## From Murrays Desk

It's been a hectic but exciting few weeks in my role as Interim CEO. The key projects I'm working on at BBNZ are assisting the Board in managing the process for the appointment of someone to the permanent CEO role, working with **Sport New Zealand** to finalise the details of two investments they are making in Basketball totalling almost \$1.5m, preparing for the AGM (please see other details in this newsletter) and working with a great team of people to get our international teams overseas, informing and assisting in the All of Basketball Pathway Plan that **Chris Simpson** is working on our behalf and building on our relationships at an international level with FIBA Oceania and FIBA.

The **All of Basketball Pathway Plan** is an enormous piece of work and will be used to inform the strategy that was signed off at last year's AGM. Community basketball, coach, administrator and player pathways, leagues and competitions and key commercial opportunities all form part of Chris project. We are keeping Sport NZ well informed of progress, and although time frames are tight, we will have a full briefing on the Pathway Plan at the AGM.

There have been 41 applicants present their credentials for the permanent CEO role. The level of interest and more importantly the calibre of the candidates who are interested in working for the game has been extremely encouraging. Short listing candidates for interviews (to be held 26 April) is well underway and we hope to be able to confirm and announce the successful candidate shortly after that.

Sport New Zealand are showing confidence in basketball as a sport by increasing their investment in our game over the next three years. The opportunity to be a part of this exciting phase for the game is fantastic and the ability for basketball to plan for its future over an extended timeframe and put in pace some strong programmes at a community level coupled with an increased focus on coach development will further allow the game to grow and develop.

Obviously, being an Olympic year, there is a lot of work being done in getting our men's and women's teams to the upcoming qualifying tournaments. The coaching staff are doing a great job in preparing the teams and **Peter Kadar** who has replaced Warrick as the Senior Teams Co-Ordinator is incredibly busy also preparing for what we all hope will be an Olympic campaign after the qualifiers.

**Maree Taylor** and **Shawn lwikau** are well into the swing of getting tournaments organised for the season and there's plenty of information in the newsletter for associations and rep coaches/managers. Your on-going support of and involvement in these tournaments is highly valued by BBNZ – thank you.

**Saileen Raj** has been working tirelessly getting funding and grant applications in front of the many organisations that support BBNZ, helping me out with forecasts and minding the money, and working with the Board Audit and risk Committee finalising our annual audit and ensuring we're being prudent and sensible with our finances.

With Warricks departure, Peter has taken over his role and **Melinda Hodgson** is going to begin working on the Junior Teams portfolio as well as being a great help to me and the Board. We'll be advertising for a replacement for Melinda shortly. Please check out the new vacant positions section on the website for that and other roles.

We also welcome Melony Wealleans to the team as our Referees Coordinator. Melony will start in her new role on 16 April.

In the meantime I wish you all the best as we head into another exciting season and with the Breakers going so well, Olympic qualifiers and growth in team registrations in some parts of the country it look like it could be basketballs best ever year.

## News Around the Country and Abroad



New Zealand's **Rob Loe** (Pictured left) and his Saint Louis Billikens have been knocked out of the NCAA tournament in the third round by number one seeds Michigan State.

Loe had five points (2/6 FG, 1/5 3pt), four rebounds and an assist as the No 9 Billikens pushed the top seeds until the end, eventually going down 65-61.

Loe, starting in the power forward spot, scored all five of his points in the first half as the Billikens trailed 26-21 at the half.

The Billikens won their first NCAA tournament game since 1998 by beating eighth-seeded Memphis 61-54 in the West region second round.

Former Junior Tall Black **Ritchie Edwards** had 16 points in Valparaiso's NIT first round loss to Miami. Edwards had a good season with Valparaiso averaging nearly ten points per game in his junior season, with the team finishing the season with 22 wins and 12 losses.

**Kirk Penney** and his Spanish team Fuenlabrada have been knocked out in the quarter finals of the EuroChallenge Cup by Russian club Triumph Lyubertsy losing game three of the series 80-65. Penney had 5 points (2/9 FG, 1/6 3pt) in the loss.



## Inaugural World Tour Launches first Full Season of 3x3 basketball



GENEVA, Switzerland (3x3 Basketball) – FIBA has officially announced the first ever FIBA 3x3 World Tour to be held in some of the world's most iconic cities.

The 2012 calendar of 3x3 basketball events also includes senior and U18 World Cups for men and women.

FIBA Secretary General and IOC Member Patrick Baumann shared his enthusiasm: " The first edition of the FIBA 3x3 World Tour and the first-ever FIBA 3x3 World Cup are two key landmarks in the development of the game, which we see as a future Olympic discipline. 2012 is going to be remembered as the year when 3x3 basketball was launched."

The **FIBA 3x3 World Tour** will see men's teams from around the world qualify for five Masters tournaments, each comprising of 16 teams and held in some of the world's most cosmopolitan cities.

#### FIBA 3x3 World Tour Masters:

Sao Paolo, Brazil: 7-8 July Vladivostok, Russia: 21-22 July New York, USA: 18-19 August Istanbul, Turkey: 1-2 September Madrid, Spain: 8-9 September

The 16 best teams from the Masters qualify for the **FIBA 3x3 World Tour Final**, which will be held in Miami, USA, on 22-23 September.

Any team of four players is eligible to participate in the Masters tournaments by earning a place through a worldwide network of qualifying tournaments. For further information about the FIBA 3x3 World Tour, contact <u>3x3@fiba.com</u>.

The inaugural **FIBA 3x3 World Cup**, for Men and Women respectively, will take place in Athens, Greece, on 23-26 August.

The second **FIBA 3x3 U18 World Cup** will take place in Seville, Spain, on 27-30 September. Boys and girls born after 1 January 1994 will be eligible to compete for their respective National Teams. The inaugural FIBA 3x3 U18 World Cup was played in Rimini, Italy in 2011.

#### 3x3 basketball

Exciting, urban and innovative, 3x3 basketball is inspired by several forms of streetball played worldwide. Endorsed by FIBA, games see two teams of three players face off on a standard halfcourt. It was played successfully for the first time in international competition at the 2010 Youth Olympic Games (YOG) in Singapore.
