

Liston Preview

FOR those who are superstitious Monday night (September 3) could hold special significance.

It will be the 87th medal presented for the fairest and best in the VFL and in its guises as the Recorder Cup from 1923 to 1942 and then the JJ Liston Trophy from 1945 to the present there has not been a triple winner.

With such a backdrop could Shane Valenti, a winner of the past two Liston Trophys, create history with a third Liston?

Certainly, Valenti must be considered among the main contenders

The Port Melbourne rover has several things in his favour, quite apart from the bleedin' obvious that he polls well.

To reinforce that point it should be noted that Valenti finished second in the 2007 Liston Trophy, beaten two votes by Geelong's James Byrne.

Last year Valenti finished a staggering 10 votes clear of his nearest rival, the biggest winning margin since Sam Mitchell won the 2002 Liston.

Valenti has played every game this season and according to the details provided to AFL Victoria each week after a match, he has appeared in Port Melbourne's best six players 13 times

And, in the Ford Coaches Player of the Year Award, Valenti was among the top dozen vote scorers when voting went in camera.

There is no doubt that Valenti is conspicuous by his fearless

attack on the football as well as his ability to not only win the ball, but use it to advantage.

While Port Melbourne was not as dominant as last year, the Borough won enough games for Valenti to poll votes.

What could count against Valenti is that his teammate, Port Melbourne captain John Baird is enjoying a career season.

Baird was tied with Northern Blues Adam Marcon in the lead for the Ford Coaches Player of the Year Award, which gives the winner the use of a car for six months, late in the season.

The 32-year-old was mentioned in Port Melbourne's best one more time than Valenti.

But, while Baird played virtually all the home and away games last season he did not poll a solitary vote.

North Ballarat's Myles Sewell was the Rooster's best player in what was a disappointing season for the club. He received more mentions than both Baird and Valenti in the club's best players and he's a perennial candidate when it comes to Liston discussion.

The 2009 Liston Trophy winner possesses the same attributes as Valenti, but could be penalised because North Ballarat won just nine games. When he won, the Rooster's won 14 games.

Williamstown captain Ben Jolley is another who usually polls well in the Liston. He finished third last year, 12 votes behind Valenti

Marcon, who has taken his game to a new level in this his second VFL season, is expected to poll well despite the Northern Blues' dismal season. Young teammate Kane Lambert also played well.

Werribee's Ben Warren finished third on the goal kicking with 50 goals, an excellent return given he was not the designated go-to-guy.

And you could not discount a number of Casey Scorpions or Geelong players, especially with their 14 and 13 wins respectively for the season.

Qualifying Final 1 Casey Scorpions vs Werribee Tigers

FEW people tipped Casey Scorpions to make the finals this season and only the most one-eyed Scorpion expected the club to end the home and away fixture as minor premiers.

But, that's exactly where Casey Scorpions sit as they welcome Werribee to Casey Fields for a Qualifying Final that wasn't on anyone's radar.

With the much publicised departure of Messrs Fevola, Mohr, Stockdale and Wall and what developed into a virtual season erasing injury to cocaptain Kyle Matthews, Casey has defied all the pundits.

Now they have to defy Werribee, which smashed them earlier in the season and looks as formidable as any finalist.

Werribee has won five of its past seven games, including a 13-goal win over Casey at Chirnside Park in Round 14.

Nathan Ablett kicked four goals in that match, but he's only just returned from injury. Significantly, Ablett kicked five goals for Werribee's Development League team last weekend and is likely to be included in the Qualifying Final team.

Apart from the loss of Ablett, Werribee's team has been pretty much stable in recent weeks and that always augurs well

finished third and fifth respectively on the goal kicking ladder with 50 and 37 goals respectively.

Add Ablett to that mix and it poses giant headaches for the Scorpions coaching staff.

North Melbourne's emerging ruckman Majak Daw has been outstanding while Malcolm Lynch is a quality player who can be damaging through the midfield or pushing into attack and Levi Greenwood is a prolific possession winner.

But, Werribee has found itself in the Qualifying Final not only on the back of its aligned players. The Tigers have a strong VFL list led by captain Robbie Castello, defenders Scott Sherlock, Kyle Hartigan, Matt O'Dwyer and veteran Leigh Harding.

Former North Melbourne player Ben Ross has enjoyed a good season as too has Sam Wormald and Ben Sharp is as good a run with player as there is the competition.

While Casey has home ground advantage, where they are 6-3 this season, Werribee owns a 5-4 record on the road.

What Casey has been able to do all season long is win, regardless of how many Melbourne players are in the team or if they're staring defeat in the face. They're 8-1 in games decided by three goals or less.

Somehow Casey has found a way to win and that's a credit to the players and coach Brett Lovett who has instilled great faith in his players.

The Scorpions have been strengthened by the late season return of Matthews while the other co-captain Evan Panozza has never played better.

While Jack Fitzpatrick is Casey's leading goal kicker with just 28 goals, the Scorpions ability to spread its goal kickers to kick a winning score has been its trademark.

Casey will again be cast as the underdog in this Qualifying Final, but as they have repeatedly shown all season the Scorpions can't be under estimated.

Qualifying Final 2 Port Melbourne vs Geelong

ALL the raging disappointment which accompanied Port Melbourne's narrow loss last week would have been eased somewhat when the scores from the other games were relayed.

While Casey Scorpions catapulted over Port Melbourne to grab top spot at the end of the home and away season, the result that would have resonated the most with Gary Ayres and all the Port players was that arch-rival Williamstown had done them a favour.

It's not often, if ever, that bouquets have been exchanged between the clubs over a journey built on animosity and angst, but the Seagulls win against Geelong ensured that Port Melbourne would finish second.

And, that entitled Port Melbourne to the luxury of a Qualifying Final at its North Port Oval, where it has not lost since the Semi Final of the 2010 season

Port Melbourne has won its past 20 games at home – as imposing a home record as there has been in recent years.

It's worth noting that Port Melbourne's average winning margin this season at home is 63 points and the only game it hasn't won by five goals or more was the Round 20 match against Box Hill Hawks when they won by three points.

It's against that daunting back drop that Geelong find themselves, but the VFL Cats

go into the match with several positive factors.

While they lost to Williamstown, it was only by four points and it was the club's first defeat since North Ballarat defeated them back in Round 10.

And, Geelong was without veteran Dominic Gleeson, a proven big game player. The VFL Cats were also hit by several late withdrawals to its AFL team. As many as two players who played in Geelong's victory against Western Bulldogs will find themselves in the VFL.

Geelong will also have the confidence that they defeated Port Melbourne by 21-points at Simonds Stadium at the clubs only meeting during the home and away season.

The Cats were without captain Troy Selwood that match and had seven VFL players in its team. Selwood will play in the Qualifying Final and he's been in great form all season.

Port Melbourne is certainly not the team it was last year. No one expected it would be, afterall it's hard to replicate perfection.

The Borough has lost three of its past six matches, albeit all by under two goals.

While the bulk of Geelong's team will be emerging young players, the experience of Selwood, Gleeson, Andrew McLean and veteran Cat David Wojcinski, who has played three of the past four games in the VFL, can't be underestimated.

Geelong must curb the dominance of Port Melbourne captain John Baird, dual Liston Trophy winner Shane Valenti and Adam Bentick and therefore dry up the opportunities presented to Dean Galea and Chris Cain.

No club has done in the past two seasons what Geelong will attempt today, but the Cats like their chances





Elimination Final 1 Williamstown vs Bendigo

WILLIAMSTOWN launches its seventh consecutive bid, the biggest, most recent streak of any current club, for the premiership from an unusual base.

The Seagulls find itself for the first time during its successive finals campaigns playing in an Elimination Final against Bendigo.



Williamstown is on a 6 game winning streak entering the finals, whilst Bendigo have won only 1 of their last 6 matches.

For the past six seasons, Williamstown has played in a Qualifying Final in the first week of the finals

While Williamstown won't have the buffer of a second chance. Peter German's team goes into the finals as the in-form club of the competition.

After scrambling mid-season, highlighted by its draw against subsequent wooden-spooner Frankston. Williamstown has regrouped and is now playing as well as any club in the finals.

Williamstown enters the Elimination Final riding a six game winning streak and its scalps include Port Melbourne, Geelong, Werribee and Sandringham.

Admittedly, the Seagulls won by under two goals against Port Melbourne, Geelong and Werribee, but it is a positive sign that Williamstown was able to emerge victorious in those finals-like games.

Bendigo snapped a five game losing streak to defeat Box Hill Hawks in the final home and away match to secure its place in the finals in what is its last year of its alignment with Essendon

The Gold's season has been in splurges. They lost heavily against Northern Blues (100 points), Geelong (86) and Sandringham (38) early in the season before reeling off six successive wins.

But, Bendigo then went into a funk losing five straight to put in jeopardy its final's participation. With just eight Essendon players, which included two rookies. Bendigo showed plenty of resolve and character to topple Box Hill Hawks to seal its place in the finals.

Now they must regroup again as they face the surging Seagulls.

Bendigo can take confidence from the fact that they defeated Williamstown by 19-points at the club's only meeting during the home and away season.

It's worth noting, however, that both clubs will field drastically different teams in the Flimination Final

Bendigo will not have the services of David Myers or Scott Gumbleton and with Essendon enduring more injuries in its latest AFL match the number of Bombers who will play is again likely to be in single figures.

Williamstown will be in a similar situation. The Seagulls boasted just six Western Bulldogs players in its win against Geelong, which had 19 AFL/ rookie players in its team.

While Williamstown hasn't been kicking huge scores it has been able to shut down its rivals. During its latest winning spree, the Seagulls have shackled its opponents to 13 goals or less and that includes three single digit goal scorelines.

With its mojo restored, Williamstown will be a tough proposition for a Bendigo side struggling to regain their mid season form.

Elimination Final 2 Sandringham vs Box Hill Hawks

SANDRINGHAM returns to finals action for the first time in five years as it hosts Box Hill Hawks in an Elimination Final

The Zebras are pleased to end its finals drought, but it won't be satisfied with just reaching the finals.

With an advantage of playing at home, Sandringham will like its prospects of advancing into the Semi Finals.

Sandringham dealt the VFL Hawks a nine goal hiding at the club's only meeting, but that was way back in March and it won't only be the weather that will be different this weekend.

Box Hill Hawks had no answer for Sandringham, which rode to victory on the back of exciting St Kilda small forward Terry Milera.

In fact, Sandringham's team against Box Hill Hawks in the season opener included Milera, Beau Wilkes, Ahmed Saad, Farren Ray, Jack Newnes, Tom Simpkin, David Armitage and Seb Ross.

All eight players played for St Kilda last weekend and all are expected to again play in the AFL this weekend.

It will certainly test the depth of Sandringham's list, but what will favour the Zebras is a return to the cosy confines of the Trevor Barker Oval.

Captain Beau Dowler, Adam Cockie, Myke Cook and Michael Sikora have been the mainstays of Sandringham's resurgence and its VFL depth was strengthened mid-season by the return of the classy Marcus Marigliani.

Sandringham has lost its past two games, but both were on the road. The Zebras are a much better team at home and that will be to their advantage.

What Sandringham needs to turn around is its indifferent form. They're 4-6 in the second half of the season and its only win against a finalist in the period was against Bendigo.

Box Hill Hawks also enters the Elimination Final losing its past two games, but both could easily have been victories.

The VFL Hawks failed by three points to end Port Melbourne's two-season long unbeaten run at home and then they were in the match right up until the final minutes against Bendigo.

Both games were on the road and Box Hill Hawks again have to saddle up for another away game. They're 4-5 on the road this season.

Box Hill Hawks had 10 Hawthorn players in the team that lost to Bendigo and that number could increase if Cyril Rioli returns to the AFL this weekend.

Apart from its strong Hawthorn representation, Box Hill Hawks has a core of seasoned players led by former Hawk Beau Muston and emerging young players David Mirra and Luke Andrews.

Sandringham may have the home ground advantage, but it may not be enough to hold out Box Hill Hawks.

VFL Experience

MUCH is made of the AFL players that aligned clubs can utilise during the finals.

There is no denying that players with AFL experience bring something to the table, but is it enough for a club to build a premiership team from?

It's a question that is always debated come finals time.

Port Melbourne put an exclamation mark for the rebuttal case last season when they swept through the finals just as they did the home and away season to take out an historic premiership.

The Borough is not the invincible team of 2011, but that doesn't undermine its claims for back-to-back flags.

While Port Melbourne doesn't have the AFL expertise to call upon, what they do have is the most experienced bunch of VFL players in the competition.

And, it has been counter argued since the VFL competition was revamped in 2000 that the toughest team to beat come finals time is not the one laden with players with AFL experience, but the team whose VFL players step up.

There is no denying that Port Melbourne's list is strong and seasoned with seven players with 100 plus VFL games to their credit and Adrian Bonaddio on the door step of his 100th game.

It's worth noting that Port's arch rival Williamstown boasts the next highest number of 100 game players, but it's total of three is half as many as the Borough.

Werribee has two 100 plus game players – captain Robbie Castello and playing assistant coach Leigh Harding – while Geelong's sole centurion is ex Werribee captain Dominic Gleeson; Bendigo has former 'Frosty' Miller medallist Matthew Little and Sandringham's only player with more than 100 games is Marcus Marigliani.

Casey Scorpions and Box Hill Hawks are the only finalists that don't boast a 100 game VFL player.

Evan Panozza, the Scorpions' co-captain, heads the club's seniority list with 85 games while at the VFL Hawks former North Melbourne player Daniel Pratt tops the list, also with 85 games.

But, if you look deeper the strength of Port Melbourne's experience is magnified when you consider that its 10th most experienced player is premiership player Michael Dillon who has played 91 games.

For the sake of defining a VFL club's own experience depth, we've listed the top 10 players in games played. It's detailed below



What is interesting is how many clubs not only have 100 plus game players, but have 50 plus game players.

Port Melbourne's extraordinary depth has been discussed, but it's worth noting which club boasts the most 50 game VFL players.

Werribee leads the way of the remaining clubs with six 50 game players followed somewhat surprisingly by Geelong who emerges next with the most 50 plus players – five.

Casey Scorpions and Williamstown each have four; Bendigo three with Box Hill Hawks and Sandringham just two.

Time will tell just how significant it is to have experienced VFL players heading into final's battle.

Season Review

AS much as it's a preseason objective of every club, the reality is that 13 clubs simply doesn't go into eight finalists.

It leaves five clubs cast in the role as unwanted spectators when the business end of the season rolls along.

Every club, particularly Collingwood, has a different modus operandi, but for some there is no escaping the fact that 2012 simply didn't measure up.

Here is a look at the five clubs that didn't make the finals and what went wrong, what's needed to ensure they don't find themselves in a similar position in 12 months and who were the players that shone.



NORTH BALLARAT

Position: 9th Record: 9-9

Goalkickers: Bill Driscoll (32), Aaron Black (24), Paul McMahon (22), Lachlan George (17), Derek Micallef (21), Aaron Edwards (10)

What happened?: North Ballarat simply never recovered from a horrendous opening. The Roosters were forced to play catch up footy on the premiership ladder and while they finished strongly they simply ran out of games. When you are

1-5 after six games and 3-6 at the half way mark it is literally all uphill from there. Not only did North Ballarat suffer some humbling losses in that horror stretch - Port Melbourne thumped them by 14 goals, Sandringham and Williamstown by 55 and 52-points respectively – but the Roosters lost a heart breaker by one point against Casev Scorpions. For the first time since Gerard FitzGerald returned. North Ballarat's granite-like defence crumbled like sand, especially in the first half of the season when the Rooster's allowed seven century scorelines kicked against them. They tightened up in the second half of the season, but the damage had already been done. Second half wins against Williamstown and Sandringham, both away, provided a glimmer of hope that North Ballarat would sneak into the eight. but losses to Geelong and Werribee scuttled those hopes and consigned the club to missing the finals for the first time since 2005. North Ballarat showed its character and class with a thrilling one point win against Port Melbourne in the last home and away match, but it was to no avail.

Star performers: No surprises here. Myles Sewell reaffirmed his status as not only North Ballarat's best player, but also one of the stars of the competition. Sewell was not only prolific in winning

Michael Searl, in his return to the club after missing the past couple of seasons, underscored what a quality player he is. Billy Driscoll remained one of the most dangerous small forwards in the competition. All the North Melbourne players played their part.

What's needed?: An Orren Stephenson clone. The big O. the No 1 ruckman in the VFL for the previous four seasons, was sadly missed. Ben Mabon did develop as the year progressed, but they were big shoes to fill in the ruck North Ballarat also needs to find a replacement for captain Marc Greig, who announced his retirement after 200 plus games. Greig has been the heart and soul of the club for more than a decade. His leadership on and off the field will be hard to replace.



NORTHERN BLUES

Position: 10th Record: 6-12

What happened?:

NORTHERN Blues endured a season they would gladly forget. Not only did they lose its captain and best and fairest winner before the season started, but then they lost double digit games and mid-season its coach. Rob Hyde, one of the best coaches in the TAC Cup history, decided he could not continue after the 51-point loss to Geelong, which left Northern Blues with a sad and sorry 1-9 record. Hyde noted the VFL was no longer the domain for a part-time coach. While Northern Blues continued to suffer some

hefty losses – Box Hill Hawks and Port Melbourne defeated them by 57 and 69-points respectively – new coach Darren Harris was able to get the club back on track to some degree. Northern won four of its last seven games, which included a 40-point win against Casey and Werribee.

Star performers: Young Adam Marcon stamped himself as a player that AFL clubs will seriously look at after

an outstanding second-year season. Marcon was one of the few constants for the club. He is in the running to win the Ford Coaches Player of the year award. Kane Lambert, a Northern Knights graduate, enjoyed a break-out season. Nick Meese battled much of the year in the ruck without support, and held his own. Carlton's Bret Thornton, David Ellard, Jordan Russell and Andrew McInnes all played well for the VFL Blues.

What's needed?: Northern Blues need to stump its VFL list, especially with some experienced players. When you lose quality players like Adam lacobucci and Jarrod McCorkell in one hit it leaves a Grand Canyon-like void. While an alignment has worked well at Cramer Street in the past, a VFL club is only as strong as the depth of its VFL list. There's no doubt that Northern Blues need to bolster its VFL list.



COBURG TIGERS

Position: 11th Record: 4-4

What happened?: Yet another dismal season. Coburg Tigers find themselves spectators come finals for the fourth successive season. Coburg Tigers posted their lowest mark in terms of wins since 2000 when they also won just the

four games. One of the most disappointing aspects of the 2012 season is that Coburg Tigers won three of its first five games and lost another game by six points. Its only win after Round 6 was a 26-point win against Collingwood. Twice Coburg Tigers lost to Frankston, they endured five defeats of 50 plus points and ended the season on a seven game losing skid

Star performers: Regrettably for Coburg Tigers they were few and far between. Willie Wheeler, one of the contenders for the Fothergill Round Medal, was probably the club's most consistent player while Leigh Masters played well as did David Fahey, but he was restricted to playing just nine games. Richmond ruckman Angus Graham and the speedy Matthew White both played well.

What's needed?: Clearly, Coburg Tigers need to ramp up its VFL list. The club needs a couple of key position forwards and defenders, but then again which club doesn't, but seriously Coburg Tigers need to attract more quality players or they could easily find themselves in a similar position next season.



COLLINGWOOD

Position: 12th Record: 4-14

Goalkickers: Caolan Mooney (17), Jackson Paine (17), Jonathon Ceglar (14), Ricky Ferraro (14), Kirk Ugle (13), Jarrod Witts (11) What happened?: Well, on face value it appeared that Collingwood's season never rose to any great heights. The VFL Magpies won just four games. the same number it did last season, but they included a win against Port Melbourne, which snapped the Borough's modern day competition record winning spree of 28 games. Collingwood also defeated another finalist - Bendigo but they also encountered some fearful drubbings. They lost five games by 50 plus points, including two games by 100 plus points. While the pickings were decidedly slim, Collingwood's primary purpose of its VFL team is to have players playing their designated role so they can step up whenever needed to the AFL. On that score Collingwood has unearthed several promising AFL players - Jamie Elliott and Paul Seedsman ended the season playing in the AFL while Jackson Paine gained a feel for the game's elite level and will benefit greatly.

Star performers: Captain Kris Pendlebury gained overdue recognition with his selection in the VFL representative match. Pendlebury proved himself again one of the best defenders in the competition. Collingwood also unearthed a number of promising young top-up players – Lachlan Wallace and Nick Riddle. Both Wallace and Riddle showed they are certainly up to the required standard.

What's needed?:

Collingwood has a handful

of regular VFL players, led by Pendlebury and Tom Sundberg, who missed a large of the year through injury. It rarely head hunts a bunch of seasoned players. preferring to top up its list with aspiring young players.



FRANKSTON

Position: 13th Record: 2-15-1

What happened?: For a club that won just two and a half games, Frankston's season

wasn't as bad as it may look. Certainly, the Dolphins were far more competitive than in the previous two seasons. Apart from defeating Coburg Tigers twice -they've owned Cobura Tigers in recent years - Frankston ran minor premiers Casey Scorpions to one point and another finalist - Sandringham - to six points and drew with yet another finalist Williamstown. There were several blow outs -Bendigo and Port Melbourne got hold of them, but they were the only clubs to inflict 50 plus point defeats.

Star performers: One of the most pleasing aspects of Frankston's season was the number of emerging young players. Recruits Kyle Martin, Lachlan Delahunty, Leigh Osborne, Dylan Van Unen, Leigh Kitchin as well as Khan Haretuku all played at such a level that they will come under scrutiny from AFL clubs. As strange as it may sound Frankston may have the most players drafted from any VFL club later in the vear.

What's needed?: Clearly, Frankston needs to solidify its young list with a couple of older, more seasoned heads who can stand up when the going gets tough and show the leadership that comes with experience. Obviously, a key forward and defender are required as well as a ruckman.



Female Umpires Leading the Way

WOMEN and girls now play a greater role in all aspects of football - from playing. coaching, training and umpiring.

The Ballarat Football League were excited to have a Youth Girls match officiated by all female umpires on the 18th of August in the Ballarat Junior competition. This included Field, Boundary and Goal umpires and was a fantastic promotion for female umpiring in the region.

Kellie McLeod is just 19 years of age and has umpired over 150 games in her 7 year career. She was given the opportunity to be the central umpire for the all girls match and is leading the way for other young women to see that being a girl does not inhibit choices on and off the field.

McLeod has a long term dream that she will be the first AFL female central umpire.

"I'm just a couple of seconds away from having the fitness levels required and I've been told I have a great understanding of the rules of the game and a strong voice to ensure the game is played in a safe and fair manner ".

McLeod's career in community football began at 12. in Warrnambool. When she moved to Ballarat for University she was welcomed by the Ballarat Umpires Association. McLeod now officiates as a field umpire for the Junior competition and a boundary umpire for the Senior competition

She has seven central games under her belt and is aiming for under 18's before the end of the season

As a child, McLeod developed an interest in football from supporting her vounger brother. Kellie's father encouraged her involvement when he first saw a female boundary umpire and encouraged his daughter to do the same.

McLeod reported that there are



many aspects that she loves about umpiring.

"What I love about umpiring is the fact that I can view the game at such close proximity to the players".

The fitness side of umpiring as well as the pay are also significant benefits according to Kellie. The pay ranges from fifty to seventy dollars per game. Kellie says the social aspect of training is another attraction.

"It gets me out, I mix in well with the guys and we have a lot of fun."

BFNL Umpire Coach/ Coordinator, Rob Simmonds has recognised that girls are a huge resource for his Umpiring department.

Rob believes Kellie is more than capable of reaching her dream.

"Girls respond well to encouragement, which is why I have taken Kellie under my wing".

Simmonds gave a few insights into what can be done to recruit girls in grass roots football.

"It's a confidence thing, aim for friendship groups and promote the fact that they get paid to run.

"It's good to get them early, say 13, 14, 15," Simmonds said

"Once engaged girls enjoy the social aspect of umpiring as much as the fitness side. They often

need a coach to encourage them to take the challenge and tend to do well once asked to participate."

"It is important for girls to be involved for their health, fitness and for self esteem, they are feeling the body image pressure these days.

"Umpiring is a way for all girls to be involved no matter what their body shape, just to get out there and have a go".

He has made a commitment to engage and retain female umpires by creating development programs and a pathway for them to follow. As a secondary school teacher, Simmonds understands the psychological needs of girls.

His goal is to mentor several girls to hold significant positions in the AFL.

"Girls often lack confidence in themselves ... once they get started they gain confidence and make fantastic umpires."

When asked what is different about coaching boys and girls, Simmonds explained much of it was about feedback

"Girls take feedback better, some boys can be really defensive. Initially some girls might second quess themselves, then one day it clicks for them and away they go".

Qualifying Final 1North Ballarat Rebels vs Sandringham Dragons

NORTH Ballarat went through the 2006 home and away season undefeated, but this year presents the Rebels with its best chance to win a premiership since its sole flag in 1997.

Admittedly, this year's Rebels have some gigantic shoes to fill as the '97 team included dual Brownlow Medallist Adam Goodes, Shane O'Bree, Shannon Watt and James Walker.

But, while North Ballarat dropped three games during the home and away season – two against Dandenong Stingrays – they have been dominant all year.

The Rebels have occupied top spot every round except one since Round 9 as they have defied the challenge from Gippsland Power to usurp them

North Ballarat chases a Preliminary Final berth when it goes head-to-head with reigning premiers Sandringham, which sealed the coveted double chance with its win against Oakleigh Chargers in the final home and away match.

Sandringham moved from fifth to fourth while Oakleigh tumbled from third to sixth.

While the Dragons endured two three game losing streaks during the season they were able to regroup and win pressure games at the end of the season.

Significantly, Sandringham



defeated Gippsland at Warrawee Park in Round 16 then returned to Oakleigh's home ground to inflict on the Chargers what could be a season defining win.

North Ballarat defeated Sandringham by 17-points in their only meeting during the season, but the win has to be put in perspective as it happened during the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships.

What could be an issue for Sandringham is their ability to apply scoreboard pressure. The Dragons have only one score line over eight goals in the past five games and that was its 12 goal haul against Oakleigh.

Conversely, the Dragon's defensive pressure has been one of its main characteristics this season. After coughing up 20-goals against Calder back in Round 9, Sandringham has not allowed a century score line kicked against them and in

eight of those games they've shackled the opposition to single digit goals.

Sandringham's defensive pressure when North Ballarat has possession will be critical. North Ballarat has kicked 14-goals or more in nine of its games.

And, while the Rebels keep the scoreboard ticking its ability to tighten the screws on rivals has seen it emerge as the best defensive club in the competition.

Apart from Dandenong, only two other clubs – Geelong and Murray - have kicked 10 goals or more against the Rebels in a match and both managed 11 goals.

In fact, so Scrooge-like have North Ballarat been that seven times they've restricted the opposition to five goals or less.

It's against that daunting backdrop that Sandringham somehow has to find an avenue to kick a winning score.

Certainly, that's going to be tough against North Ballarat team brimming with talent, including Vic Country representatives Matt Crouch, Nick Rippon, Michael Close, Tony Lockyer, Tanner Smith and Tyler Blake as well as well as Jake Lloyd.

Sandringham will need its stars Tom Temay, Tom Tyquin, James Stewart, Kenny Ong and Michael Barnes to reproduce their very best to stop the rampaging Rebels.

Qualifying Final 2 Gippsland Power vs Dandenong Stingrays

IS this the season that Dandenong Stingrays will bury its September demons?

Dandenong has been perennial finalists virtually from the TAC Cup's inaugural season, but repeatedly they've walked away with broken hearts.

Four times Dandenong has made the Grand Final, including three of the past seven seasons, only to watch in dismay as the opposition celebrated premiership jubilation.

One of those clubs to inflict such a torturous outcome is Gippsland Power, the club that the Stingrays meet in the Qualifying Final.

Gippsland emerged with a 15-point win in the 2005 Grand Final when the Power boasted Scott Pendlebury, Dale Thomas, Trent West, Xavier Ellis and Jay Neagle and Dandenong's team included Nathan Jones, Travis Tuck and Aaron Edwards.

That was in the past and both clubs will only be concerning themselves with what they can control – a direct passage to the Preliminary Final in a fortnight.

Not surprisingly, both clubs ooze class.

Lachie Whitfield, long touted as a top 10 selection at the upcoming NAB AFL Draft, headlines the Stingrays' team.

While Whitfield's talents are well known – he was an All Australian at the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships



- he's not alone in driving Dandenong towards its first ever premiership.

Dandenong had 11 players in the Vic Country squad. Whitfield and Taylor Garner were All Australians, and Nathan Wright must surely have been knocking on the door.

Gippsland also had a bevy of Vic Country representatives and

none better than Tim Membrey whose strong marking and four goals stood out against South Australia.

Ryley Hall is one of the best defenders in the TAC Cup and it will be interesting to see who coach Nick Stevens assigns Hall to shut down. Dandenong certainly have some key forwards in Jake Calvert and Matt Repnie

With Country representative
William Hams now back with
a couple of games behind
him and Nick Graham and
Shannen Lange in great touch,
Gippsland will be close to full
strength for this enthralling final.

Gippsland belted Dandenong by seven goals in Round 2 while the Power sneaked home with a four-point win in Round 12. That match was during the AFL Under 18 Championships when both clubs were well below top strength.

Apart from that narrow loss to Gippsland, Dandenong is in as good a form as any club. They've won seven of their past nine games with its biggest defeat a 14-point loss to Murray in Bushranger territory.

Hard also to find fault with Gippsland's form. Its only defeats for the season were a four-point loss to North Ballarat, a 45-point defeat by Murray and an 11-point loss to Sandringham.

Expect a tight match like the Round 12 encounter, but this time it may be Dandenong who emerge victorious.

Elimination Final 1 Murray Bushrangers vs Geelong Falcons

ELIMINATION finals combatants Murray **Bushrangers and Geelong** Falcons are no strangers to each other.

This will be the third meeting this season between the clubs with honours shared. For the loser the season will be over. for the victor the dream stays alive.

Murray won the first encounter by 34-points at the QE Oval in Round 4 on the back of a stunning seven goal haul from Cadeyn Williams, who unfortunately suffered a season-ending shoulder injury in his next game.

Just six rounds later, Geelong extracted revenge with a threepoint come from behind win at Highgate Reserve.

There was nothing in that match from the get-go and a similar scenario is expected in the Elimination Final.

Geelong's victory against Murray sparked a three game winning streak, the club's biggest run for the season and they've entered the finals trading wins and losses with a draw against Calder thrown in.

The Falcons' biggest scalp has been minor premiers North Ballarat in Round 11. but it was during the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships when both clubs had players representing Vic Country.

Last week Geelong started well against Dandenong and held a nine-point lead at half-time, but could manage just one goal

in the second half while the Stingrays added seven goals.

Murray comes into the finals on the back of a win against Eastern, but the Bushrangers' 19-point win was aided by the Ranges atrocious kicking for

The Bushrangers won two more games than Geelong and claimed more wins against finalists than the

Falcons. Twice they defeated Dandenong while also winning against Gippsland, Oakleigh and Sandringham.

While Murray had a small Vic Country representation it highlights how they climbed to fifth on an overall team effort than on the back of a handful of stars.

Kaiden Antonowicz has been the Bushrangers go-to-guy in attack. He finished third on the goal kicking ladder while Sam Martyn, a Vic Country representative, produced his best game post Championships last week against Eastern.

Murray has been good defensively all season. Just twice have they conceded century scorelines and that's tailored their game style as they're not prolific scorers themselves.

Geelong's ability to score has fluctuated. Eight times they've been held to 10 goals or less while they've kicked 11 goals or more nine times. The Falcons have spread their goals since Sam Gordon returned mid-season to Warrnambool

The Falcons will be looking for Country representatives Darcy Gardiner, James Tsitas, Zak Sherman and Lewis Taylor along with Tom Gribble and Daniel Watson to lead the way against a resilient Bushrangers.

Murray's overall strength may prevail in what promises to be another close match.

Elimination Final 2 Oakleigh Chargers vs Calder Cannons

CALDER Cannons begins its sudden-death mission to add to its imposing TAC Cup history with an Elimination Final showdown with Oakleigh Chargers.

The Cannons quest to claim its seventh premiership in the past 12 years revolves around it winning every match it contests over the next month.

But, there's no point Calder looking any further than toppling Oakleigh, last year's Grand Finalist.

Both Calder and the Chargers square off after dropping their respective final home and away matches against Western and Sandringham.

The challenge for Calder coach Marty Allison is to turn around a second half slump that has seen the Cannons spiral from third at the mid-point mark of the season to seventh.

During the second half of the season, Calder owned a record two wins and a draw from eight games.

Admittedly, some of those losses fell during the AFL Under 18 Championships, but every team had to deal with losing quality players as well as juggling school commitments.

Included among those losses was a 16-point defeat by Oakleigh back in Round 12, but more recently Calder has suffered back-to-back thumpings by North Ballarat Rebels (75-points) and Western Jets (58).

What was particularly disturbing



about the latest loss was that just 12-points separated the clubs at three-quarter time, but Western blew apart the match with a nine to one goal last quarter.

After kicking six century scorelines in the first nine rounds, Calder's goal-kicking ability has dried up. Its biggest goal haul in the second half of the season is 13 goals.

Oakleigh is not without its own worries. The Chargers have dropped two of its past four games against Gippsland Power (51-points) and Sandringham (24) while its wins were against Bendigo and Northern.

Apart from a 20-goal haul against the Pioneers, Oakleigh has also found it hard to

penetrate the opposition's defence. Outside the Bendigo game, the Chargers other three recent games have realised just 20 goals.

Both obviously need to lift, but that's one of the beauties of the finals – it's a compact new season when every club starts from scratch.

One of the pivotal players for Calder is Joe Daniher, who created such a huge impression in the final AFL Under 18 Championship match against West Australia.

Daniher has the ability to take control of games and if he gets into full swing early in the game then Calder will be hard to stop.

The Cannons will also be looking for their Vic Metro players – Jonathon O'Rourke, Darcy Bailey, Rory Atkins, Matthew Dick, Liam McBean and Lachlan Plowman - to provide the leadership in such a crunch situation.


Young Jack Billings and Luke McDonald gained All Australian honours after their triumphant AFL Under 18 Championships and they will be keys to Oakleigh's success.


