The following end Bligh's team picked up three shots to draw level at 17-17. They then went on to win the next three ends in typical Bligh fashion - quote "You only need one good bowl to win an end" unquote.

So, down to the 21st end with the score in favour of Bligh's team 20-17 and Don's team only having to draw to retain their title as they were ahead on margins from their two wins. This is how I saw it.

"In the battle between myself and Tony, Tony held shot after four bowls had been played, once the second's had finished their bowls Tony's bowl was still shot, then Peter arrived at the mat and with his first bowl picked up kitty and took it back to give our side two shots. Heath drove into the head and took out one shot bowl. Peter stepped up with his second bowl and picked up kitty once again and we moved to three up, both skips went to the other end with the game held precariously in the balance at 20-20.

Bligh with his first bowl banged it into an opposition bowl and sent it into the head to give away another shot.

Don then positioned his first bowl amongst the counters to move us to a five shot lead. So, now it was all on Bligh and as cool as a cucumber he trundled his final bowl through the head and positioned it as second shot.

It was at this point I felt not so dissimilar to the way I felt after NSW had lost the first State of Origin a few weeks ago, totally deflated. Bligh had done his job well.

Now it was up to Don to try and rescue the situation, what a suitable ending it was to what had been a very evenly contested game and as Don fired his last shot so to speak, his bowl looked very much on target to remove Bligh's bowl but in the last two meters just deflected off course after getting a very slight touch off one of the many bowls in front of the jack".
