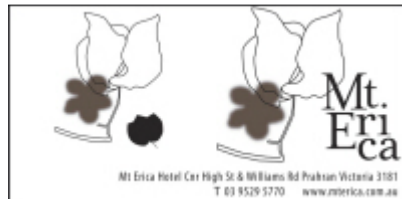

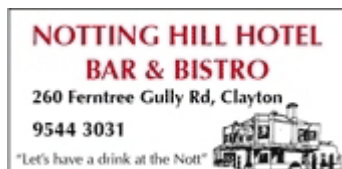

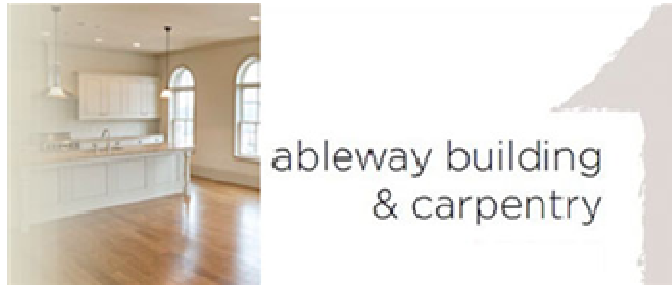

PRESIDENTS REPORT 2012 – RICHARD WILLIAMS

It is with great pleasure that I offer the 58th Annual Report of the De La Salle OCFC to members for their consideration. The preparation and compilation of this report is a culmination of the efforts of many people from within the club who have voluntarily given up their valuable time and on behalf of the club I would like to formally acknowledge and thank them for the tireless work. In no particular order: Treasurer Roy Meiklejohn; Secretary Simon Humphrey; club stalwart Col Glover; immediate past Secretary Bryan Moloney; and for his guidance throughout the year immediate past President Martin Kelliher.

Whilst I acknowledge the above for their work it would be remiss of me if I didn't also acknowledge our Committee. Their dedication to helping run and improve this wonderful club that we all enjoy is outstanding.

Football

Coaches

We entered the 2012 season guided by a settled coaching group with Greg entering his second year as Senior Coach; ably assisted by John McDonough, Damon Paull and Leigh Harrison who took on an assistant role while recovering from injury.

Our successful seconds coach, Dom McNerney, with the assistance of Lachie Walker, was looking to go back-to-back; Liam once again led the Thirds and Tommy Kovarik was also hoping to go back-to-back with the club XVIII. Mick Brown and brother Simon hoped to go one better this year with the U19 Blues, and the club welcomed Mick Hogan and Peter Harrington as our new U19 Golds coaches with a new appointment also of Sefton McGraw as U19 Football Manager.

Pre-Season

There was a real resolve from within the whole playing group to get our 2012 season off to a good start and we saw excellent numbers at most sessions, with a particular focus on improving fitness levels. Additionally, a lot of work went into rehabilitating players who had suffered injuries in 2011.

The efforts put in by Greg, John, Damon and in particular Michael Brown coordinating the fitness program was most impressive and we certainly saw the fruits of their collective efforts during the season.

Particular mention goes to Wayne McDonell who was present at almost every session, making sure water bottles were filled, equipment and footballs available. Great work Macca.

With the pre-season behind us and a fit playing group we had every reason to feel confident that all six teams were well placed to challenge for success in 2012.

Senior XVIII

After the disappointment of not playing finals in 2011, the senior playing group was determined to make sure that would not be the case in 2012.

Some 45 players represented the first XVIII this season, with the following players making their Senior debut: Sebastian Gotch, John Griffiths, Harry Haley, Ryan Harris, Matt Hine, Tyson Parker, Ben Pratt, Jake Williams and Luke Williams.

Unlike 2011, this large number was more a case of players deserving the opportunity, rather than necessity through injury and whilst at times throughout the season we couldn't get our best XVIII on the field, the depth we had developed over the past two seasons combined with the talent pushing up from our U19s held us in good stead.

The Seniors played some really exciting football at times and proved they deserved to be considered a real premiership threat. Possibly in the end it was our inconsistency that cost us the opportunity to secure the double chance. However, finishing third with a win/loss record at the end of the season proper of 12 wins/6 losses was nevertheless a good launching pad into the Premier finals series.

ITEM 6 - PRESIDENTS REPORT 2012 (cont'd)

All went to plan with an exciting win against Old Scotch in the first Semi final by 20 points. However, we failed to get over our next hurdle, Old Xaverians, in the Preliminary final. After leading by 26 points at 3/4 time, a disappointing final term saw the team lose by 14 points.

There is no doubt in anyone's mind that the Senior team has let slip an opportunity. As they themselves know; they were definitely good enough to go all the way. So they now need to discover where they must improve as a group and show the resolve and composure that was very evident from the opposition if they are to go further in 2013.

But we had another great group of players come in from the under 19s and also a group of players who'd previously played a lot of footy in the thirds in previous years to strengthen the side.

The team showed some great resilience during the year with many changes throughout because of injury and promotion and we were always able to find a way to win games when up against it and not necessarily playing the best brand of football. In fact our form throughout the year belied the top position on the ladder that we held for most of the year. We did however use 53 players during the season so were rarely able to have a settled line up.

It was great to see a number of twos players get their opportunity to play at the first grade level this year and show that the club is in a strong position with plenty of depth. Tyson Parker, Dan Close and Luke Williams, among others taking their chances this year.

Overall when you finish the home and away season with only two losses you can only be proud of the achievements of what this group was able to accomplish during the year. The character and hunger shown to win is really pleasing to have been a part of.

The finals series proved to be a very exciting three weeks of football. Having had the opportunity in the first quarter against Xavs in the 2nd semi final to ice the game, we kicked an incredible 2.11 and allowed them to stay in the game. We were pretty well outplayed for the remainder of the game, not taking our chances in front of goal and going into our shell playing safe football. But bad kicking is bad football and we paid dearly for it in the third and final quarters when they kicked 8 goals to take it away from us and put us in to a sudden death final against Old Collegians. We needed to be able to take our chances and play a more adventurous brand of football if we were to continue on in the finals.

James Hansen was again rewarded for his consistency sharing the runner up best and fairest with Tyson Parker who grew into his role at half forward and also earned his first games at the first grade level in season 2012

Peter Harrison once again provided tremendous leadership for the playing group. He provided a great example for the younger players and really helped the team gel and commit to the cause.

Once again Paul Lourey has provided a great support to the team and I. He commits every year to the twos without any fuss and I know that the boys truly appreciate his efforts.

To all the support staff – Laurie Dacey, our time keeper, the trainers, interchange stewards, timekeepers and, goal umpires who've taken time out to help this year, The playing group and I are thankful for your efforts in helping us to premiership success this year.

Thanks to Greg and the senior coaching staff for their support throughout the year, I'm sure with the planning and training that the senior group has put in so far, the first grade side will be ready for the ultimate club success in 2013. I'm sure they will develop even more next year.

Lachie Walker has once again put in a power of work with the twos and his contribution each week has been invaluable and greatly appreciated by the team and myself.

Thanks, finally, to all the players who came through the twos this year. I'm incredibly proud of the efforts and achievements we have made together over the last four years and Back-to-Back Flags is a great and well deserved reward. Congratulations!

The 2012 season started in late January with training twice a week. The attendance at pre season training was much better than last season and it was very encouraging to see so many new faces from the College and other clubs. The boys worked hard, particularly on their fitness, in the pre season months from January to late March.

The first of three practice matches was in late March and it became apparent in these matches that positions in the Blues team for Round One and beyond were going to be hard earned. With a list of over 50 Under 19 players the coaches had a wealth of depth to choose from consisting of both experienced and first year players.

With 13 players available from the losing 2011 Grand Final Team, we were confident that with the injection of new talent combined with the natural improvement of others that a top two finish by the end of the season should be a realistic goal.

We began the season very impressively defeating Old Scotch away by 69 points and the highlight of this day was the long awaited return to football of Brad Wilson who missed all of the 2011 season following a knee reconstruction. It was obvious from Round One that Brad was going to be a key player in our anticipated success.

In our first Home match for the season we demolished Beaumaris by 186 points with 11 different goal scorers and 8 classy goals from Luke Barda. One of few genuine tests for the boys came in Round 3 at Home vs St Bede's. We expected that they were keen to make a strong statement to the Under 19 Premier Competition about their finals plans and they certainly did from the first to the last bounce. Despite falling behind late into the last quarter, our boys managed to kick the last two goals of the match to register a 5-point victory in a classic Lasallian Derby.

In the following four rounds, the team continued their fine form defeating bottom teams with an average winning margin of 88 points. After seven rounds, we were undefeated and had already been well served by some of our leaders in Harry Haley, Sam Brooks, Matthew Hamilton, Michael Stizza, Joel Mattiske and Joshua Fisher.

Brad Wilson was getting better each week and Seb Gotch had made a huge impact as both a midfielder and small forward. Paul Johnson and Hamish Ramsay, both first year players at the club, had really impressed and both were well on their way to cementing their spots in our all-conquering team so far.

Having been untested for a month of football, the much-anticipated clash against the reigning premiers arrived in Round 8 at Stradbroke Park. Old Xaverians were also undefeated so the reward for the winner was bragging rights to top spot on the ladder. By half time of this high standard match, we had established a very handy 4-goal lead and had definitely played our best half of football for the season, especially considering the quality of the opposition. However, as all DLS football teams should know, a 24 point lead over Old Xavs in any stage of a match is never enough. The second half gave our boys another reminder about the importance of playing 4 quarters of sustained pressure football against them.

They out played us after the main break to record a rather comfortable 17-point victory. Any 7-goal turnaround in a half of football is not good but it was a very big reality check for the boys that Old Xaverians were still the measuring stick for Under 19 Premier Football in 2012.

One of the best parts of footy is that once defeated, you can very quickly move onto next week and set about returning to your winning ways. Waiting for us in Round 9 was our ACC crosstown rival, St Bernard's. They had made an impressive start to their season in the Premier division after promotion in 2011. This challenge from a new contender coincided with my six week departure to Europe to gain some intellectual property for my coaching career from other sporting clubs as well as searching for a revolutionary treatment for premature balding. Oh, and to have just a little bit of fun as well!

The head coaching duties stayed in the family with my brother and assistant coach, Simon "Plugger" Brown, entrusted with the responsibility of maintaining our position in the top two on the ladder.

Well, Plugger certainly responded well to his challenge and was presented with a hard fought 27-point win over the Snowdogs by 24 highly committed and resilient players. On the back of a superb team effort, the "Haley Brothers" certainly turned on a stellar brother act at Waverley Park with Charlie kicking 5 goals and Harry dominant in the midfield with his great endeavour, courage and inspirational acts. The only negative for the day was the loss of Hugh Nicholson very early in the match with a serious and mysterious leg injury that kept him out of action for 8 weeks.

This stirring win over St Bernard's certainly gave the boys great confidence and impetus for the next six weeks recording very convincing victories with our lowest winning margin being 44 points against Beaumaris on a day that we kicked just 11 goals and well over 20 behinds.

Other than the obvious unblemished coaching record of Plugger, the highlights of those six matches were: two 10 and one 9 goal hauls by the best small forward in the competition, Charlie Haley (Competition Leading Goalkicker for the season with 76 goals), James Howard booted 11 goals against Fitzroy at the Brunswick Street Oval just when he had been challenged by the coaches to prove to them and his team mates that he had a long term role in the team, our miserly backline continued to starve the opposition of opportunities without their Captain Brooks who had earned senior selection (played 8 matches in Premier A) and this period also saw the emergence of Jordy Bull as a big and versatile player who could play a key role at both ends of the ground as well as David "Pale Fist" Convery refusing to let the wind through the opposition goals.

With now sixteen rounds of the season played, we returned to the top of the ladder on percentage as Old Xavs had also lost one game. Round 17 saw us head to the claustrophobic capital of the VAFA, Brindisi Reserve, for the return Lasallian battle with St Bede's. It also marked my return to coaching following my overseas sojourn and in this time I realised how much I missed footy and in particular the great bunch of boys who proudly and bravely represent the DLSOCFC Under 19 Blues. With the team having powered to 7 straight victories in my absence, I'd be lying if I didn't admit that the pressure for the Head Coach to make it 8 in a row was pretty high.

Chock full of confidence from our recent dominant period, the boys produced a scintillating first quarter of football to lead by 5 goals. St Bede's hit back hard on their cosy little home patch and we held a narrow half time lead. The third quarter was a real arm wrestle and we still had a small buffer on the scoreboard at ¾ time. By the 20 minute mark of the final stanza, the boys had once again displayed great resolve and determination to shoot clear of a gallant opposition.

Even though we allowed them a couple of late goals, we held on for a gutsy 9-point victory. With two matches remaining before finals, we had now secured the vital double chance knowing that we would meet with Old Xavs in the Second Semi Final.

Whilst we did rest some key players over the remaining two matches, our finish to the season was a little disappointing. In Round 17, car pooling was all the rage for the longest road trip out to the "Snake Pit" to face St Bernard's on an arena better suited to mud wrestling. Despite a reasonable start, we were then clearly outplayed for 2 quarters but still found ourselves in the match a $\frac{3}{4}$ time. We constantly attacked for the first 15 minutes of the last quarter but only managed one goal and multiple behinds from our numerous scoring opportunities. Conversely, when the opposition went forward they converted and duly won the match by 20 points. Our biggest losing margin of the season and our smallest score as well, kicking just 4 goals for the match.

Our final match of the regular season provided a full dress rehearsal for the following week at home Vs Old Xaverians. We were now almost back to full strength and the coaches were keen to settle the team line up in preparation for the first final. In what proved to be a truly fitting "dead rubber", the intensity and fierce rivalry between them and us was not at its usual level on this day. Other than a brief period of 10 minutes in the 3rd quarter, the match was very even. However, Old Xavs really hurt us on the scoreboard in this time and this enabled them to win the match by 18 points.

As well as experiencing our second defeat at the hands of the titleholders, we hoped that our boys had learnt yet again that nothing short of a full four quarter effort is enough to beat the archrival. The positives from the match were that Nicholson got through his second match back from injury and Lucas Forato and Adrian Indovino were beginning to fit in well after their stints with the Oakleigh Chargers.

Other than our Co – Captain, Brooks (still on Senior Football duties) we fronted up at Trevor Barker Oval for our 3rd meeting with Old Xavs for the season in the Second Semi Final with the winner straight into the Grand Final. Just for a change, there was a strong 4 – 5 goal wind blowing straight down the ground away from the main grandstand end of the ground. Despite Matt Hamilton losing the toss and kicking against the wind in the first quarter, we only trailed by 8 points at the first break. We then produced a stunning quarter of football with our intensity, decision-making and execution all at their best. Old Xavs were making a lot of mistakes due to our relentless pressure on them whenever they did get possession of the ball. Those that were fortunate enough to see the first half of this match were treated to a master class of gut running and pure skill from Seb Gotch who kicked 5 goals playing as a midfielder and small forward. Coincidentally, we had established a 33-point lead at 1/2 time and once again we found ourselves in a great position to book a berth in the Grand Final.

The only negative from a super first half of football was the untimely loss of possibly our best back man in the opening half, Charlie Athanassiou. He was felled off the play and sustained serious facial injuries that sadly ended Charlie's finals campaign.

After kicking the opening two goals of the 3rd quarter into the wind, we had raced to a 41-point lead and appeared to be in total control of the match. What then took place from here for the remainder of the match, almost had to be seen to be believed. Just as Old Xavs began to seize control of the match and piling on 9 unanswered goals in the process, we lost three more players to match ending injuries to now have only 20 players available for the last quarter. We now trailed by 9 points but were kicking with the aid of the breeze.

Despite a gallant effort in the last quarter where we did close to within 5 points, Old Xavs had all the momentum and with their confidence sky high they booked their place in the Grand Final with a 10 point win after kicking 13 of the last 19 goals of the match. In a genuine match of "two halves", they were just too dominant for us and for longer.

As well as licking our wounds and counting our injuries post match, we now had to prepare for a Preliminary Final against St Bernard's. Earlier in the day, they had dismantled St Bede's in clinical fashion to the tune of 81 points.

The boys were able to very quickly turn their focus to winning the Preliminary Final as the reality that only a victory would extend the season and keep our premiership hopes alive.

The return of Sam Brooks and James Howard for this match certainly gave us more options at both ends of the ground and the injured players from the previous week managed to recover in time for the penultimate match. Another positive for the boys was that the match was to be played at Central Reserve, Glen Waverley, which meant that the negative thoughts about unsuccessful finals matches at Trevor Barker Oval could stay right there!

Buoyed by their First Semi Final win and the fact that they had beaten us just 3 weeks ago, St Bernard's went into the match with justifiable confidence and began accordingly. We held a 10-point lead at ¼ time and it seemed that it was going to be another tough day at the office for all concerned. However, in what has been described by many, especially some of the players, the DLS Blues produced possibly their most complete team effort and performance for the year with a 77 point thrashing of the 'Snowdogs'. Another than the emphatic manner in which we destroyed the opposition, the highlight of the match was the timely return to form by Hugh Nicholson with 9 goals from half forward. Unlike last year, we now looked forward to meeting the archrival again chock full of confidence on the back of a superb display of four-quarter football. We were on our way to the "Big Dance" again and the prospect of returning to Central Park for the Grand Final was "music to our ears".

Other than the unavailability of Charlie A for the Grand Final, the selectors had a full list to choose from and Liam Wood returned for the Grand Final after missing the previous week with an ankle injury. 10 players from our 2011 Grand Final Team were selected and given the opportunity for redemption against our archenemy. The coaches were thrown a curve ball on the Thursday evening before the Grand Final with news that Hugh Nicholson had injured his left thumb in a trade school mishap. Any doubt about Hugh taking his place in the team was quickly erased as he informed us "there is no way I will miss this match".

As you would expect, we went into the match with a wealth of knowledge about the strengths and weaknesses of our opposition. Sefton McGraw in his first year as an Under 19 player got the task again of shutting down their key playmaker on the wing. Sefton had a superb season as mainly a backman and nothing changed from the wing in both the Second Semi Final and Grand Final as he took the honours on both occasions. Joel Mattiske, who had also played most of the season in the back line, was given the task of shutting down their best midfielder who had played Senior Premier football this year and had caused us a lot of headaches in most games over the past two seasons.

On a perfect day for football at Central Park Reserve, the stage was set for a cracking Under 19 Premier Grand Final and the 48 players from both teams certainly didn't disappoint the large crowd. As we had done in all three previous encounters for the season, we began very well with our pressure and intensity fitting of a Grand Final and Old Xavs were getting very few easy possessions. Aided by our accurate kicking, we stretched our 18-point lead at ¼ time to a very handy 5 goal lead at ½ time.

We had winners all over the ground to half time with Oscar Persson working tirelessly at CHF and if not taking marks creating opportunities for the likes of Hugh Nicholson, Luke Barda and Charlie Haley. Yet again, we found ourselves in a very similar position against the defending champions and the big question at ½ time was "Would the Xavier Script Writer have his way again?"
