The Mozzies put together consecutive wins at the expense of Robe and can now take a fortnight's break from Saturday competition. That being said, there should still be plenty of track work still being undertaken at "Mick" and Jean Walker Oval to make up for the low-key summer training regime.

The Mitchells

Peter Mitchell (senior) and his winning grand final team from 1963 will be at Glencoe today as they celebrate 50 years since that 31 point win over Port MacDonnell.

He won the 1958 Mail Medal and was a key member of his club's dominant teams in the 1950s and 1960s.

Strangely, the Murphies went through the 1970s without a flag and then his son Peter Mitchell (junior) kicked three goals in the 1985 season decider to end a 17 year premiership drought.

Peter (junior) has been the Mid SE president since 2009

Their son Bradley made his A Grade debut last month.

For the record, Glencoe defeated Port Mac in the 1963 grand final 11.15 to 7.8.

The two teams had also met the previous year and the result was also a triumph for the Murphies over the Demons. The score was 12.14 to 10.13.

The Demons contested their third consecutive grand final in 1964 and defeated the Tarpeena Canaries 10.6 to 5.14.

The Scanlons

After serving as an infantryman with the 2nd/27th Battalion (AIF) during World War Two, the late Bill Scanlon played in at least one of Tantanoola's two post-war premierships.

His son Terry was a dual Tiger premiership player in 1973 and 1975.

Terry's son Tim went with a whisker of being a third generation Scanlon to play in a Mid

SE premiership team in 2001.

Tim played his junior footy at Hatherleigh but was playing for Nangwarry 12 years ago as his brother-in-law Leigh "Leroy" Capewell was the coach.

The Saints tied the grand final at Mt Burr and Kalangadoo then won the replay and so Tim Scanlon was denied this rare feat.

The Skeers

Leading Hatherleigh and Mid SE goalkicker Jack Skeer shares the passion for footy with his grandfather Brian Skeer.

One of Brian's many contributions to the Eagles was his ability to be both a player and a club president while aged in his early twenties.

His first stint at the helm came in 1965 and he had further years as president in the early 1980s after he had retired as a player.

We don't have any playing presidents currently in the Mid SE other than Shane Ploenges (Nangwarry) and Jack Perkins (Robe) who pull on the boots

The Pratts

Kalangadoo's James (Jags) Pratt is the son of ex-Magpie coach and president Nicky Pratt and the grandson of the late Jim Pratt, a Mail Medal winning rover with Blyth in the North Eastern Football League in the 1960s

Lazarus/Allen

Gary "The General" Lazarus played 132 times for Fitzroy in the VFL and was a premiership playing coach and league medallist with East Gambier in the Western Border. He also coached Millicent, Tarpeena and Port MacDonnell.

His grandson Nick Allen played his formative years at the Bay and also some A Grade football

He joined West Gambier in 2012 and is really making a mark in A Grade performances.

Walker/Wight

Brad Wight, 16, made his A Grade debut for Hatherleigh on the recent opening day of the 2013 season

Long-time MSEFL followers would be interested to know that Brad's late maternal grandfather was Barry Walker.

He won Mail Medals at Mt Burr (1964) and Hatherleigh (1970) and was a life member of the Mozzies, the Eagles and the MSEFL.

Barry also coached for a total of eight seasons at Beachport, Hatherleigh and Mt Burr.

The Murdochs

We are basking in the knowledge that the Murdoch brothers, Jordan and Brodie, are now fully fledged AFL footballers with Geelong and St Kilda respectively.

Mid SE buffs also know that their dad Roger kept wearing red and blue colours with the Norwood Redlegs, Port Mac Demons and the West Gambier Roos.

Family patriarch Bill Murdoch has a few claims to fame in country footy including six Mail Medals in the Murray Lands Football League between 1952 and 1961

Just two seasons ago and at the age of 81, Murdoch accepted the role of A Grade coach with Pinnaroo in the Mallee Football League.

The role was non-playing!

The Von Duves

A sad event each year brings Kevin "Joe" Von Duve (senior) and the members of his clan to the Tantanoola/Glencoe match at Tigerland.

They honour the memory of one of his sons, Neil, who died of a brain tumour several years ago.

Although the Von Duves are most closely associated with Glencoe, Joe's grandsons have played at other Mid SE clubs and in Mount Gambier.

The Seebohm connection

Last year, Mt Burr UFC life member Noel Seebohm and his wife Pat were rightly on the front page of The Advertiser as their grand daughter Emily Seebohm (OAM) had swum so well in the London Olympics Games

Their grandsons Nathan and Jordan Muhovics are currently in the Mossies senior teams.

Another grandson of Noel and Pat is Simon Hughes but he is not playing at Mt Burr at present.

He has collected three A Grade premiership medallions to date with the Mozzies.

As with many other Mid SE footballers, his body bares a permanent reminder of the winning years.

Max Matthews Memorial

Ever since 2009, the Magpies and the Murphies have honoured the memory of "Spud" at their annual Glencoe meeting with a shield and B.O.G. medal.

"Spud" played with both clubs during a long career.

His grandson Jed Matthews, son Trevor, has presented his grandpa's B.O.G. medal for the past five years.

In his fourth game against Port Melbourne, Brodie was very good and was taken from the field just after half time to do a full recovery ready to travel to New Zealand with the senior squad. The historic first game for points off Australian soil against the might of the Sydney Swans on ANZAC Day became Brodie's debut. This was an incredible experience for Brodie, realising his boyhood dream of playing AFL football.

Brodie's journey has been very exciting for the whole Port Mac community and we congratulate him and wish him well for not only the rest of the season but his future career.

JUNIOR FOOTY UPDATE

Junior Football Margin Rule

AT the recent executive meeting the 60 point margin in our junior competition was discussed. The rule was introduced to minimise the number of one sided results and to have more games that are evenly contested each week.

Coaches are responsible for managing their players and I have seen many excellent player exchanges where the players are able to participate in a game where increased numbers of players are able to benefit from the support provided by the stronger team. Players from the winning team also benefit from playing a more competitive game and learning how to play under increased pressure. Coaches that lend some of their better players to the weaker team are able to create games where play is contested and the skills of the participants are developed.

The rule ensures no side is advantaged by games with large margins against weaker opposition and the final positions on the ladder will be determined from the results when the stronger teams play each other. Recently in the press the rule was highlighted without the writer seeking an explanation for the rule and its operation. In short, the margin for any junior game cannot exceed 60 points for the determination of percentage. When a margin over 60 points occurs, the total points for the game are halved, with 30 points added to the winning side and 30 subtracted for the loser. This is the second year the rule has been in operation and my thanks go to the coaches that have applied this rule in the spirit of its intentions and creating more competitive games for our junior footballers each week.





THIS Saturday against Nangwary Nat Scott will play her 100th game for Tantanoola.



Congratulations Nat on 100 senior games for Tantanoola.






