PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



2012 has been a very mixed year with many frustrations and much to reflect upon. The recommended Region led structure that Wellington, Hutt Valley, Kapi Mana, Kapiti and Wairarapa Centres moved into this year caused much angst as we all 'let go' of our respective competitions and development programmes and entered service agreements with the Region to 'get on and deliver it' for us. We had a few issues as new Region staff came to grips with the competition draw and our competition

rules. As with all new ventures the first year is a learning one and then it becomes progressively easier but unfortunately for Wellington that will not be the case. Netball has moved from a 12 Region model to a five Zone structure which incorporates the five ANZ Championship teams. We are part of Zone 3: Netball Central - Taranaki, Manawatu, Hawkes Bay, Wellington and the Pulse. Centres will remain autonomous and the Regions will be disestablished. Netball New Zealand says this restructure will be good for grass roots netball and that funding will return to the Centres. My comment to NNZ's statement is that Centres will always work hard for grass roots netball because that is what we are and that is where we come from. I also sincerely hope that funding does return to the Centres because right now it looks very bleak.

What this means for Netball Wellington Centre is that we will have to set up our office again and employ staff to run our competitions and programmes. The development and high performance programme for the five Wellington Centres will be delivered temporarily from Netball Central. The Board have a very busy time ahead; we have begun the process to employ staff and are prioritising our time and efforts so that we will be fully operational in the lead up to our Premier winter competition and have as many of our other programmes and competitions operating, as is possible.

On to brighter things our new ASB indoor stadium has been an absolute wonder for Wellington netball. The vision 12 years ago of an indoor facility that Netball Wellington Centre has fought long and hard for came true for our members this year. The fact that the ASB exists is a legacy to all those Netball Wellington members that believed and committed long hours to ensuring that Wellington netball would have a first class indoor facility. Alongside our normal netball programmes and competitions 2013 will see Wellington hosting two National tournaments at the ASB. For the majority of our Saturday competition it has been great just knowing that the weather will not be the deciding factor of whether we play. The new venue has also allowed the holiday programmes to be bigger and include more variety. Twilight continues to be both indoors and outdoors with the four pre-Christmas twilight competitions fully subscribed.

Our representative season was hard fought with good but varied results leading to their final tournaments. Congratulations to our U15 Wellington Black team who won the U15 regional tournament held in New Plymouth. Marcelle Parkes, Mila Reuelu-Buchanan and Rose-Ann Rikihana were named in the tournament team with Mila Reuelu-Buchanan named player of the tournament. The winning U15 team was coached by Sandra Edge and managed by Kelly Herbert. The U17 NNZ tournament was held in Christchurch this year and our Wellington U17 team came in 7th - congratulations to Monalisa Groom and Whitney Souness who were named in the tournament team. Special thank you to all our representative coaches and managers and also to the many people that make things happen in the background, in particular our parents.





Our club teams and one college team again dominated the Regional Super League (RSL) which was won by Wellington East who is also Netball Wellington Centre's Premier 1 winner for 2012. Wellington teams placed 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 5th and 6th in the RSL Division 1 and placed 3rd and 5th in Division 2. The Regional Secondary School League (RSSL) was a new initiative this year and our secondary school teams are also very competitive. In Division 1 Wellington college teams placed 1st, 3rd and 7th, in Division 2, Wellington teams placed 7th and 8th and in Division 3 Wellington teams placed 3rd, 6th and 8th. Wellington East Girls College and St Mary's College finished 2nd and 3rd at the Lower North Island Secondary Schools tournament and qualified for the New Zealand Secondary School Championships.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many people that have made 2012 possible.

I would like to thank Kim Whiteman and her staff at the Region for their hard work and the many long hours spent ensuring that Netball Wellington Centre's competitions and netball programmes were implemented well.

Finally to all Netball Wellington Centre members I thank you for another successful netball season and I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

She was named a member of the 1999 New Zealand Dream Team and is a MBE Recipient for services

to netball. She now resides in the Cook Islands where she continues to passionately contribute to the sport of netball at both a governance and grassroots level.



NETBALL OPERATIONS

2013 has been a year of change and challenges for Netball Wellington Centre. The competition and staff moved into their fabulous new home at the ASB Sports Centre and partnered with new sponsors Pak'nSave Kilbirnie and Gasworks in Miramar to bring you the Saturday competition. The Centre entered into a new service delivery saying goodbye to two key staff members, an in school programme for Year 1 - 3 and Year 9 & 10 started, and planning got underway for the new Netball New Zealand Zone structure. The year was bumpy but with many key learnings, constructive feedback and planning 2013 is shaping up to be exciting and well organised.

July saw the Wellington Black Under 15 Team return home victorious following a comprehensive win over Wanganui in the final at the Regional U15 Tournament coached again by the great Sandra Edge. Cityfitness assisted greatly with recognition for coaches, players and fundraising opportunities.



Margharet Matenga was inducted into the Wellington Sports Hall of Fame with the hall being officially opened at the ASB Sports Centre later in the year.

Top Wellington club sides again proved too strong in the Regional League with Wellington East 1 unbeaten on their journey to the final where they convincingly beat PIC Green.





Wellington East Girls' College took the honours in the newly established Regional Secondary School League off the back of their first year in the Regional Super League.

St Mary's College and Wellington East Girls' College both finished in the top three at the Lower North Island Secondary School tournament and are set to take on the best of the best at the New Zealand Secondary School Championships in October.

The ASB Sports Centre has been a hit with members who are not missing the wild winter weather. It has become home to staff, the Premier 1 to Collegiate 4 grades of the winter competition, year-round Twilight leagues, school holiday programmes, the Junior and Senior Netball Academy, Kids' Comp and club trainings. It also played host to the 2013 University Games, College Sport tournament, and some of the Regional Super League games.

Hataitai continues to be the home of the history, Collegiate 5 - 8 grades of the winter competition, trainings, coach and umpire courses, the inter-satellite competition and hosted the Marjorie Jenden Queen's Birthday Tournament. A project is currently underway in conjunction with the Wellington City Council, Sport Wellington and other key users to ascertain the long term viability of the Hataitai venue and a 10-year maintenance plan for the pavilion.



The relationship with our Satellites continues to grow with solid numbers at the coach and umpire courses on offer, Pulse visits, and the organisation of the inter-satellite competition.

Players, Coaches, Umpires and Managers continue to make their mark locally and nationally and acknowledge the part they all play in the success of netball at all levels.

Staff again completed a season in times of uncertainty and should be recognised for their determination to improve offerings and plan for 2013 without job security. The hard work of all the permanent and contract staff at Netball Wellington Region is pivotal in delivery of all the Centre programmes and competitions.

We thank all those volunteers including the Board and Life members who assisted throughout the season. Your contribution is greatly appreciated. A volunteer database is being established along with a list of opportunities and projects for 2013 and we would love to hear from anyone keen to be involved.

2013 is set to be exciting as we welcome new staff, continue to roll out new programmes and competitions including a Fast5 competition and host the National Under 23 and Under 19 tournaments in July. Hataitai Park

UMPIRES

The 2012 year has been a very successful season for the Wellington Umpires with a large number of umpires achieving umpiring qualifications and a number rewarded appointments to National Tournaments.



We attribute this success to not only the commitment of the umpires themselves but also to the work of a large base of volunteers who commit every Saturday to not only umpiring for themselves but also coaching or mentoring others. In addition to this there is also the work that the centre and regional panels do each weekend that goes far beyond expectations. We believe that the achievements are from the team work that the umpires group has developed and driven over the 2012 season.

The Umpire Executive Group was co-led by Holly Far and Jess Lea over the 2012 season. Their attention to detail and their need to have strong communication happening provided a good foundation for the

whole Group to work together cohesively and put in place some processes that were not there in 2011. This group of people once again volunteered not only on a Saturday but also to monthly meetings and, planning and running umpire skills sessions. They created an atmosphere that has been well received by all of the umpires.

This year we had great success in the theory arena with a 99% success rate. Kerryn Greaves agreed to come back and continue to build on her 100% success rate in the regional theory tutoring arena. All of the umpires felt valued and learnt so much from these sessions with Kerryn. Ann Hay tutored Jennifer Wray towards her NZ theory with a mighty pass received. One umpire sat their NZ theory but did not attend classes and unfortunately was not successful with a pass. This shows the importance of the classes and the valued added by both Ann and Kerryn.

The Wellington Centre umpires also assisted in the Kiwi Whistler programme in our Satellites. This meant eight weeks of theory classes and then the practical sessions on top of this. This was a great commitment and all but one person did this on a volunteer basis. They wanted to give back to the Satellite that gave them their start into umpiring which tells you

something about the umpires that we have in this centre - passionate and committed. The Kiwi Whistler programme was also run in Wellington Girls' College and this is something we would recommend building on in 2013 – offering it to the senior schools.

Theory and practical classes were run for clubs and also Motu Kairangi (MK) at the beginning of the season. This was compulsory for all Premier 1-2 players and also for all umpires at MK. These sessions are sometimes taxing as players are required to attend but Jess Lea (for club level) and Holly Far (for MK) managed to lift the attendees so that they are contributing and learning along the way.



It was impressive this year to see so many Umpires making themselves available for appointment to Year 7 & 8, U15 and the Lower North Island Secondary Schools Tournament. We were able to give all umpires that put their name forward at least one tournament and this was appreciated by the umpires. These tournaments are a great opportunity for umpires to shine and it was pleasing to see that some of our umpires were recognised with awards.





2012 Netball Wellington Centre Awards

This year there were many worthy candidates for the Centre's Contribution to Umpiring trophy for the 2012 season and it was hard to separate the work that both Anthony Karauria and Yvonne Small have done so it was jointly awarded.

Anthony dedicates a lot of his time to the development and support of umpires from Elementary through to NZ. He will be at the courts first thing in the morning right through to the last game to ensure all umpires are supported. He is the 'rock' that many an umpire would lean on and help them feel heard and understood. He had a great way of putting things into perspective. On top of the support he gives he also umpires most nights during the week at twilight and covers 2-3 games on a Saturday.



During 2012 the netball development programme at Netball Wellington Centre was overseen by the Netball Wellington Region Development Team. In this new structure we were fortunate to retain the knowledge and experience of Maria Hegarty, who transitioned from her role at Netball Wellington Centre into the Development Administrator position for the Region. The Regional office also retained the services of both Sandra Edge as Coach Development Officer and Sue Geale as Umpire Development Officer. They continued to work tirelessly to create meaningful opportunities for the region's coaches and umpires throughout 2012.

In the new structure we were also fortunate to have dedicated Player Development Officers, their roles focused on specific age groups. Rebecca Wills worked with the Intermediate/Junior secondary school age-group on regional projects and facilitated the Netball Wellington Centre player development programmes. Jo Paora worked with the primary school age-group on regional projects and facilitated the Netball Hutt Valley player development programmes. This approach increased our capability to implement in-school KiwiSport programmes, continue to visit schools on request and implement new player development opportunities. Evaluations of all our player development programmes have been conducted and the schools and parents have been impressed with the dedication and professionalism of Jo, Rebecca and development programme staff delivery.

This year has been about creating improved relationships with our stakeholders and providing them with more quality opportunities. Looking ahead to 2013 we have set a strong platform to build the capacity and develop our players, coaches, umpires and officials. We would like to thank all those involved with making this year's development programme a success.

JUNIOR NETBALL DEVELOPMENT

IN-SCHOOL KIWISPORT PROGRAMMES

Welly Ball (Year 1-3)

The Welly Ball programme involves introducing Fun Ferns into primary schools across the region and is linked to the NZ Health and Physical Education curriculum. Fun Ferns is a Netball New Zealand programme that focuses on the development of fundamental skills in a netball setting for Year 1-3 students. At the same time we have introduced a new 9-a-side game called Welly Ball that has been designed specifically for our Fun Ferns age group. Schools are provided with a resource and equipment pack to ensure the programme can continue to be delivered.

The Netball Wellington Centre schools that have taken part in the programme to date are: Brooklyn School, Churton Park School, Miramar Central School and Miramar North School.







Nek Net (Year 9 & 10)

The goal of the Nek Net programme is to increase player participation and level of skill through a modified netball game. Nek Net caters to both boys and girls to participate in an easy, fun, fast-paced environment. The Nek Net programme has been designed to incorporate the New Zealand Health & Physical Education Curriculum. Schools are provided with the resources and equipment to continue with the game at the conclusion of the programme.

The Netball Wellington Centre schools that have taken part in the programme to date are: Wellington East Girls' College, St Mary's College and St Catherine's College.

Jo Paora and Rebecca Wills facilitated the KiwiSport programmes and we have had excellent feedback from all the schools involved. Both programmes are funded by KiwiSport through Sport Wellington. Our thanks for their support throughout 2012.

JUNIOR NETBALL AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMMES

Pre-season Programme

The pre-season programme was based at Hataitai Netball courts over 6 weeks in March and April. The aim of the programme was to prepare players interested in trialling for the Year 7, 8 & Under 15 representative teams. It also gave the opportunity for players to get back into training mode heading into their school trials. Olivia Webb (2011 Under 15 Black Rep Assistant Coach) facilitated the programme and put together a resource to assist the players in assessing their fitness and looking at conditioning. The numbers were indicative of the interest in programmes of this nature, with 61 Year 7 & 8's and 49 Under 15s taking part.

Junior Netball Academy

In Term One of 2012 the Junior Netball Academy took place in Karori and at the ASB Sports Centre in Kilbirnie. As the interest in the Karori programme was on the decrease the decision was made to move the new look Term Two Junior Netball Academy to Netball Wellington Centre's new home base at the ASB Sports Centre. We saw an increase in attendance in Term Two and maintained this number in the Term Three programme. The new venue, format and content have been successful and we hope to offer an even better programme next year.

Netball Wellington Centre has had a great group of dedicated young coaches this year who have brought great energy and enthusiasm to this year's academy. Thank you to the parents of our Junior Academy attendees whose on-going support of this junior initiative is most appreciated and of course the participants who create fun while learning.





Senior Netball Academy

The Senior Netball Academy was a new initiative instigated in 2012. The large number of players trialling for the Under 15 Representative team prompted us to create a programme for players who made the call-back trial but were not selected in the final teams. There has been a large drop-off in players returning to trial for the Under 17 team and the Senior Netball Academy was set up to support players who show potential in developing their skills in a representative environment.

The Senior Netball Academy programme was facilitated by former Pulse player Cushla Lichtwark and former New Zealand Under-21 player Emma Weenink. The players also had the opportunity to receive a coaching session with 2012 Pulse players Amber Bellringer and Daya Wiffen. The feedback from parents and players was very positive and this programme will be considered in next year's development plan.

Off-Season Programme

Two very passionate U15 Rep Team Management members – Sandra Edge and Kelly Herbert – initiated two highly beneficial off-season development programmes held for four-weeks between October to December 2011. The first programme targeted those U15 representative players who were moving upward from the U15 representative teams into the U17 age group to prepare them for the higher level of skill required. The second programme aimed at assisting players who remained eligible for U15 age group level in 2012 to maintain their skills in preparation for the 2012 trials. Players were reminded of the importance of key off-season training concepts such as aerobic fitness, core stability and strength and muscular endurance. A big thank you to Sandra and Kelly for their fantastic efforts that received high praise from players and parents alike. Their efforts shone through in the high level of skill shown displayed by those U15 representative players who returned to trial in 2012.

REPRESENTATIVE NETBALL

On the back of success from both U17 & U15 teams in 2011, Netball Wellington Centre was excited for the 2012 season. Representative trials were communicated directly to all previous trialists, through each school Sport Coordinator and on the Netball Wellington Centre website. Sport Coordinators were contacted to request nominations and supplied with updates on players that had registered giving them the chance to follow-up with any that had failed to register. A total of 82 trialists registered for Under 15 and 27 trialists registered for Under 17. The available talent meant that there were sufficient players to form two Centre teams within each age group. All four representative teams attended tournaments throughout the lower North Island culminating in the national/regional tournaments held in July.

COACH DEVELOPMENT



Netball Wellington Centre (Incorporated) Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30th September 2012

Reporting Entity

Netball Wellington Centre (Incorporated) (the Centre) is an Incorporated Society reporting under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 and its Constitution.

Measurement Base

The accounting policies are inline with GAAP recommended by the New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants. Historical cost basis is used by the Centre for the measurement and reporting of income and expenses and financial position.

Differential Reporting

The Centre qualifies under the New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants' Framework for Differential Reporting as it is not publicly accountable, and is not large. The Centre has applied all Differential Reporting exemptions available to it.

Specific Accounting Policies

- (a) These financial statements include income and expenditure for the Centre only.
- (b) Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation has been calculated on either a straight line or a diminishing value basis. This is to write off fixed assets over their estimated economic life or lease life as follows:

Building	1-29% SL	and	10-20% DV
Equipment	9-36% DV	and	9.6-36% SL
Office Equipment	36% DV	and	10-36% SL
Uniforms	48% SL		

- (c) Accounts Receivable are stated at their expected realisable value after allowance for bad debts.
- (d) The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.
- (e) No taxation is provided for in the financial statements as the Centre is exempt from income tax under section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007.
- (f) Grant income is matched against expenditure incurred for that grant during the financial year. Where not all of a grant is spent by the end of the financial year, these unexpended funds are carried forward on the balance sheet into the subsequent financial year and matched to expenditure incurred during that year.
- (g) Operating lease payments, where the lessors effectively retain substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the lease items, are included in the determination of the operating surplus in equal instalments over the lease term.

Changes to Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in previous years.

10. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Netball Wellington Centre (Incorporated) has a service level agreement with Netball Wellington Region in regard to rent of the premises at the ASB Stadium, computer and other office expenses that are shared and, in the last 8 months of the year, staff and associated costs. In the year to 30 September 2012 this amounted to \$225,665 including GST where applicable (2011: nil). In addition, Netball Wellington Centre (Incorporated) paid affiliation fees to the Netball Wellington Region of \$91,432 including GST (2011: 93,761 including GST).

Netball Wellington Region applied for, and was successful, in obtaining grant funding to offset some of the above expenditure and for the 2012 year \$43,500 (2011: nil) was credited to Netball Wellington Centre (Incorporated). Consequently, Netball Wellington Centre (Incorporated) paid a total of \$273,594 to Netball Wellington Region for 2012 (2011: \$93,761).
