

QUARRIERS DEMORALISE LOCAL OPPOSITION

NOBODY in The Quarry last Saturday afternoon could have predicted the second half onslaught after witnessing a first half which seemed equal, but even for unbiased onlookers. The Quarriers always seemed in charge.

Val Tasevski had by far his best game for The Quarriers this season, playing a totally unselfish role. The diminutive striker managed to set up four goals for Kiama in a starring role.

The Cove could not contain the direct approach of Tasevski, causing heaps of problems in its defence throughout the game, creating space for Blake Coates, Andy Lockard and Rodney Kis, who all enjoyed his composed play.

The first 20 minutes were cancelled out by each side, but the deadlock was broken when a Tasevski pass on the half hour mark was well taken by Andy Lockard to open the score from 10m out after a well worked Kiama move.

And it was Tasevski who once again, moments later, cracked open the Cove defence with some sublime play to put Lockard through again for the midfielder to net his second on the 33rd minute with Chris Hudson

mark to give Kiama a 2-0 lead.

With Kiama pushed forward and keeper, Glen Fisher caught off guard. Cove's striker. Billy Sterjovksi, scored an opportunists goal from 35m out, with the Kiama keeper well beaten from distance.

At 2-1, but with much of the play going in Kiama's favour at the interval, it was "game on," when the hosts came out firing for the second period

With some delightful skill from midfield powerhouse Gary Vian, Kiama went further ahead within minutes of the restart in a six minute spell that broke Shell Cove's determination.

As in previous weeks, coach, Manny Mavridis, brought on Chris Christoudolou off the bench, and the young striker dutifully obliged his faith in his coach with two goals in a half hour spell, either side of a Blake Coates strike, to put the game out of reach of Shell Cove.

Christoudolou managed twice to beat the poor marking and stagnant back line of Shell Cove. with some remarkable finishing after breaking clear, but it was largely thanks to Vian's creativity that opened up Cove's defence.

and with Tasevski always a pain to Shell Cove's markers, Kiama's goal tally always looked as though it was going to be increased.

And it did after 68 minutes when Shane Williams latched on to a near post ball from Tasevski to make it 6-1.

It was about this point in time that the game took on an unsavory taste when Billy Sterjovski was shown his marching orders for his second yellow for his constant abuse of an official.

10 man Shell Cove looked shell shocked and could not cope with Kiama's constant threats from the wing play of Daniel Gillespie and overlapping full back, Ben Hardcastle, who was playing some intelligent balls into midfielder's paths while also feeding the strikers.

With Vian, Lockard, Williams and Kis more than coping in midfield, and with Brett Fleming and Bren Apperley soaking up the pressure at the back with ease, it was no wonder that Coates finished off the score as Kiama ended the game totally in charge in this 7-1 route of a demoralised Shell Cove.

Last week's win sets up today's game in The Quarry against ladder leaders Balgownie Rangers as a "must win" situation for The Quarriers.

Balgownie despatched Helensburgh last Saturday 2-0.

Four points separate the two sides at the top, so it is in the hands of both these sides today as to which team will continue on its dream run into the Premier League. With a Goal Difference of only four, it will be interesting to see how Balgownie defend against a rampant Kiama on last week's showing.

THE youth grade continued on its way to the title with a handsome 3-1 win over Shell Cove last week.

Midfield dynamo, Jack Lowrie, scored for the second week in succession and had another fabulous game.

Dean Land and Joel Taddeo also got on the scoresheet while the defence, without Jordan Inwood, coped well in his absence.

Barry Jones, the only over-aged player in the team, plotted Shell Cove's downfall, while it was another pleasing display from Jordan Lloyd and Mitch Farquhar, giving the young Quarriers its width it needed to stretch the Cove defence down the flanks.

The young Quarriers could make strong claims for the title, if it can beat second placed Balgownie today.

A win for Kiama today would see it go seven points clear at the top, however, a win to Balgownie would keep them in touch, while third place Shellharbour take on fourth placed University in another game which could also have a bearing on the title outcome.


