

East Malvern's youth girls continued their fine start to the 2012 season last Saturday with a second win, this time a hard-fought 13-point victory over St Damian's at Stanley Grose Oval.

The Knights had to work a lot harder for a win than the opening-round romp over Warrandyte, but there was still a common denominator, namely a flying start, the girls building a 19-point break by quarter-time, and hanging on grimly to the lead for the rest of the game.

Once again, team defence was as big a highlight as the girls' scoring capacity, some great tackles laid early by Charlotte, Sarah and Dani, and some smart kicking along the boundary from Elyce, Ally, Alana and Tori.

The opening goal came from Harper after a nice long kick to the goal square by Mia, followed soon after by another goal by Alana. Holly showed great touch with a nice pick-up and pass to Tilly, Toni and Dani also combining well.

Kaytie tapped cleverly into space, and Amber put the seal on a dominant opening term with two goals to give East Malvern a 4.2 to 1.1 lead at the first change.

The second quarter saw St Damian's really lift their game, taking it right up to East Malvern with their first three goals of the game, but the Knights were equal to the challenge.

The Knights added three goals of their own, the first from a long kick by Alana, the next from Amber after a fine passage involving Kate, Tilly and Alana in the lead-up, the third from Mia.

With East Malvern still 21 points to the good at half-time, St Damians loaded up their defence, making scoring more difficult. The Knights, however, still managed to add 2.3 for the quarter to the visitors' wasteful 1.5.

Elyce and Mimi led the way with some great tackling, Mia took a fine mark and Holly's handling under pressure was impressive. The girls were determined not to let the hard-won advantage slip, and further goals to Tilly and Mia kept East Malvern a few goals to the good.

The last quarter was a dour affair, with St Damian's continuing to creep closer, and the Knights failing to score a goal. But the defensive side of the game is becoming a trademark for the team, and was typified in the final term by more fierce tackling, smothering, and a terrific mark by Sarah in the defensive goal square.

St Damian's had come within 13 points at the finish, but the Knights once again emerged with the win, and go into the third game of the season next week still undefeated.


