Kiama won a memorable 5-4 win in the Highlands, after being 2 goals down and playing with 10 men in the last 15 mins, followed by a glorious 4-4 thriller in the Quarry, when Kiama scored the equaliser with just 8 mins remaining.



## **District Leagues Matchday Wrap**

# ANOTHER SOLID QUARRIERS WIN

KIAMA Quarriers overcame a stubborn Coniston Lions to eventually run out comfortable 4-1 winners in its District League encounter in The Quarry on its last home performance.

It was the first of the "cross-over" rounds and Coniston went into this game on the back of five straight wins and sitting on top of the PeopleCare division. Kiama meanwhile, were second in the ICU division behind runaway leaders Warilla.

It was the visitors which took the lead as early as the 3rd minute with a well headed goal from 5m out with the defence left flat-footed. But Kiama were plaving some attractive football with sweeper Paul Gaffney spraying passes around to midfielder's, Andy Lockard, Gareth Willis, Gary Vian and Kieron Duncan who were dominating proceedings.

It came as no surprise then when striker. Corey Rvan, muscled his way through the defence to equalise on the 18th minute mark with a well taken goal. Moments later, Ryan could have doubled his score when, with his back to goal, turned with a rasping half-volley from 18m, but the keeper was equal to the task with a brilliant acrobatic save.

In the second half. Kiama continued to dominate

large parts of play, but Coniston missed a glorious chance to go in front, only for the striker to hit the post on his own from 3m out with only Michael Broadwood to beat in Kiama goal.

In the 72nd minute, Kiama hit the front from the penalty spot after a deliberate hand ball halted a goalbound shot. Keiron Duncan calmly placed the ball into the net wide of the keeper to make it 2-1.

The goal of the game followed in the 80th minute, when Gaffney ran through the heart of Coniston's midfield from his sweepers position, brought in Duncan out wide on the right who crossed for a simple Willis header on the far post to make it 3-1.

Kiama's back four of Daniel Gillespie, Matt Gallagher, Gaffney and Dean Land, were solid as Coniston probed and prodded in a final assault on Kiama's goal.

But it was substitute, Josh Gibson, who had been on the field less than 3 minutes to put matters beyond doubt beating the keeper on his near post after some fine work on the right from man of the match Duncan in 88th minute.

EARLIER in the day, the Reserve Grade ran out easy 5-0 winners over Coniston with goals from Colin Studman (2), John Dover, Jamie Kadwell and Steve Larsen, with a splendid strike from the outside of his right boot to confirm all three points in the 87th minute.

The Reserves were dominant throughout, with some fine individual skills united in a team effort.

Midfield dynamo, Trent Cruickshank, ably supported by ball winner John Dover and the tenacious Steve Parkes, were always in charge of the centre of midfield.

Not even when defensive stalwart, Todd Schofield was taken off after 25 mins with an over stretched hammy, did the team alter its course, with utility player Barry Jones stepping up to the plate to control the defence admirably.

Jamie Kadwell and James McCeland were outstanding, while Kadwell scored a brilliant goal in between Col Studman's brace to put the game beyond Coniston's reach.

Studman in particular, up front, harrassed the visitors backline all day and was unlucky not to come away from the game with a hat trick, while Sean Poulton out wide tested the defence often.

The back four of Pete Tidswell, Jeremy Bull, David Larsen and Jones, didn't give Coniston much room and goalkeeper, Thomas Hassler, had very little to do in Kiama goal due to the solidarity of the back four.

But man of the match, Steve Parkes had a workmanlike performance while Trent Cruickshank, John Dover and Colin Studman all stood out, in what was overall a solid Kiama team performance.

New coach, Larry Beringer, has structured the team well since taking over the reins and the players now seem to play with a purpose and on this performance, should find themselves in the top four of the ladder at season's end.

Two early goals within the first 15mins were enough to seal the fate of Kiama's youth grade. However, a spirited second half come back with a goal from Mitch Farguhar gave The young Quarriers a glimmer of hope. But it wasn't guite enough to gain the points in its 2-1 loss.

ON the road, The Quarriers had goalkeeper, Michael Broadwood sent off as early as the 18th minute at Corrimal Rangers.

Even with only 10 players, Kiama were cruising, but a late goal by the home side levelled the scores at 2-2 for an undeserved draw.

The result means the Quarriers drop to third on the ladder, with Helensburgh winning at Consiton 3-1. The reserves continued its winning ways with another resounding 5-0 victory, while the youth grade again lost by the odd goal, 2-1 and now drops to sixth on the ladder.
