David Nolan came to the Penrith Club in 1990 when he was transferred to Sydney as part of his employment. He was already an experienced footballer when he arrived at the Rams. He played junior football with the Finley Club from 1975-81, being part of two premiership sides and winning the Under 17's Best First Year Player award in 1980. Transferring to the Blighty Football Club in 1982 he immediately made an impression, winning the Under 17's Best and Fairest and Leading Goalkicker awards in his first season. Dave made the step to First Grade in 1983, taking out the Best First Year Player trophy, and continued in the top grade in 1984. After taking a break from the game, Dave played two seasons with Temora in 1987-88, winning one flag and making the grand final in the other year.

Dave has proved to be an invaluable player and clubman in his time with the Rams. Playing a lot of his football across the centreline, he was equally skilled on both sides of his body but was not known for his pace! In only his second year with the club he participated in Penrith's second First Grade premiership, when Hawkesbury were demolished at Whalan Reserve. The same year he took out the First Grade Endeavour award. Two years later the First Grade Most Consistent award was added to his list of achievements, as was the Best and Fairest runner-up trophy.

In 1995 Dave took over the Treasurer's position, at a time when the club was all but broke. Under his "treasurership", this position was turned around to the current healthy financial situation. As well as his financial expertise he contributed positively to the committee at all times, and was always ready to help out when and if needed. This included unglamorous

tasks such as sweeping out the changerooms after the games, etc. (The editor especially appreciates Dave's willingness to undertake tasks which no-one else would normally volunteer to do). Still playing while contributing at the committee level, Dave played his 100th game for the Rams in 1997 against Manly-Warringah at Weldon Oval, and at the end of that season made the decision to retire as a player. (This was partially due to the fact that he could no longer make the trip at training from the changerooms to the oval without getting injured). He filled the Treasurer's position again in 1998, when he had really decided to give this position away also. It is a measure of his commitment to the club that he would do this.

David Nolan is the kind of person you want around the club. Someone who will contribute without complaining. The Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated is proud to bestow upon David its highest honour, life membership.







Penrith Australian Football Club Inc. – Reserve Grade Coach's Report

After agreeing to fill the position of Reserve Grade coach I was uncertain of what to expect. Our start to the season was not too bad (very competitive against Wollongong and beating Hawkesbury), but after that we went downhill (and fast !). To say I was disappointed after the end of the first round would be an understatement. Winning just one game and losing against Holroyd-Blacktown and Cronulla-Sutherland by narrow margins was extremely disappointing.

After the loss to Cronulla I was particularly frustrated and I told the players so afterwards. I don't know why I was so disappointed when our results seemed to indicate that we were just not good enough to win games. I didn't believe this and neither did the players. We really needed to look at ourselves, our goals and the effort we were putting in to achieving these goals. I asked every player to document what they thought were the reasons we were losing games. I think this had the effect of everyone assessing their own efforts.

I then set our goal for the rest of the season - to improve on each first round result against the respective opponents. Our first game of the second round against Sydney University saw a great effort in which we were still in the game going into the last quarter. I think this gave our confidence a huge boost. The following week we cut loose against a slightly overconfident Wollongong team and never looked like losing. The amount of self belief we received in this game provided the impetus for the rest of the season. Winning the following week by a point against Macquarie University who were fourth on the ladder at the time (and finished third overall) was by far the most satisfying victory of all. The following week we beat Hawkesbury (who I thought we underestimated) to win three games in a row.

Our efforts for the rest of the year were fantastic - we did improve on our first round meetings and revenged ourselves against Blacktown and Cronulla. Winning five of our last seven games was more than any of us could have thought possible. All in all it was the most enjoyable end to a season that I have had in quite a while.

I would like to thank all the players for their efforts during the year. As I said at our recent presentation night, I would like to reward all players for their efforts particularly in the second half of the season but this is not possible. Importantly, I want to congratulate all the award winners. But overall I think the greatest reward is the satisfaction we received from our own efforts.

I would also like to thank Allan Tinker, who conducted training and shouldered most of the responsibility this season, as well as Under 18's coach Peter O'Neil. Also the efforts of Rob Ryman (Team Manager), Wendy Dembowski, Joe Bradley and the general committee (particularly Mark Spooner and Garry Ayres) were invaluable. 

Treasurer's Report

The 1998 year has been one of mixed fortunes. We managed to increase our income substantially, thanks largely to increased sponsorship from Emu Plains Sporting and Recreation Club and the hours of work put into running the canteen for the SFA finals series (which alone contributed \$3,316.85 to club funds). Without the latter source of income the club would have operated at a loss for 1998 and next year we will not have this luxury. Unfortunately fund raising , raffles, etc were limited this season due to various circumstances.

We have also managed to increase our expenditure however, and as a result our end of year surplus is less than last year. Obviously operating an Under 18 team has resulted in increases in costs such as umpires, trophies, etc. Merchandise and club membership costs included in player registration fees have increased substantially as a result of the club's policy to provide a club shirt and membership to Emu Plains Sporting Club to all financial players. Ground rental also increased substantially due to our decision to pay the full amount (including the Junior Club's share). Improvements to the ground surface, such as top dressing early in the year, also contributed to increased costs.

Auditor's Report

Scope

We have audited the attached special purpose financial report, comprising the Trading Statement and Accumulated Surplus of Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated for the period 18 October, 1997 to 16 October, 1998.

The Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated's Committee of Management is responsible for the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies used are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Penrith Australian Football Club's constitution and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used are appropriate to the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee of Management's financial reporting requirements under the Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated's constitution. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared. Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our procedures included examination of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the cash basis of accounting whereby revenue is recorded when it is received, expenses are recorded when they are paid, and no assets or liabilities, other than cash or bank balances, are recorded. Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements (UIG Consensus Views) are not applicable to the cash basis of accounting adopted by the Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualification

As is common for organizations of this type, it is not practicable for Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated to maintain an effective system of internal control over subscriptions and other fund raising activities until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to fund raising was limited to amounts recorded.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the limitation discussed in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly in accordance with the cash basis of accounting, as described above, the payments and receipts of Penrith Australian Football Club Incorporated for the period ended 16 October, 1998 and its accumulated surplus balance as at that date.
