ROUND EIGHT PREVIEW

GLENCOE hosts the match-of-the-day for the second time in the space of three weeks.

It remains to be seen if the Murphies can match the skills and hard-running of the Eagles which have been their hall-marks in 2013.

The visitors have "lost" just a handful of quarters this season but they have won many more at a gallop.

As we approach the half-way mark of the season, we will invariably talk about minor premierships and double chances.

Whatever way you look at it, Hatherleigh are favourites.

A big flock of Eagles used their bye a week ago to make the long trip to the Bay to check out other likely finalists.

The heart-and-soul of the Mt Burr Football Club is thankfully back on deck and I am not referring to any player.

Club life member Aileen Bellman is again filling the time-keeping duties after being indisposed.

At the end of each quarter of the Mozzies home ground match against Nangwarry, Aileen will blow the siren and the adjacent scoreboard will show a handsome Mt Burr lead.

The Saints have given up all hope of securing Tyson Ploenges from West Gambier while ex-captain Matt Fatchen is still on the injured list.

Mt Burr was not overly impressive against Kalangadoo a week ago and, with injured spearhead Chris Murray on the sidelines, no player bagged more than three goals.

On the other hand, Nang-

warry did well to overcome a 41 point half-time deficit to Robe and tie the scores just before the final siren.

The two seaside clubs meet at Guichen Bay and I don't expect Robe's winning streak to continue and so neither will Port MacDonnell's losing streak.

Tantanoola's expected win at home over Kongorong will just about end the finals' hopes of the Hawks.

They have suffered heavy losses against three of the competition heavyweights and it is hard to see this trend coming to an end.

It was good for the Roosters to break the ice.

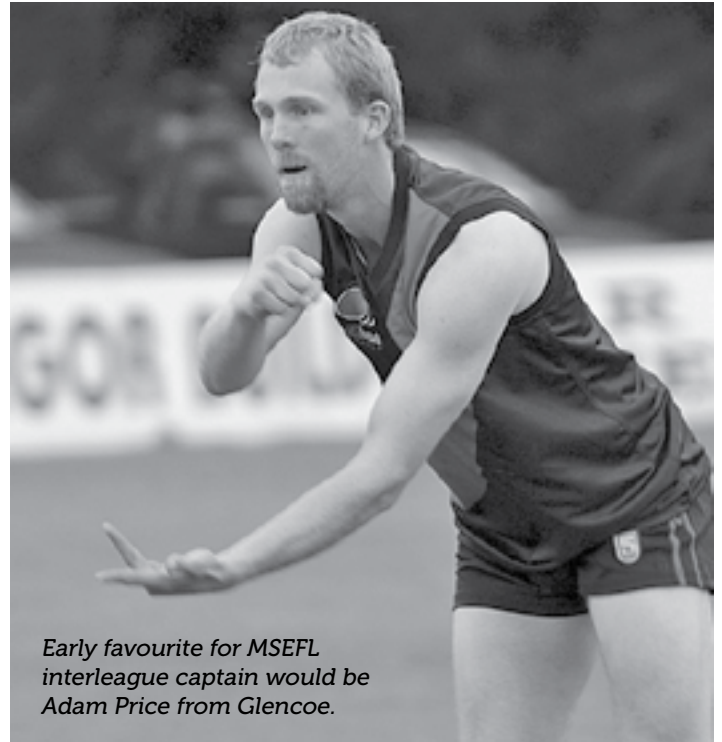
The Glencoe outfit was terrific from the get-go at Kongorong and won by 66 points.

Here is my player-by-player summary.

Kieselbach would be leading the first ruck in many country competitions in this state and beyond. It is only the superb form of Will Macdonald that is keeping him in the forward pocket.

Skeer: The title of leading Mid SE goalscorer is well deserved by a teen who is in only his second full season in A Grade after his schooling in Adelaide. After six rounds, Skeer had kicked more than any other player in more than 20 country and near-city competitions in South Australia.

Phillips: One of the recruits of the year and leaving East Gambier with his two brothers. Pace and strength as well as the goal sense of his father David.

Gallio: This young bloke said it perfectly on an interview with Milo on Radio 5SE a few weeks ago.

The Mossies have given him the opportunity to play in four grand finals and win three flags and he reckons he owes a debt to the club. I just wish other



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players around country SA had this view.

Bromley: As good a centre half forward as you will see. He has the happy knack of playing in winning grand finals.

J. Williams: One of the surprise packets for the Tigers in 2013 and is playing a consistent brand of footy.

Muhovics: Has been one of the quickest players in the Mid SE ever since he made his A Grade debut quite a few seasons ago.

McGregor: They have quite a few Supermacs at the Bay and he is one of the best. A tough and skilled competitor with a big heart.

Sullivan: Approaching his best form after injuries restricted him in his return to the Mid SE in 2012. He won the coveted Corcoran Medal as Millicent's B&F in 2011.

Fatchen: Missed the past few weeks with injury and the selectors won't risk him if he is not 100%. Club officials don't expect him to resume until later next month.

Pearce: The absolute heart and soul of the Robe Football Club. It is quite a few seasons since we have seen a centre half back of his ilk.

Watson: A similar type of player to Fatchen and another who is under an injury cloud.

Z. Williams: Not your average type of back pocket as he has the pace of a wingman or a forward. A cool head means he can often avoid panicking in defence and can set up attacking moves instead.

Price: This man should be the on-field leader of the Mid SE. While in his teens, he was vice-captain of the Murphies. Some men are born leaders and he is one such man. A problem with a driving muscle has caused him to miss a few matches.

Cocks: Back pocket is where this dynamo began his career. He could also be used on the ball or in attack. Like all defenders or ex-backmen, he loves to get among the goalkickers.

Macdonald: Simply the best

player in the Mid SE over the past five years.

Saffin: An ideal ruck-rover and my pick to be vice-captain to Price.

Saunders: In career best form and perhaps destined for footy beyond our competition and our region.

INTERCHANGE:

Bennett is a big chance to start in the first 18 and his best class is absolutely first class.

Last year, he represented the Western Border Football League when it still had nine clubs.

O'Dine is one of the two East Gambier brothers who have helped to turn around the fortunes of the Demons in the past four seasons.

Hennink was a member of Mt Burr's last premierships team in 2011 and can be used in a variety of roles down back.

Tincknell won the "Farmer" Phil Scanlon Rookie of the Year Award last year and is a classy forward.

Fabris is part of the renowned Hatherleigh on-ball brigade of Ciaran Buckley, Saunders and Sullivan.

Stone has been an outstanding performer in Kalangadoo's otherwise lacklustre season. The speedy flanker joined the Magpies in 2011.

Murray is a past winner of the goal kicking trophies in both the Mid SE and the Western Border (when it had ten clubs). He can be a match-winner as he has the capacity to produce purple patches of play. Missed last week's win at Kalangadoo.

Povey is a hard-at-it Demon who has contributed much to his team's success.

Hale is a versatile young Tiger, who can be used in various roles.

Schulz is one of the youngest and speediest of the Hatherleigh line-up.

Merrett is set to take over the reins of the Nangwarry Football Club in 2014. He has only shown glimpses of his best form this year.

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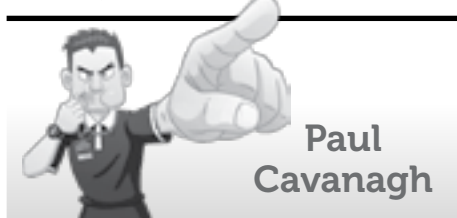

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VALE: MICHAEL PETERSEN

MICHAEL Petersen ("Tige") did an apprenticeship as a carpenter, and with the help of a few others, rebuilt Darwin after Cyclone Tracey. He played football for North Adelaide Reserves in SANFL, Athelstone in SAFA, and at Apsley. He moved to Robe in the early 80s, where he lived and worked until his passing on Friday 10th May 2013.

Michael was a big man - tall - and indeed "larger than life". His recounting of his days in Darwin show that he was never backward at coming forward. As a footballer he was a formidable opponent, and if not for his "carnival knees", he would have continued to play longer. Michael was passionate about football - all aspects of the game. He coached Robe, and was an executive member of the league. He promoted interleague matches, and locally, organised some "memorable" end of season trips. Not that any of us who went along can actually remember much about them - apart from vague recollections of Riverland hotels, and lakes full of yabbies near Apsley, and fireside gatherings, and male bonding sessions, that included instructions on how to successfully rebuild cyclone damaged cities.


Michael was a proud man. He took great pride in his work, and his appearance. His home was immaculate inside and out. He always strived to be the top dog. Coming second wasn't an option. Michael was one of the first people in Robe to have a mobile phone. His "brick" was mounted in his work ute, and connected to the horn, so that he would easily hear an incoming call on the work site. Michael, I have a confession to make (and only now am I game enough to do it). I was the one who watched you climb to the top of the roof trusses, and back down to your ute to answer the phone, twice, when I called from a landline from where I could see you at work, and you couldn't see me. It was an opportunity too good to pass up at the time. I'm sure you would have done the same to me, had you had the opportunity.

Michael wasn't perfect. Not many of us are - I met a perfect person once, and after two minutes we had nothing to talk about. But I accepted Michael's imperfections, as he did mine. But I don't think he accepted his own. If I needed help, and went to Michael, he would give it. But I think that Michael's pride prevented him asking for help. His pride wouldn't allow it. His pride insisted he maintain control - to keep up the appearance he was on top of things.

Michael's sudden passing has made me think about how I relate to others around me. I think that out of all this negativity, there is a positive. I think we have to cut through the defensive "veneers" we put around us, and when we greet someone we care about with the usual "how ya going," we should really listen for an answer to the question.

"Tige", I hope, where-ever you are, the "Saints" are kicking goals, and every games' a winner.

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WE MUST GET SMARTER ABOUT MULTI-MEDIA &

TODAY'S society is consumed with multi-media and technology that enhances our lives in many ways, however with the integration of these methods of communication into our lifestyle, misuse and a lack of education as to the hazards of these technologies is sometimes overlooked.

Social networking sites like Facebook, MySpace, Twitter and YouTube can be a great way for clubs to provide information, promote their sport, their activities and successes.

Fortunately for our League the misuse of various forms of social media extending into the sporting environment has been minimal. However with the ever increasing use of mobile phones and social media (Facebook, Twitter etc.) being evident at club, league and umpiring level, the Community Football League recognises the serious aspects of inappropriate use of social media, websites, etc, and have introduced the SA Community Football League Cyber Safety Policy to cater for investigating and penalising the proven misuse of social media when it relates to the Community Football League environment.

As with off-line communities, some social media users can act anti-socially and show disrespect for their online community with little consideration of the social and potentially legal implications. Issues like bullying and harassment, unwanted or inappropriate contact, uploading of inappropriate or offensive content can cause issues for individual club members or the club involved.

In the club environment you may choose to promote cyber-safety by recommending to your members to:

- Use the privacy settings.
- Keep your private information private.
- Think before you post any content, video, images or text online. You can put it up, but you can't necessarily take it down.

Ask before posting images or stories about others. What you see as harmless fun may be embarrassing and humiliating for them and create a poor club image.

- Don't project on undesirable self-image of yourself or the club.
- Choose your online friends wisely. Others' inappropriate views and behaviours can reflect badly on you and the club.
- Communicate with others as you would do offline, with courtesy and respect.
- If you think someone is being bullied or harassed online, speak out. If club members are involved speak with your coach or club official. The club will not tolerate this behaviour.

Below is the SA Community Football League's (SACFL) Cyber Safety Policy. As the MSEFL and all Affiliated Clubs are governed by the SACFL, this policy relates to each and every one of us. Please take the time to read and comprehend the policy. Should you feel that you or someone you know have been a victim of misuse or it becomes a problem in the future, please either contact your Club Executive or the League Secretary.

SA Community Football League CYBER SAFETY POLICY

Rationale

THE SA Community Football League (SACFL) has an obligation to maintain a safe physical and emotional environment for league officials, staff, registered players, umpires, coaches, club members, parents, spectators and sponsors.

This responsibility is increasingly being linked to the use of the Internet and Information & Communication Technologies (ICT), and has seen the emergence of a number of related Cybersafety issues. The Internet and ICT devices/equipment bring great

benefits to all users and to the effective operation of the SACFL, individual leagues and clubs.

The SACFL places a high priority on the acceptable use of ICT devices/equipment which will benefit members however; it recognises that the presence in the sporting arena of these technologies can also facilitate anti-social, inappropriate, and even illegal behaviour and activities. The SACFL aims, therefore, to maximise the benefits of these technologies, while at the same time to minimise the dangers and manage the risks.

Policy

THE SACFL and its member clubs encourage effective and safe Cybersafety practices which aim to maximise the benefits of the Internet and ICT and allow for the effective operation of the SACFL and member leagues and clubs, whilst minimising and managing any risks.

The SACFL takes seriously its responsibility in providing robust policy, guidelines and education for its members in relation to what is deemed acceptable and appropriate online behaviours. The League and/or club name, motto, crest, logo and/or uniform must not be used in any way which would result in a negative impact for the league or club and its members.

Members of the SACFL and its clubs have a responsibility to ensure that all online communications are in keeping with the leagues expectations in relation to appropriate and respectful interactions with officials, coaches, umpires, players, parents, spectators and sponsors. Players will not post inappropriate comments about individual SACFL or club members which if said in person during the playing of a game would result in disciplinary action being taken.

Images of Children

IN South Australia under the Summary Offences Act 1953 a person must not engage in indecent

filming. Images of children and adults should not be used inappropriately or illegally. Whenever possible, obtain permission from a child's parent/guardian before taking an image of a child that is not their own and ensure that the parent knows the way the image will be used. The privacy of others needs to be respected and clubs should disallow the use of camera phones, videos and cameras inside changing areas, showers and toilets.

Clubs or Associations displaying an image of a child should avoid naming or identifying the child or, wherever possible avoid using both the first name and surname.

Do not display personal information such as residential address, email address or telephone numbers without gaining consent from the parent/guardian.

Additional information such as hobbies, likes/dislikes, school, etc should not be included as this information can be used as grooming tools by paedophiles or other persons.

It is the responsibility of the organisation to only use appropriate images of a child, relevant to the sport and ensure that the child is suitably clothed in a manner that promotes the sport.

Cyberbullying

"CYBERBULLYING is a way of delivering covert psychological bullying. It uses information and communication technologies to support deliberate, repeated and hostile behaviour, by an individual or group that is intended to harm others." (Belsey 2007)

Cyberbullying includes, but is not limited to, the following misuses of technology: harassing, teasing, intimidating, racially vilifying or threatening another person by sending or posting inappropriate and hurtful e-mail messages, instant messages, text messages, phone messages, digital pictures or images, or Web site postings (including social network sites eg facebook or blogs) and the sending, receiving and/or possession of
