RIVALRY ROUND

IF the Mid SE had made one change to last weekend's round, then it would have been a true rivalry round.

If Nangwarry had been granted the bye, then the two northern teams in the competition in Hatherleigh and Robe would have been playing each other. As it was, the Eagles played the Saints and one team remains undefeated and one team remains without a win.

The other three matches were true derbies with Tantanoola finishing poorly against cross town rivals Mt Burr.

For the first time ever, Glencoe retained the Max Matthews Memorial Cup and Kalangadoo also remains without a win.

Reigning premiers Port MacDonnell easily kept the Bruce Lightbody Memorial Shield at Kongorong with visiting ruckman Will Macdonald pocketing yet another John Rogers Memorial Medal.

Perhaps Craig Lock will get the call-up to A Grade as he is a quality footballer.

Likewise, Kalangadoo players still won't get to sing their song this afternoon at home to Tantanoola.

Mt Burr supporters have finally seen a winning team as the Mossies will again finish ahead of Robe.

The match of the day will be at the Bay when top team Hatherleigh takes on the Bay Boys.

Gee whiz, this match is just too close to call and I will opt

for the comparative safe prediction based on the home ground advantage.

WELCOME TO PETER DEMPSEY

FORMER Kongorong and East Gambier champion player Peter Dempsey has joined the noble ranks of the scribes with his views now appearing each week in The Border Watch and the weekly Budget of the Western Border Football League.

His first column had the following statement about the Western Border:

"I have no doubt clubs of other leagues will be watching with interest and the enticement to be part of the premier league and I can see an eight team competition in the near future".

I can respond to him with the well-chosen words which were once used in the House of Commons by a famous British Prime Minister:

"No, no, no".

I cannot see any of our nine Mid SE clubs joining the Super Duper Premier League, Penola obviously want to stay in the KNTFL and I don't reckon the other closest clubs of that league in Lucindale, Kybybolite or Naracoorte are keen to move either.

That leaves perhaps Sandford and Dartmoor to be the two clubs to bring the Super Duper Premier League up to eight clubs.

League has had a lop-sided competition since it was formed in 1964.

Penola and Heywood never went top; Millicent has won just one flag in almost half a century while the Casterton tally is only two.

As it came into its 46th season in the Western Border, West Gambier had only a solitary premiership pennant on the wall.

Coleraine managed one flag in 20 years and then departed the WBFL.

Compare that record with the Mid SE where eight of our clubs went top in a nine year period from 1998-2006.

Should we change the successful structure of the Mid SE? "No, no, no".

FOOTY DIGEST

THE South Australian Country Football Digest was published

last year with oodles of information about the Mid South East Football League.

It has 391 pages of SA country football history, records, stories and photographs that will appeal to anyone with an interest in football at any level.

Author Peter Lines has also published two editions of the history of the Mail Medal.

There are a few errors and omissions but most footy supporters could happily spend a couple of hours with their noses in it.

One of the bigger boo-boos was to write that Kevin Dinnison has been the secretary of the wait-for-it, Kongorong Football Club since 1974.

When he took up his role, I was still wearing my high-cut Blue Star footy boots from the Rossiter's Factory at Unley!

As we all know, K.D. is a

Nangwarry Saint and is within striking distance of the all-time SA club secretary record of 45 years.

It is held by Merv Lehmann who was at the helm of the Robertstown Football Club from 1958 to 2002.

What are some of the records of note from the SA Country Football Digest?

The late Stan Jones was captain of the Glencoe Football Club for 11 years from 1949 to 1960 with a break only in 1952.

He is commemorated in the Mid SE with the medal awarded to the best-on-ground in our A Grade grand final.

The late Phil Muhovics is also commemorated on grand final day with a medal bearing his name awarded to the premier-ship coach.

He was an A Grade footy coach for 17 seasons at Glencoe, Robe, Nangwarry and East Gambier.

This is the same number of seasons as current Pioneers basketball coach and SANFL premiership player Richard Hill.

He took Port MacDonnell top in his sole season in charge in 1979 as well as coaching Millicent's last premiership side in 1984.

Hill also coached Onkaparinga Valley and Hahndorf.

Among the others to give long service as coaches are Andrew Bromley (10 seasons with Kongorong, East Gambier and Tantanoola), the late Barry Walker (8 seasons with Beachport, Mt Burr and Hatherleigh), the late Stan Jones (7 seasons with Glencoe), Roger Doody (6 seasons with Kalangadoo) and Peter Ey (6 seasons with Glencoe).

The leading grand final winners are Glencoe trio Jerry Phelan (9 flags), Max Childs (8) and Stan Jones (7).

Among the rare members of the 1,000 goal club are Michael Timms (Robe, Nangwarry, Port MacDonnell, Tarpeena and South Gambier), Peter Ey (Kalangadoo, Tantanoola and Glencoe) and Greg Cotton (Kalangadoo, Strathalbyn, Lang-horne Creek and Reynella).

The late Phil Scanlon kicked

nine goals in Glencoe's losing grand final team against Kalangadoo in 1983.

This is believed to be the highest recorded in the Mid SE.

In terms of B&F trophies, Michael Jones has 10 with successes at Glencoe, Penola, Kongorong and East Gambier.

I reckon he might have won at least one more in the South West District Football League but the SA Country Football Digest does not take in Victoria.

Under the curious title of "Country Footballers Who Excelled In Other Areas", we read of Peter Agars, formerly of the Glencoe Football Club.

His claim to fame is that he was the World President of the International Federation of Accountants from 1992-95.

The others on the list from the Mid SE are Hatherleigh's Nash Chambers (musician), Tantanoola's "The Honourable" Bob Sneath (retired politician) and Mt Burr's Leith Forrest (Adelaide newspaper journalist and radio announcer).

Our late, departed Tarpeena Football Club endured 121 consecutive losses from 1993-2001 when they broke the drought at the expense of Hatherleigh's Peter Zeitz.

You might like to remind Zeitsy of this fact when you next call in at his excellent Periwinkles Café at the Bay.

I am sure there will be quite a few flat whites served up at his café today.

You might also like to ask him about his role in the 1993 premiership team with Murray Bridge Imperials in the River Murray Football League.

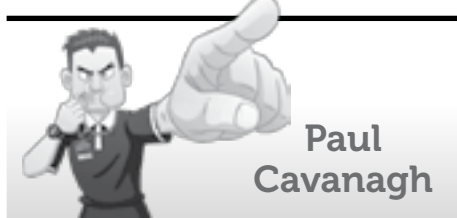

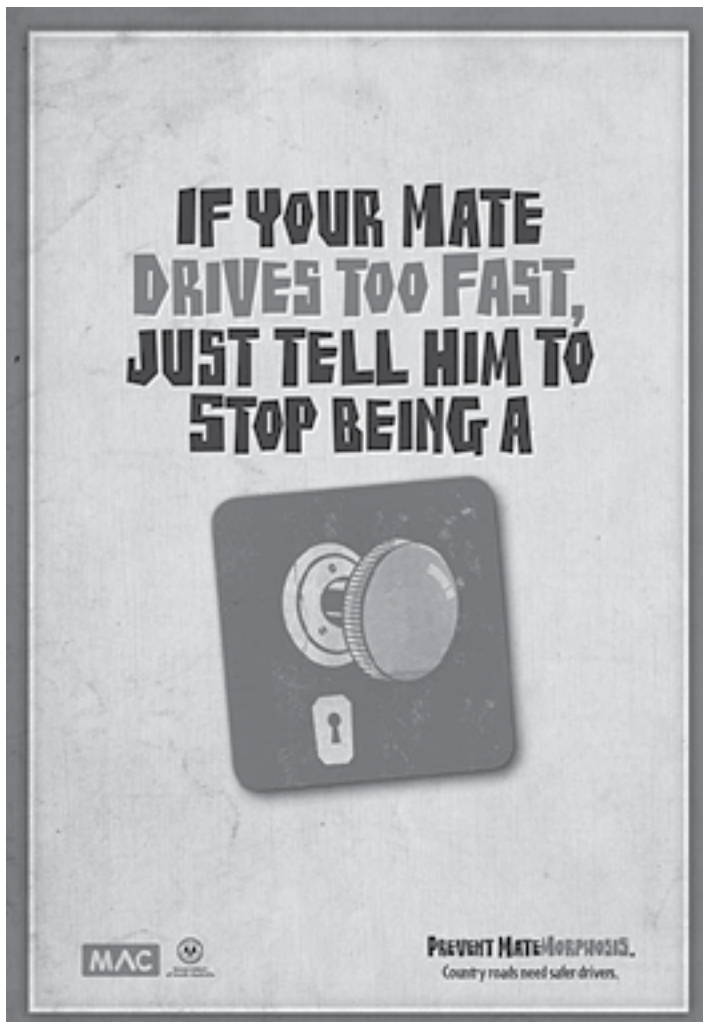
