YEAR OF THE RED CARD

It seems on average that six or seven red cards have been handed out to each of the visiting clubs so far this season as we enter only round 10 of the comp. It is going to be a long season for players seeing red.

While many could not understand some strong tackles going un-punished, or just shown a mere "yellow" for the infringement, which could well put a player out for more games than a swearing red card.

I agree that there are varying levels of swearing; Loud obnoxious continuous swear words heard by children on the sidelines is not on, while directed swear words towards an official also means a coloured card.

But when a player swears under the breath to himself, or makes one expletive remark from sheer frustration, surely this is not an offence? No victim, no crime? Surely the officials realise that this is just part and parcel of the heat of the moment, or, as viewed by some visiting committee members; "It's just another fundraiser for Football South Coast." (?) I sincerely hope not!

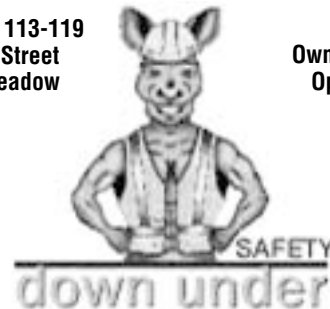

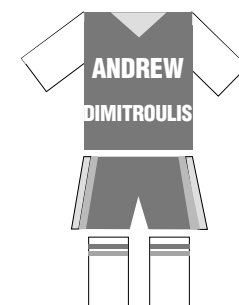

and in the 51st minute Josh Swinton broke through on the left found space and from 12m out curled a terrific strike from the outside of his boot to make it 3-0.

In the 78th minute a fabulous team move from its own half, ended with the Swinton brothers passing to each other through the Uni defence for Daniel Swinton to place a shot past the onrushing keeper from 10m to make it 4-0.

University managed a late consolation goal, but the three points were well and truly in the bag thanks to a great team performance from a determined Kiama unit.

The Reserve grade were systematically overruled by a creative University side eventually losing 5-0. Possibly one of the best hat-tricks witnessed in The Quarry in all grades was scored by the impressive Uni No.9 Thanh Le, with all three goals being top shelf material.

As early as the 8th minute Le latched onto a low cross unmarked in the area with a superb diving header from 10m out which gave James McClelland in Kiama's goal no chance. 30 minutes later a fluent Uni move through the heart of Kiama's defence found Le in enough space to ram home a terrific angled strike from 12m.

In Kiama's midfield, John Dover was trying hard to stop the flow, while Keegan Beringer up front was running his socks off chasing every ball and break-

ing up many a Uni move being played out from the back.

In the second half, Uni continued to press and hit the woodwork in the 45th minute, but no one could stop Le's hat-trick with yet another great strike. This time, it was a sublime volley on 52nd minute mark.

Moments later, a Beringer freekick from 25m whistled over the bar, but on the break Uni made it 4-0 in the 58th minute with a well directed header from 6m. 10 minutes later, Uni sealed all three points with another close range header with the Kiama defence out of sorts from a free kick 30m out.

The Youth grade held its own for the first 15 minutes even having the game's first clear cut chance on goal when Kyle Noronha tried his luck from the edge of the area only to see his effort well saved.

Kiama keeper, Phil Bitterlin was called upon to make some dramatic saves to keep Kiama in the game as Uni's tide of attacks just kept on rolling in. But Kiama were in the game for long spells and if not for the clinical finishing of the Uni strikers could have gone in front on 15 minutes as a fabulous Jacob Lester direct free kick from 20m out was goalbound, but brought off a terrific save from the Uni keeper to force a corner.

University's playmaker Peter Besnard scored the opening goal on 17th minutes and went on to create numerous chances throughout for his forwards.

With only a 1-0 half time lead on the board, Kiama were still in the hunt, but a second half rout saw Uni eventually run out 5-0 winners.

QUARRIERS NOTCH FIRST WIN IN STYLE

Kiama Quarriers finally got off the mark notching its first win of the season in fine style, with a 4-1 win over University in its last home game in The Quarry in the first FSC District League game cross-over round two weeks ago.

Last week on the road trip to Thirroul, Kiama made it back to back wins with a tremendous 4-3 win, coming back from being 2-0 down.

Previously drawing four of its six league games, Kiama ticked all the boxes against Uni with a solid team performance in a game which saw two red cards and some clinical finishing to secure all three points.

With influential defenders Keiran Duncan (suspended) and Jason Forrester (injured), coach Larry Beringer was forced to recruit Kiama stalwart James Spence into defence, and the seasoned campaigner brought stability to the back four.

The Quarriers started brightly and had its first chance on goal as early as the 4th minute, when a Steve Parkes cross was headed goalward by Daniel Swinton.

With neither side gaining control of the midfield and with many early passes going astray, the first 15 minutes was scrappy as both teams tried to settle and play constructive football.

Uni's first effort came in the 18th minute when

a floated freekick into Kiama's area was not cleared and allowed to find a Uni striker on the far post to shoot, only for keeper, Volkan Guden, to parry the ball onto the bar.

This seemed to spark Kiama into life and a break down the right found Steve Parkes in space on the edge of the Uni area who evaded a challenge to unleash a fantastic strike from 15m to open the score.

Six minutes later, striker Daniel Swinton rushed onto a through ball from Daniel Pisani to stab home from close range to make it 2-0. Both Josh and Daniel Swinton were linking up well with Pisani and Jacob Cooper as Kiama dominated midfield in patches.

Then in a space of five minutes, both sides were reduced to ten men. First Kiama midfielder, Trent Cruickshank, got his marching orders for swearing, which was quickly followed by a Uni midfielder player sent off for the same offence.

University had a flurry of corners in the remainder of the half but found Kel Ferguson, Sean Poulton, Daniel Sigmund and Spence in resolute form, while keeper, Guden, punched, pushed and parried the ball away from goal to hold on to a slender 2-0 half time lead.

From the restart, Kiama pressured the Uni goal
