Both of these athletes have been playing in division 1 at Wanneroo & Districts Netball Association. Both had solid games after no doubt fighting back a little pre-game nerves. Wendy showed her athletic ability over the court with some great intercepts and speed making her hard to keep up with. Larissa with her height was a strong target in the shooting circle for the centre court and showed that she is going to be an asset in the shooting circle.

Emma Cosh also made her debut for Falcons after having moved to Perth from Geraldton where she played for Mid West Tigers. Coming back from injury Emma was allowed 1 quarter where she showed everyone how you put away the long shots with pin point accuracy. We look forward with anticipation to her full recovery.

After playing most of their games in Falcons reserves last year Numi Tupaea, Jess Eales and Tayla Grigg all had strong games making valuable contributions to the team. Jess in WD and Tayla in GK made numerous intercepts and drove the ball into attack strongly. Numi was hard to stop showing her creativity in the attacking end as WA and then C finding the circle edge and ensuring that the shooters were provided endless opportunity with the well placed balls she fed into them.

Gina Zupanovich who only 2 weeks ago celebrated her 17 birthday made her debut on the league court after having played a handful of games in the 18Under Falcons team last year. After a nervous start Gina found her rhythm and the circle edge delivering some well-placed balls into the shooters.

Veteran League athletes Alice Coakley, Denise Shepley and Club Captain Kate Schleicher showed their on-court leadership. Alice had a good game in GK getting lots of tips and some well-read intercepts. Relishing the opportunity to have a run at GD Alice consistently looked for the intercept opportunity.

Kate and Denise were exceptional supporting the new and younger athletes in the team providing them with lots of positives on court. Denise showed her athletic ability around the court using her speed and elevation to take some good intercepts in the forward court. This ability was not limited to the open court, delivering some strong circle work taking rebounds and producing a large shot load. Showing that she can be a play maker Denise combined well with the new circle shooters in the team and the young centre court around her.

Kate played a captains game showing her strong defensive and communication skills, providing lots of opportunity into the forward court. Setting the intensity and work rate for the game the team had no illusions as to what was expected of them. Showing great skill acquisition in both defence and attack Kate led by example for the four quarters continually providing support through the mid court when opportunity was denied by the opposition.

## 18's

#### Falcons 2013 Team

Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> February saw the early morning conditioning and skills sessions that begun in November 2012 finally put into a competitive game for the 18U athletes who were due to play the WATCO Wheatbelt Flames. For the majority of these athletes it was their first State League game in which they were representing West Coast Falcons. Arriving an hour before the game, saw the girls instructed to meet out the front in the foyer at the Arena, however with all the excitement and nerves of the first game they headed to the change rooms to listen to some tunes supplied by Emma Johnson before Lauren, Brooke and I entered to start the pregame chat.

Clearly it was nerves all round as the starting seven were read out, the coach decided to read out Breanna Peacock into the position of WD, sighs and laughter from the team made sure I was aware of the mistake and I quickly corrected myself!

We got out onto the court early, to prepare the bench, view the surrounds and gain control of the excitement and nerves for the upcoming game. The warm-up was strong and all players were focused and pumped for the first whistle that began the first game of Season 2013! What transpired in the first 8 minutes of the game boosted the confidence of the girls on the court and those on the bench. Each team was able to score off their first centre pass, but that's where it ended for Flames. Falcons were able to link five consecutive goals together before Flames were able to next score with the score 8-2 at the 8 minute mark in the first quarter. Falcons ended the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter ahead 14-8.

One change was made going into the second quarter (Anderson to GS), with the rest of the team left out on court to implement the feedback given to them. The quarter started with each team converting their own centre passes before Flames were able to intercept and string three goals in a row. There girls maintained their composure and finished in front 22-19.

The third quarter saw changes to most of the court (Peacock to GS, Faith to GA, Bailey to WA, Helen to C, Pow to GD). It took a while for the team to settle in and find their rhythm, with Flames making minimal changes and capitalising early and converting 4 goals in a row before the girls hit back, turning the ball over multiple times which enabled them to link 6 goals in a row! Both teams went one for one until the last minute of the quarter where Flames ran onto a 4 goal streak to draw the game 33-33.

Combination change in the last quarter (Bartels to C, Helen to WA) and the teams were goal for goal with Flames. Fatigue was setting in with an increase in turnovers occurring. The ball flew up to the attack end only for it then to be sent straight back down to the defense without a shot being put up. Falcons outscored Flames 10-5 to become eventual winners 43-38 to post their first win of the season!

It was great to be able to get all the athletes out on court for the first game and give them a taste of what the competition is like at State League level. It has given the girls the opportunity to put into practice what they have been working on for the last 3 months. The team showed great composure throughout the game, building upon turnovers and pushing forward as a group when Flames attempted to fight back.

A consistent effort from Amy Kennedy in the defensive circle, Emily Haywood picking off balls in the centre third and Breanna Peacock a strong target in the goal circle is just to highlight a few of the outstanding efforts on the night.


