DD GIRLS PERFORM WELL IN ADELAIDE

After three months of travelling and training in Brisbane at AFL Queensland centre of excellence, DD girls Isabella Baldock, Marnie McGorm and Jade Loch have performed well and matched it with the Nations best at the 2012 Under18 Youth Girls National Championships in Adelaide. All three were originally identified through school AFL for St Ursula's College, as they progressed through the female talent pathway to reach the top of female AFL. Queensland finished 2nd at the championships, going down to powerhouse state Victoria in the Grand-Final at AAMI Stadium. This is the best result for any Youth Girls/Women's Queensland side and is a major step forward in Female footy for Queensland.

Summary of each player from the championships;

Isabelle Baldock - Played as the attacking half back flanker throughout the championships, was named in the best against Western Australia and South Australia in the round robin games. Was named in Queensland's best in the Grand-Final against Victoria at AAMI Stadium. Baldock was unlucky not to be named in the best against New South Wales, but Queensland's 89point win and dominance, meant Isabelle didn't see a lot of footy down back.

Marnie McGorm - McGorm's second selection in the maroon and white, after representing her state in 2011. McGorm played predominately as a wing throughout the campaign, was moved to the halfback/rover. Marnie was named in Queensland's best against Western Australia, New South Wales and South Australia. Marnie was unlucky to miss out on All-Australian selection. Jade Loch - In her first year of AFL football, these championships were all about learning the key fundamentals of our great game. Loch was played as a defensive forward, as Jade finished with QLD's most pressure acts throughout the round robin stages and used as a small crumbing forward. Jade was able to chip in with a few handy goals. With two more years being available for selection, Jade will develop into an elite youth girl's footballer.

Invitations will be out shortly for the 2012 Under17 Southern Stars team which combines girls from the Darling Downs, Gold Coast and Northern Rivers. Under 14 South Country Championships 2012 - Results



The 2012 U14 South Country Championships took place last weekend at Highfields AFC with all teams winning 1 of their 2 games played in the round robin format.

The opening game was between hosts the Darling Downs and traditional rivals Wide Bay. The Downs jumped out of the box well leading at every break and by 3 quarter time had opened up a handy 19 point lead. But the Wide Bay found their rhythm in the last term kicking the opening 3 goals to level scores with 1 minute remaining on the clock. A late snap to Darling Downs small forward Kale Ross sealed the win for the demons in the opening game 8.3.51 to 7.3.45 The second game had the Downs boys backing up against a fresh and eager Northern Rivers outfit. The first quarter was a real shootout with the Rivers booting 3 goals straight to the Downs 2 but the local boys couldn't keep up with the run of the Northern Rivers who kicked away in the second term with 3 goals to nil opening up a 16 point lead at the half. While the DD boys tried harder than a Papa Giuseppe frozen pizza in the second half they couldn't reel in the fresh River. Final score Northern Rivers 8.3.51 Darling Downs 4.5.29.

The final round robin game matched the Rivers against a rested Wide Bay and while many had the Rivers as clear favourites for the is game the Bay responded in stunning fashion by dominating the second half and running out 32 point winners 8.10.58 to 4.2.26 and in doing so opened up a percentage winning score to take the championships back to the Wide Bay for the second consecutive year.

Day 2 of the championships matched players against each other with all 3 teams being split in accordance of skill level. The opening game had Darling Downs representatives teaming up with the Dalby FC in a mixed game against the Northern Rivers / Wide Bay. While this game was a curtain raiser to the much anticipated possibles Vs probable's game it proved to be the game of

the day with both teams showcasing their talent and trading goals throughout the game in the end the Rivers / Wide Bay combination prevailed by 2 goals in what was a terrific battle.

While the main game was also suspected to be a close encounter this was not the case as Graham Gale's (Wide Bay coach) Probable's gave Paul Jago's (Northern Rivers coach) possibles a real football lesson in the opening half. The probable's went in at half time with a 50 point advantage and kept their opposition goalless throughout the first half.
