# Step Back Think

**THREE simple words – Step Back Think – carry a powerful meaning that's relevant to everyone, particularly young adults.**

AFL Victoria endorses the message of Step Back Think, a non-profit organisation which is raising awareness about street violence.

Its theme of using your head instead of your fists will be highlighted across a number of games this weekend in the AFL, Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup through its 'Lace Up' campaign.

Clubs have been asked to wear orange boot laces in a united stand against street violence and its serious consequences.

One reckless punch can deliver devastating, even lethal ramifications which can change a person and their family's life forever.

Sadly, one punch was the catalyst for launching Step Back Think following the assault of young Melbourne James Macready-Bryan, who was felled and suffered brain damage in a tragic street violence act in our CBD.

The scary thing is that anyone can be targeted in random, senseless acts of street violence.

AFL Victoria hopes the campaign can engage and help educate people about how to behave when confronted with a potentially explosive situation.

The message is clearly Step Back Think and help erase street violence.

Also this weekend, Williamstown will continue their support of the charity Ladder, raising funds for youth homelessness, while Sandringham and Box Hill Hawks will recognise the Blue Ribbon Foundation as they play for the Blue Ribbon Cup.

Victoria's two Under 18 teams – Country and Metro – take their unbeaten records on the road this weekend as the

NAB AFL U18 Championships enter the Division 1 phase.

Vic Country and Vic Metro have both posted two emphatic wins in the Division cross-over section of the Championships, which again has showcased the untapped potential of so many young Victorians.

Vic Country travels to South Australia while Vic Metro will play Western Australia in the curtain raiser to the Fremantle/Brisbane Lions match.

It's a challenging assignment, but that's what football is all about and one which both Victorian teams embrace.

Already, both teams have exposed more than 60 talented young players to a standard of football they've never previously experienced.

And, that's one of the great things about the Victorian talented player pathway – the opportunity it provides for players to challenge themselves and maximize their ability.

We wish both Victorian teams the best.

At the North Port Oval on Sunday, Port Melbourne coach Gary Ayres will equal a coaching record he established during his time at Geelong.

Ayres, already the longest serving coach in the storied 130-year history of Port Melbourne, will coach the club for the 116th time.

# Herbert makes his move

**MUCH has changed in Louis Herbert's life in 2013 and, significantly, it's all been for the better.**

Herbert accepted an offer from North Ballarat Rebels not only to return as one of its 19-year-old players, but also to relocate from his home town of Warrnambool to Ballarat to undertake his tertiary studies.

Thoughts of moving to a VFL list were quashed when Herbert summed up the advantages of remaining in the TAC Cup for one more season.

"I knew that if I wanted to take the next step and play AFL then playing in the TAC Cup was my best chance," Herbert said.

The flow-on effects from that decision is many fold, none the least that Herbert can train not only with the Rebels, but also sister club North Ballarat Roosters.

Such continuity and specialized training has resulted in Herbert playing his best football.

"It's been really beneficial," Herbert said.

Already, Herbert has played as a 23rd player with the VFL

team and drew high praise from legendary coach Gerard FitzGerald.

"It was a good challenge coming up against the Essendon boys, but I really enjoyed it. Hopefully, I can get another crack at it later in the season," he said.

And, the other significant change is that Rebels' coach David Loader has moved Herbert from attack to defence as well as running him through the midfield.

Combining all the factors, Herbert, who last year rarely trained with the TAC Cup team due to his education and location, is realizing his potential and drawing more scrutiny from AFL recruiters.

Herbert, likely to be in Vic Country's squad to travel to Adelaide this weekend for Game 3 of the NAB AFL Under 18 Championship, is loving life, particularly his football.

"They still do throw me forward every now and then, which I don't mind, but I am loving the fact they are allowing me to play through the midfield and off half back," Herbert said.

There's never been a knock on Herbert's ball skills, but this season he's erased queries about his ability to win possession and showcase his other athletic talents.



Loader is generous in his praise of Herbert, who earned the maximum three votes in the TAC Cup Coaches Award in the Rebels first win of the season when they defeated Oakleigh Chargers.

For Loader it was the continuation of a good season by Herbert. "He's just climbing the ranks very quickly," Loader said.

"I think by moving to Ballarat and buying into the program a lot more has really helped. He has grown as a person and a footballer.

"He has bought into the direction we wanted to push his football and he's getting results."

# Falcons fly high for Country

Victoria Country has made it two wins from two matches in the NAB AFL U18 Championships with a commanding 63-point victory over Tasmania at Visy Park last Sunday.

The men from across Bass Strait proved a worthy opponent for three quarters, eventually succumbing to Vic Country's wealth of midfield talent 15.17 (107) to 7.2 (44).

Geelong Falcons midfielder James Tsitas was best afield with 32 disposals and goal of the day, a half-volley strike from 20m out that Tim Cahill would have been proud of.

Tsitas' Falcons teammates Lewis Taylor (27 touches) and Nicholas Bourke (21) were also highly influential through the middle, while Dallas Willsmore (North Ballarat Rebels) and Clayton McCartney (Dandenong Stingrays) each bagged 3 goals.

Tasmania's resistance was led by midfielder Eli Templeton (30 touches) and the classy Kade Kolodjashnij (24) who both caused plenty of headaches for the home side. Toby Nankervis was also pivotal in the ruck and around the

ground with his strong marking a feature of the visitors' play.

Vic Country's midfield strength was obvious from the outset with Tsitas and Taylor prominent at the stoppages and Willsmore capitalising with two first quarter goals.

A 24-point lead at the first break looked ominous but some staunch defence from Tasmania and some inaccurate kicking from Victoria Country saw the margin swell to just 28 points at half time.

Two majors in two minutes to Geelong Falcons centre half forward Patrick McCartin helped Vic Country regain their control in the third term, a strangle-hold they would enjoy for the rest of the match.

Lively half forwards Jarman Impey (Murray Bushrangers) and McCartney showed their exceptional skills with moments of brilliance, while Zak Jones (Stingrays) was damaging off half back.

A 38-point lead at three-quarter time was always going to be too much for visitors, but Taylor made certain of it. The on-baller was everywhere in the last term, showcasing his skills on both the right and left foot to challenge Tsitas for best-on-ground honours.

Bushrangers' clearance king Nick Holman was another to impose himself on the contest, lifting his possession tally to 22 before the final siren and helping Vic Country run out comfortable winners.

Sandringham Dragons small man Zachery Merrett (21 disposals), Aaron Heppell (Gippsland Power) and Isaiah Miller (Bendigo Pioneers) were other solid contributors.

Vic Country travels to Adelaide this weekend to take on South Australia in the first of the Division 1 encounters on Sunday afternoon.

# What the coach had to say...

**IF Mark Ellis talks about the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships as a job interview then Vic Country are applying for executive positions this weekend.**

Certainly, Vic Country players are well credentialed as they head into the match against South Australia at City Mazda Stadium on Sunday.

Vic Country head into the first match against a Division 1 team on the back of two impressive wins against Northern Territory and more recently Tasmania.

After defeating Northern Territory in trying, unfamiliar conditions in the Top End, Vic Country were just as impressive as they demolished Tasmania.

Ellis said selectors would pick the best available team for the match against South Australia, which belted Queensland by 100-points last weekend.

"We're getting into the bigger games now where the pressure will be on," Ellis said.

"We have adapted pretty well so far. I think we have a game that will stand us in pretty good stead.

"It's going to be tough opposition, but as we say it's like a job interview every week."

Ellis noted the stark contrast conditions between the first two games as well as the different team composition – about 10 changes - that Vic Country took into the Visy Park match against Tasmania.

"It was good to play as well as we could and win," Ellis said.

"While the weather was completely different, the challenge was to get a virtually new team to click together.

"We focused before the match to get the game going the way we wanted it played and we were lucky enough to be able to do that.

"Tassie' did a good job of trying to hold us up and block us up, but the boys stuck at it well and were rewarded."

Headlining Vic Country's 15.17 (107) to 7.2 (44) victory was Geelong Falcon teammates Lewis Taylor and James Tsitas.

Taylor and Tsitas, both members of the AIS/AFL Academy, nudged 60 disposals between them as they dominated the midfield and provided plenty of drive and opportunity for the teammates inside 50.

But, it was not only racking up high possession numbers that impressed Ellis who noted that Tsitas laid 12 tackles while Taylor won six clearances.

"Those two know each others game inside out. They certainly look for one another when they're playing," Ellis said.

"They rotated through the midfield and played some good footy."

Ellis praised Dandenong Stingrays Clay McCartney, North Ballarat's Dallas Willmore and Falcons' Patrick McCartin for their hard work in attack.

He said Zac Jones, a Stingray whose brother Nathan plays for Melbourne, did a good job across half back as did Falcons Nick Bourke and Murray Bushranger Nick Holman.

# Boyd leads Metro win

Six goals to Tom Boyd and a commanding performance from ruckman Michael Apeness have fired Victoria Metro to a 70-point win over NSW/ACT last weekend.

Under clear skies at Visy Park, Vic Metro powered home to claim a 20.12 (132) to 9.8 (62) victory in Round 2 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Boyd and Apeness, both Eastern Ranges exports, proved too big and strong for NSW/ACT's tall, with Boyd's six majors, and Apeness' 33 hit-outs pivotal in the win.

Classy left-footers Christian Salem and Karl Amon (both from the Sandringham Dragons) kicked three goals each, too often finding space at forward half.

Another duo from the Dragons, Josh Kelly (26 disposals) and Nathan Freeman (21 and 8 clearances) were also key players, combining well through the middle with captain Luke McDonald (24).

NSW/ACT were far from disgraced in the loss and had stars in Michal Gibbons (Murray Bushrangers) and Lloyd Perris, who finished with 29 and 26 possessions respectively.

Jake Barrett was another who could hold his head up high with 22 disposals and three goals, the last of which was kicked after the final siren to reduce the margin to 70 points.

In a free flowing first quarter it was Metro who got the

jump, enjoying a 20-point buffer at the first break, thanks to three goals to Boyd and the class of their midfield brigade.

But with star Jack Billings (Oakleigh Chargers) leaving the ground not to return, NSW/ACT managed to limit the damage, and the margin, to just 23 points at the main break.

The visitors refused to be intimidated by Vic Metro's talent, which was best illustrated when Barrett fought off opponents to win the ball before drilling one from 40m out mid-way through the term.

A classy running goal to Will Maginness sparked the home side in the third quarter, before Boyd add three more to his total and Aidan Franetic threaded one from the boundary on the three-quarter time siren.

The classy finish extended the hosts' lead to 50 points at the last change but still coach Martin Allison demanded more.

In his first year at the helm, Allison called on his chargers to lift their tackling pressure and suffocate their opponents, naming the players who had yet to register a tackle.

Whether it was his words or the weight of numbers, NSW/ACT allowed the flood gates to briefly open in the final term with Salem and Amon the beneficiaries.

Amon's second was the highlight, slamming a low ball through the middle after Kelly had dodged and weaved his way past three opponents before releasing his teammate.

Max Hayes (Sandringham Dragons), Tom Cutler (Oakleigh Chargers), Nick Evans (Eastern Ranges) and Lachlan Ritchie (Dragons) also hit the scoreboard before the final siren, helping Vic Metro run away with a comfortable victory.

Vic Metro now travels to Perth this weekend to take on Western Australia in the first of the Division 1 encounters on Saturday.

# What the coach had to say...

**IT surprised few that Thomas Boyd would prove a headache for NSW/ACT in the last of the cross over division NAB AFL Under 18 championship matches.**

After all, Boyd represented Vic Metro last year in the Championship where he kicked three goals against Vic Country.

And, of course, Boyd topped the TAC Cup goal kicking last year, an outstanding effort given he was a bottom age player.

With such a backdrop, NSW/ACT was always going to struggle to combat the 199cm Eastern Ranges power forward and that's what panned out.

Boyd kicked six goals as Vic Metro inflicted a 71-point point win over NSW/ACT, 20.12 (132) to 9.8 (62).

While Boyd was dominant, he was not alone. Sandringham Dragons teammates Christian Salem and Karl Amon each chipped in with three goals.

Vic Metro coach Martin Allison described Boyd was "pretty handy" as he provided a target whether as a leading target or in a contested situation.

He said Dragon Max Hayes also played well across half forward with his strong, contested marks and leading up the ground, creating space for his smaller, quicker teammates to capitalize.

"Max played his role particularly well. He allowed Tom Boyd to compete one out with his opponent," Allison said.

Midfielder Nathan Freeman, another Sandringham player, racked up possessions and used the ball effectively as did Will Maginness.

Michael Apeness, a teammate of Boyd's at Eastern as well as matching him centimeter for centimeter, also impressed Allison as he controlled the ruck with 33 hit outs.

"He rucked well and took some really good marks around the ground. He was quite pivotal to the game," Allison said.

"We rested him late in the game because we are going to Perth on a six day break, but he was really impressive in the first half with his work rate and what he did around the ground."

Fresh legs is a large component of how Vic Metro plan to tackle Western

Australia at Paterson Stadium on Saturday.

Ranges captain Ben Cavarra, best-on-ground in Metro's Championship opening match, and teammate Mitch Honeychurch were rested from the NSW/ACT clash with the Western Australia match in mind.

"We just wanted to freshen him up so he could be right on a big ground," Allison said.

"We will bring into the team some players with leg speed."

Vic Metro has played 38 players in the first two Championship games, but will select its best available team.

Jack Billings, an All Australian last year, will need to pass a fitness test after receiving a knock on a knee early against NSW/ACT.

Billings aside, Vic Metro will take its best, freshest team west in search of what shapes as a Championship defining match.

# Around The Grounds

Each week we will take a look at some of the news and views from around the TAC Cup.

## Top of the ladder clash

This weekend produces a top of the ladder clash between the Geelong Falcons and the Eastern Ranges. While the result will not dislodge the Falcons from top spot on the ladder, it will give a good indication of the depth of both squads with each side providing a number of Vic Country and Vic Metro representatives as the Division 1 fixtures begin this weekend in the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

## Whitfield latest Rising Star nominee

Former Dandenong Southern Stingray Lachie Whitfield from the Greater Western Sydney GIANTS was the Round 10 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

The 18-year-old, selected by the GIANTS with pick number one in the 2012 NAB AFL Draft, collected 21 disposals - including seven marks and a goal - in the Giants' loss to Carlton at Etihad Stadium a fortnight ago.

After debuting for the GIANTS in Round One this year, Whitfield has gone on to play in all but one of the GIANTS 10 matches so far this season.

GIANTS coach Kevin Sheedy said Whitfield's nomination was a fitting reward for a very consistent debut season in the AFL.

"Lachie has showed his skill and class and demonstrated why we selected him with our first pick last year. It's not easy coming straight into the AFL in your first year as an 18 year-old but he has shown he is comfortable at this level and already taking great strides as an AFL player," Sheedy said.

Whitfield, an AIS-AFL Academy graduate, was recruited from the Dandenong Stingrays as the number one pick at last year's NAB AFL Draft. He was originally from Mornington in Victoria.

His selection followed consecutive standout performances at the 2011 and 2012 AFL Under 18 Championships – in 2011 he was named All-Australian and received the AFL Life Members Scholarship, while in 2012 he won the Larke Medal as the best player at

the Championships, as well as All-Australian honours.

He is averaging over 15 disposals a match in his debut AFL season, his Round 10 performance was his third 20+ possession game so far this year.

Following each round of the home and away season, a panel of judges will select a NAB AFL Rising Star nominee. At the completion of the season, one of these nominees will be chosen as the 2013 NAB AFL Rising Star.

**Jackson:** Yeah was lucky enough to get on the end of it and sneak it though for a point so yeah it was nice.

**Shifter:** Nathan, this time last year you set yourself for Vic Metro to play in that team, playing well in that team and you certainly fulfilled those goals, All Australian, and MVP, can you relate back to this particular period last year and your particular goals.

**Nathan:** Yeah defiantly, last year was very nervous just wanting to get selected for the Vic Metro side and after I sort of accomplished that I tried to set some new goals and ended up playing all 5 games and yeah playing my part in the side so it was good for Vic Metro and good to get a win so personally to have a good carnival.

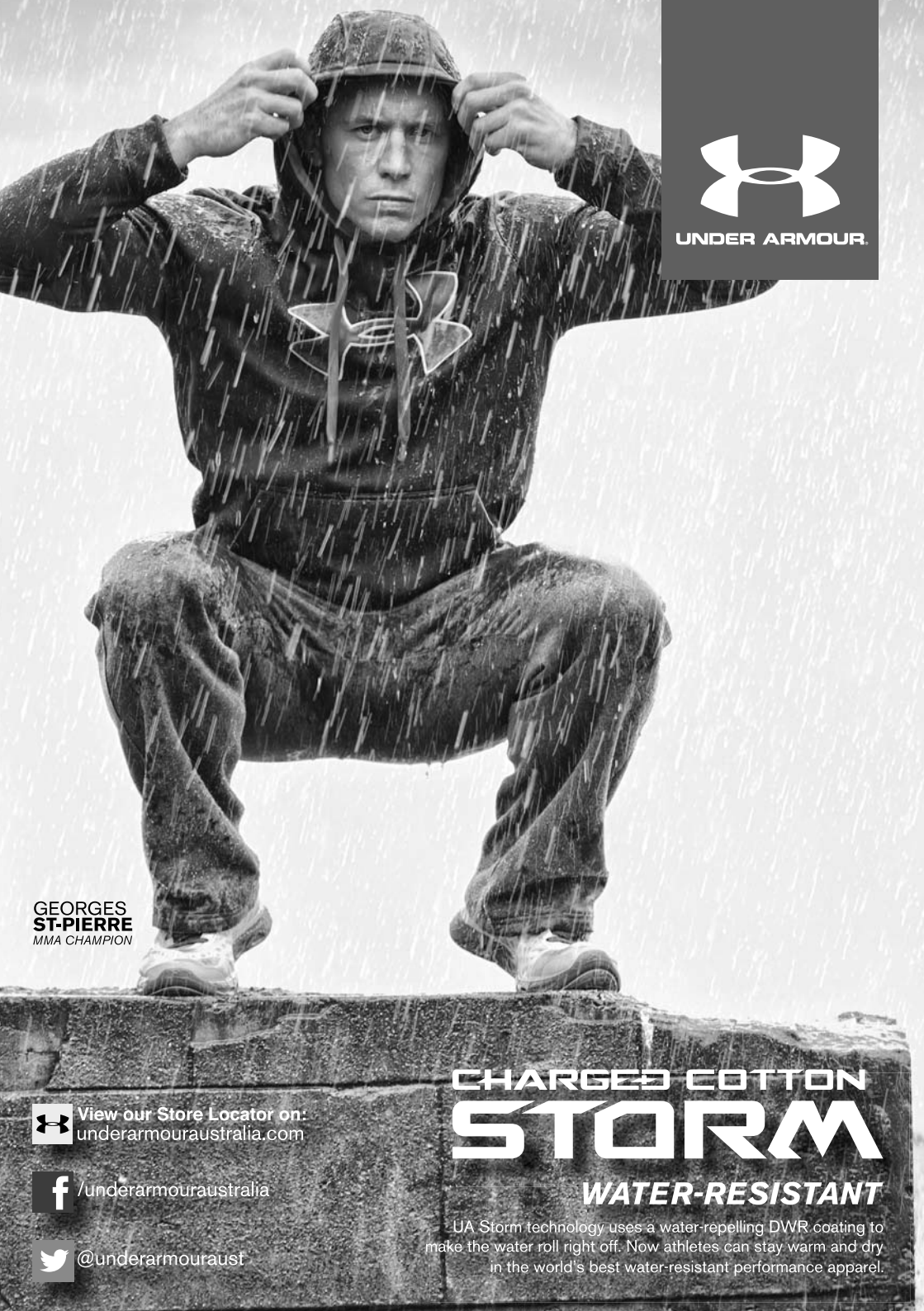

# Laguntas Indigenous Tigers Program

AFL Victoria's Laguntas Indigenous Tigers program is well on the way to producing the next crop of Indigenous AFL stars after the conclusion of a five-day camp earlier this week.

Thirty seven of the 50 Laguntas squad members, chosen from across Victoria – many from regional areas - gathered in Melbourne at the Korin Gomadjji Institute (KGI) for a five day camp.

The camp concluded with a match against the AFL Victoria's Country U16 squad on Monday at Punt Road Oval, the first of three games that will be incorporated into AFL Victoria's talent pathway program match schedule.

Supported by the AFL, the KGI and AFL SportsReady, the aim of the program is to further develop the pathway to the AFL competition for Victorian Indigenous players, as well as providing training and education to support the off field development of the players and support staff involved.

As part of the camp, players heard from AFL Indigenous Ambassadors Lindsay Thomas (North Melbourne) and Shaun Burgoyne (Hawthorn), and were provided with cultural strengthening sessions from a broad range of Indigenous community leaders and role models.

The players also gained valuable insights from an experienced coaching team, led by Head Coach Chris Johnson (a three-time premiership star with the Brisbane Lions and current AIS/AFL Academy Coach) and Director of Coaching Terry Wallace.

AFL Victoria General Manager Grant Williams said the program would help those involved enhance their knowledge of the expectations of the current talent

pathways, while exposing them to best practice in athlete performance, within an intensive football program.

"We have identified a gap that exists for Indigenous players aged between 16 and 19, so one of the aims of the program is to increase opportunities for young Indigenous players to enter AFL Victoria's talent pathway including the TAC Cup competition," he said.

"Indigenous players already participating within a regional TAC Cup program will continue their involvement, however, if not selected they will have the opportunity to play with the Laguntas Tigers and also be able to participate in the off-field development program that sits within it."

"This is a program designed to strengthen the cultural connection to the talent pathway in Victoria and will assist with players committing to, and engaging, in the program.

All players representing the Laguntas Tigers will be aligned to their respective AFL Victoria talent region which is determined by place of residence.

Significantly, AFL Victoria has seen an increase in the number of Indigenous boys participating in the twelve regional talent programs over recent years, a trend that AFL Victoria's Talent Managers are keen to see continue.

The new program will complement the successful U15 Kickstart program, which saw the Victorian side finish runners-up to WA in the Kickstart Championships in April this year.

The team's performance, along with the leadership and character within the group saw Anthony Young

(Newborough), Dion Johnstone (Warrnambool), Jy Simpkin (Shepparton), Kyle Thomas (Reservoir) and Samuel Walsh-Bannam (Mill Town) all selected in the Flying Boomerangs Squad to play at the NAB AFL U16 National Championships in July.

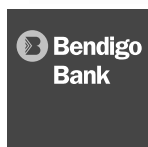

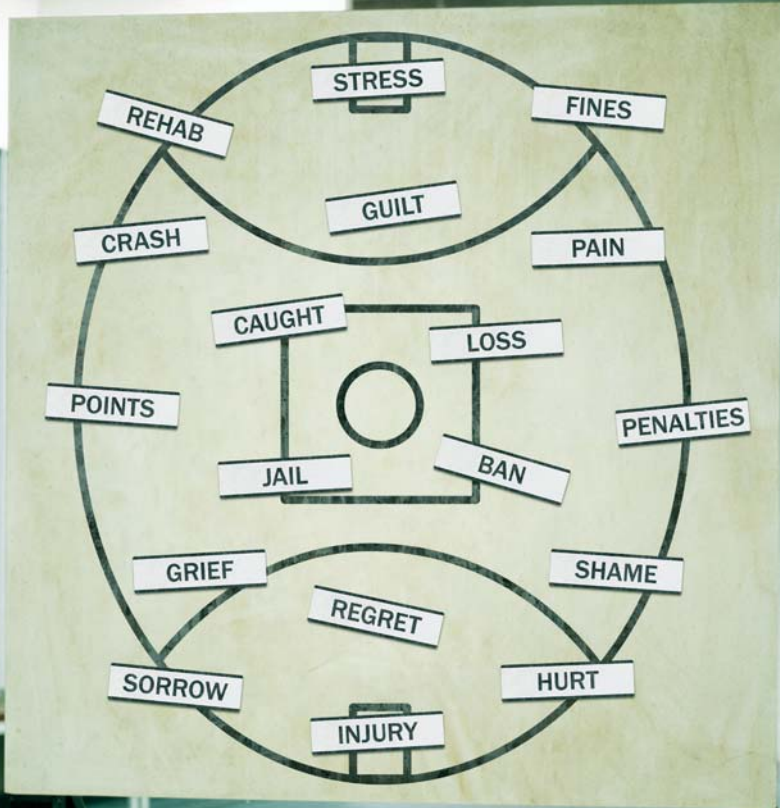
