

UNDER 12 MID YEAR

The under 12's this year have had an enjoyable season with many boys playing for the first time together. At the beginning of the year we had too many listed players for one team, but as it was Easter and a couple of schools had camps and we could only field one team. After a few rounds we soon realised we had to form two divisions with our 2000 born players forming Div 1 and our 2001 players in Div 2. Thank you to the parents who have allowed players to play across both divisions.

Div 1: The players have been competitive with four wins and three narrow misses. The team have really worked this year on their ball skills and work at stoppages. Coach Peter Southern has been delighted with the players increased confidence in kicking on their non preferred foot and taking the game on with breaking runs out of defence, give offs to passing players and the awareness of when to switch. KooGA U14 STATE

The 2012 AFL Queensland KooGa Under 14 State Championships were a soggy wet occasion at Fishermans Road and the boys from Papua New Guinea were toughing it out in even wetter conditions at Jubilee Drive, Palmwoods.

The PNG Binatangs approached Nambour and Hinterland Australian Football Club about staying at the Club house for the duration of the Under 14 Championships to keep all the boys together and save on accommodation expenses.

Nambour and Hinterland Chairman, Grant Vayro said that having the PNG boys use the Club house is no hassle and really promotes the community spirit harnessed by the club.

"We have hosted these teams several times in the past and we will continue to foster this relationship and encourage the boys from PNG to come to the Coast and who knows, maybe one day come over and play some footy with the Mighty Blues," Vayro said.

Nambour and Hinterland already have an existing relationship with AFLPNG through a billet program which sees a couple of boys each year travel over and play with the Blues and stay with members of the club.

"The billet program is great with Junior footy as the PNG boys really enjoy helping out at training and the kids really enjoy the interaction," Vayro said.

"Most of the boys are fairly shy but the interaction with the Juniors really brings them out of their shells during the season.

"We have hosted the boys annually to play in our Under 18 and Senior teams for several years... Club Life Member, Lance Nunn has been the driving force for this program."

The PNG boys enjoyed their time on the Coast aside the wet conditions and had a convincing win over the Country Kookaburras on the final day of the Championships to go home with fifth place. AFL Asia Pacific Development Manager, Andrew Cadzow said the boys really enjoy the opportunity to travel to these Championships and utilise local Club resources.

"Most of these boys have never been out of their home towns, so coming over here is a huge thing but they all take it in their stride and produce some really good footy," Cadzow said.

"It is great to have Nambour and Hinterland Footy Club on board with providing accommodation because all of the boys are able to stay together and feel more comfortable in that sort of environment." Nambour and Hinterland strive to be a family club that is inclusive to all participants and with programs such as the PNG Billet and Squad Accommodation they are well on their way to forging a greater identity on an international scale.

"These types of events help us to foster the environment that we open our doors to our footy family," Vayro said.

"As a Club it helps create a better understanding of cultural differences as well as providing PNG boys with a great experience and opportunity."

With AFL really kicking on in PNG this relationship will continue to flourish with both AFL PNG and Nambour and Hinterland AFC actively promoting AFL development and cultural understanding between the two countries.




