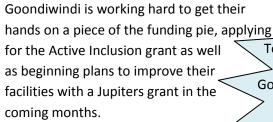

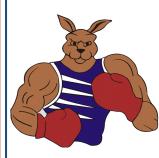

GRANTS UPDATE

Positive or It's Pointless Equipment Program:

Up to \$2 000 dependent on junior participation numbers. **Closes:** December 31, 2011 The easiest money your club can ever get its hands on. There is \$500 or \$1000 on offer to spend on equipment for your club, depending on the number of junior players at your club. You only have to complete a behaviour management plan (then action it) and one has been filled out and sent to your club.

Building Rural Communities Fund:

Up to \$15 000 for clubs outside of Toowoomba. Closes: November 23, 2011

Funding is available for any project which links the club in with the community, including planning for facility upgrades. These small scale events can be a great way to bring new people into your club.

Jupiters Casino Community Benefit Fund:

Up to \$150 000. Funded quarterly. Next round closes: November 30, 2011

A grant for numerous projects, including facility upgrades, training education or pilot projects.

Gambling Community Benefit Fund:

Up to \$35 000. Funded quarterly. Next round closes: November 30, 2011

A grant to help a club provide community services or activities that benefit the community; including participation events, facility upgrades or equipment purchases, amongst others.

Young Athlete Assistance Program:

Up to \$200. Always open. Must apply within 6 months of the competition occurring.

Provides financial assistance for kids who have attended a state or national championship, either as a player or an umpire. Children must live at least 200km from where the championships were held.

Preseason has kicked off for all juniors on the Darling Downs with over 140 kids from Under 12's through to Under 18's participating in the AFLQ run program. The program is tailored to the individual ages of the kids, with the young ones being introduced to training to improve, rather than just playing the game. The older kids however are being developed with the intention of getting as many kids selected in state representative squads in 2012.

Specialist coaches will take a session with the kids with personal trainers from **Zenon Fitness** already whipping the boys into shape and a session with a sprint coach to follow this week. The kids are also being introduced to correct training practice and learning how to manage their bodies. Crucially, the kids are developing social links with many players in the other clubs which will help integrate them into the AFL community on the Downs.

The AFL Quality Club Program has been developed and designed for clubs to evaluate their club and strive for accreditation.

The Quality Club Program has three different levels of accreditation: Bronze, Silver and Gold.

Receiving this accreditation will allow your club to access logos and a certificate of acknowledgement. These will be particularly beneficial when applying for grants as well as promoting your club to new members. Furthermore, AFL Darling Downs is the only region in the state to recognise the award with a commemorative plaque.

Bronze level assessment is the first step and only requires you to fill out an online assessment form which will take no longer than half an hour. To begin your assessment, just head <u>here</u>.
