.

Coming off an interstate trip as part of the Fostel Cup, the Northern Bullants appeared sluggish, with Geelong remaining a stubborn opponent. The game eventually opened up with Geelong kicking six goals to five in the second term to ensure scores were level at the main break.

One of the season's biggest upsets appeared on the cards when the Cats kicked six of the first seven goals of the third quarter to open up a match-



high 29 point lead. However the Bullants, in a response typical of their top four position, responded to kick seven of the next eight majors, including the first five goals of the last quarter.

In the closing minutes both sides held and subsequently coughed up narrow leads. The match reached a dramatic conclusion with Cat Cameron Mooney marked 25 metres out on a tight angle for the right footer. The forward, with a chance to tie the scores, unfortunately pushed the kick across the goal face narrowly missing to the left. The Bullants held on in the ensuing final minutes for a five point win.

After the game, Northern Bullants coach Darren Harris adopted a fundamental and pragmatic way of viewing the result, affirming the importance of a win.

"It's another four points, it's another qualifying game that you win that gets you closer to playing finals footy and I think from a development point of view today, to watch some of the efforts of the players was fantastic," Harris said.

Furthermore, the coach highlighted the team's ability to stay in the game after a poor third quarter.

"They [Geelong] were able to win those 50-50 contests from the get out kick forward and they got a good contest and brought the

ball across half forward. And we got caught out. But to our credit we kept doing what we wanted to do and keep pressing up and we eventually got there."

The victory itself was also about restoring "pride" after last week's loss to Claremont.

"We just wanted to get a little bit of pride back. We thought our brand was tarnished a little bit last week with the way we went about it."

For the victorious Bullants, Brock McLean was an important factor, with the midfielder lively and damaging around the ground.

Despite the loss, the return of Simon Hogan was a positive for the Cats and the continued improvement of Mitch Brown (three goals) gave supporters some joy in an otherwise bittersweet day. Shannon Byrnes' (two goals) push for senior selection received a boost, with the small forward producing his best game since returning from injury.

The Northern Bullants now prepare to host North Ballarat while Geelong's task gets no easier when they travel to Port Melbourne to take on the league leaders on Saturday.

Meese can't go past Bullants

WHEN Northern Bullants General Manager Garry O'Sullivan gained a sniff that other VFL clubs were showing an interest in Nick Meese he knew there was only one course of action.

While Meese had left the Bullants after an injury-interrupted couple of seasons to spend the 2010 season playing with his local club West Preston in the Northern Football League, O'Sullivan understood the ramifications.

"I thought we can't have a Meese playing at any other club, but the Bullants," O'Sullivan said.

Afterall, Meese's grandfather Reg played with Preston as did his father John and uncle Adrian Marcon. The latter two are life members of the club.

It wasn't hard to persuade the Bullants that Meese was worth pursuing. He won the Frank Rosebrook Medal for best and fairest in the Northern Football League and captained West Preston to the premiership last year.

And, while flattered by the interest of other VFL clubs, Meese considered himself a Preston boy. He grew up and still lives about five minutes

from Cramer Street so it was a win/win situation for all parties.

Meese is glad to be back with the Bullants. Already, he's played more games this season than he did after joining the club from TAC Cup club Northern Knights.

Back in 2007, his first year with the Bullants, he broke his wrist, and then in 2009 after breaking into the seniors, Meese suffered a broken jaw. When he recovered, Meese was unable to fight his way back into a team that included Sam Jacobs, and Shaun Hampson. He was named an emergency for the Bullants' '09 Grand Final team.

At the end of the season, Meese thought it best if he spent a season playing with West Preston, the club he'd come through the juniors with.

While he thoroughly enjoyed the season with West Preston, Meese realised midway through the year that he still wanted to prove himself at VFL level.

"I'd played VFL seniors, but I hadn't put together a full season with all my injuries," Meese said.

"I saw myself as a twos player who had played a bit of seniors and I wanted to see myself as a senior VFL player. That's what really got me back in the end.

"I was surprised at the interest other VFL clubs showed in me."

Meese did pre-season training for the 2011 season with Bendigo Bombers, but the Bullants' perseverance won out.

So, what did it take to get him back to Cramer Street? Meese revealed they didn't have to do too much.

"I love the club and I love the boys there. They said they would consider me as a senior player so I said 'okay, I'll go back to where all my mates are'".

Batsanis back to enjoying footy

IT'S taken the best part of four years, but Nathan Batsanis is finally really enjoying his football again and the results are evident.

Batsanis, one of many drivers in Port Melbourne's stunning start to the season, acknowledged it's taken him that long to exorcise the demons associated with his brief flirtation with AFL.

After being rookie listed by Port Adelaide in 2007, Batsanis spent an exasperating season in the City of Churches. It proved anything but a divine 12 months.

The then 19-year-old was struck with osteitis pubis, which effectively made his season redundant. "I was basically in the swimming pool for six months of '07," he said.

"There was Dave Rodan and a few others stepped up to play my role and 'Choco' (then Port Adelaide coach Mark Williams) basically said it would be hard for me the following year to get a game."

And, with that Batsanis was without an AFL club and crushed by what had transpired.

While he had a season with Box Hill Hawks following a pre-season with Hawthorn on his return to Victoria, Batsanis was still out of sorts and moved to Port Melbourne in 2009.

"Obviously, it is a big thing to get drafted, but to get spat out after one year it is pretty shattering," Batsanis said.

"It takes a while to get over. All you want to become is an AFL footballer and when you

are spat out, you don't really know what to do.

"I wanted to get out of the whole AFL environment thing and 'Ayrsey' was a big factor. I wanted to get back to enjoying my footy, I know I play my best footy when I'm around blokes that I love."

Batsanis is now in a good space at the Borough with an upward spiral in his form synonymous with his disposition.

He's been among Port's best players this season and he feels as if he's playing the best football he's done since his days with TAC Cup team Oakleigh Chargers.

Interestingly, Batsanis is not the only player at Port Melbourne whose AFL career was effectively over before it began. Many have a point to prove.

"I haven't been happier in my football than this year. When the team is going well and you are going well, there is no better place to be than at a footy club," Batsanis said.

"We're all absolutely loving it down there. It's been a good start, but the boys know it's only half the season. There is plenty of hard work still to be done.

"We are a pretty close knit group; there is good chemistry around the club."

Lockyer living the dream

TARKYN LOCKYER'S playing days are over. After twelve years in the AFL for Collingwood, a new chapter has begun. He has been thrown into the deep end this year in his new role as coach of their VFL side, and is relishing the opportunity to able to live and breathe his dream, football. Brendan Lucas reports.

Honest, astute and committed are some of the words that ex-team mate and now Collingwood VFL General Manager Paul Licuria has used to describe this once prolific midfielder – and for good reason.

Having played in two grand finals for Collingwood, and missing another two from injury, in addition to a Jason McCartney Medal awarded to him for courageousness in 2009, Lockyer has quite the resume. His experience, knowledge and exceptional rapport he has with his players will only continue to provide great benefits to a club on the rise.

"I just jumped straight in, I coached when I was a kid, but I wouldn't really classify that as coaching. I have spent a fair bit of time with Mick [Malthouse] and the other coaches here at Collingwood, so they have had a fair understanding of my game knowledge, and clearly showed a lot of faith in me, so it was really good to get a big pat on the back from them," Lockyer said.

"I certainly feel it is advantageous at the moment because I have got a really good rapport with my players.

I have spent a lot of time with them as a peer as a player myself, so therefore I know them fairly well, and from that regard I think it helps me really well to relate and communicate to them."

After beginning his coaching this season, Lockyer has had big shoes to fill. He has been following closely in the footsteps of Collingwood hall of famer Gavin Brown, and has drawn on inspiration and styles from those who have led the way before him, including Collingwood AFL coach Mick Malthouse.

"I think you take a little bit from any coach you play under, you try and work out what works and what doesn't work, but you also have to understand your own personality, and you put your own slant on the way you want to coach, I definitely think I have done that."

"Certainly there are elements of the way I coach that has Mick about it, Brown, numerous different people I have been around that have helped me out along my journey. At the end of the day though, I am my own person, and I try and coach the way that suits me."

"My favourite player though when I was a kid was Chris Mainwaring, I loved him. But you can certainly draw inspiration from a lot of greats, you don't have to look too far to find some really good success stories."

Whilst drawing on inspiration from many different fields, Lockyer's mentors reside in those who have followed his development from his playing

days, Collingwood coach Mick Malthouse, and former captain and teammate, Nathan Buckley. "They have been sensational, particularly early on Mick was a really good mentor to give me pointers on how to go about it, getting feedback from the other coaches was terrific from day one."

"The other good thing was the fact that they just threw me into the deep end, I was straight into taking training drills, obviously coaching my own VFL side, I had my own group of VFL players, and as far as the AFL side of things goes, they threw me into the deep end there so that was really good."

Stepping into a new role is never easy, and can be full of trepidation and marred by scrutiny. There are many difficulties that a new coach always faces, the season is young, but to every season there is a journey.

"It's been challenging from time to time, the thing about our VFL side is that we are a tool used to primarily get our players to eventually play AFL football. So from that regard, we are coaching these guys to get them ready, they are the challenges first and foremost." "But that is part of the job, and I knew that going in, I have really enjoyed my first couple of months coaching Collingwood anyway."

Lockyer's desire to breed the youth within the side shows his dedication to coaching, but also his understanding of the importance of a strong VFL and AFL alignment; Geelong

and Collingwood the two teams who are leading the way. Collingwood's decision to move away from an alignment from Williamstown and form one club at the end of the 2007 season has only provided dividends.

"When you look at the successful teams over the last couple of years, I don't think there is much coincidence, we have had so many rookie listed players who played in our premiership side last year, and I think there is no secret as to why Geelong has been so successful in past seasons."

"St. Kilda and Hawthorn are another two who have very strong alignments with their VFL sides, but certainly we feel it is very advantageous in fielding a stand-alone side."

"We don't necessarily have the added pressure which may come from VFL clubs, the pressure is not there to win games necessarily."

At the half way mark of the VFL season, Lockyer's performance on paper may not look exceptional, but is commendable in his first season, considering the youth and inexperience he is fielding. However there is much promise, with three wins and seven losses to date, through his coaching and strong determination he plans to generate consistency in his side in order to ensure a finals berth come September.

"We have been a little bit patchy I suppose, we have had some big losses those couple of weeks against Werribee and Bendigo which were really disappointing, but I think those two games in particular aside, I think that we are a really young group, a couple of



weeks ago we only had Brad Dick in the side, and he was the only player who had senior experience."

"Some of the things they have done is really pleasing, we have seen some really big improvement from our younger VFL guys, but it is just about trying to get them consistent every week."

With team contributions from talented developing younger players like Fasolo, Farmer, Ugle and Perham, Lockyer stresses that teamwork must be utilised and is critical in order to win games, stressing that individual moments of brilliance are not the key.

"We want to demonstrate a style of football, and I suppose when you look at the Collingwood Football Club we pride ourselves on our defensive pressure, and I think first and foremost that is where our guys need to realise what they have to do for the side. Mick and the other coaches are really trying to push the fact that we don't necessarily look at the best player, people get the opportunity to play senior football if they can demonstrate they can play the role for us."

With dominant sides like Port Melbourne and Williamstown continuing to set the benchmark in the competition, Lockyer is assured that the VFL still remains strong, and that despite the lack of AFL alignments, it creates room for improvement and diversity in the competition for future years. "When you have got clubs such as Williamstown, Port Melbourne and Coburg that have been around for so long and have a rich line of heritage and tradition, it would be really disappointing to lose that system."

"Certainly looking at it from an AFL point of view we love having our own players and our own side, but whether that suits everyone I am not too sure. When we were aligned with Williamstown that seemed to work pretty well, there are certainly pros and cons for both."

"When you see a side like Port Melbourne playing such good strong football, who are not aligned to an AFL club, I think seeing something like that is really healthy for the competition. I think the competition in general is travelling pretty well."

'Absolutely unbelievable' Boroughs

PORT Melbourne coach Gary Ayres heaped praise on his players after they pulled off an "absolutely unbelievable" 64-point win over reigning premiers North Ballarat at Eureka Stadium on Saturday, as Samantha Landy reports.

The Borough dispatched the triple-premiers in a spectacular second half, booting 12 goals to the Roosters' four to claim their tenth straight win of the season. The visitors overcame a number of challenges, including losing star midfielders Adam Bentick and Toby Pinwall to injuries in the second quarter and wet and windy conditions, to post the decisive away win.

North Ballarat had the opportunity to prove themselves as a genuine chance for a fourth straight Grand Final berth, coming off five straight wins including a telling victory over second-placed Williamstown last week. But their performance seemingly dashed these prospects. The Roosters' forward line was exposed as frail, able to muster only eight goals, and their midfielders laced pace in comparison to the Boroughs' slick onballers.

Ayres could not contain his glee after the match, telling his players he was "enormously proud" of their effort.

"Today's game was really really hard," he said. "The weather, the [away] ground, having players down. But we deserved to win and I'm very very proud." The Borough shrugged off another top-echelon team, once again proving their premiership credentials and, according to the coach, instilling further confidence in the side.

"For us to measure up against the [AFL]-aligned sides; for us to measure up against Ballarat,

who we regard as a fantastic opposition, and then to win, I think it creates a real self-belief," Ayres said.

Stellar Borough forward Patrick Rose booted eight goals to claim the best-afield honours and bring his season tally to 46 majors.

"He's just been so consistent for us," Ayres said. "He's all class, as we know. He looked like he was really having fun out there today." But the Port Melbourne coach was reluctant to single out players, praising the whole team for chipping in for the win.

Ayres did however acknowledge Jarrod Dalton's performance at full back, where he amassed 12 marks and Shane Valenti's 28-possession return after over a month on the sidelines.

Marcus Darmody led the way for North Ballarat with 27 touches and 10 marks, supported by consistent performers Cameron Richardson and Cruize Garlett. Myles Sewell tried hard, gathering 25 possessions and slotting an early goal while Driscoll and Derick Micallef contributed with two goals apiece.

The Roosters started the contest strongly, booting the first two majors through Driscoll and Myles Sewell. Port Melbourne struggled to kick accurately into the roaring breeze, posting one goal and four behinds to trail by nine points at quarter time.

The Borough affected a 21-point turnaround in the second term, advancing to a 12-point lead. The visitors came out firing after Ayres urged them to "keep taking the game on" at quarter time, winning the first three centre clearances and converting five majors as a result. North Ballarat mirrored Port's first term performance, struggling to pinpoint forward targets kicking into the wind

and finding the goals only once through Micallef.

The third term began with a splash of rain which turned the contest into a scrappy affair. North Ballarat again laboured to find targets up forward, repelled time and time again by Port's backmen Pleming, Johnson and Dalton. The visitors increased the margin to 31 points at the final break, converting six majors, three of which came from miraculous soccer kicks in the goal square. Port Melbourne broke the reigning premier's spirits in the final term, booting another six goals to win by 64 points in a quarter which at times resembled a Boroughs' training drill. This was most apparent when Ryan McMahon booted two goals in as many minutes to put the result beyond doubt.

The win was marred for the Boroughs by an ankle injury to Bentick, which early indications suggest will sideline him for four to six weeks, and a possible fractured cheekbone or jaw to Pinwall. Ayres said the true extent of the injuries would be determined once the players had scans. But the coach is confident the loss of these influential midfielders can be covered.

"It opens the door to Josh Scipione and Matt Smith, and hopefully Sam Dwyer and Malcolm Lynch will be fit to come back next week [against Geelong], maybe after the bye," Ayres said.

"So it just creates another opportunity for us to expose our depth; a great test for us." North Ballarat arguably face a bigger test next week, taking on top-four side the Northern Bullants at Visy Park in a game where they must perform well to regain their finals credentials.

Maddern receives VFL call up

SOMETIMES you need a sea-change to jolt you out of a rut and realise your true potential.

Certainly, Justin Maddern would subscribe to that theory. It's exactly what he did at the end of the 2007 season following another year with the Bendigo Bombers that never rose to any great heights.

After playing a grand total of 18 games in four seasons with the VFL Bombers, Maddern decided he was in need of a change.

"I'd been there for a while and my body hadn't really matured. I wanted a bit of a change so that's why I went to Queensland," Maddern said.

Maddern headed north, played with Labrador in the Queensland Football League and performed well enough to win State representative selection.

He acknowledges it was the battery re-charger that was required and ever since he returned to the area, Maddern's football stocks have soared.

"Confidence was a big key. I got more of that when I was up playing with Labrador," he said.

"It's definitely helped me out." Playing with Kangaroo Flat in

the Bendigo Football League, Maddern kicked 96 goals in the 2009 season, a tally he bettered last season when he kicked the magical 'ton'.

Maddern had decided after the '09 season he would have another crack at the VFL, but a hip operation put those plans on the back burner.

But, after his stunning season last year, Maddern thought his body was right to give it his best shot.

"I wanted to play the best football I could and the VFL was going to be a good challenge for me to get back into," Maddern said.

As good as Maddern's record at local level unquestionably is, Bendigo's recruitment of 'Frosty' Miller medallist Matthew Little and Tory Dickson, who kicked 100 goals for Noble Park in the Eastern Football League last year, coupled with the alignment with Essendon meant the 26-year-old would have to bide his time.

While frustrated, Maddern knew the selection parameters and continued playing for Kangaroo Flat waiting for an opening to appear.

"That's the thing with aligned clubs. If Essendon haven't any injuries then it's going to be hard to get a game," Maddern said.

"While I was frustrated because I wanted to be playing at that level, I wasn't frustrated with anyone why I wasn't."

Maddern's return to Bendigo

Football League continued a recurring nightmare for fullbacks as Maddern kicked 51 goals in seven games, including three double digit hauls, before he received the call up from Bendigo coach Shannon Grant.

Maddern has certainly made the most of his opportunity. He kicked six goals against Coburg Tigers in his first game and followed that with four goals against Sandringham in his next.

But, Maddern knows that he has to keep producing if he wants to stay in the team and even then he could be squeezed out if the numbers don't fall his way.

"I'm enjoying playing with Bendigo, but I know that I have to keep performing," Maddern said.

"It helps with the delivery you get from those guys and the forward line works well with Matt Little and Tory Dickson."

"I was rapt with my year last

year. It gave me confidence coming into this year and with the increased fitness it's really helped and I think we've got a better team."

Martinello said the potential is unquestionably there, but the team needs to play at a consistently higher level in its bid to seal a final's berth – its first since 2008.

WHAT has catapulted Port Melbourne to the top of the VFL ladder and clear front runner for the 2011 VFL premiership?

It's a question many have asked and pondered, but Borough recruit Jake Edwards uses the analogy of the recent NBA Championship playoff between Dallas Mavericks and Miami Heat to explain the club's success.

Edwards noted that the Heat contained all the big name players: Lebron James, Dwayne Wade, Chris Bosh, and Eddie House while the Mavericks boasted just one glamour player Dirk Nowitzki. He said the Mavericks success underlined the saying 'a champion team will always beat a team of champions' and therein lies the strength of Port Melbourne.

It doesn't rely on one forward to kick all the goals, one ruckman to win all the hit outs, one midfielder to win all the clearances and one defender to nullify the opposition.

"Every player understands his role, there is no standout players. 'Ayresy' (coach Gary Ayres) has driven it into us that if you are not doing your

role, not doing the team thing first then there are players just waiting for the chance to take your place who will do those things," Edwards said.

"Everyone wants success and we are all moving towards it as a team."

After spending four years at Carlton, which realised five AFL games, Edwards was undecided about his football future when he was released following the 2009 season.

Initially, Edwards contemplated a season away from the game, but eventually joined brothers Jarrad and Dwyane at Darley in the Ballarat Football League.

"I sat down with my family and decided it was best for me to go back to country football and enjoy my football again," Edwards said.

It was an experience that Edwards thoroughly enjoyed. "Darley Football Club was fantastic; they did everything for me and made me feel welcome.

"I found the love and passion for footy again. It was something I was losing towards the end of my AFL career.

"Spending the year playing for Darley was really good for me; it's a different style of football. Having to win my own hard ball in country footy has helped my development."

Edwards spoke to former Blues teammates Adam Bentick and Dylan McLaren about playing at Port Melbourne. "I asked them what the club, culture and

environment was like and they were all really positive.

"And, that was really important to me. I want to be around good people and the stand-alone nature of the club also appealed," he said.

"Everyone has been great. I've been able to step into the club as if I've been there for years and Gary Ayres is a terrific coach and also a good life mentor as well.

"The chemistry is great. We spend a lot of time together outside of football and that relationship helps your performance. It's not just the senior group; everyone is part of the club."

And, as both the Mavericks and Heat now know that's what wins Championships.

Review of football in country Victoria

THE AFL has announced a review of football in country Victoria. The review is to be headed by AFL Victoria chairman, Peter Jackson, who at the start of June announced the terms of reference for the review of the governance and structures of football across country Victoria to a meeting of representatives from the VCFL Board, staff, affiliated leagues and umpire associations.

The AFL have made a significant commitment to football in country Victoria, with direct grants of almost \$600,000 to the Victorian Country Football League (VCFL) and indirect investment of \$2.8 million for TAC regions, Under 16 and 18 country championships and the employment of development managers and officers in country regions.

The review will make recommendations to the AFL, AFL Victoria, the VCFL and its members about how to improve the governance and

structures in order to maximize collaboration.

The intent of the review is to ensure that football's peak bodies adequately respond to the future needs of football in country Victoria.

AFL Victoria strives to achieve seven key development objectives for the game in the state by working with its major affiliates, including the VCFL.

These key development objectives are centred around participation, community foundation, engagement, talent and second tier, facilities, fan development and people and culture.

The purpose of the review is to examine the current governance and structures of football in country Victoria to determine:

- The effectiveness of these structures
- The level of duplication of resources and administration
- The levels of collaboration between various stakeholders

- Their impact on achieving the seven key development objectives

- Whether AFL investment in country Victoria is efficient and effective

The review will seek submissions and feedback from the VCFL, affiliated leagues and umpiring associations as well as AFL Victoria's network that is responsible for talent programs, pathways and development outcomes in country Victoria.

The review will also seek feedback from other stakeholders including the Victorian Government and local councils and municipalities and look at the structures and programs of other sports.

A final report with recommendations will be provided to the AFL by the end of August. The final recommendations will be presented to all stakeholders by the end of September.

Tudor grows into Falcons spot



WHEN you stand 195 cm it's hard to sneak under anyone's proverbial radar, but that's what happened with Cameron Tudor.

In defence of the Geelong Falcon recruiting scouts, however, it should be noted that Tudor literally sprung out of nowhere.

Tudor revealed he grew between 10 and 15 centimetres in the one year when he was in Year 9 and his football development enjoyed such an explosion.

So much so that the Falcons took on Tudor as one of their 19-year-olds. It's been a win/win situation.

Falcons' Regional Manager Michael Turner said Tudor has continued to blossom as the season has progressed and developed into a key player.

"He's really surprised us. We didn't know too much about him pre-season, he's a bit of a late maturer," Turner said.

Not only has Tudor, whose father was on Geelong's list in the 1980s, played every game, but with Vic Country representative ruckman Jay Lever being used in other roles, Tudor has carried the Falcons' ruck.

While he's not considered a ruckman's height – 195 cm – in today's era of 200 cm plus big men, Tudor has been nothing short of outstanding.

Against Sandringham Dragons, Tudor won 35 hit outs, the third time this season that he's won 20 plus hit outs.

If the 35 hit outs were not enough, Tudor also gathered 24 possessions, took eight marks and had seven hand ball receives.

Not surprisingly, Tudor was a clear top vote poller in the TAC Cup Coaches Award.

Turner believes that Tudor would be even better suited if he played in a key position, a prospect that may eventuate in the second half of the season.

"He's been terrific. We're hoping during the holidays when the (Geelong) Grammar and College boys come back that we can play him at centre half back – that's where AFL recruiters want to see him play because they know he's not tall enough to play in the ruck," Turner said.

During the Vic Country trial matches, Tudor played in defence and while he did not gain a call up for the AFL Under 18 Championships he likes the idea of playing there.

Tudor acknowledges he just took time to adjust to his growth spurt and several injuries also held him back, but he played okay last season with St Joseph's.

It was enough to gain him an invitation to try out for a spot on the Falcon's list this year, but he didn't expect to be the club's No 1 ruckmen.

Playing against some of the proverbial 'giants' has proved challenging, but Tudor has done his best to stay away from body contact.

"Some of those guys are massive," Tudor said.

It hasn't stopped Cameron Tudor, however, from making an impact for the Falcons.

Seniors to TAC suits Jong



ONE of the great beauties about the TAC Cup is that there is a never ending supply of good stories and surprises.

Oakleigh Chargers' Lin Jong is one of them. The son of East Timor and Taiwanese parents, Jong wasn't on any football short list until last year.

And, that's largely because Jong didn't start playing football until under 15s. But in the space of three seasons, the athletic Jong has made significant strides.

"It's a great story, he's come from nowhere," Doyle said.

Jong wasn't part of the Chargers program last year, but showed up enough playing for Mulgrave under 18s that he received an invitation to pre-season training.

While Jong made the Oakleigh list, expectations were not high that the 18-year-old would make the impact that he has.

It was only when the Chargers' private school boys returned to their school commitments that Jong received the call up from Mulgrave, where he had been playing in the seniors.

"He's come in and had a real influence," enthused Doyle.

Indeed. Jong was the Chargers' best player in its 15-point win against Bendigo Pioneers in round 8, earning the maximum five TAC Cup Coaches Award votes.

Jong collected 16 possessions, laid four tackles and kicked one goal as he provided plenty of midfield drive to set up Oakleigh's win.

Doyle said Jong's kicking efficiency was just "ok" at the start of the year, but as the practice matches progressed the Year 12 Brentwood Secondary College student's athleticism began to shine.

"He's 187cm, he has a great vertical leap, he's quite quick and he's very clean below his knees," he said.

"When a guy comes out of a contested situation with a bit of pace it catches your eye and Lin has been able to do that."

Such is Jong's athleticism that he's literally played in every position this season for the Chargers. Doyle said they

even gave Jong a 10-minute stint in the ruck because of his leap.

Ideally, Jong is suited to a wing or forward or back flank, but such is his ability to impose himself on a contest that he's played key position roles in both attack and defence.

"Lin's been a bit of a surprise packet. When you have those physical attributes he's a hard match up," Doyle said.

While he played basketball during his early teens, Jong said he always had an interest in football, but it wasn't until he was asked by some friends to come to training at Glen Waverley Rovers for the under 15s that he started playing.

Jong said when he was overlooked for selection for the Chargers he returned to Mulgrave, where he was chosen in the seniors.

Asked if he found it easier coming back from Eastern Football League Division 1 to TAC Cup, Jong replied: "I wouldn't say easier, just that the bodies aren't as big."

Jong said he doesn't mind switching from Mulgrave to Oakleigh. Basically, he said he's just happy to be playing football.

Vic Metro continues winning run

JONATHON Patton and Hayden Crozier provided Vic Metro with the one-two punch that eventually felled West Australia in an enthralling NAB AFL Under 18 Championship match at Paterson's Stadium last Sunday.

Patton and Crozier gave Vic Metro a dual pronged attack and in the end it wore down the home State, which led for the first three quarters.

But, with Patton and Crozier each kicking four goals it proved telling as Vic Metro took command in the last quarter to register a 12.13 (85) to 11.9 (75) victory.

Patton's Ranges teammate Hayden Crozier made the most of his 14 possessions, kicking 4.1 and took a stunning pack mark.

Northern Knights' Billy Longer reaffirmed his status as one of the best young ruckmen as he repeatedly gave Vic Metro first use of the ball as he won 28 hitouts.

Oakleigh Chargers Dom Tyson's reputation as one of the best ball user was again underlined as his 22 possessions were at an efficiency rate of 86%.

Tyson's Charger teammate Jack Viney collected a team-high 23 possessions, one more than Tyson, and his stamina and class was evident when the game was in the balance in the last quarter.

Toby Greene, with 22 touches, and Adam Kennedy, who had 20 possessions, also contributed to the victory.

Defender Michael Tallia again showcased his talent with eight marks and 18 possessions. Sandringham Dragon Jackson Paine took a team equal high nine marks.

Metro's inaccurate kicking saw them trail West Australia by six points at half time and they were still down by two points at three-quarter time.

But, Metro's overall class

shone through in the last term as they added 4.3 to West Australia's 2.3 to run out 10-point winners.

Vic Country stumble against SA

THE third quarter is not termed the 'premiership quarter' without good cause.

It is so often the pivotal term of any match as Vic Country will vouch after they were on the receiving end of a stunning third quarter from South Australia in last Saturday's AFL U18 Championship match at AAMI Stadium.

South Australia violently swung the match its way with a 10-goal third quarter to turn a 22-point deficit into a 40-point lead.

Such a dominant third quarter paved the way for South Australia to post a 19.9 (123) to 11.11 (77) victory, to maintain its unbeaten status and inflict the first loss for Vic Country during the Championships.

It was hard to predict that the home State would so dramatically change the course of the match as, if anything, Vic Country could have been further ahead at half time.

Vic Country had seven more scoring shots in the first half, but those wasted opportunities came back to haunt the reigning Championship winners.

And, while South Australia's influence in the final quarter was not anywhere near as

pronounced they still had 10 scoring shots to four.

But, the unmistakable fact is that South Australia had 29 scoring shots to Vic Country's six after half time.

Vic Country had no answer for South Australian captain Chad Wingard who accumulated a match-high 27 possessions, including 12 contested, won five clearances and finished with two goals.

Wingard is enjoying a brilliant carnival. He was South Australia's best in its earlier match against NSW/ACT.

Just as damaging as Wingard was around the ground, South Australian ruckman Brodie Grundy set the momentum going his team's way as he took control at all the stoppages.

Grundy won 36 hit outs as South Australia controlled the ruck duels winning 62 to 24 hit outs.

Dandenong Stingrays Lachie Whitfield and Brad Couch were Vic Country's main possession winners with each gaining 20 touches.

Taylor Adams, Nic O'Brien and Clay Smith all had 19 possessions while defender Josh Tynan had 17 possessions, including 12 contested, and took seven marks. He played a lone hand.

Vic Country returns home for its final two matches – against West Australia at Skilled Stadium on Friday, July 1 and then the much awaited

showdown against Vic Metro at Etihad Stadium on Wednesday July 6.

For Vic Country to get back into Championship contention it must win its final two matches and hope that Vic Metro and/or West Australia can defeat South Australia.
