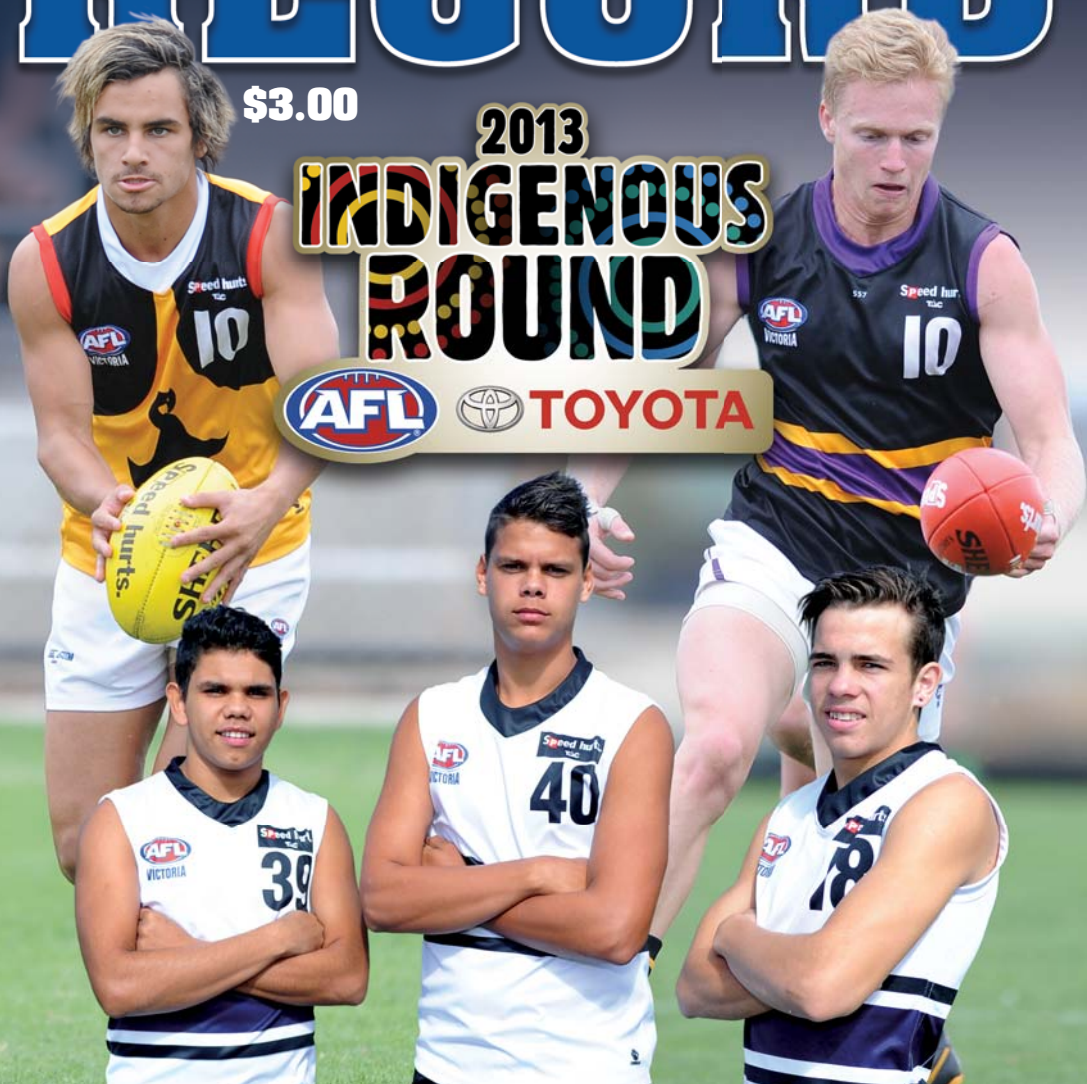

Indigenous round

IT'S been 20 years since Nicky Winmar stood defiantly at Victoria Park, raised his St Kilda jumper and proudly pointed to his identity.

Much has happened since that poignant moment in Australian football history, which still serves as a lasting symbol of resilience, determination and pride for many Indigenous people, but also for all Australians.

As we reflect on the trail blazers like Winmar and legends like Graham 'Polly' Farmer, Syd Jackson, Barry Cable, Gavin Wanganeen, Maurice Rioli and Michael Long, we can only marvel at the numerous Indigenous players that have excited and entertained football fans as well as helped grow our great game.

The AFL's Indigenous Round, highlighted by the Dreamtime at the G match on Saturday night, allows everyone to celebrate and share aspects of the Indigenous heritage, history and culture.

Certainly, Indigenous Round provides a fabulous opportunity to recognise, honor and salute the achievements and ever-increasing contribution Indigenous players have made.

At the AFL level this season there are more than 80 Indigenous players or, more significantly, 10 percent of club lists.

This involvement at the game's elite level is underpinned by the many programs and competitions throughout Victoria and Australia.

Earlier this year in Townsville a combined Victorian/Tasmanian U15 team made the national AFL KickStart Championship Grand Final where they were gallant in defeat against Western Australia.

It was an extension of the newly created High Performance Camp that provided 50 participants with fitness, skill testing and an introduction to the four pillars of Kickstart which include resilience, communication, identity and culture and decision making.

In addition, earlier this year, AFL Victoria announced the development and implementation of the Laguntas Indigenous Tigers program.

Supported by the AFL, the Korin Gomandji Institute (KGI) and AFL SportsReady, the aim of the program is to further develop the pathway to the AFL competition for Indigenous players in Victoria. In the future, it is planned that the program will provide training and education to support the off field development of up to 50 Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islanders annually.

This year the Laguntas Indigenous Tigers team play three games that will be incorporated into AFL Victoria's talent pathway program match schedule including playing against some TAC Cup sides.

In this edition of the Football Record Oakleigh Chargers' Jay Kennedy-Harris, the first Indigenous player to captain a TAC Cup team side, speaks about how beneficial the KickStart program has been to his career.

Kennedy-Harris this weekend will represent Vic Metro against Queensland in the opening match of the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

At Victoria Park on Saturday, the U15 Kickstart team will play the U16 Ahmed Saad Squad as a curtain raiser to the Collingwood/Essendon Peter Jackson VFL game.

Ultimately, AFL Victoria hope that our Indigenous programs will result in a better defined more inclusive pathway so more Indigenous people can be involved at all levels of the game, including the TAC Cup and Peter Jackson VFL competitions.

Victorian selection for Kennedy-Harris

AS he reflected on last year's exhilarating TAC Cup Grand Final, Jay Kennedy-Harris noted "some special things can happen in footy".

Kennedy-Harris, a first year science student at Melbourne University, is the co-captain of Oakleigh Chargers - the first Indigenous player to captain a TAC Cup club.

As well as his leadership role with Chargers, Kennedy-Harris is also in the Vic Metro squad, which this weekend will open its NAB AFL Under 18 Championship campaign in Brisbane.

He admits he's looking forward particularly to this weekend for many reasons, quite apart from the honor of representing Victoria on the national stage.

"To have the acknowledgement of the Indigenous contribution to the AFL recognized is pretty special," Kennedy-Harris said.

"I feel a little special being able to play for Victoria in this round. Football is pretty big in the Indigenous community and it's been a big part of my life.

"To be where I am now, I'm pretty proud of myself. Each step is a little closer to a childhood dream of playing AFL.

"Like a lot of Indigenous boys it is a pretty proud thing."

While he said he hasn't had what he would call a role model, Kennedy-Harris said he's taken great solace from some of his Indigenous peers like Jarman Impey and Clay McCartney, who also play in the TAC Cup.

He said the camaraderie of those and others helped him progress through the KickStart program.

"It's kept me going, kept me stepping it up," Kennedy-Harris said.

"I remember when Jarman and Clayton were part of the AIS (AFL Academy) squad and how proud I was that they had been able to do that.

"For us there hasn't been too many Indigenous players to look up to in Victoria. To start setting a new trend is pretty special. It's like we're starting a bit of a movement for the Indigenous talent in Victoria.

"I have a lot of recognition and respect for the KickStart program and what it's done for myself and the other boys coming up through the TAC Cup system."

The Kickstart program is for Indigenous players at the Under 15 level, which introduces them to an elite football environment and includes playing for the Flying Boomerangs, an all Indigenous team.

Kennedy-Harris said it had helped him with his leadership skills.

"We talk a lot about our culture and what it means to be an Indigenous person to each other," he said.

"I think it accelerated a lot of us in terms of our character and our footballing ability and I think it is starting to show with growing number of players starting to represent TAC Cup teams.

"I've been given a lot of opportunities, some of them I may not have deserved, so I feel pretty fortunate," he said.

"If you really want to reach somewhere you just work as hard as you can until you achieve it and then you set a new goal.

"You keep climbing until you can't climb any further. It is the best way to look at things, not just football."

Lang earns Big V

DEALING with disappointment is a life companion, football included.

Geelong Falcon's Darcy Lang had his heart set on representing Vic Country in the NAB AFL Under 16 Championships two years ago.

Lang moved through all the various stages and player cuts, but he fell one short.

"I was an emergency for the (Vic Country) Under 16s," Lang recalled on the eve of the start of the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships, which sees Vic Country travelling to the Northern Territory.

"I didn't get a call up. It was pretty disappointing at the time, but I'm in there now and it's a privilege to wear the Big V."

Lang said he didn't focus on gaining selection for the Championships at the start of the year with his concentration honed on playing well for the Falcons.

Lang described the season opener "as not great", but he quickly found form as he adjusted to his new role.

Falcons' coach Andrew Allthorpe moved Lang, who played every game as a bottom age player last year mainly as a forward into the midfield, a position he said he found a "little different".

The advice from the Falcons' coaches was that Lang needed to work on his "tank" so he could handle the transition to the midfield role.

After the opening game, Lang has averaged 20 plus possessions and proved one of the pivots to Geelong's unbeaten start to the season.

Lang said the unity within the team had been a great driver for the team success and the focus had been contained to each up-coming game.

But, Lang said he began thinking of the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships once the trial matches rolled around and he was among those trying out for a spot in the squad.

"Once the selection came up, I really wanted to make the team," he said.

"But, I didn't play as well as I would have liked in either of the trial games. I was hoping I'd done enough throughout the season to put my name up there.

"I've been trying to keep the form up week to week."

Like all players, several areas of the game were identified to Lang as aspects of the game he needed to address.

For Lang they were winning contested possession, improving his tackling numbers and defensive transition.

"I've been working pretty hard on them," Lang said.

It's been enough to impress Vic Country coach Mark Ellis and his co-selectors who included Lang in the squad.

Lang said he hopes the opportunity arises where he will get to wear the Big V jumper. It will expunge the disappointment from two years ago.



Laguntas Indigenous Tigers Program

In March, AFL Victoria announced the development and implementation of the Laguntas Indigenous Tigers program.

Supported by the AFL, the Korin Gomandji Institute (KGI) and AFL SportsReady, the aim of the program is to further develop the pathway to the AFL competition for Indigenous players, as well as providing training and education to support the off field development of up to 50 Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islanders annually.

AFL Victoria General Manager Grant Williams said the program will see the Laguntas Indigenous Tigers team play approximately three games that will be incorporated into

AFL Victoria's talent pathway program match schedule including playing against some TAC Cup sides.

"We have identified a gap that exists for Indigenous players aged between 16 and 19, so one of the aims of the program is to increase opportunities for young Indigenous players to enter AFL Victoria's talent pathway including the TAC Cup competition.

"Indigenous players already participating within a regional TAC Cup program will continue their involvement, however, if not selected they will have the opportunity to play with the Laguntas team and also be able to participate in the related off field development program that sits within it," Williams said.

"This is a program designed to strengthen the cultural connection to the talent pathway in Victoria and will assist with players committing and engaging in the program.

"All players representing the Laguntas team will be aligned to their respective AFL Victoria talent region which is determined by place of residence."

Significantly, AFL Victoria has seen an increase in the number of Indigenous boys participating in the twelve regional talent programs over recent years, a trend that AFL Victoria's Talent Managers would like to see continue.

"Our Talent Managers will play a key part in this new initiative in their role of developing talented young players in Victoria, however their task is often challenging given the number of overall participants in the state and the scale of the community League and Club network."

The team will utilise the Korin Gamadjji Institute facilities based at Richmond Football Club while at the same time undertake accredited education and



training facilitated by AFL SportsReady. The program will not only engage 40 young Indigenous men in a high performance football development program, but also provide 10 Indigenous staff with career pathway opportunities in team support roles to facilitate the management and administration of athlete preparation, education and coaching.

The program will be led by AFL Victoria's State League & Talent Manager John Hook, who along with AFL Victoria's Indigenous Programs Manager Aaron Clark and other stakeholders have already contributed significantly to the development of this all-Indigenous Under 18 team. The concept received positive support when discussed at the inaugural Indigenous State Gathering held last September at the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup Grand Final day.

"The State Gathering provided 140 Indigenous players and their families an opportunity to provide feedback of their experiences within the Victorian football network," Clark said.

"The majority of those that attended were already on TAC Cup and VFL lists or were a part of Indigenous programs offered by AFL Victoria, so the aim was to educate key individuals within our programs about the opportunities offered to them, in a bid to have these insights filtered out to other people within their communities."

Clark believes the new program will complement the

successful U15 Kickstart program, which saw five Victorian boys form part of the National Flying Boomerangs team, and will help increase Indigenous participation across all levels of the game in Victoria.

Earlier in the year over 100 Indigenous participants trialled for the Kickstart program with a final squad attending the National Kickstart Carnival in April. Showing great improvement from previous years, the Victorian/Tasmanian side came runner-up in the Championship.

"Last year we saw 29 Indigenous players within the TAC Cup and VFL competitions.

"Also introductory level Indigenous participation in NAB AFL Auskick increased last year with five new Koori Auskick centres established in Mildura, Ballarat, the City of Hume, Bairnsdale and Dandenong," Clark said.

"The addition of the Barrowarn Program last year has added five full time Indigenous trainees within AFL Victoria's regional development network with the aim to increase football engagement amongst regional Indigenous communities including Shepparton, Morwell, Dandenong, Ballarat and Mildura.

"The trainees work closely with AFL Victoria staff in each region and assist them across the areas of NAB AFL Auskick, engagement with local football clubs and leagues, talent identification, welfare/community services and administration."

VIC Country kicks off Championship

A supremely talented Victoria Country squad will travel to Darwin this weekend to tackle Northern Territory in Round 1 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Eleven players from the Geelong Falcons and 10 from the Gippsland Power are in the final squad of 40 players, and are likely to lead Vic Country's charge in the Top End.

The squad boasts several members of the AIS-AFL Academy, with classy Falcons on-ballers Lewis Taylor and James Tsitas, and Dandenong Southern Stingrays speedster Billy Hartung, likely to play crucial roles in Vic Country's engine room.

The trio are likely to be rested from the Northern Territory clash to give some of the squad's younger and less experienced players a chance to shine at the national level.

Murray Bushrangers clearance king Nick Holman and Bendigo Pioneers inside-midfielder Jake Maher are likely to benefit from the absence of some of the more high-profile names, while Zachary Merrett (Sandringham Dragons) will line-up thanks to his Cobden origins.

North Ballarat Rebels tough-nut Matt Crouch has a broken hand and will miss the opening matches of the Championships but remains a chance to line-up in the Division One encounters, which begin in mid June.

Fellow AIS-AFL Academy members Dallas Willsmore (Rebels) Hugh Goddard (Falcons) could join forces in what looms as a forward line brimming with talent.

Victoria Country's forward setup will also benefit from the services of Power gun Josh Scott, and Stingrays live-wire Clay McCartney.

Scott sits at the top of the TAC Cup goalkickers list with 26 majors from six matches so far this season, while McCartney (14) has also proved difficult match-ups for opposition defenders.

Other players to watch include Bushrangers excitement machine Jarman Impey, Power big man Jack Leslie and elusive Pioneers runner Isaiah Miller.

The squad also contains plenty of key position talent with Falcons defenders Jye Cross and Fraser Fort, tipped to join teammate and AIS Academy member Darcy Gardiner in the key position posts.

Vic Country will play five games in total over six weeks, with their next match following the Northern Territory clash, scheduled for Saturday June 9 at Visy Park against Tasmania – see full fixture below.

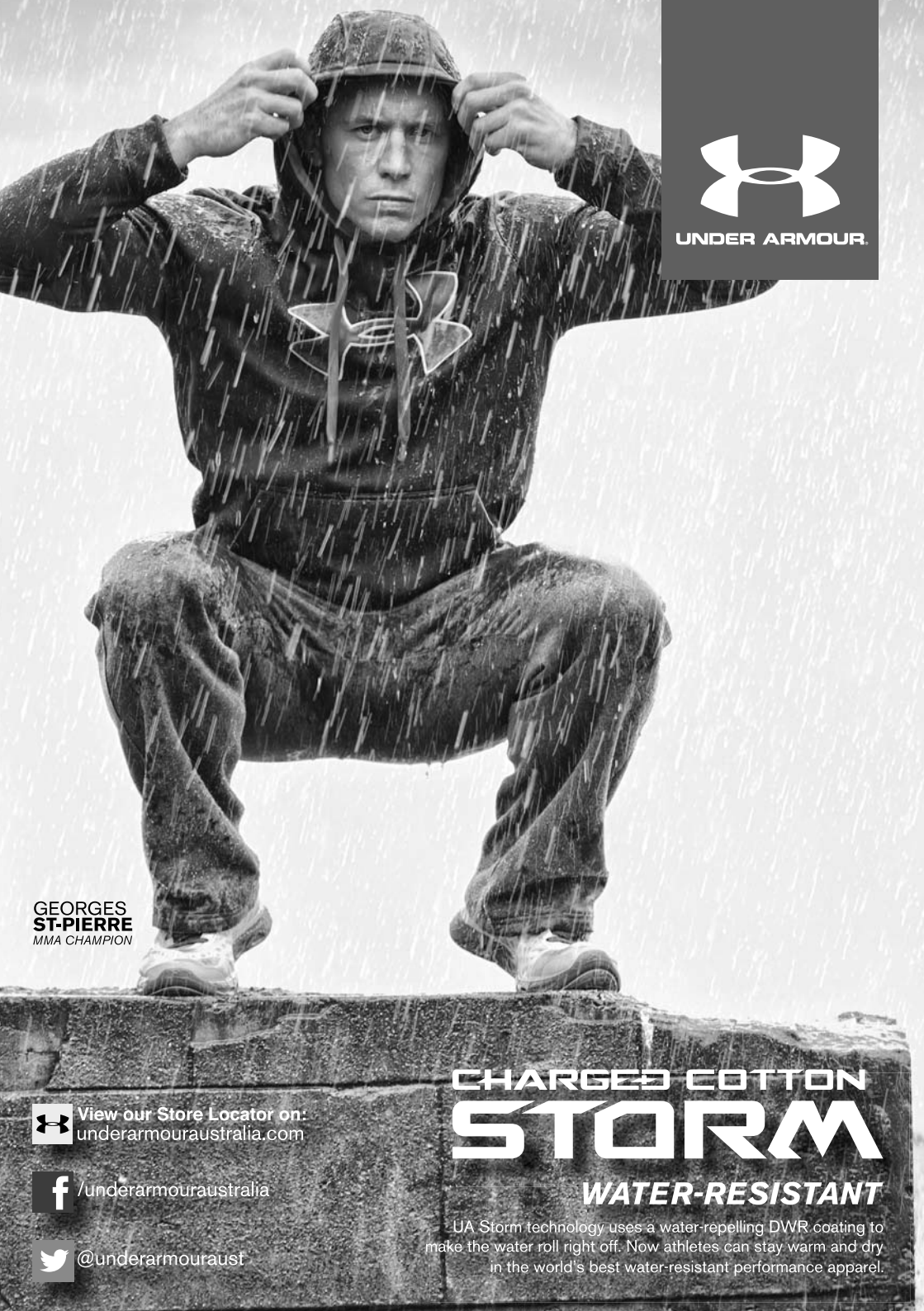

WorkSafe Country Championships

The reputation of leagues across country Victoria go on the line this weekend as the WorkSafe Country Championships take centre stage. With the addition of the Warrnambool and District league and the Colac and District league to the program of matches this year, 34 competitions will go to battle for bragging rights and the chance to climb the WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country rankings.

At the pointy end of the rankings ladder, the Goulburn Valley league will be out to clinch their fourth consecutive interleague title when they travel to Simonds Stadium to tackle the Geelong Football League.

The Purples have defended their title in Shepparton for the past two years but will need to produce their very best if they hope to overcome an ambitious Geelong side at home.

Geelong's quest for the No.1 ranking has been gaining

momentum for three years after overcoming Bendigo in 2011 and Ballarat in 2012, while the Purples will rely heavily on host of seasoned interleague campaigners to remain at the top.

The highly-rated Ovens and Murray league will start slight favourite in the battle for third spot with the Mornington Peninsula Nepean league's Peninsula Division at Visy Park.

The MPNFL fell just short in the title match last year – playing as combined side of its three divisions – but will rely on the strength of solely its Peninsula Division this year to remain in the top four.

The battle for fifth spot looms as one of the most heated contests of the weekend with traditional rivals, the Ballarat league and the Bendigo league, going head-to-head with city pride on the line.

A big crowd is expected at Ballarat's Eastern Oval for the clash on Saturday afternoon as the hosts' try and stem the tide of consecutive interleague losses that has seen them slip from second to fifth in two years.

Another grudge match looms in Swan Hill when the Mallee league goes in search of a third-straight upset win over a more fancied rival when they take on the Central Murray league.

Mallee surprised everyone but themselves when they knocked off the Wimmera league in 2012, a year after outpointing close neighbour the North Central league.

The Murray league will also be one to watch this weekend when they host the Bellarine league at Tocumwal, hoping to restore its reputation after copping a hiding at the hands of the Sunraysia league last year.

The men from Mildura will have the longest trip of the weekend this year, enduring a 13-hour round trip to Warrnambool to take on the Hampden league for seventh spot.

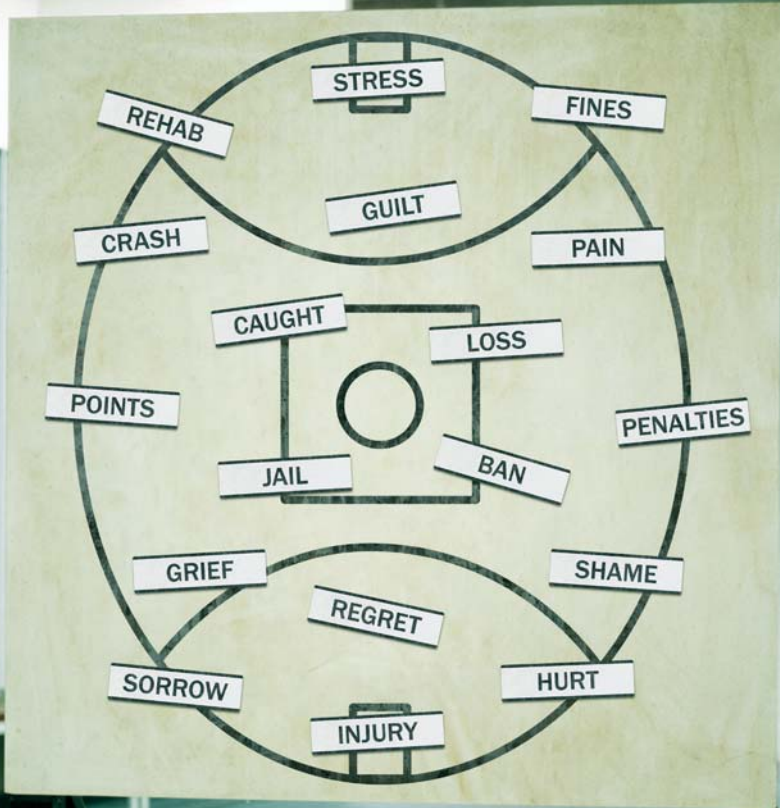
