

# Seagulls triumph

The Williamstown FC have brought home the Foxtel Cup to Victoria, proudly representing the Peter Jackson VFL



CONGRATULATIONS to the Williamstown Football Club for winning the inaugural Foxtel Cup Grand Final last weekend at Patersons Stadium.

It was a credit to General Manager Brendan Curry, coach Peter German, captain Brett Johnson and all the players, particularly Williamstown listed player Ben Jolley, winner of the Coles Medal for best-onground.

Williamstown's performance was an outstanding advertisement for the Peter Jackson VFL competition as it reinforced the VFL as the premier second tier competition in the country. The Foxtel Cup proved a resounding success on a raft of levels as it showcased the extremely high standard of football across every State and Territory.

One of the key elements to the Foxtel Cup was creating greater awareness of second tier competitions, which drew 16 clubs, played in seven different States and Territories and at nine venues. What emerged from the competition was a large number of talented footballers who were able to increase their profile before a national audience.

Significantly, 14 players who participated in the Foxtel Cup games have received an invitation to the AFL Draft Combines in early October. It's pleasing that exciting Northern Bullants prospect Ahmed Saad is one of those players who will have the opportunity to further advance his appeal before AFL talent scouts. It will be interesting to see how many players from the Foxtel Cup gain a chance on an AFL list at the end of the season.

Clearly, the Foxtel Cup is providing yet another legitimate pathway for young players striving to take their game to the next level. Several players actually made their senior debut in the Foxtel Cup and that's an experience they'll always remember.

The Foxtel Cup allowed players to experience a standard that previously may not have been available to them and such a challenging experience will no doubt be beneficial to their football careers.

Players were also able to experience travelling interstate and playing at AFL venues like Etihad Stadium, Patersons Stadium, AAMI Stadium and Metricon Stadium.

As part of the media rights package secured by the AFL earlier in the season, the Foxtel Cup will continue for at least the next five years.

Certainly, the live coverage on Foxtel added to the appeal of the competition as football fans were able to watch from the comfort of their homes the two hour production, which brought insights from the coach's box as well as interviews with players on the boundary line. The Foxtel Cup was a welcome addition to the football calendar and AFL Victoria is proud that the Williamstown Football Club, along with North Ballarat Roosters and the Northern Bullants, represented the State and the competition so well.

An early preview of Acacia finals football will be witnessed this weekend.



COULD this be the Grand Final preview we are seeing this weekend?

Many Port Melbourne and Williamstown supporters will hope so, but there are plenty of clubs that are still in the fight for the premiership cup. Last week we featured the Acacia finals predictions, on who would make the eight and where clubs would finish. Box Hill Hawks and Geelong last weekend firmed as the two clubs showing the form that could see them as late entries into the finals mix. Werribee continued to hold their treasured fourth spot on the ladder, whilst Casey showed that the double chance positions are far from decided this year.

This week in the Record we take a different look at the season, as Adrian Dunn breaks down the Peter Jackson VFL season up until round 18, looking at the quarter by quarter performances. Despite current ladder positions, the quarter by quarter ladders tell a different story on the season to date, and reveals some clubs strengths and weaknesses. # Seagulls win Foxtel Cup



FOR much of his 100-plus VFL games, Ben Jolley had pretty much flown under the radar, except at Williamstown where his value had never been undersold

While captain Brett Johnson and former teammates Matthew Little and Patrick Rose were headline makers, an unassuming Jollev quietly went about his business.

Jolley's undoubted talent, on display repeatedly during the Foxtel Cup preliminary rounds, was evident as Williamstown captured the inaugural Foxtel Cup Grand Final in Perth last Saturday.

The Williamstown rover shone as the Seagulls defied a third-quarter comeback from Claremont to run out comfortable 21-point winners, 9.5 (59) to 5.8 (38).

Jolley distributed 16 handballs, collected 14 kicks, laid 10 tackles and took four marks in a best-onground performance that saw him win the Coles Medal.

It is the sort of performance that the Williamstown faithful have become accustomed, but it's taken the Foxtel Cup for others to fully appreciate just what a gifted football Jolley is.

Putting Jolley's performance in context highlights his dominance. He was the game's leading

possession winner with five more possessions than Claremont's Kane Mitchell.

Jolley's disposal efficiency was 77 percent, which, again, highlighted his value to the team.

And his 10 tackles was another game high. It was five more than nearest teammate Brett Johnson.

While Jolley was the standout performer. Williamstown's bid to win the Foxtel Cup was aided by a strong Western Bulldogs' presence.

With Williamstown fielding 14 Bulldogs listed players the class factor became evident when the game was on the line at threequarter time.

After Williamstown held a 13-point lead at half time, Claremont surged in the third quarter to reduce the margin to just five points at threequarter time.

But, when it mattered most. Williamstown stood tall, snuffed out any further Claremont rally to collect the silverware.

Williamstown held Claremont to just three points in the last quarter while the Seagulls kicked 3.1 as they secured a 21-point victory.

Western Bulldog Jordan Roughead was outstanding as he played a lone hand in the ruck for

Williamstown. Apart from winning 19 hit outs. Roughead collected 18 possessions, took five marks and kicked two goals.

Roughead was well assisted by teenager Mitch Wallis who gathered 19-possessions, Christian Howard (18), Andrew Hooper (16) and Sam Reid (16).

As determined and spirited as Claremont undoubtedly was, all credit must go to Williamstown who defied the travel factor, just as they did throughout the Foxtel Cup. to emerge with a thoroughly well deserved Foxtel Cup Grand Final victory.



# Captain's reach 100 game milestone

COBURG Tigers haven't had many reasons to celebrate during season 2011, but it has good cause this weekend when captain Nick Carnell plays his 100th match.

The significance of Carnell's achievement is not lost among the club faithful at the City Oval. Carnell is the first player to reach

the century, so to speak, since Anthony Alessio in 1997.

It seems extraordinary that such a long standing club like Coburg Tigers can go more than a decade without a player playing 100 games, but it's a fact and may explain why the club has not enjoyed finals success in recent times.

Carnell is as well aware of his 'history' making game as he is of the need for Coburg Tigers to retain players so it won't be another decade before the next Coburg Tiger player reaches the 'ton'.

It's one of the reasons why Carnell has committed himself for another two seasons at least at the club so he can set an example of stability as well as pride and passion for the club.

"If I was to jump off the ship now and say 'I've done my bit' then it drops right back. Sam Power has played a lot of games and Damien Rayson played his 50th a couple of weeks ago, but after that it drops right back to 20 games." Carnell said.

"That's the culture 'Pottsie' (coach Adam Potter) and I'm trying to build at the moment is to keep players at the club. One of the things we have got is that we're all really good mates."

When Carnell first arrived at City Oval he made a pact with himself that he wanted to be a 100 game, one club player and he never deviated from that plan.

Interestingly, Carnell views his upcoming milestone as "giving something back" to the club and by extension the competition.

"A lot of players come into the system and drop straight out," Carnell said.

"When you play 100 games, you can say you've stayed around a while and given a bit back and, I guess, paid your dues."

Carnell acknowledges the lack of finals during his 100 games is frustrating and he notes that is due largely to the club not having a core base of VFL players with between 50-100 games experience.

He points to the success of Sandringham and North Ballarat, clubs laden with 100 game VFL players, over the past decade to illustrate his point.

"Playing and winning finals is the one reason you play football and it comes back to the philosophy of keeping guys around the football club," Carnell said.

"If you look at the North Ballarat and Williamstown's they have a very good VFL base, an experienced VFL base and that's what we need to do.

"If we start getting guys up between the 80 and 100 VFL games you will start seeing the results turn around."

Carnell noted that currently the club relies too heavily on Richmond players while he would like to see a model developed where the aligned players are the bonus not the drivers of club success.

He hopes the young first year players like Willie Wheeler, Dylan Murphy and Glen Grgic will be part of the wave that rolls into 100-game players and bring success back to the City Oval.

LIFE is basically about choices. Inherently, it seems, choice and comfort are constant companions.

And, that helps explain why Sam Gibson, who plays his 100th game for the club this weekend, is still with Box Hill Hawks after his cameo on aligned partner Hawthorn's rookie list did not pan out as he'd hoped.

Most players delisted by an AFL don't stay around its aligned VFL club. Untold machinations are involved, but basically it comes down to choice.

It would have been easy for the Oakleigh Chargers graduate to find another football home and begin afresh, but Gibson decided to remain at Box Hill for a variety of reasons: its spirit, camaraderie among players and officials and a homely feel.

"I think I'm a person who does best when I'm comfortable and the club went out of their way to prove to me that they wanted me." Gibson said.

"I had a lot of people at the club that I enjoyed being around, a lot of friends and I sort of felt at home there."

While acknowledging it was a "bit hard at first" given the obvious Hawthorn connection, Gibson soon moved on and he's more than comfortable with the choice he made.

Gibson is the first Box Hill Hawks player to reach 100 games since dual best and fairest winner Matthew Ball, brother of Collingwood premiership player Luke, who played his 100th game in 2007. Gibson and Ball are the only two Box Hill Hawks players since former club goal kicking great Darron Wilkinson in 1999 to reach 100 games.

"It's nice that I've been able to

hang around and I've certainly proud to play my whole career at one club," Gibson said.

"It's something I'll look back on fondly when I'm done playing.

"We've always been a development club and quite young. We've developed players for a couple of years and then they've moved on."

With the departure of veteran Steve Kenna, Gibson was elevated to club captain this season. It's coincided with the 25-year-old playing his best football.

Although injury and a bunch of narrow defeats have conspired again the club this season, Box Hill Hawks are still in the race for the finals

"We haven't had the ideal season, but we're not in too bad a position. If a few of those (close) games had gone the other way we would have been a lot more comfortable.

"We still think we can play finals and definitely scare a few sides when we get there."

Gibson noted that the club had developed "a hell of a lot of players this year and we've played a lot of Box Hill players, which is great."

He said Box Hill Hawks ability to develop players is an area that the club is better at than any other club. It's backed by a long list of players who've been either drafted or rookie listed.

All associated with Box Hill Hawks would be mighty proud as to how Sam Gibson has developed.

# Casey still in top four mix

WHILE the Melbourne Demons may be finding it difficult to win in recent weeks, their VFL affiliate team in Casey certainly did the club proud after disposing of Sandringham by 61 points at Casey Fields on Sunday as James Hunter Smith reports.

The Zebra's first goal came at the 7-minute mark of the third quarter in a disappointing display of football that abruptly halted their chances of making the finals.

The Scorpions made light work of their opponents and were led by former first round draft pick Cale Morton (32 disposals), Matthew Warnock (27), James Wall (26) and Brendan Fevola (5 goals).

The 18.12 (120) to 9.5 (59) win has set Casey up with a mouthwatering scramble to claim fourth spot on the Peter Jackson VFL ladder, alongside Werribee and the Bullants

Omitted Demons star Colin Sylvia didn't dominate the stats sheet by any stretch of the imagination yet



kept key Sandringham midfielders Marcus Marigliani and James Magner relatively quiet for the first half, much to the delight of Casey coach Brad Gotch.

Gotch said the win was a great turnaround from the team's round 18 belting from Geelong and made particular note of the Melbourne players dropped from the AFL squad.

"Their attitude was great today... they jumped on board with our values down here at Casey," he said.

"They really drew a line in the sand to say that Melbourne want Casey to be successful, and I think that's a really good thing going forward. Now it's about being successful week in week out."

Gotch admitted while playing solid football was the main priority, the prospect of a top-four finish is a real possibility.

"Naturally it's on your mind, (but) I was more worried about getting a more competitive performance today than last week," he said.

"Now it puts us back in the mix... really our destiny is in our own hands."

For the Zebras, youngster Tom Lynch was solid off half-back with 27 touches, while captain David Gallagher and Steve Baker had 19 disposals each.

A low scoring opening term was plagued by poor delivery inside 50, despite Casey's ability to glide their way out of defence with relative ease.

Addam Maric eventually opened the account for the home side after shrugging off a Tom Lynch tackle to drill the first major, but the Scorpions failed to apply enough scoreboard pressure given their nine more entries inside attacking fifty during the quarter

The Scorpions were applying too much forward pressure for the visitors to handle, accumulating 20 tackles inside their attacking 50, as well as a Fevola onslaught of goals as he booted three majors in just as many minutes. Casey held a 51-point lead as they headed into the main break, with Sandringham yet to register a single goal

Their first major finally came through Will Johnson in the seventh minute of the third term but the game was well and truly out of reach with Casey leading by 64 points at the final break.

The Zebras' 23rd player in Jackson Coleman showed glimpses of his future potential with two late goals in the last quarter, but a couple of quick majors to Melbourne forward Liam Jurrah saw the home side eventually run out 61-point winners.

Sandringham coach Brett Lovett said he was disappointed not only with the loss, but his team's output over the last month.

"Our form over the last 3 or 4 weeks has been not up to it... we've been down a little bit on confidence, and down on the ability to use the footy effectively," Lovett said.

This week Sandringham will try to get back on the winners list as they take on Box Hill at home, while Casey clash with Coburg in a game they must win to secure a top-four position heading into the finals.

# **Quarter by quarter review**

AS the finals race intensifies, clubs increasingly look for a chink in their rivals. Sometimes it's easy to identify than others.

Not surprisingly, every club is pumped when it plays Port Melbourne and that's reflected by the fact that the unbeaten ladder leader doesn't own a winning record in first quarters.

But, the problem for rival clubs is stopping Port Melbourne in the second quarter where it is nigh on unbeatable. They're virtually unstoppable also in last quarters, too.

It's said the third quarter is the premiership quarter, but, somewhat surprisingly Port Melbourne is middle of the pack when it comes to winning the third term.

So, what are clubs various strengths and weaknesses? We've broken the season down into quarters and constructed a quarter by quarter ladder as well as ladders for each individual quarter.

Some results are most predictable, others will surprise. Here is a look at each club, quarter by quarter.

### **BENDIGO BOMBERS**



BENDIGO Bombers season has bounced about a fair bit, but what is certain is there has been no better first quarter

club up to and including round 18. The VFL Bombers own 12/1/1 record with its sole first term loss against Coburg Tigers, a match where they incurred a 10-goal plus defeat. Bendigo also drew its seasonopener first quarter against Northern Bullants. While Bendigo Bombers have been nigh on unbeatable in the first quarter they haven't been able to sustain such a frenetic start. They're a combined 18-23-1 in quarters won after quarter time. The second quarter is clearly their worst with a 4-9-1 record. In fact, the last time Bendigo won a second quarter was back in round 11 against Sandringham. The VFL Bombers break-even 7-7 – in both the third and fourth quarters. During its first quarter dominance, Bendigo has outscored its opponents 61 to 29 goals and owns a best effort nine goals - against Collingwood in round 4 – and has kicked five goals or more seven times. It's never been held goal less in the opening quarter with one goal, in both the season opener against Northern Bullants and round 15 against Coburg Tigers, its lowest output. Its second term woes can be traced to the fact that it was held goal less once - against Northern Bullants - and six times has kicked two goals or less. During the second quarter, Bendigo has been outscored 62 - 48 goals. Little variation in goals for and against during third and fourth terms, which marries with its

### **BOX HILL HAWKS**



CONSISTENCY has been an issue for Box Hill Hawks throughout the season. The VFL Hawks have been good for one quarter then dropped away the next as evidenced by its quarters won/lost graph. Box Hill Hawks own identical records in the first and third quarters where they are 6-8 and second and fourth guarters where they're 9-5. During those winning quarters, Box Hill Hawks sit second and third respectively in the guarters won ladder. While the first and third quarter record is identical. Box Hill Hawks

third quarter is its worst in terms of goals for and against - they have a negative 14 goal differential. Cleary, its best quarter is the last where they outscore the opposition 50-34 goals. Box Hill's inability to kick goals is illustrated by the fact that only once - round 4 against Coburg Tigers - has it kicked more than six goals in a quarter. They kicked eight in the last quarter that day. Only 11 times has Box Hill Hawks kicked five goals or more in a quarter. Conversely, Box Hill Hawks have been held to two goals or less in 18 quarters and that doesn't help in applying scoreboard pressure. While it has won more quarters than it has lost, Box Hill Hawks have been unable to seize the moment in the quarters it's won and break open games.

### **CASEY SCORPIONS**



CASEY Scorpions sit fifth overall in the quarters won ladder, which equates to one position higher than where they sit on the win/loss ladder. What hasn't helped the Scorpions is that they have been slow starters - they are 6-8 in the opening guarter and have been outscored 37-47 goals. And, this can be traced back to their inability to score. Casey was held goal less in its round 9 match against Williamstown and eight times they have been held to two goals or less. Their best first quarter haul is their six goals against Frankston, but just three times have they kicked five goals or more in the first term. Once the Scorpions kick into gear they rank in the top four in quarters won in the second, third and last

stanzas. Casev is 8-6 in both the second and third terms and 9-5 in the last, where they really put the pedal to the metal to outscore rivals 60-41 goals. While they were held goal less by North Ballarat in round 3 and to one goal by Coburg Tigers in round 12, Casey kicked its season equal high eight goals against Frankston in the last quarter and seven times they've kicked five goals or more. Casey's scoring chart from the first through until the last quarter sees them rise from 37 goals to 55, dip to 50 then spike to 60 while its goals against remains static at 47 in the first and second quarters then drops to 40 and 41 in the third and fourth quarters.

### **COBURG TIGERS**



COBURG Tigers season woes are clearly reflected in the quarters won ladder. which places them above only Frankston. The VFL Tigers have a 22-33-1 season quarters record, with only the last quarter where they boast a break-even mark and even then, they've been outscored. Coburg Tigers' opening quarter has set the tone pretty much for the season - they've been forced into playing catch-up football. Coburg Tigers is 4-10 in the first quarter where they've been outscored 34-59 goals with its best scoring performance - seven goals in the season opener against Sandringham. Only twice have they kicked five goals or more in a first quarter while they've been held goal less

three times and restricted to two goals or less nine times. Its six goal second quarter haul against Collingwood in round 9 is its only production above five goals in the second term. Six times they've been held to two goals or less, but the third quarter is the club's lowest scoring output where their seven goal haul, also against Collingwood in round 9, is the only time they kick above four goals and they only managed four goals once! Ten times they've been kept to two goals or less. Coburg Tigers best quarter is definitely its last where they're 7-7, albeit outscored 53-57 goals. Its last term best haul is seven goals, again against Collingwood in round 9, but four times they've kicked five goals or more.

### **COLLINGWOOD**



FOR much of the season Collingwood has been right in games, but its inability to close games out has cost them dearly. It's apparent in the quarters won ladder. The VFL Magpies are in the 'eight' on the ladder for quarters won in the first and third terms, but there is no worst performed club in the final term than Collingwood. After owning a respectable 21-23-1 record through the first three quarters, Collingwood is 2-13 in the final quarter. In fact, Collingwood has not won a last quarter since its round 5 clash against North Ballarat where they stormed home over the reigning premiers. Sure, they've 'lost' a number of those last quarters by a couple of points, but they've still lost them. During that last

quarter fade out, Collingwood has been outscored 44-70 goals. In fact, Collingwood has been outscored in every quarter even though they boast a winning record in the first and third quarter. They're 8-7 in the first term and 8-6-1 in the third but its 5-10 and 2-13 marks in the second and fourth quarters have really hurt them. While its spread of goals doesn't vary much across the quarters - a low of 44 in the last term to a high of 50 in the second, it has only held the opposition to 50 goals or fewer once - in the first quarter. Its highest scoring quarter over the season is its seven goals kicked in the second quarter against Bendigo Bombers in round 4.

### **FRANKSTON**



IT'S no secret that Frankston has struggled mightily and this can be seen in a number of ways, most particularly in the quarters won ladder. The Dolphins have a 14-41-1 record - the worst in the competition and eight fewer quarters won than second-last placed Coburg Tigers. Clubs have pounced on the Dolphins from the get-go as evidenced by its 3-11 first quarter record where they have been outscored 29-60 goals. Frankston improves somewhat in the second term - 4-9-1 but fall away again in the third guarter with a 2-12 where it is outscored 26-57 goals, the same negative differential as

the first quarter. To its credit, Frankston has fought out all games and in the last term they're 5-9 with a 43-65 goal differential. Frankston has found it tough to kick goals at the best of times, but in the third quarter it has kicked multiple goals just six times with a best effort of six goals against Northern Bullants in round 7. Interestingly, against Geelong in the opening quarter of its round 14 match is the only time Frankston has been held goal less in a quarter, but they've managed to kick no more than one goal 18 times. Frankston's best haul is seven goals in the last quarter of the round 14 match against Geelong and they've kicked a season high five goals or more three times in the last term.

### **GEELONG**



GFFLONG doesn't feature highly on any of the respective quarter ladders. Its 10th overall in quarters won with a 25-34-1 mark: 10th in the first quarter: sixth in the second term; ninth in the third stanza and 12th in the last quarter. The VFL Cats don't own one quarter where they have a winning quarter. Its best term is the second quarter where they're 7-7-1, its worst is the last where it is 5-10 with only Collingwood below them. For such an unflattering record, Geelong hasn't been blow out of the water. It's actually outscored its opponents in

two quarters - the second where its kicked 55-52 goals and the third where its kicked 57-46 goals. Geelong's biggest discrepancy is the last quarter where they've been outscored 51-69 goals. All its offensive quarter highs across all quarters, except the second were obtained in its break-out round 18 match against Casey Scorpions. The Cats kicked its season high 10 goals in the first quarter, seven in the third and eight in the last. For the most part kicking goals or bundles of them in a quarter has been an issue. Twenty times Geelong has kicked two goals or less in a quarter. Conversely, it has held opponents goal less three times, but coughed up 20 guarters where opponents have kicked five goals or more.

### **NORTH BALLARAT**



IF you're looking to see where North Ballarat has gained its impetus for its determined bid to make it four flags in a row then look no further than the first guarter. The Rooster's set the trend for the match in the opening term where they're 12-3 (and two of those losses were in the first two games. which they lost) and have outscored opponents 66-35 goals. Once on top, North Ballarat have proved hard to run down. While they have been totally dominant in the opening guarter, the Rooster's own a losing record 22-23

after quarter time, but by that stage they're well and truly in command of the match. North Ballarat has kicked five goals or more seven times in the first term with its smallest return, two, two goal guarters. The Rooster's defence plays a significant part in its first quarter dominance - 10 times they've held opponents to two goals or less. During the second quarter, where they're 7-8 and are outscored 46-47, the Roosters have only two five goal plus hauls. While they're 8-7 in third quarters, North Ballarat have outscored its opponents 65-50. The last quarter is the club's lowest scoring quarter - four times they've kicked just the solitary goal, but they still outscore rivals 42-39. And, that again is thanks to its defensive pressure. Eight times they've kept opponents to two goals or less. Sometimes, numbers don't always tell the story as North Ballarat is the ninth ranked club in final quarters.

### NORTHERN BULLANTS



FOR its lofty ladder standing, Northern Bullants, surprisingly, own a losing record in quarters won – 27-29-4, which places them eighth overall in the quarters won ladder. And, it seems the longer the game progresses, the worst the Ants become. The Bullants best quarter is its first where it is 8-5-3, the fourth best ranking, and they outscore rivals 45-38 goals. It's not that they've

gone on a goal binge - just three times they've kicked five goals or more, but its defence has held rivals to two goals or less eight times. Surprisingly, they Bullants have been outscored 56-57 in the second quarter, but they still boast a winning record – 8-7 – but after half time. Northern Bullants take an 11-17-2 mark. Its third quarter is its worst -5-8-2, which ranks them 11th and yet it is the quarter where they've kicked its highest single quarter return - eight goals against Collingwood in round 10. And in the last term they're rated 10th overall. What makes that a little perplexing is that Northern Bullants outscore opponents 58-55 goals in the fourth quarter, but they've been held to two goals or less four times.

### PORT MELBOURNE



NO surprises that ladderleader Port Melbourne also sits atop the quarters won ladder, but what is interesting is that it take the Borough time to get into gear. Perhaps they're luring their rivals into a false sense of security. but Port Melbourne certainly doesn't bury opponents in the first quarter. In fact, Port Melbourne own a 6-7-1 mark in the opening term, which ranks them seventh overall. They boast a nine goal first quarter against Coburg Tigers in round 11 and five times they've kicked five goals or more, but significantly opposition clubs

have managed to put clamps on their scoring. Six times in the first quarter they've been kept to two goals or less. For all that. Port Melbourne still out score rivals 50-34 goals in the first quarter. It's a totally different story in the second guarter where Port Melbourne really monster opponents. Its 13-1 mark is clearly the trend setter and the most quarters won by any club during the season. A measure of Port's dominance is reflected in it outscoring rivals 74-33, again the biggest positive differential of any club this season. Port Melbourne breaks even in the third quarter, but reinforces itself in no uncertain manner in the final term, where its 12-2 mark is again the competition bench mark. It's also Port's highest scoring quarter - 10 times they've kicked five goals or more while restricting rivals to two goals or less seven times.

### **SANDRINGHAM**



SANDRINGHAM'S well documented slump can easily be traced to its poor starts to games. The Zebras' first quarter, where they're 4-10, is the second worst in the competition. Significantly, Sandringham has not won an opening term since round 10! And, during the first term, Sandringham have been outscored 35-50 goals. Only twice has it kicked five goals or more and its best first term production – 7 goals

was back in round 5 against Box Hill Hawks. Since round 10, Sandringham has not kicked more than two goals in the first quarter and they only managed two goals once. Sandringham is better in the second quarter, but only just. They're 6-8, but are again outscored 41-52 goals and have been shackled to two goals or less six times. So, when the first half is completed, Sandringham stands 10-18 and in the last seven games they've won just three of 12 quarters. The Zebras come to life in the second half, but too often the game has already been decided. Sandringham is 16-12 in the second half and its third and fourth quarter mark of 8-6 sees them ranked fifth in both third and fourth quarters. However, they do no better than break even with rivals in goals scored - 43-43 in the third term. and that includes a seasonbest 10-goal haul against Werribee in round 9. The last quarter is Sandringham's most productive for goals, but again they gain little ground as opponents match them 50-50 goals.

### WERRIBEE



WERRIBEE'S quarters won status marries up with its ladder position. The Tigers have won three quarters and own a 7-7-1 mark in the other. As Werribee's season has gathered momentum, it can be traced back to how they begin a match and also how they respond after half time. Werribee's best two quarters are its first, where it is 9-4-2. and the third, where it is 9-5-1. Such performances rank them third in first quarters and second in third quarters. Since the midway point of the season. Werribee is 5-1 in the first guarter and 5-1 in the third guarter. During the first guarter they outscore the opposition 53-45 goals and while they only have three five goal hauls in the first term they continually keep the scoreboard ticking. Only four times have they been kept to two goals or less. It should be noted that Werribee is one of the few clubs that hasn't been held goal less in a quarter. During the second quarter, where Werribee is 7-7-1, they've kicked four hauls of five goals or more and are held four times to two goals or less. Werribee's biggest goal differential is in the third where they outscore opponents 60-49 and that includes a season equal-high eight goals against Frankston. The Tigers again kicked 60 goals in the last quarter, but rivals kick 56. Again, this features two eight goal hauls among the four times it has kicked five goals or more. It's been held four times to two goals or less, but none since round 10.

### WILLIAMSTOWN



ONLY Port Melbourne has won more quarters than

Williamstown, which raises the pressure as games progress. While its first and second quarters, where they own an identical 8-7 mark, rank them fifth, it's after half time that the Seagulls really click into over drive. In the second half of games. Williamstown is a combined 21-8-3 and it is the top ranked club for third quarters. Williamstown owns an 11-3-1 record in the third term and they dominate as evidenced by its 66-38 goals scored statistic. While not as dominate in the last quarter, in terms of goal production, they still outscore rivals 66-49 goals. Since the midway mark, Williamstown has really stepped it up in all quarters. They're 5-2 in the first quarter: 5-2 in the second: 6-1 in the third and 5-2 in the last quarter. The Seagulls sit second behind Port Melbourne in last quarter performances. Williamstown's ability to keep applying scoreboard pressure rises quarter by quarter. In the third quarter they were held goal less by the Northern Bullants, but, significantly, it is the only time they didn't kick three goals or more in the guarter. It's a similar storyline in the last guarter. North Ballarat kept them to one goal, just one of two occasions where they didn't kick three goals or above. There's a couple of eight goal hauls, but more of a consistent goal kicking surge that has driven Williamstown to its lofty ladder position.



# Hawks edge closer to finals berth

BOX Hill Hawks moved one step closer to consolidating their place in the finals with a 12-point win over a fast finishing Coburg last Saturday, as Samantha Landy reports.

The Hawks sit in eighth spot on the ladder and are a game ahead of both Geelong and Sandringham with three rounds to play. With a tough run ahead of them with matches against the top two teams, Port Melbourne and Williamstown, it is crucial Box Hill make it two in a row against the Zebras this Sunday to keep their finals chances alive.

"If we can get over next week we'll start to look then at playing finals." Hawks coach Damian Carroll said post match.

Box Hill controlled the first three terms fairly comfortably. But Coburg gave the visitors a last quarter scare, cutting the margin to nine points after the Hawks led by 22 at the final break.

Had they kicked more accurately in the dying minutes of the match, the Tigers may have pulled off their second come-from-behind win in as many weeks, following their two-point victory over the Bullants the previous Saturday. The home side sprayed four gettable shots at goal in the final ten minutes, kicking two behinds, one out on the full and another straight to a Box Hill defender.

Both teams were inaccurate in front of goal, but imprecision hurt Coburg the most, a factor that did not escape Carroll.

"No doubt there were probably some set shots in the first quarter that they missed that probably at the end of the game cost them the game," he said.

The coach admitted he was "relieved" his players managed to hold on.

"Thankfully there wasn't another ten minutes in the game." Carroll said.

"Coming off the bye we had a real focus on winning this game, and obviously we got the four points. It probably wasn't convincing in the end, but certainly we're pleased with the result and again full credit to Coburg."

The visitors started the game strongly, booting five goals to one to amass a 24-point lead at quarter time. Coburg had four behinds on the scoreboard before Robert Hicks slotted their first major at the 23 minute mark.

Box Hill extended the margin to 33-points in the second term. The slippery surface of Mantello Holden Oval made clean disposal difficult, causing an array of turnovers from both sides. The Tigers continued their inaccuracy, but the Hawks also strugaled in front of the sticks. converting two goals and five behinds.

Coburg hit back in the third term, reducing Box Hill's lead to 22 points. Both teams increased their intensity in the aptly named premiership quarter, laying fierce tackles and implementing severe pressure.

The Tigers fulfilled coach Adam Potter's plea to "maintain their intensity" in the final term, pushing Box Hill right up to the final siren. Coburg forward Rowan Hore had the Tigers' faithful on the edge of their seats when he booted the first two goals of the quarter to bring

his side within nine points of their adversary. But the Hawks managed to hold on, coming away 12-point winners.

Carroll praised ruckman Sam Grimley for standing up after fellow big man Adam Pattison was forced off the ground through injury.

"Sam was terrific," he said. "It was a day where he had to stand up in his footy because we lost Pattison in the first 15 minutes and the Coburg ruck division is strong through [Andrew] Browne."

The coach also singled out Tom Schneider Cameron Bruce and Rvan Jackson for their work around the ground.

Best afield honours went to AFL listed player Ryan Schoenmakers for his work in defence

"We were really impressed with Schoenmaker's game as a key back [gathering] 18 possessions and then moving a little bit forward and through the wing area." Carroll said. "He stood tall when we needed another tall bloke down back, he was really strong and positive in the last couple of minutes there."

Jayden Post and Browne were amongst Coburg's best. They were supported by Ben Clifton, who booted one major. Michael Tanner and Hore, who kicked a match high three goals.

The Hawks victory was somewhat sullied by injuries to Pattison as well as forward Derek Wanganeen and Jarryd Morton. Carroll said post match they did not know the extent of the injuries, but early indications suggest "it's 50/50 for all of them" to play this week against Sandringham.

# Tigers in a close one

THE Werribee Tigers consolidated their top four spot with a hard fought 9-point win over Bendigo Bombers at Avalon Airport Oval last Saturday as Ben Carbonaro.

With Prime Minister Julia Gillard - who is also the Club Patron - watching on, the Tigers got off to a solid start with good ball movement around the ground. There was some cause for concern, as the home team scored three goals from nine shots, but disciplined work in the back half ensured Werribee led by 10 points at quarter time.



Werribee came out firing, playing a more attacking brand of football during the second quarter. Cleaner delivery of the ball by foot into the forward line gave the Tigers a handy 16-point lead at the main break, despite Bendigo gaining the early advantage in the term.

The third quarter was almost Werribee's undoing as they allowed Bendigo to kick four goals to one and gain the momentum. A number of costly errors and general inability to use the football allowed the Bombers to pounce and score some much needed goals. The stage was set for an enthralling quarter as the visitors led by 3 points.

An impassioned plea for improvement from Tigers coach Paul Satterley worked. as the home team returned to play some attacking and consistent football. Despite the Bombers hitting the front at the 15 minute mark of the final term via a 50 metre Matt Little major, three in a row to Werribee sealed the game including a two bounce, long run and goal to Majak Daw after gaining possession in the middle of Avalon Airport Oval. The six goal to four final quarter set up the win and consolidated a top four ladder position for the Tigers.

Satterley was pleased with the win, especially the fightback shown in the final quarter

"They were all over us in the third quarter, they probably could have been further in front and we didn't want the game to turn into junk time footy," he said.

"We had a bit of a resilience and persistence, really pleased to finish with a win against a team that smacked us earlier in the year."

Ben McKinlev kicked five goals in an improved personal performance for the Tigers and North Melbourne's Ben Ross (28 disposals, 2 goals) was best for his outstanding midfield performance. 

## **TAC Cup Finals Race**

LITTLE wonder it's viewed as one of the most exciting times of the season: anything can happen and probably will as the TAC Cup home and away season draws to its climax.

Here's the deal -three rounds remaining, 10 teams still in the hunt for a spot in the finals; four clubs vying for two final vacancies in the eight with the possibility that every position on the ladder could change before round 17 ends.

Unlike any other competition the matrix of the TAC Cup changes dramatically throughout the season as the AFL Under 18 Championships and the availability of those players who attend private schools draws players away from the competition.

But, come this final period what usually happens is that all those above-mentioned players return to their respective TAC Cup club.

And, that can produce a whole set of different results than the previous couple of months.

It's why no club can feel entirely comfortable as to their current position and how the landscape can be totally reshaped as the race for the 2011 TAC Cup premiership intensifies

Here is a break down, club by club, as to the various situations clubs find themselves and the equation that faces them as they jockey for the best possible ladder position.

**GIPPSLAND POWER** 



Record: 11-3
Position: First

Percentage: 145

Story so far: After an early season aberration where Sandringham thumped them by 94-points, Gippsland has given itself every chance to avenge last season's Grand Final defeat The Power has lost just twice since the Dragons took to them in round 2 and one of those was by five points against Geelong. Western inflicted a 34-point defeat, but it should be noted that match was during the AFL Under 18 championships and the Jets have been on a roll. Significantly, apart from its season opener one point win against Dandenong, the Power's next smallest winning margin is 17-points against North Ballarat. Five of its wins have been by 10 goals or more.

Who's ahead: Oakleigh Chargers (Oakleigh), Sandringham (Morwell), Calder (Highgate)

What's the equation: With definite pressure from Sandringham and Calder, Gippsland needs to win two of its remaining games to claim top spot, as long as

one of those wins is against Sandringham. Certainly, the round 16 match will go a long way to determine bragging rights for finishing on top of the ladder at the end of the home and away season. Gippsland has already locked away the double chance.

#### SANDRINGHAM DRAGONS



Record: 10-3-1
Position: Second
Percentage: 144

Story so far: Apart from a patch mid-season where they dropped three in a row – all by 42 points and above - Sandringham has been as impressive as any club. The Dragons opened on a six game winning trot, where it belted all its rivals its smallest winning margin was 31 points and four wins came at a margin of 50 plus points. When it emerged from the three game losing streak, Sandringham has gone on another winning spree. notching five wins as well as a draw against Northern.

Who's ahead: Dandenong (Shepley), Gippsland (Morwell), Western (Highgate)

#### What's the equation:

Sandringham is very much in the running for the honour of finishing on top of the ladder, but the Dragons face a tough run into the finals. No trip to Shepley is ever pleasant and the dormant Stingrays have sprung to life now it has all its Vic Country players back; ladder –leader Gippsland commands utmost respect and the Jets are flying. Coach Dale Tapping will gain a far greater insight as to where the Dragons sit in the race for

the flag after the next three games.

#### **CALDER CANNONS**



Record: 10-4
Position: Third
Percentage: 132

Story so far: Just when some were thinking the cyclical clock must surely have turned after Calder dropped two of its first four games, the Cannons have returned to the menacing form that has been their signature since 2000, Calder posted a five game winning roll before Bendigo upset them during the AFL Under 18 Championships then they lost by three points to Geelong. With all its Vic Metro and private school players now back in the fold, the Cannons again pose an ominous threat to win an extraordinary seventh premiership since

Who's ahead: North Ballarat (Horsham), Northern Knights (Highgate), Gippsland (Highgate)

What's the equation: For Calder to usurp Gippsland from top spot they first must defeat North Ballarat at Horsham then topple Northern Knights. The Cannons have beaten both clubs earlier in the season. If that scenario plays out then Calder would need to defuse the Power, ironically, in

the club's first meeting for the season. In Calder's favour is that the game is at Highgate Reserve.

#### **NORTH BALLARAT REBELS**



Record: 9-5
Position: Fourth
Percentage: 113

Story so far: No big peaks or troughs in North Ballarat's season - just a consistently solid season. The Rebels' biggest winning streak is two, but, significantly, they haven't lost two games in a row. Apart from an early season blip when Dandenong smashed them by 10 goals, North Ballarat has been in every other game they played. Importantly, they have fared well against all the finalist with the exception of Sandringham who inflicted a 39-point defeat. They defeated the Stingrays second time around, thumped Northern, boast two wins against Geelong and fell just three points shy of Calder.

Who's ahead: Calder (Horsham), Murray (Norm Minns Oval), Northern Knights (Visy Park)

What's the equation: North Ballarat will definitely play finals, but the key for the Rebels over the next three weeks is whether they can hold on to a top four spot and the double chance that comes with it. Big match coming up against Calder (where the MCC Herald Sun Shield take away at least 14 players from their line up) then they're on the road to finish off the season against Murray and Northern. Given its percentage buffer over Geelong and Western, North Ballarat can clinch fourth spot with two more wins.

#### **GEELONG FALCONS**



Record: 8-6
Position: Sixth
Percentage: 108

Story so far: Geelong appeared to be tracking well for a top four finish until they dropped the last two games against North Ballarat and Dandenong to slip to fifth. The Falcons certainly showed themselves to be a top four club with the way it disposed of Sandringham (40-points) and Gippsland (five points) mid-season.

Who's ahead: Eastern (Skilled Stadium), Western (Skilled), Oakleigh (Visy Park)

What's the equation: While the past two losses have made its task harder, Geelong can still climb back into the four. The draw favours it with two home games and then a match against Oakleigh on neutral territory to close out the season. If the Falcons win all

three games they'll move back into the top four.

#### **WESTERN JETS**



Record: 8-6
Position: Sixth
Percentage: 101

Story so far: Streaky season, but the Jets have landed on a roll at the right time winning their past five games to set up a return to the finals for the first time in a long time. Significantly, Western has defeated ladder leader Gippsland as well as other top eight clubs - North Ballarat Rebels and Dandenong. Certainly, the Jets defensive pressure has been a stand out during its latest winning streak as no club has kicked a 100-point scoreline or come within a couple of goals of doing that.

Who's ahead: Bendigo (Queen Elizabeth Oval), Geelong (Skilled), Sandringham (Highgate)

What's the equation: One more win will lock away a finals berth, but the Jets could climb even higher, possibly into the top four if they can extend its current winning spree. The final two games will be a good test as Geelong and Sandringham promise to be right in the middle of the fight for the flag.

Story so far: Dandenong has emerged from a mid-season rough patch, which coincided with all its stars - Lachie Whitfield, Todd Elton and Matthew Buntine - all away on Vic Country duty at the AFL Under 18 championships, to be the sleepers of the final series. Once the Championships concluded. the Stingrays haven't missed a beat posting effortless wins against Murray, Oakleigh and Geelong. As evidenced early in the season when they defeated Gippsland and North Ballarat, Dandenong definitely has the talent to make big inroads into the finals.

Who's ahead: Sandringham (Shepley), Eastern (Box Hill), Bendigo (Highgate)

What's the equation: While they hold a tenuous place in the eight, Dandenong is riding a momentum wave that can ensure it will play finals and prove a force. While the Stingrays have too much ground to make up to finish in the top four, it would not surprise many if they win all their remaining home and away games to finish closer to fifth than eighth.





NORTHERN KNIGHTS



Record: 6-7-1 Position: Eighth Percentage: 81

Story so far: It has been a season broken into bunches. but there have been more losses in those bunches than wins. After emerging victorious from three games, all decided by 19-points or less, the Knights struggled during the end of the AFL Under 18 Championships. a period that coincided in them playing North Ballarat, Geelong and Gippsland. What has been encouraging is that the Knights have rebounded strongly to draw against Sandringham then post a comfortable win against Bendigo to keep itself in the final's race.

Who's ahead: Murray (Highgate), Calder (Highgate), North Ballarat (Visy Park)

What's the equation: The draw against the Dragons has given Northern a little buffer over Oakleigh Chargers, its main challenger for a place in the eight. Northern needs to win one more game than the Chargers over the final three home and away games. If the Knights can defeat Murray this weekend and Oakleigh loses to Gippsland then Northern will be well placed to play finals.

Story so far: Oakleigh's season has fluctuated wildly. #### **EASTERN RANGES**



Record: 5-9 Position: Tenth Percentage: 78

Story so far: After flying the blocks to win four of its first six games, Eastern has been mired in a trough that has seen them lose seven of their last eight games and tumble down the ladder, out of the eight and nearly out of finals contention. It has left Eastern tenuously poised as the race heats up for the finals. In conjunction with club major sponsor McDonalds, Rebels TAC Cup players returned to local clubs throughout Western Victoria, including clubs such as Golden Point, Heywood, Warrnambool and Horsham.

Over 500 young footballers across Western Victoria benefited from this experience, helping these footballers aspire to be the best they can be but also encouraging them to lead a healthy and balanced lifestyle.

The majority of the Rebels returned back to their grass root football clubs that have been instrumental in their development as a promising junior player.

North Ballarat Rebels Region Manager Phil Partington believes the training sessions are not only a great experience for the local footballers, but also for the Rebels players.

"As we say to all players involved with the Rebels, we are more than just a Football Program. If we can help develop each player into a better person when they leave our doors we have achieved one good thing," Partington said.

"We do encourage all players within the Rebels Talented Player Pathway Program to give something back into the community and our McDonald's Junior Club Clinic Program does this."

The players' involvement with their local communities came to the fore earlier in the year after the floods.

"Already this year many of our players have volunteered their own time to help clean up communities effected by our recent floods, supporting the TAC, as well as collecting donations for seriously ill children and their families through McHappy Day.

"It certainly gives you satisfaction as a program

when the players want to put something back into their home communities and become role models amongst their peers," Partington said.

are operating at an elite level.
From this example, the Rebels
developed their own program
in their region.

"Through the Rebels major partnership with McDonald's stores across Western Victoria we thought the Rebels could do it at a lesser scale for young footballers across our Talent region," Partington said.

"The feedback we received back from the local clubs and their players last year was outstanding and our players this year were again looking forward to going back to their home junior clubs and help promote healthy, balanced lifestyles through the help from McDonald's and the Rebels."
