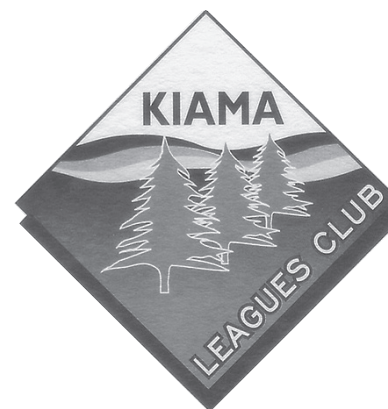

CAUSING UPSETS

Kiama 1 Albion Park White Eagles 1

A "never-say-die" attitude eventually paid dividends for Kiama in a hard fought one all draw against third placed Albion Park White Eagles, in the IFA Premier League at The Quarry, in the last Saturday of April.

The Eagles had already clocked up three corners before Kiama had their first effort on goal in the 14th minute. But it was well worth the wait.

A direct free kick at the edge of the box, was drilled into the corner of the net by Kris Brant, but it was cleared off the line by a defender with the keeper well beaten.

The visitors were swinging the ball wide and using the wings to an advantage, which made Kiama defend in numbers, leaving a strike partnership of Dave Buchanan and Brant with limited support.

Albion Park showed why they are third on the ladder with some inventive inter passing play and quick breaks out of the defence, and in the 20th minute a 30 yard screamer just flew over the Kiama bar.

Minutes later however, Kiama's Matt Goss out-sprinted the defence, only to see his wonderful cross from the byline cleared for safety, with only Brant on hand against a four-man defence.

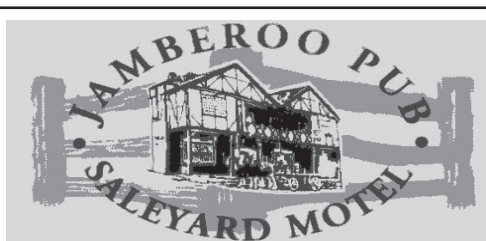
Alex Cross was playing a deeper than usual role, often called upon to defend, which he did to good effect. The tigerish Mitch Grant, harrassed the visitors all day and Brad Gallagher showed composure in a cluttered midfield.

Albion Park continued to force Kiama on the back foot however, as the corner count rose to seven before Kiama rattled the Eagles when a sweetly taken corner thier own taken by Goss, which caused panic in the area and several chances in the melee went begging, but somehow the Eagles managed to clear to safety.

Kiama keeper Kiel Zerner was called upon soon after to pull off a marvellous save to deny a direct free kick from 25 yards.

In the 39th minute however, the stalemate was broken. Kiama gave the ball away just inside the Albion Park half, which left the defence wide open and from a quick break, Albion Park capitalised on the chance and took the lead.

In the second half, Albion Park once again continued to chalk up the corners with three in the first eight minutes. The defence held firm however, with Brad Page once again having a huge game. But his partner at the back, Matt Gallagher, made a crucial tackle on the hour to deny the visitors a certain match clincher when the forward only had the keeper to beat. It was a text book tackle from Gallagher, and it proved decisive with Kiama finally starting to believe that they could salvage something from the game. Then in the 78th minute Kiama levelled, Buchanan finding space 18 yards out to hammer home the equaliser.

It can only be described as a gutsy performance by The Quarriers in a highly tense atmosphere. Albion Park were clearly disappointed at the end of the day, but nobody could deny Kiama its first point of the season.

KIAMA came away from the Albert Butler Memorial Park, with three vital points in its IFA Premier League "must-win" game, with a comfortable 2-0 victory over Kemblawarra.

The Quarriers had a dream start and were on the board after only seven minutes.

Long-throw specialist, Alex Cross, caused panic

in the Kemblawarra defence, when he found the head of James Donlon at the edge of the six yard box, who flicked on for the on-rushing Matt Goss to side-foot the ball over the line.

It started a flurry of chances for the visitors, with Kris Brant missing a golden opportunity to double the score in the 15th minute. Clean through and with only the goalkeeper to beat, he took one step too far and the keeper managed to smother his shot.

Dave Buchanan was used to full advantage, with the ball being pumped long out of the defence to the target man, who was winning every aerial duel, feeding Goss, Donlon and Brant to good effect.

The Kiama defence were lying very deep throughout the half and this meant the workload of its wingbacks of Cross and Goss, had a busy time with much ground to cover.

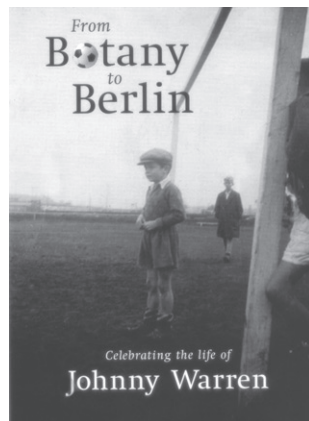
Just before the half-hour mark Kiama again went forward, with a great move ending in Buchanan heading on for Donlon to tap the ball past the keeper while the Kemblawarra defence appealed for off-side, but there was no flag.
