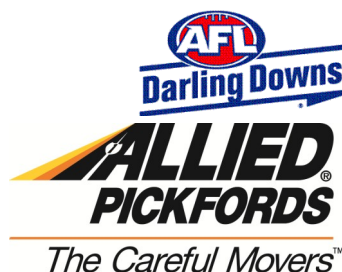

Allied Pickfords Cup
Game of the Round
Seniors - Souths Vs Coolaroo



In a much anticipated top of the table clash traditional rivals South Toowoomba host an in form Coolaroo in this week's Allied Pickfords game of the round at the 'Sardine Pit' Harristown Park.

These teams last met way back in round 2 where the Bombers came away with a hard fought 14 point victory in a physical game played under wet conditions.

Much has transpired since that round 2 encounter where Souths have gone on not to lose a game throughout the opening 14 rounds but came very close last week in their clash with 2010-11 premiers the Toowoomba Tigers where they fought out a 92 point draw. The Bombers would count themselves lucky to escape with a shared 2 points in that game after a very lacklustre opening half.

Coolaroo on the other hand are arguably the form team of the competition and are showing signs of the Roos of old after missing the finals last year for the first time in over a decade. Tom Rudolph is in career best form and must be considered one of the favourites for this year's Holman Medal while vivacious power forward Miles Grice has been a welcome return to the club boasting 64 goals to date.

Souths will also look for a large contribution from their super recruit Dan McPhee who currently tops the goal kicking table with 72 goals. Souths midfielders Jeff Neumann and Braden Behan have been more surreptitious than a Bin Laden compound raid this season and will be looking to use their stealth like skills to effect on the small confines of Harristown Park.

All in all this game looms as an absolute humdinger with the winner to take sole position atop of the Allied Pickfords ladder.

In other games Highfields will be looking to bounce back from their shock loss to Goondiwindi last week as they host Warwick at Kratzke Oval while the Hawks will be looking to make it 2 in a row when they host the University Cougars. The Toowoomba Tigers are at home against the Lockyer Valley Demons at Rockville Park and the Dalby Swans have the bye.

Game of the Round

Juniors - Lions and Reddies in Humdinger of a clash

The Highfields Lions and Warwick Redbacks will face each other in this week's junior game of the round at Kratzke Oval, as the Reddies look to secure a finals appearance in the under 16 competition.

Warwick are clear by a game and half in fourth place at the moment but will want to keep that break between them and the Bombers, as they look to hunt down the Lions at Kratzke Oval.

Highfields will come into this game fresh after the week off and will be looking to stop the celestial Redbacks at home. Warwick will be on a high after last week when every player that played kicked at least 1 major in the win over Pittsworth.

U18 Crows book home final

Darling Downs have won convincingly in the top of the table clash with Yeronga South Brisbane, running out 17.9 (111) to 9.8 (62) victors at Leyshon Park on Sunday afternoon.

It was the Devils who started the better of the two sides, as they had 10 scorings shots to the Crows 2 shots. The Crows didn't adapt to the muddy and wet conditions at Leyshon, as Yeronga burnt the Crows right across the paddock. Darling Downs went into the first quarter 23points down and didn't look the top of the table side they are.

Again, another moment that you'd like to hear because whatever coach Neumann said at quarter time inspired the Crows to kick 7 second quarter goals to Yeronga's 1 and turned the 23point deficit into a 14point advantage going into the main break.

The second quarter was mainly on the back of an inspirational 3goal quarter to small forward Jack Rockliff and Lachlan Walters going into the ruck, which lifted the standard with his second and third efforts.

Darling Downs started where they left off booting 5 majors to Yeronga's 2 in the third quarter. Dignan, Stahlhut and Tate continued their good season form and setting up a lot of attacking raids. It was Dignan's laser like left foot, along with Tate's tackling pressure and Stahlhut's work rate which stood out most in the third term.

DD extended their lead to 34points going into the final quarter.

The Crows have normally gone into cruise control and would usually take their foot of the "accelerator" and ease home. For the first time this season, they continued to motor home extending the three-quarter time lead. Darling Downs kicked 4.5 to Yeronga's 1.2 in the final term.

Jack Rockliff finished the game with game high 4 goals while Lachlan Thomas and Wylie Buzza chipped in with 3 each.

Darling Downs will now finish on top of the SEQ Central Conference Ladder with the 49point victory, even with 2 regular season games left. The Under 18 Crows will play at home next weekend against the Alex Hills Bombers in after the weekend's results will be a top of the table clash against the Bombers.

In other next the Under 14 Crows recorded their third win of 2012, after defeating the Redland Bombers by 4points at Rockville on Sunday morning. The 14's Crows will now take the long road-trip to Redcliffe this Sunday to take on the Tigers.

The Darling Downs Crows have jumped from 8th to 6th on the ladder after a hard fought 4 point win over a bigger bodied Redlands outfit at Rockville Park on the weekend.

The win against Redlands was set up on the back of another terrific effort by the backline who kept Redlands to just 2 goals through the opening 3 quarters while the Crows managed 6 goals in that time. Rebounding defender Riley Easton was sensational across the half back line and won countless contested ball throughout the game while Sam Copland and Brendan Shelton performed brilliantly against bigger bodied opponents.

This is the first time that the Crows have won back to back games this season and with a modest run home the Crows may just scrape into the top 5 in their first season of Div 1 football. All players and coaches arent getting ahead of themselves though and realise while the team has shown great improvement their is still much room for further improvement this season.

Next week the Crows hit the road lining up against bottom placed Redcliffe in a game they are expected to win.
