Palm Beach Currumbin v Aspley at Salk Oval

The reigning premiers are doing what they need to get over the line after a first round scare against the Western Magpies. They are yet to reach the standards set in 2007 however are warming to the task nicely and in taking on the Hornets at Salk Oval have the opportunity to make a statement to a contender for their title. Big Lindsay Bredenoord is coming along nicely after a year out of the game and working well in tandem with Michael l'Anson. James Drake will provide versatility and this could well be the round when Baker, Dyson, and Rynehart all hit their straps. THEN THERE WERE TWO

After eight players won Team of the Week selection in each of the first two weeks of the Velocity Sports Cup, just two can still boast a perfect three from three record – Morning-side's Ryan Holman and Zillmere's Austin Lucy.

BIG BUT NOT BIGGEST!

The Lions staged the seventh-biggest turnaround for a win in AFL history when they came back from 47 points down at the 22-minute mark of the third quarter to beat Port Adelaide by 20 points in Adelaide last Saturday night. Incredibly, the 67-point turnaround was 14 points shy of the all-time biggest comeback, set by Essendon when they hit back from 69 points down to beat North Melbourne by 12 points in 2001. Hawthorn (76pts - 1999), Richmond (71pts - 2003), Collingwood (69pts - 1978), Footscray (69pts - 1978) and St.Kilda (68pts - 1937) also mounted a bigger recovery operation to take the points.

NOT EVEN A CLUB RECORD

As hard as it was to believe, the Lions, 33 points down at three-quarter time against Port, couldn't ever claim the biggest final quarter comeback in the club's history when they stole the points from the Power. That record stands to the 1995 Brisbane Bears side that turned a 45-point deficit at the last change into a seven-point win over Hawthorn at the Gabba. It was the day when Hawks coach Peter Knights took his players into the shade of the grandstand at three-quarter time and paid the ultimate price.

SOLE SURVIVOR

Nigel Lappin is the only 'survivor' from the Brisbane Bears side which made history against Hawthorn in '95 still on the club's list, but instead of playing a key role in the final quarter rout as he did last week he watched the first miracle comeback from the stands. Why? He was dropped. But he did regain his senior place the following week and went on to play in the club's first finals side seven years ago. Without being absolutely sure, we reckon it was the last time Lappin was actually dropped from the senior side.

THAT 21

How's the memory? The 21 players who wore Bears colors in their remarkable win over the Hawks that day were Jason Akermanis, Marcus Ashcroft, Trent Bartlett, Andrew Bews, Richard Champion, Nathan Chapman, Matthew Clarke, Adrian Fletcher, Adrian Fletcher, Andy Gowers, Shaun Hart, Craig Lambert, Steven Lawrence, Gilbert McAdam, Scott McIvor, Michael McLean, Roger Merrett, Chris Scott, Dion Scott, Michael Voss and Darryl White.

SEVEN CLEARANCES

There were plenty of Lions heroes against the Power but none bigger than Simon Black. Beaten by Chad Cornes early in the game, he stuck at his task magnificently and finished with 32 possessions, 10 hard-ball-gets, 10 clearances and a goal. And no less than seven clearances came in the final quarter – more than most good centre-square players will get most weeks in a full game.

GREAT GAINS, BIG LOSS

Daniel Bradshaw has received plenty of publicity for his sensational comeback from a knee reconstruction, but he is not the only one. Joel Macdonald found career-best form in the second half of last year after his knee reco – and has taken his game to a whole new level again in 2008. And Anthony Corrie could be placed a similar category. Their recoveries appear to be testimony to the work of strength and conditioning coach Alex Moore, who perhaps not surprisingly has been head hunted by the Canadian skiing team for the Winter Olympics. Moore's loss could be very significant given the outstanding recoveries of the Lions trio.

A BIG CALL, GERARD

Brownlow Medallist Gerard Healy made a huge call on 3AW on Monday when he rated Port Adelaide among the top six sides in the competition despite the fact that they are without a win in the first four rounds and sit 15th on the ladder, ahead only of the hapless Melbourne. But he wasn't backing away from it: Hosting "On the Couch" on Monday night, Healy reiterated his claim and said he still expected the Power to "play a significant role in September". Obviously the bookies don't agree. They still had Port at \$3 just to make the eight, ahead of only Carlton and Richmond at \$5 and Melbourne at \$34.

ANOTHER BIG CALL

Former Carlton captain Mark Maclure didn't pull any punches when taking aim at new Melbourne coach Dean Bailey over the weekend. Suggesting Bailey had not yet stamped his mark on the aging Demons list, Maclure suggested Bailey needed to go to David Neitz (33), Jeff White (31), Russell Robertson (29), Cameron Bruce (28) and Brad Green (27) and ask if they really wanted to play, and suggest that maybe one of them needs to retire – immediately. He might have liked to include 30-year-old Adem Yze, who is playing in the VFL and destined never to return, and 30-year-old Ben Holland, who is on the injured list, but it wouldn't be fair to include 31-year-old James McDonald, the Demons' 2006-07 B&F winner.

WEST AUSSIE RECORD

Fremantle's Peter Bell last weekend posted his 277th AFL game to equal the record for most VFL/AFL games by a West Australian. Who did the former North Melbourne premiership player join at that mark? Former Collingwood captain and dual B&F winner Wayne Richardson, who played 277 games for the Pies from 1966-78.

QUEENSLAND RECORD?

Who holds the record for most games by a Queenslander? No prizes for knowing Marcus Ashcroft tops the list at 318, but the next few aren't so well-known. Michael Voss (289) is second, while this year Jason Akermanis (271) has slipped past Jason Dunstall (269) into third spot. Others to top the double-century have been Gavin Crosisca (246), Mal Michael (227), Max Hudghton (208) and Scott McIvor (200). The Ashcroft record will take some beating, but if it is going to fall 25-year-old Nick Riewoldt (138) is the most likely challenger.

QUEENSLAND DREAM

There were a total of seven Lions picked in the two 40-man squads – Charman, Simon Black and Matty Leuenberger in the Dream Team squad, and captain Jonathan Brown, Nigel Lappin, Luke Power and Daniel Bradshaw in the Victorian squad.

OPPORTUNITY FOR GROSE

Ex-Mt.Gravatt youngster Gavin Grose is eyeing an opportunity at Port Adelaide following the injury-forced retirement without playing a senior game of 20-year-old ruckman Hugh Minson, younger brother of Bulldogs star Will Minson and a fourth-round draft pick of 2005. This creates a vacancy on the Power senior list, and Grose is the only second-year rookie at Alberton so you'd have to think he might have the inside running.

IN THE CIRCLE

Notice the team song sing-a-long in the Carlton rooms after they posted a 23-point win over Collingwood Sunday to avoid a club record 15th loss in a row? In the middle of the circle alongside first-time Blues winners was none other than coach Brett Ratten. Didn't catch exactly who else was there, but if they were fair-dinkum it would have included off-season pick-ups Chris Judd and Richard Hadley plus elevated rookie Michael Jamison, who played the last five games last year without success, and 2008 draftees Matthew Kreuzer and Darren Pfeiffer.

MUM NOT HAPPY

Barry Hall's seven-match suspension Tuesday night for his king hit on West Coast's Brent Staker didn't exactly please Staker's mother Rosemary. Describing the blow as a "gut-wrenching" and "sickening" act, she had called for the ex-Sydney captain to be suspended for the rest of the year.

WHEN RIGHT IS WRONG!

There's no doubting the AFL's new tribunal system has worked nicely, but sometimes it tosses up a bit of an oddity. Like the list line in the summary of the Hall-Staker incident in which the incident was referred direct to the tribunal. It said: "He has no existing good or bad record". That despite the fact that he did 16 weeks suspension from 1998-2002. His 'record' only referred to the past five years. In fact this was his 13th report, which sees him fifth on the list of current players behind Shane Crawford (16), Josh Carr (15), Jeff Farmer (14) and Dustin Fletcher (14). And in fact it helped him because his guilty plea spared him a longer stretch.

FOUR-ROUND RECORD

AFL attendances after four rounds of the 2008 Toyota AFL Premiership Season are at their highest in the history of the game - more than 5% ahead at the same stage of the all-time record set last year. The eight matches in round four last weekend drew a combined attendance of 315,414 fans, taking the season total to 1,297,678 fans -- 5.1% up on 2007.

ROOS NOT HAPPY

The attendance records keep ticking over despite a couple of disappointing turnarounds last weekend. Port Adelaide would have been disappointed to see just 25,205 at AAMI Stadium for the 2004 grand final

replay against Brisbane. And, despite a massive publicity campaign from North Melbourne, pleading for a crowd of 30,000-plus, the Roos were only able to attract 23,427 to the MCG for the game against Melbourne.

RIGHT OR WRONG?

One person conspicuous by his absence on Saturday was North president James Brayshaw. The multi-pronged media personality was elsewhere on commentary duties for Triple M. Right or wrong? And what about new Melbourne CEO Paul McNamee? The former tennis ace will miss a couple of weeks mid-season to go to Wimbeldon.

RECYCLED DOCKERS

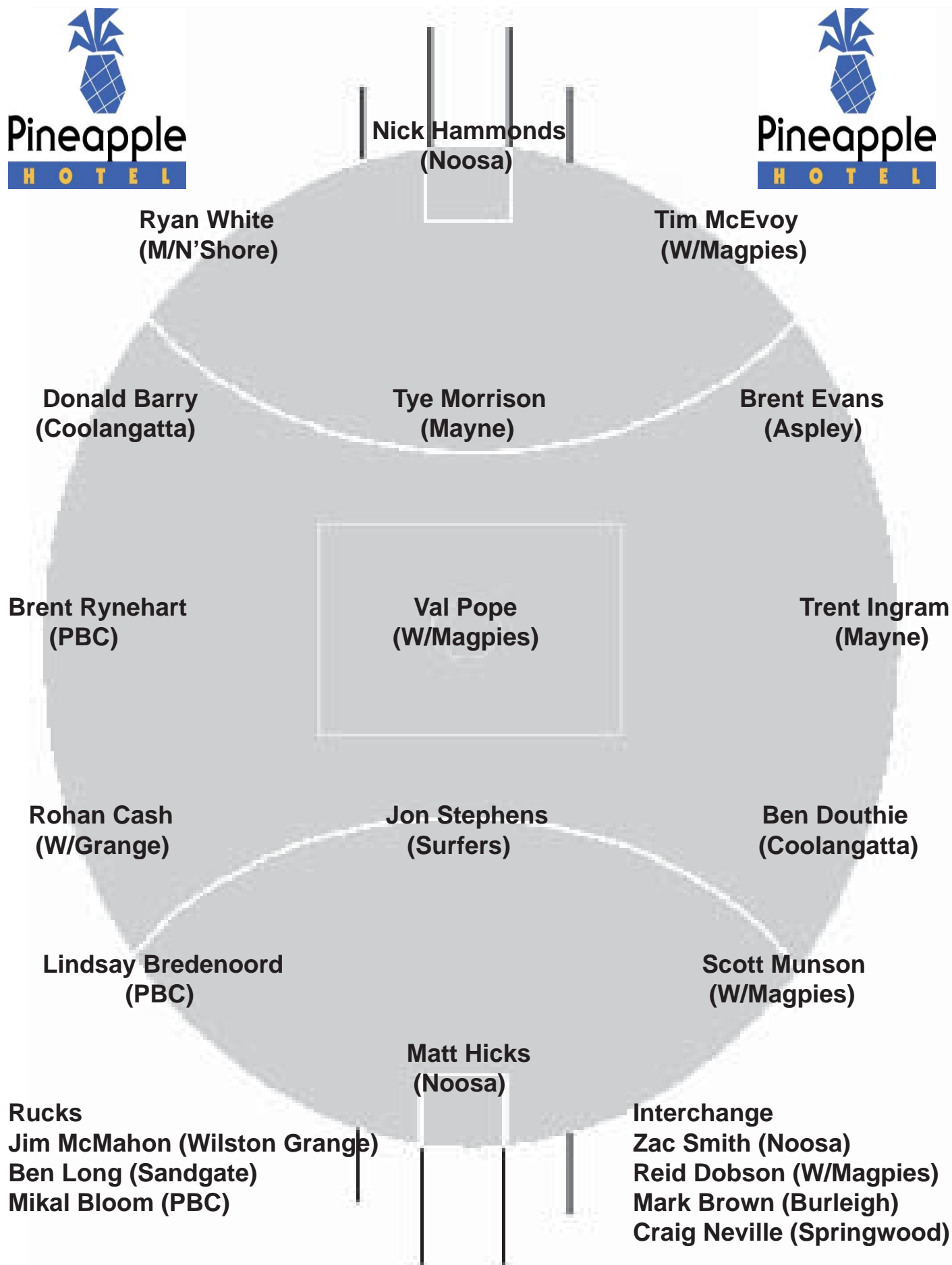

FAMILY 500

The Tuck family is set to become the third father/son combination in AFL history to post a combined 500 senior games this weekend. Shane Tuck is scheduled to play his 74th game, which comes on top of father Michael's League-record 426 games. Ahead of them in the 500 Club are Serge Silvagni (239) and Stephen Silvagni (312) for a total of 551 games, and Ken Fletcher (264) and Dustin Fletcher (280) for a total of 544. Others in the top group are Ted Whitten Snr (321) and Ted Whitten Jnr (144) for a total of 465, and the Tucks again, with Travis Tuck's five games sitting on top of father Michael's 426 for a total of 431.
