Positive start to Championships

IT was a most encouraging start by the two Victorian teams in the opening round of the NAB AFL U18 Championships last weekend.

Vic Country trekked to the Top End and returned with a 100-point plus win against Northern Territory while Vic Metro posted a 40-point win against Queensland from its match in the Brisbane suburb of Yeronga at AFL Qld headquarters. Both sides are proudly 'Powered by Milk'.

Whilst there are many games to go, early indications are that this year's Victorian teams will once again demonstrate the strength and depth of the talent pathway in the State.

In fact, either one of Victoria's representative teams have won 11 of the 13 Championship titles since 2000.

The Championships provide an opportunity for players to challenge and test themselves at a level that many have previously never experienced on the national stage.

Both Victorian teams will play on the same day at Visy Park on Sunday, June 9. It's a great opportunity to gain a sneak preview of many players who next year will be on AFL lists.

Last week AFL Victoria hosted its first Local Government Forum with more than 200 Local Government and community football representatives in attendance at the KGI Centre at Punt Road Oval.

It was an event designed to showcase the strategic direction of football in Victoria as well as acknowledging the important role that Local Government plays in the development and growth of the game at community level.

Significantly, more than 80 per cent of Victoria's 79 Local Councils attended, including CEO's, Mayors/Councillors, Senior Management and Recreation Department staff.

AFL Victoria is well aware of the crucial role that Councils collectively play in Victorian football as they invest millions

into football annually in both the development and maintenance of facilities.

The Forum will enhance our collective understanding of each other's needs and plans in the areas of participation and the development of facilities for the 240,000 participants in Victorian football.

With more than 3,000 games played each week in Victoria it is important to promote greater collaboration among all stakeholders to ensure continued investment and support of the dedicated volunteer network that carry and support football across the State.

Last Sunday, North Melbourne star Lindsay Thomas launched his Indigenous Academy, which AFL Victoria is one of the partners.

The Academy program, which will begin in early July, will include football led by Thomas and other players as well as netball sessions with the Melbourne Vixens.

Regrettably the unacceptable incident involving a young supporter and Adam Goodes last Friday night at the MCG was extremely disappointing on every imaginable level.

Hopefully, it will serve as another teaching/learning moment in terms of increasing the awareness that racial vilification is unacceptable under any circumstances and should not be tolerated at any level of our game.

As Goodes so succinctly said – racism has no place in society.

Rebels deal with year of change

HOW dramatically and quickly things can change.

This time last year North Ballarat were perched second on the ladder with a 6-1 record and with finals beckoning. Fast forward and a win, let alone finals, appear light years away.

North Ballarat is cemented in the TAC Cup cellar, still searching for their first win.

Coach David Loader is seemingly forever being quizzed as to what's happened.

Loader noted there are so many entwined factors that have conspired against the club this season there is no single explanation.

For openers, a couple of players were involved in the AIS/AFL Academy tour then St Patrick's College, Ballarat, took an overseas trip, which took with them 14 Rebels players for the first three rounds of the season.

As Loader explained that left the Rebels about 16 players short on top of some players having exited the program to concentrate on other sports and then there's been a run of injuries.

"A lot of the public perception is 'hey you guys have been really good the last couple of years and you usually are a strong competitive unit, why aren't you winning games'," Loader said.

"People look at the ladder and say 'you must be down and out, and worried about this and that.

"In a way, I've enjoyed coaching as much or more than ever. We are all really being challenged as to how we are

going to get a group that is really struggling back on track.

"I've got a saying that you learn more about yourself sometimes in adversity."

With football, particularly in the TAC Cup so cyclical, depending on the relative strength of top or bottom age players, results can be volatile season to season.

As a result, Loader finds himself and his coaching staff working with a totally different group of players from last season.

Out of the Rebels top age players, a third have never been involved in a TAC Cup program before.

"We are really low on players who have played TAC Cup before. There was a game earlier in the season where we only had 28 games of TAC Cup footy across the whole team," Loader said.

Loader believes these situations provide a really good

insight into the character of not only the players but all those around the club.

For all the disappointment associated with a 0-6 start, Loader said he can't fault the enthusiasm of the players or their willingness to get out on the track and work hard.

"The kids are putting the hard work in and they're developing," Loader said.

"Provided we can continue to take steps forward, I'm happy and the results will come."

Indigenous talent celebrated in Country win

IT was a celebration in more ways than one as Vic Country opened its 2013 NAB AFL Under 18 Championship campaign with a stunning victory against Northern Territory last Saturday night.

On the weekend that Australian Rules football celebrated Indigenous Round, Indigenous players Clayton McCartney, Jarman Impey, Alex Saunders and Bohdi Walker headlined Vic Country's 111-point win at TIO Stadium.

McCartney, Impey and Saunders kicked half of Vic Country's 22 goals in the 22.13 (145) to 5.4 (34) demolition.

McCartney was particularly explosive as he kicked six goals while Impey kicked three and Saunders two.

Vic Country coach Mark Ellis said all the players, especially the Indigenous players, were extremely excited and proud of their performance.

"It was certainly pleasing," enthused Ellis.

"The boys played really well. Northern Territory's team was a bit like ours in that they don't come together very often.

"It was important that we got a good start and that's what we worked on. Our preparation was really good.

"It was a fantastic experience for the boys and not just the footy. We had a couple of sessions on the culture of the Indigenous people.

"It was a good weekend all round."

What particularly pleased Ellis is the Vic Country only had a handful of players who had experienced a national Championship game beforehand.

Ellis noted that for some players it was their first trip on a plane and even the first time they had left the State.

He said the camaraderie of the players was striking and everyone bought into the team structures and roles they were asked to play.

"We are pretty blessed. They are good players in their own right and it was up to all the coaching staff to get them to play good team footy and that's what they did," Ellis said.

"Everyone played their part and that was the most pleasing thing."

Murray Bushrangers midfielder Nick Holman generated plenty of drive while Gippsland Power's Josh Cashman, who captained the team, and Zac Merrett all contributed to the team win.

Merrett, the younger brother of Essendon's Jackson, showcased his skill, pace and poise to end with three

goals.

Ellis said Vic Country will swing around its team for the Visy Park match on June 9 against Tasmania.

As in keeping with its policy to introduce as many players in the squad to the Championship, Vic Country could have double digit new faces for the Tasmanian match.

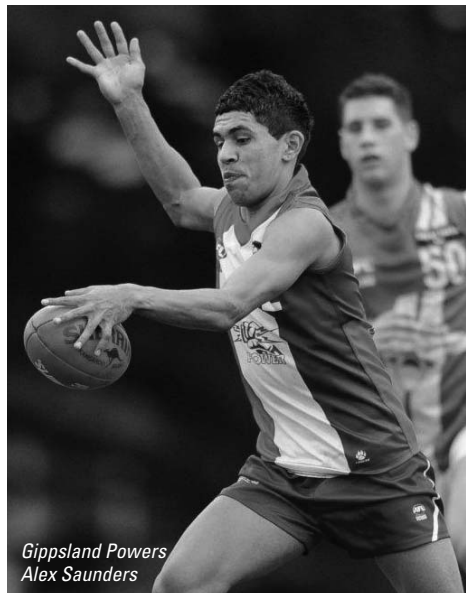

Cavarra earns Victorian honours

MANY things set Ben Cavarra apart from the pack.

One of the most telling is that Cavarra is just one of four players in their bottom age level to win a best and fairest at Eastern Ranges.

The others?

How does Sam Mitchell, Rory Sloane and Jonathon Patton resonate as the other triumvirate?

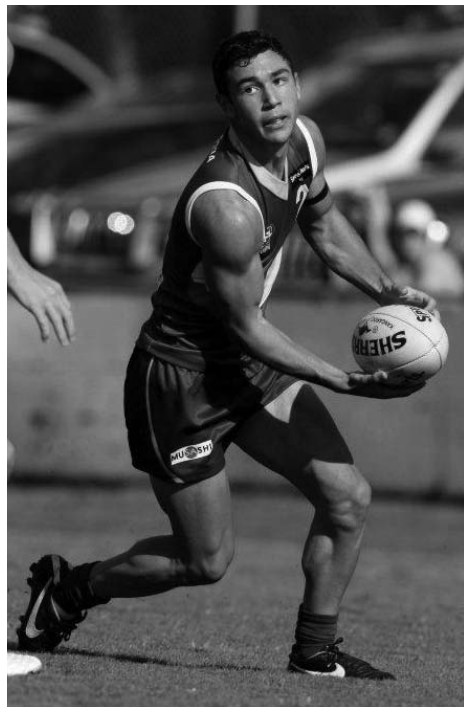
Impressive company, but those who know Cavarra, the captain of Ranges, are not surprised.

Ranges Talent Manager Anthony Parkin, an unabashed fan, noted that 55 of the 58 players who voted, selected Cavarra as captain.

"Every time Ben Cavarra has put on an Eastern Ranges jumper he's never played a bad game," Parkin said.

Cavarra described it as a "huge honour" to be mentioned in the same breath as Messrs Mitchell, Patton and Sloane. "They're obviously super stars in the AFL," Cavarra said.

For all that, Cavarra, 173 cm and 69kg, has had to rebound from adversity, one feels largely because of his size.



It's as if every time Cavarra and players of a similar stature play expectations are unfairly placed upon them – they're marked tougher than others.

Cavarra was overlooked for the Vic Metro squad in the AFL Under 16 Championships. He was told he needed to work on his endurance, among other things.

"It was pretty disappointing at the time. I was told I needed to work on a few things so I went back to Eastern Ranges and really worked hard on all those things," Cavarra said.

The major thing was his fitness. He took on board the advice and lifted a 12.4 Beep Test time to 14.8 this year.

And, that improvement coupled with his continued ability to find the football, use it to advantage and provide inspiration to his teammates has seen him named in the Vic Metro squad for the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships.

Vic Metro opened its campaign last weekend when it travelled to Brisbane to play Queensland. Cavarra stood out with a best on ground 35 disposal game.

"Fitness at TAC Cup is one thing, but the National Championships is up another level and so I really worked on making it my biggest focus in pre-season," Cavarra said.

"I really needed to and that's what I worked on."

"I'm rapt to get the opportunity represent Victoria in the Nationals, I mean it is a huge honor.

"Obviously, I have a huge respect for all the players I play against and now to play with a lot of them is going to be a huge thrill. I'm really hoping I can contribute to Vic Metro."

Inaccurate Metro claims first win

NO one from Eastern Ranges was surprised that Ben Cavarra dominated Vic Metro's opening match of the NAB AFL Under 18 Championship match against Queensland.

The Ranges faithful have watched repeatedly as Cavarra, just one of four players in the club's history to win its best and fairest as a 'bottom age' player, show cased his enormous talent.

While Cavarra still has much to do to emulate the other three – Sam Mitchell, Rory Sloane and Jonathon Patton – the Ranges' rover certainly made an impact in his first game wearing the Big V.

Cavarra collected a game high 35 possessions, boasted seven inside 50s and kicked two goals as Vic Metro emerged from its trips to Brisbane with a 40-point win against Queensland.

Certainly, the winning margin could have been much greater, but Metro's conversion – 12.28 (100) – was poor while conversely Queensland's better strike rate – 9.6 (60) kept the loss from blowing out.

Vic Metro coach Marty Allison said the team's scoring shots – 40 to 15 – highlighted Metro's dominance.

Allison said Queensland defended well and dropped numbers into Metro's forward 50, which made kicking goals more difficult.

He said for all Metro's control on the game, Queensland crept within 10-points in the last quarter before Metro put the game beyond doubt.

"I thought our guys were fantastic the way they absorbed that challenge then refocused and kicked away to what was a pretty comfortable 40-point win," Allison said.

"We played some pretty good footy in patches, but were not able to get reward for our effort.

"Our quick ball movement was good, but I was really proud of our ability to defend when Queensland had the footy. This was an area that this group wanted to concentrate and get better in."

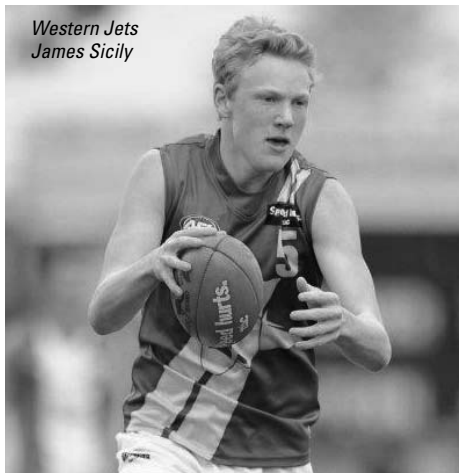
Vic Metro's dominance can be measured in many ways, quite apart from its ascendancy in scoring shots.

They had more than 100 more possessions and went inside 50 an impressive 28 more times.

Allison praised Cavarra for his outstanding work rate as well as Calder Cannons Touk Miller who had 26 possessions with game highs in clearances – seven – and tackles – nine.

He said Oakleigh Chargers' Jay Kennedy Harris with 25 possessions and Cavarra's Ranges teammate Mitch Honeychurch was also effective with 23 disposals as was

Western James Sicily with 20 touches and nine marks.

The one downside to Metro's win was the injury to Oakleigh Chargers' Lewis Fitzgerald who was injured late in the first quarter.

It left Metro's rotation, on a day when it was a balmy 23, down one, which applied added pressure.

"Considering everything that happened there were a lot of positives to come from the match and there is still improvement to come from this group," enthused Allison.

Metro will make considerable changes to its team to play NSW/ACT at Visy Park on June 9.

Kerridge latest Rising Star nominee

Former Bendigo Pioneer Sam Kerridge was the Round Nine NAB AFL Rising Star nominee. Kerridge enjoyed a breakout match for Adelaide last Sunday, booting six goals and collecting 24 possessions in the Crows' one-point win over North Melbourne at Etihad Stadium.

After making his AFL debut in 2012, the 20-year-old has been effective both up forward and through the midfield in his six games for Adelaide this year, while going head-to-head with some of the AFL's biggest names.

Crows coach Brenton Sanderson said Kerridge had shown outstanding leadership and versatility since arriving in Adelaide.

"Sam has taken some significant steps in his development and been a key part of our team in his six senior games this season.

"He's played a variety of different roles for us, including important defensive jobs on some of the competition's best players. He's really relished those challenges and has also been able to hit the scoreboard consistently through his hard running and strong work ethic.

"Sam plays with maturity well beyond his years and is a real leader among our core group of young players."

Kerridge, who played his junior football with Mildura, was drafted to Adelaide with the Crows' first pick in the 2011 NAB AFL National Draft, going number 27 overall. During his testing at the NAB AFL Combine, Kerridge starred in the endurance testing, finishing fourth in both the shuttle run (beep test) and 3km-time trial.

This followed a standout 2011 season with Bendigo Pioneers, after sitting out most of the 2010 TAC Cup season due to injury.

After playing just one game in his debut AFL season last year – coming on as a second-half substitute in the Round Three loss to Hawthorn – Kerridge has played six

consecutive matches for Adelaide since coming in to the side that defeated the Western Bulldogs by 52 points in Round Four. Since Round Four the Crows have a 4-2 win loss ratio.

Macrae another TAC Cup rising star

Former Oakleigh Charger Jackson Macrae was named the Round Eight NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

The 18-year-old midfielder was drafted to the Western Bulldogs in the 2012 NAB AFL Draft, and made his AFL debut in Round Four and as played four AFL games in his first season.

Against the Gold Coast Suns last Saturday at Metricon Stadium, Macrae had 26 touches – 13 kicks and 13 handpasses – and four tackles.

Bulldogs coach Brendan McCartney said Jackson has the attributes to become a regular AFL midfielder.

"Jackson is a young person who understands he has talent, and has worked very hard at improving his craft.

"We know Jackson is such a balanced and driven young man and he will continue to build on his early progression as a footballer — this nomination is just one stepping stone to a really good career, and shows he was a great selection by Simon Dalrymple and his recruiting team," he said

Jackson was the Western Bulldog's second selection in the 2012 NAB AFL Draft, selection six overall.

He was recruited from the Kew Rovers, the Oakleigh Chargers and Carey Grammar in Melbourne. He represented Vic Metro in the 2012 NAB AFL Under-18 Championships.

Following each round of the home and away season, a panel of judges will select a NAB AFL Rising Star nominee. At the completion of the season, one of these nominees will be chosen as the 2013 NAB AFL Rising Star.

The 2013 NAB AFL Rising Star winner will be awarded the Ron Evans Medal and a \$20,000 personal investment folio and a dedicated personal banker, courtesy of NAB.

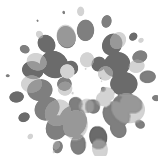

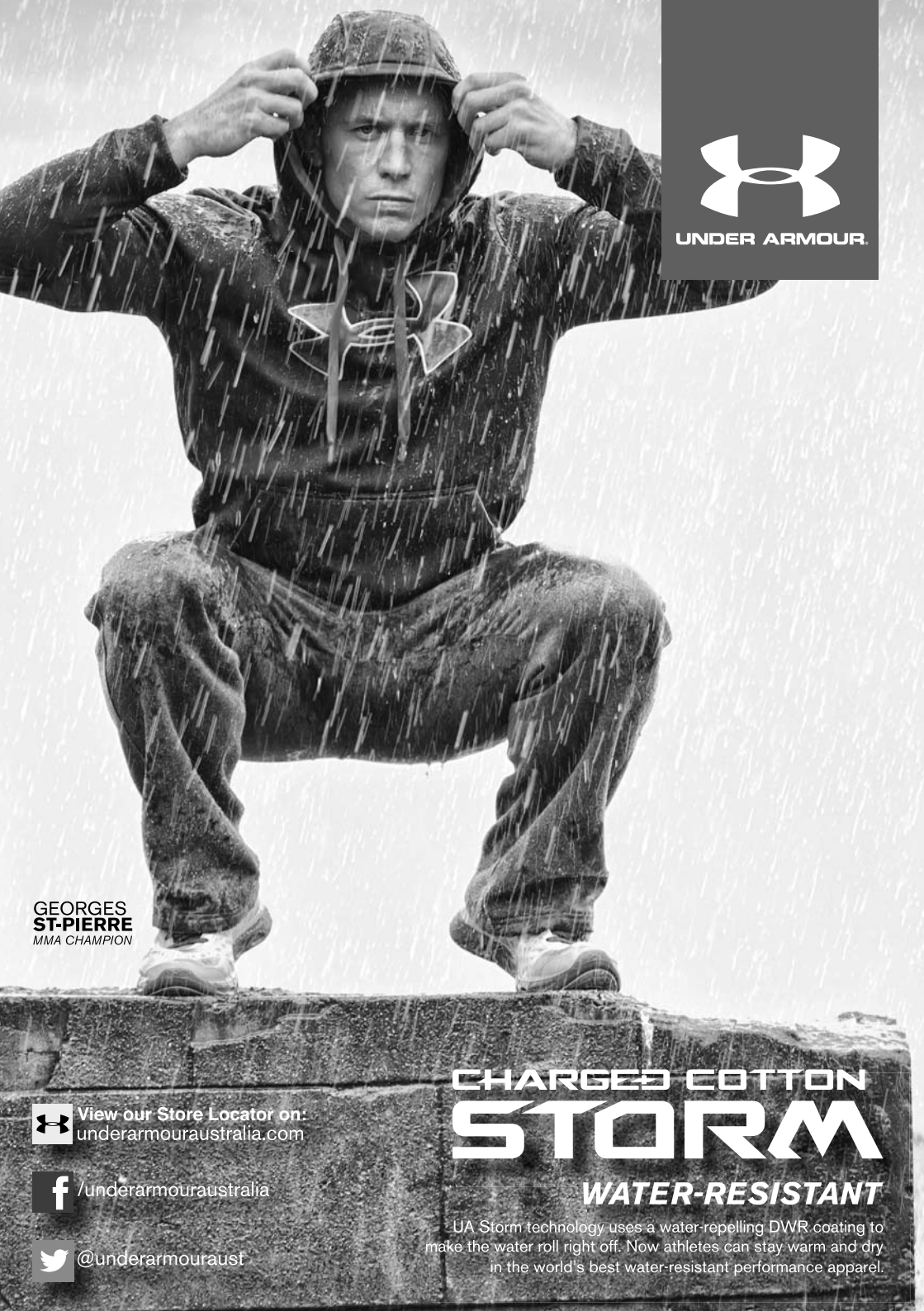

AFL Victoria recently hosted its first Local Government football forum, with over 200 Local Government and community football representatives in attendance at the ME Bank Centre at Punt Road Oval. The event was designed to showcase the strategic direction of football in Victoria and acknowledge the important role that Local Government plays in the development and growth of our game.

More than eighty percent of Victoria's 79 Local Councils were in attendance including CEO's, Mayors/Councillors, Senior Management and Recreation Department staff.

AFL Victoria General Manager Grant Williams believes the forum provided an opportunity for AFL Victoria, Local Government and community Leagues to come together and discuss future planning for football across the State.

"We acknowledge that Councils collectively invest millions of dollars into football annually in the development and maintenance of football facilities."

"By discussing our strategic direction in a forum such as this, we believe it will enhance our collective understanding of each other's needs and plans in the areas of participation and the development of facilities for the 240,000 participants in football," Williams said.

"Whilst a major focus with Local Government is facilities for the over 3,000 games played each week in Victoria, we would also like to promote greater collaboration amongst all stakeholders to ensure continued investment in and support of the dedicated volunteer network that assist with the running of football across the State."

Guests on the day were fortunate to hear an opening address from AFL CEO Andrew Demetriou, as well as listening to North Melbourne footballer Majak Daw discuss his rise through the community football ranks, coming from a multicultural background. Majak also talked about his role as an Australia Post

AFL Multicultural Ambassador.

Throughout the day a number of key speakers discussed the economic impact of football, a local volunteers' perspective, planning for growth and new clubs and engagement of our Multicultural and Indigenous communities.

The day was also an opportunity for AFL Victoria to provide Councils and Leagues an update on the integration between AFL Victoria and the Victorian Country Football League, which has seen additional resources and staff allocated to football across country Victoria, as well as the establishment of 13 Region Commissions to help govern football locally.

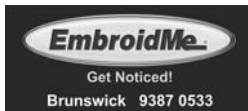

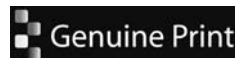

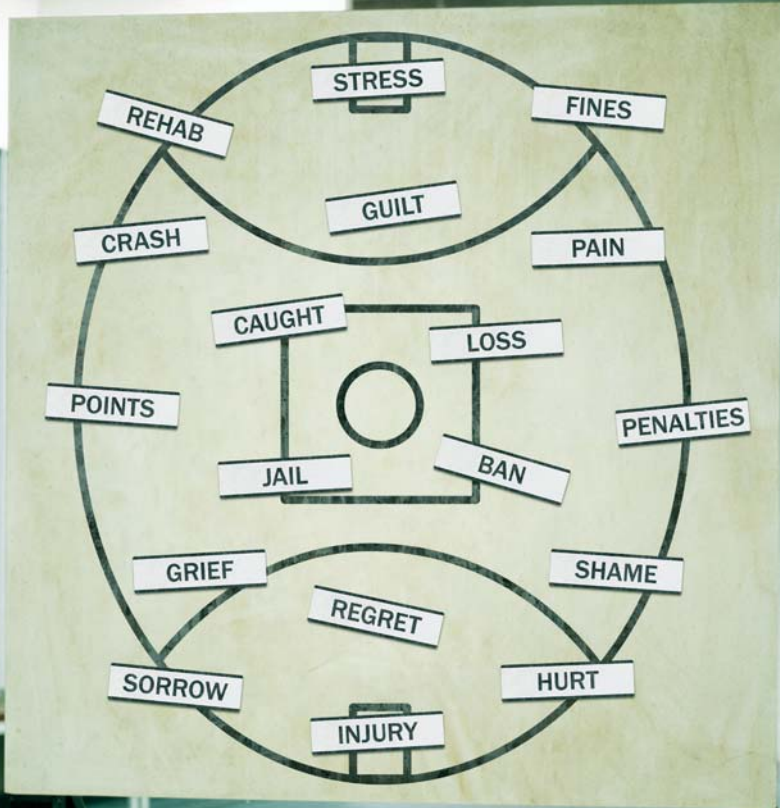
