Dear All Stars, Federation officials, parents and friends,

This newsletter contains information on your accommodation and travel times to Australia. Please print it out and keep it somewhere very safe, so you can refer to it as is needed.

Home Program Reporting Forms:

In the first newsletter I sent out, there was a reporting form on your home program. Every player is expected to fax or email me that form every 2 weeks, so I know that you are doing your training. I should have had report forms on 5th November and 19th November.

GUESS WHAT???

Only Perry Oiterong Palau, and Puraru Muri PNG, sent me their forms for 5th November.

I must stress the importance of your home training program. You all played against Australia at the Guam Youth Tournament. You know how physical and tough they were – well, can I tell you, every team we meet at the Under 20 Nationals will be just as tough. We need to be fit, we need to shoot accurately and we need to know the team plays as set out in your Players book. It is your responsibility to do the training and to send the information back to me. Just write your answers on the page, and fax it to me on 61 2 66586114. Easy, easy, easy – so let's do it please.

I want everyone's forms for 5th November, 19th November and 3rd December by next Thursday, 4th December – no excuses! If you want to remain in the All Star team, I need to get your forms!

Accommodation in Townsville:

Last week I travelled to Townsville to check on our accommodation and transport bookings, and to look at the stadium. I am pleased to report that everything is on track for a terrific tournament. The All Star players, coaches, managers and referees will be staying at:

The Villas is a small complex of 10 apartments. We will be the only people staying at the apartments, which will give us more freedom to come and go as we need to without disturbing other guests.



There are a combination of 1 and 2

bedroom apartments, each self contained with full kitchen and bathroom facilities. The apartments all overlook a very clean swimming pool, which will be very handy as the temperate in Townsville in February will be very similar to your own countries.

The managerial staff will prepare most of the meals for the players, but sometimes we will also eat out at restaurants and cafes. All of the meals, accommodation, transport and uniform costs will be covered by FIBA Oceania. Players will need a small amount of money to purchase souvenirs and gifts and any other things they might want to buy from the shops.

Uniforms Have been Ordered:

The 2009 Oceania All Star uniforms have been ordered, and they will look terrific. We always play in the colour purple, so we never clash with any other team at the tournament. As usual, I have included tropical flowers into the uniform to give it a true "Oceania" feel.

Players will be provided with a playing uniform and warm-up top, plus training singlet and shorts. You will need to bring additional training shorts and singlets, as you will be doing 2 x 2 hour training sessions each day, plus playing a game most nights (now, you will see why it is so important to do your fitness program, so you can keep up with this training schedule)



Parents can rest assured that your children will be well supervised and well

looked after during the tournament. Our staff will consist of at least 7 adults – myself, coaches Langomazino and Bonnet from Tahiti, coaches Ferris and Allen from Australia, manager Hattori from Guam, referee Kuartei from Palau, as well as Mrs Allen from Australia and perhaps Charlie and Marguerite from Tahiti.

All of us have a great deal of experience in taking young people on camp, and we all have very high standards of behaviour. Most of us have children of our own, and I know we will all treat your teenagers like we would our own.

This is our 4th All Star tour. In that time we have had only one incident of poor behaviour, and the player in question was immediately sent home.

I would urge you all to ensure that your son or daughter is undertaking their home fitness and home skills program on a regular basis. It is their responsibility, and therefore your responsibility, to ensure they arrive in Australia fit, and ready to play. They can only do this with regular and hard training in their home country. Please insist that your child does the training, and that they send their reports to me as has been requested.

You will see the travel itineraries of all players on the next page. You should note that either Katrina Ferris or myself will meet the PNG, Fiji, Tahitian and New Caledonian players on their arrival into Australia, and we will escort them to their domestic flights to Townsville. So please do not worry that your child might get lost in the big Australian airports, we will be there to meet them and travel on with them. Guam and Palau parents, your children already have 2 adults with them, and they only have to change flights in Cairns for a short flight to Townsville.

Finances:

FIBA Oceania will contribute about \$60,000AUD to the tour. Each participant on the tour is asked to contribute \$600 AUD to assist with the tour expenses. Just to remind everyone, this money must be paid into the FIBA Oceania bank by **16th January 2009**
