BALGOWNIE RANGERS come into this game clear leaders on top of the PeopleCare District League, but not without an early season scare.

A poor start to the season with only a sluggish 1-0 win over Highlands Utd in the opening round, and then losing at home to Bellambi 2-1 and again on the road at Coniston Lions 3-2, Rangers did not have the best of starts but have managed to pick themselves up and not look back and have since charged up the table to take top spot. In fact, all three grades now top their respective leagues.

Always a dangerous opponent, last season's champions, and chasing its fourth consecutive title, Balgownie are now on a roll with recent wins at home to University 1-0, and at Shellharbour City Falcons 2-0.

Last week against Shell Cove FC however, Rangers were surprisingly beaten 2-1, which means their lead at the top of the league was cut to just three points.

The last time the two teams met in The Quarry was back on July 31st last year when Balgownie were already 7 points clear of second place Kiama on the ladder. The game seemed set for a 0-0 draw until in the 83rd minute a fantastic Josh Faulks strike from 12m made it 1-0 and this was quickly followed on the next attack by a Rick Metcalf effort from 18m in the 87th minute to seal all three points.

## BACK TO SCHOOL FOR A-LEAGUE

IT'S watching TV programs like the recent SBS Football Forums on Monday night's that makes one just realise how far from the finished product we actually are.

It became aparent after the first show that from WA and South Australia, to Queensland, Victoria and NSW, there are no paths set in place for aspiring youth or state league players to forge their way into the A-League, other than direct approach by A-League clubs.

Scouts are totally indebted to coaching staff of state league clubs, but then comes the old adage... "it's not what you know, but who you know that counts."

We all talk about "grassroots" football, and indeed we are in the process of changing the mental approach of all our coaching staff, by way of coaching the coaches of our children, but there still seems to be a huge void between the elite and the rest.

Schools are not used often enough to promote football. Many times we often see AFL and NRL teams enter Kiama Public School, but I can only count on one hand in the last five years just two players turning up to represent Sydney FC in Kiama.

If we are to be taken seriously as a grassroot environment and feeder system, then it has to be back to school for many of these elite A-League clubs.

## District Leagues Matchday Wrap



### SOLID WIN AGAINST THIRROUL

KIAMA Quarriers got back to winning ways with a solid 5-2 win against Thirroul in its last home game in The Quarry (June 11).

Coming into the game on the back of two surprise defeats at the hands of lowly Highlands Utd 2-1 and then last week at Kemblawarra also 2-1, The Quarriers needed a win to get its season back on track to consolidate a top four berth.

Six of the goals were scored in the first half and as early as the 3rd minute Kiama hit the front from a well placed Paul Gaffney direct free kick from 18m.

Kiama's second followed 10 minutes later in almost identical fashion with another Gaffney direct free kick, this time more central and from 25m out, the maestro smashed home a great strike to make it 2-0.

Thirroul, fourth placed in the PeopleCare District League, did look dangerous on its quick counter attacks and on one such forward move caught the Kiama defence too far forward and Thirroul made it 2-1 on 24th minute mark.

But Kiama responded with some fine passing play; starting from the back through Gaffney, who played in midfielders Gary Vian and Keiran

Duncan, before releasing Brendan Apperley out wide to cross for Mitch Farquhar who ghosted in on the far post to slam home from close range to make 3-1.

The fourth Kiama goal was once again a well worked effort involving Duncan who found Gareth Willis in plenty of room to head home a marvellous effort from 12m.

Only half an hour of the game had gone when Kiama made it 5-1, after a corner from Duncan swung inward on the Thirroul goal which the keeper failed to hold onto and it found its way into the net through a crowded area.

Kiama have a good blend of youth and experience with Daniel Gillespie, Farquhar and Apperley learning along side the likes of Gaffney, Duncan, Willis, Vian and Lockard, which can be a formidable combination on its day.

In the second half, Kiama camped in Thirroul's half for most part of the stanza, but could not add to its five goal tally. Thirroul, from another quick counter-attack, and with Kiama's appeals for offside going unheeded, made it 5-2 with Kiama keeper, Michael Broadwood, totally exposed at the back.

Striker, Corey Ryan, left the field with a niggling ankle injury with 15 minutes remaining to be replaced by new signing Mat Parker, who made a pleasing debut.

Thirroul didn't help its cause when a defender was given a straight red card with an elbow to the face of newcomer Parker, but the contest at this stage was all but over.

With the introduction of Mat Parker, who showed some deft touches on the ball and the recent signing of stalwart defender, Brett Fleming, coach Manny Mavaridis has managed to strengthen his squad for the final run home to secure a finals berth.

EARLIER in the day, Kiama youth left it as late as the 86th minute to score the winning goal of the game through a well taken Dean Land effort in a close fought contest.

Jack Lowrie was once again a tower of strength in Kiama's defence, while Jay Reid, Josh Gibson, Phil Bitterlin and Land, all gave solid performances in a great team win, which consolidates the youth's top four position.

IN the Reserves, Chris Christodoulou opened the score with a great cross-cum-shot from out wide to give Kiama a fabulous start after only 13 minutes.

But the lead was short-lived, as Thirroul which always looked dangerous on the break, leveled

8 minutes later.

Steve Parkes was keeping the visitors defence on its toes with some darting runs down the left, while Trent Cruikshank and John Dover battled hard in midfield to contain a fluent Thirroul side which ended the half slightly on top in an entertaining game.

In the second half, Kiama lost Barry Jones early from a bad tackle which left the midfielder with a badly swollen ankle.

Kiama had its fair share of chances and were dominant for most of the half, but Thirroul started to get more into the game as the half wore on.

Kiama then lost central defender Todd Schofield with a niggling strain, which left coach Larry Beringer no other option but to change the formation.

The Quarriers always looked dangerous and looked more likely to score, with strikers Colin Studman and Jamie Kadwell looking sharp up front with Christodoulou supporting well, but they could not breakdown a stubborn defence.

Thirroul then scored against the run of play with 10 minutes remaining, but The Quarriers with its reshuffled line-up could not get back on terms.

Against Wests last week, all three grades were washed out, with the Unanderra ground not being the best in the comp all season, which means The Quarriers will back up tomorrow (Sunday) in its catch up games.
