This was the 22nd North Australian Championships held at Mackay, and as a club we put in a fantastic effort to finish 4th overall, but did you know that as a club Mackay won the champion Club shield in 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995 and 2003, something for us strive for in the future. Mackay has been fortunate enough to have had great success in past North Aussie carnivals looking back on an old program from 2006 we have several competitors who made the list of "Top 50 Individual winners" including Paul Barker, Fred Harris, Rebecca Paskins, Peter Hynes, Greg Duncan, Alan Finch, Ellen Paskins, Michael Wilson and 2nd on the list as of 2006 Stephen Bird. It's great to see many of these members still competing and still adding to their medal tally. The club has also produced some worthy Age Champions prior to 2006 including 2003 u/19 male Kerry Clyde, 2004 open female Tennille Dorham and 2003 open Male Michael Read. So let's take a look at some events we have dominated in the past including the blue ribbon event of North Aussies the open men's ironman won in 1994 by Mark Burke, 1998 by Ryan Thomas, 2000 by Mat Doige and 2001, 2002 and 2003 by Michael Reed, Michael also won the U/19's ironman event also in 2001 and 2002 with Kerry Clyde taking the event in 2003. In the masters ranks Michael Wilson won in 1993 and 94 and Tony Weldon took the gold in the 2002 30-34 age category, 1997, 1998 and 2001 saw Peter Hynes win the 35-39yrs iron man with Michael Wilson taking the title in 2000, in the 40-44 iron man Steve Bird won the title 5 times from 1999 til 2003, in 1999 David Rossiter won the 45-49 age category and 50+ was won by Paul Barker in 1997 and 98. Deanne Johnson won the open iron women in 1992 and 93 and Desley Williams the 40+ in 1995. In the junior ranks, in 1996 Shaun Bright won U/16 ironman, u/18 ironman was won by Mark Burke in 1993 and Ryan Thomas in 1994 and 95. 1991 Marine Rogers took out u/12 ironwomen, 1993 Joel Lovett won U/12 ironman, 1995 Kylie Brand won the u/12 ironwomen and again as a u/13 in 1996 with Bridgett Woodman taking the u/13 race in 1992, and **Sally Eacott** also winning as a u/13 in 2006.

Ski events have also proven to be an area of success for Mackay, in the 30-34 age group **Steve Bird** won gold in the men's ski race in 1993 and **James Fell** in 2000, 35-39yr race was won by **Steve Bird** in 1994 and 96 **Michael Wilson** in 1997,1999 and 2000 and by **Greg Dorries** in 2005 and 2006. The 40-44 age group was taken out by Robert Forsyth in 1997, **Allan McSherry** in 1998 and **Steve Bird** from 1999 til 2003, Steve also won the 45-49yrs category from 2004 til 2006, with **David Rossiter** winning in 1999, **Alan McSherry** in 2000 and 2001and Rob Forsyth in 2002. 50years+ has seen a win from **Kev Couper** in 1993 and 94, **Paul Barker** in 1997 and 98 and Alan McSherry in 2005 and 2006. The u/19 ski was won by Paul McSherry in 2001, Michael Read 2002 and **Kerry Clyde** in 2003, and the no longer contested u/18 ski was won in 1994 by Mark Burke and 1995 by **Ryan Thomas. Lee Kynaston** won the open women's single ski in 1995.

Swimming greats from the past include u/11 winner Kylie Braund in 1994 and again as an U/13 in 96, Bridget Woodman U/13 winner in 1992, Shaun Bright u/11 winner in 1992, u/12's in 93 u/13's in 94 and u/16s in 96, with Adam Walker taking the u/13's in 1996 Brent Skudutis in 97 and Tom Connole u/16 winner in 2001. The open women's race in 1992 was won by Deanne Johnson and in 2003 by Ellie Miles. 30-34years surf race was won by Michael Wilson in 1993 and 95; 35-39years surf race was won in 1996 by Peter Hynes, 97 and 98 by Michael Wilson and in 2005 and 2006 by Greg Born who also took out the tube race in his category in 2004. 40-44years saw victories in 1997 by David Wilson, 2000, 2003 and 2004 by Peter Hynes, with 50+ winners including Peter Fenner in 1997 and Geoff Robson in 1994,95, 96, and 98. Tube Rescue winners also include Michael Wilson in1993,Geoff Robson in 1994, Anthony Carris in 2000, David Rossiter in 1997 and 99 Steve Bird in 1994 2001, Peter Fenner in 1998 and Paul Barker in 99. Past winning board competitors will see the familiar names of Steven bird winning his age group in 1993,94,96and 2002, Michael Wilson also winning his age category in 1995and 2000, Peter Hynes winner in 1998, Greg Dorries2006 and Paul Baker in 1997 and 98. The 2002 30-34years men's board race was won by Joseph Cali, 1992 open women's won by Deanne Johnson, 30-39years won by Jocelyn Gervais in 1993 and U/19s 2000 by Paul McSherry. In the junior races u/11 Callan Zahner took gold in 2003and again in u/12s in 2004 with Nathan Lyons winning u/13s in 2000. Joel Lovett won u/11s and 12s in 1992 and 93and Mathew Hare won u/13s in 1992. 2003 witnessed Hannah Ridland win the u/16s men's in 1994.

With many team gold medals also earned as a club you can see we have a strong competitive history in the water.

So let's move on and review some of our history on the beach and see how many names you may recognise from these results. Beach flags have seen some great results recently for our club, a game of speed, reaction, tactics and sheer luck. The open male beach flags winner in 2004 was Mitchell Coles; Mitchell also took the u/19s title in 2004 and 2005 with Luke Saunders winning u/19s in 2000. Open female winners include Ellen Paskins from 1994 until 1997 and Justine Brettell in 1998. In the Junior ranks U/ 11 wins were awarded to Kelly Alderman in 1991 and Ryan Jones in 1995, with Rebecca Paskins also winning u/11s in 1992, u/12s in 93 and u/14s in 95, another winner in u/12s in 1998 was Jane Duncan also taking the title in u/14s in 2000. The u/12 boys had wins in 1992 with Scott Saron also winning U/13s in 93 and U/14s in 94, Brent Hinchen in 93, Scott Gillis in 1997 also an u/13 winner in 98, Jyeran Blackman in 2004 and also u/14s in 2006 and Jaiden Hargrave in 2005 In the U/13 age group 1991 win was awarded to Lee Kynaston who repeated her win as an u/14 in 92. The under 13 boys saw wins from Anthony West in 1994 and again in u/14s in 95 as well as Alan Finch in 1997 and also again in u/14s in 98, whist u/14 female winners also includes Hannah Ridland in 2001. The under 16s has seen wins for Alan Finch in 2000 and Ellen Paskins in 92 and 93, Kim Kynaston in 94 and 95 Rebecca Paskins in 96 and 97 and Jane Duncan in 2002. U/ 15s Dylan Sadd in 2005, u/17s Jordon Doonan in 2006. In the Masters ranks the 30-34 years age group has witnessed wins to Fred Harris in 1993 and 95, Dave Horsenell in 94 and Joseph Cali in 2001. 35-39 years winners include David Saunders in 95, 96 and 97 and Fred Harris in 98, whilst the 45-49 years winners list includes Greg Duncan in 2001 and 2003. In the women's 35-39 years Vanessa Bampton was declared winner in 1991. On the Sprint track junior female winners include, Rebecca Paskins u/11s 1992, u/12s in 93, u/13s in 94 and u/14s in 95. Stacey Renehan U/11s in 93u/12s in 94u/13s in 95u/14s in 96. Lara Hill u/11s in 94, u/12s in 95u/13 in 96and u/14s in 97. Jacinta Croft u11s in 95 and u/13 in 97. Cora Doyle took out the u/11s in 2000, Hannah Ridland the u/13s in 2000 and u/14s in 2001. Margot Bird the u/13s in 2003 Jessica Keeton u/12s in 2000 Andrea Mezzen u/14s in 1991 and Lee Kynaston u/14s in 1992. In the junior boys Scott Saron U/11s in 1991, u/13s in 93 and u/14 in 94. John Fink u/11s in 1992u/13s in 94and u/14s in 95. U/11 winners also included Todd Crispin in 1995 and Nathan Lyons in 1998. Douglas Kynaston was the u/13 winner in 95 and u/14s in 96, Alan Finch also an u/13 winner in 97 and u/14 winner in 98, also winners in the u/13s were Reece Bailey in 1998 and Duane Moss in 2000 u/15s was won by Kelvin Nielsen in 2006. The u/ 16 age groups also witnessed wins by John Fink in 96 and 97, Alan Finch in 2000,, who also took out the u/19s in 2001 and 2002, Mitchell Coles in 2002 and Duane Moss in 2003 and the girls with wins in 1992 with Robhin Renehan, Ellen Paskins in 93, Kim Kynaston in 94, Stacey Renehan in 97 and Hannah Ridland in 2003. The opens men past winners include Ben Dobsen in 1993. Alister Wydell in 97 and again Allan Finch in 2002, whilst the women include Kelly Renehan in 1991, Deanne Johnsonin 92 and 93, Marissa Cant in 95 and Sarah Reneham in 98. In the masters divisions the 30-34 years have seen wins from Alister Wydell in 1997, the 35-39 years David Saunders in 1997 and Vanessa Bampton in 2001, the 40-44years Gregory Duncan in 99 and Colin Coles in 2002 and 2003, the 45-49years Greg Duncan in 2001, 2002 and 2003 and the 50+ Paul Barker in 1998. Along with these individual wins are several relay victories including the open women's relay won for 6 years in a row from 1993 til1998 and the prestigious all age beach relay won by Mackay for 7 years straight from 1992 til 1998.

R &R, perhaps a forgotten event by our modern day competitors, but at North Aussies of yesterday Mackay walked away victorious with wins including the junior 2 person R&R in 1993 and 94, the open 5 women R&R in 1994 and the open 5 person R&R in 1996 and 97.

So where are they all now? Well it's great to see so many of these names from the past still involved at Mackay Surf Club, with many still competing and continuing to add to their medal tally, some are coaching and training with our upcoming stars of the future, others have turned to official roles within the club and you may even find a former Surf Girl among them, importantly they have all done an excellent job representing Mackay in the past and serve as inspiration to our competitors of the future. Since the publication of the 2006 program we have continued to enjoy the success of gold and new age champions to join the list of names above we wish them luck as they continue their journey and perhaps we can read of their success in years to come.



Pool Rescue Competition



The North Australian Surf Life Saving Championships were off to a start on Friday with the Champion Lifesaver events in the morning, a combination of gruelling exams, R&R, beach and water events. Mackay member Zoe Breitkreutz collected Mackay's first medal of the carnival collecting gold in the u/14's.

The Pool Rescue events held at the Memorial Pool followed that afternoon. The juniors were the first to compete, they competed in the 50m brick carry, 100m obstacle and medley relay events. The under 14's also competed in the 50m manikin carry and 100m manikin tow. Mackay SLSC had several juniors competing; they all did a great job with Zoe collecting another medal with bronze in the 50m manikin carry. There was a lot of tough competition from northern clubs.

Later that afternoon it was time for the seniors to compete, for some events heat after heat, all you could hear was the frightening noise of the huge fibreglass fins slapping against the wall of the pool as competitors dived into the water. Seniors have several different events to juniors, they compete in the 100m obstacle, 50m manikin carry, 100m manikin carry with fins, 100m manikin tow with fins and the medley relays. The Mackay competitors competed well, collecting bronze in the U15-U17 Medley relay consisting of Maegan Cass, Jordan Chapman, Kaylarni Close and Erin Brotherson, Joe Cali also took bronze in the 100m manikin tow and Greg Born won silver in the 100m obstacle. After a long night of competing, the competition slowly came to an end. It was well dark when the last competitors left to rest and recover for all of the action to occur over the next two days, many thanks to Jenny Mac and Geoff Robson for again running the nool rescue clinic this year to help us prepare for this year's pool













Tige Conway picked up bronze in the 35-39 board and silver in the ironman. Peter Hynes won gold in the 50-54yr surf race and his iron man event. A special congratulations to the open men competitors who took part in their first North Aussies carnival, we look forward to watching you compete again next year.

A valiant effort by our all age relay team who made the final even after a little baton fumble. The weekend ran smoothly and was thoroughly enjoyed by all!



North Aussies is an event held at Mackay Harbour every year on the last weekend of October. The carnival is always a blast, and whilst everyone is thinking about the competition have you ever considered who takes the time to make it the carnival it is? Many people put weeks and months into organising this carnival so that is to the best advantage for its competitors, so let's take a look at behind the scenes and stop to thank the people that spend their time preparing this carnival. Although the Mackay Surf Club pays a very large role in the preparation of this carnival, it could not have been carried out without the help of some of the officials and the services that help to make this a great weekend.



Reginald Butler is one of the many officials that officiate at the North Australian Championships, Reg states that "To become an official it is really quite simple, all you have to do is take an officials course. When you head down onto the beach, you will be given an arena to work in and an activity to do such as a place to observe, results to record, etc. once you are in that arena all you really have to do is watch what others do and it will show you how to do your part. Once you have started and done it for a while it becomes really easy and it just becomes natural. As officials we have to set up our arenas and get the attention of the competitors so they all understanding what is going on." Reginald Butler is a life member of the Mackay Surf Life Saving Club, and is someone who is always around the club to lend a helping hand.

Another person who is a very big part of this carnival is announcer Marg Gutschlag, Marg has been an announcer at many carnivals, she says that "It's very easy to be an announcer when you know what you are doing, I have been on radio now for 10 years and it comes naturally. At carnivals like North Aussies, I announce the events and how long left until an event, sometimes I have to fight for the microphone but it's worth it." Marg is a very big part of North Aussies and helps it to run smoothly.





There are also many companies that are seen at North Aussies and provide us with refreshments and clothing. At the 2012 North Australian Championships there were a few small companies that attended including Dippin Dots, Kozii, The Coffee Van and a few others. The Kozii tent provided us with new swimmers and the opportunity to talk to new people. In the Kozii tent for 2012 was Ashleigh Adams. Ashleigh is also a Surf Life Saver and competes in the pool rescue events; she is a duel member with North Cliff and Townsville Picnic Bay. Ashleigh is a coach at Townsville for pool rescue and is still a competing athlete; she works for Kofi Australia in designing and selling new swimmers which allows her to travel around to all different north carnivals on behalf of Kozii Australia. At North Aussies, Koziis main goal is to be recognised by club designers. If we are recognised by them and they like our work then they generally hire us to create their club swimmers. Not only are we there for clubs but we are also there for the kids to look at new designs that Kozii has.' Ashleigh said.

Two other main groups of people that are at North Aussies every year, the Canteen and the Uniform shop without them we would never have had great clothes to sell or food to eat.

The Uniform shop is a way for the surf club to raise money; they sell clothing, towels, hats, and a few other things that are great for a large carnival like this one. They open up a few days before the carnival for our club members to get first pick of the merchandise and the gear is always fabulous. Running the uniform shop at this year's carnival was the one and only Joe Hargrave, she had many of other parents assisting her during the day which gave her a big helping hand but the shop would not have happened without her organisation.





Members of the Surf Club also ran the canteen at North Aussies. One of these people is Hannah Ridland. Hannah was the Mackay Surf Clubs last season's Miss Surf Girls and has been a member of the surf club for many years now, along with the current Surf Girl Starleigh Blackman, she ran the 2012 North Aussies carnival canteen with the help of some other parents from the club and it was a great success. 'Being in the canteen at North Aussies has some disadvantages like not being able to see the live action sometimes but it definitely does have its advantages. From the canteen you get to meet new people from other clubs and at the same time raise money for your own. You get to listen to what other clubs think of how it is running and sometimes you even get some tips on how to make it better.' Said one of the canteen volunteers.

And finally, someone who definitely puts in a lot of effort and time to making this carnival great is Mick Blair; Mick is one of the many people that help to set up the beach for this carnival. "It takes a lot of time and organisation to get this carnival ready with having to ask for permission for machines and tents to be on the beach and needing to apply for licenses. Then there is the preparation of the beach and getting companies to supply equipment, then rosters need to be worked out so that there are still work force around while the carnival is on" He said.
