



KIAMA Youth grade had yet another resounding success with a 5 nil demolition of its hosts Consiton. Blake Eickaler netting a brace.


Coach. Wavne Farnsworth has instilled a great camaraderie among the team and the boys are playing terrific football this season.

KIAMA DIG DEEP FOR **IMPORTANT RESULT**

KIAMA came away from Consiton last Friday night, with three valuable points in its fight for survival in the IFA Premier League in a 5-3 thriller.

The win leap-frogs the Lions on the ladder, and with Kemblawarra losing 7-0 at the hands of a rampant Bulli on Saturday. Kiama now sit above their two closest rivals with a superior goal difference.

The Quarriers dug deep after last week's 6-0 mauling at the hands of Dapto, to consolidate its position as a future Premier League outfit worthy of a starting place in next season's competition.

Kiama hit the front as early as the 10th minute when an in-swinging Kris Brant free kick from near the byline was tapped in by midfielder Jonny Hatton in a crowded area to open the score.

But things didn't go according to plan.Within five minutes. Coniston had equalised from a disputed freekick at the edge of the area, and then took the lead halfway through the first half from the penalty spot.

sweetly struck shot from 18 yards.


Coniston were not to be outdone however, and with so much relying on the game, the Lions pushed forward and equalised on the hour with Kiel Zerner beaten at the far post.

Talking Point

FOUR years ago this month, three year-old India Verity tragically died when a portable goalpost weighing 180 kilograms fell on top of her at a Moss Vale soccer gala day.

Last month in Winchester, America, a 10 yearold boy was killed under similar circumstances, when portable goals blew over in a strong gust of wind, and in Britain it has been noted that as many as 9 youngsters have lost their lives to portable goalposts not been properly secured since 1999.

These are not 'freak accidents" but rather the negligence of adults and clubs who either know no better, or are ill-informed of the dangers.

There has been a huge campaign across the country to inform people of the dangers of these goals, but it is still left up to the clubs to monitor their own situations

Since India's death, new guidlines to a set standard of manufacturing "non-fixed goals" have been put in place (March 2005), but there are still many older-style or even home-made goals being used. Victoria banned all portable goals made prior to 2005 and they must now comply with the strict guidlines created in the Fair Trading Act (March 2005).

All football associations should make note of this on their websites, but at the end of the day, it is our children who place complete trust in adult supervision to get it right, so that they may enjoy the beautiful game without this unneccessary danger. Let's get it right for our kids!
