# The season so far



## AS season 2013 seemingly flashes by it's worth taking time to reflect on what's been achieved, the state of the game and the challenges that await.

One of the most pleasing aspects in the first half of the season is the progress of TAC and VFL graduates who find themselves on an AFL list this season.

More than a dozen TAC Cup players have achieved their goal of making their AFL debut with Oliver Wines (Bendigo Pioneers), Nick Vlastuin (Northern Knights), Jackson Macrae (Oakleigh Chargers), Sam Kerridge (Bendigo Pioneers) and Lachie Whitfield (Dandenong Stingrays) all earning a NAB Rising Star nomination.

From the Peter Jackson VFL draftees we've seen Matt Jones (Box Hill Hawks), Kyle Martin (Frankston), Sam Dwyer (Port Melbourne), Brett Goodes (Williamstown) and Jack Frost (Williamstown) also make the transition to playing at the AFL level.

While he made the transition a few years before, there was no more telling illustration of the opportunities provided by the Peter Jackson VFL than Michael Firrito, a winner of the 2002 Fothergill Round Medal, who earlier this season played his 200th game for North Melbourne.

Over the next fortnight we'll see more of the game's future stars when the NAB AFL Championships return to Victoria for the final two matches.

Some extremely gifted Vic Country and Vic Metro players will be in action at Simonds Stadium this Friday and again at Etihad Stadium on Wednesday, July 3. If you get the opportunity take in a game, you'll be impressed.

Vic Metro takes an unbeaten record into its match

against South Australia on Friday as it bids to run to three successive NAB AFL U18 Championship titles they've won.

The Peter Jackson VFL lost its State representative match against Western Australia, but the game showcased many talented players just as it did last year when Kyle Martin, Dean Towers, Leigh Osborne, Kyle Hartigan, Sam Dwyer and Brett Goodes all played and were subsequently listed at AFL Clubs at the end of last year.

Again, there's more than ample evidence to note with surety that Victorian football is in a healthy state.

At the mid-point mark of the Peter Jackson VFL there are still 12 teams in contention for the finals and as the results have indicated any team on any given day can win regardless of their ladder standing.

Certainly, Bendigo Gold has endured a tough start to its first year as a stand-alone club, but they're providing plenty of opportunities for young, local players and working hard on and off field to succeed.

What also has been impressive has been the high quality and production of the ABC TV's match-of-the-day.

There's much to look forward to not only from the ABC coverage, but from football fields around the State in the second half of the season.

# Behind the scenes

## David O'Neill joins Victoria Country for the trip to Adelaide and the big clash with South Australia in the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

It was the last thing any of us wanted to hear. Our flight from Adelaide to Melbourne on Sunday night had been delayed by an hour and a half, and the long trip home just got a little longer.

Immediately the calculations begin. The North Ballarat Rebels contingent, including team manager Phil Partington and young forward Dallas Willsmore are now due to back in Ballarat at 11pm, while it will be beyond midnight before Murray Bushrangers duo Jarman Impey and Nick Holman make it back to Shepparton.

A frustrating thought when school awaits on Monday morning.

The Geelong Falcons group, including captain James Tsitas and key defender Darcy Gardiner arrange a lift with assistant coach Cameron Loftus, saving their parents a late night trip up the highway.

The delay is particularly annoying for Gardiner, now on crutches after injuring his ankle late in the third quarter and surely seeking the comfort of home.

For the young defender and the 22 other players and 15-odd support staff, the wait means more time to dwell on the 34-point defeat suffered at the hands of a supremely talented South Australian outfit; time to figure out what went wrong.

It's a sobering evaluation after so much went right on the three-day trip, a journey that began on Friday with a light training session at Visy Park.

### Friday

The players arrived in batches, gathering from all corners of the State, some enduring two-hour plus drives to be there.

For Dandenong Stingrays defender Josh Pickess, the fresh air at training is perfect after a morning spent in a three-hour English exam, while for others it's a chance to burn up some nervous energy before the 5.40pm flight.

Not everyone is nervous though and for many it's a chance to catch up with mates from different TAC Cup regions.

Classy Falcons midfielder Nic Bourke and Stingrays speedster Billy Hartung are like two peas-in-a-pod with a few sledges offered in both directions, while Impey and fellow small forward Clay McCartney (Stingrays) are soon joined at the hip.

The plane trip is quick and uneventful and soon we are standing outside the hotel in Glenelg with rooms being allotted.

Players are divided into threes and Vic Country High Performance Manager Leon Harris issues the rules, "the biggest bloke gets the double bed".

It's good news for Gippsland Power big man Jack Leslie at 198cm tall, but not so much for his Power teammate, small forward Alex Saunders.

Soon the first meeting begins in a conference room at the hotel which has been set up thanks to property steward



Brian Kinder and much loved trainer Richard Embleton, who arrived early after making the trip by car.

The huge tubs of Powerade and filtered water are good to go and the players waste no time in seeing who can be the first with blue lips.

Harris sets the tone for the weekend with a speech that has the boys attentive and focused as he drills in the opportunity the group has in front of them.

He singles out Hartung, announcing that head coach Mark Ellis and his assistants have decided he'll have a run-with role on dangerous SA wingman James Aish.

Aish's skills are highly regarded and with Hartung's own array of offensive weapons, including a blistering turn of speed, the match-up promises to be one to watch on Sunday.

After the meeting concludes it's on to dinner and the first chance to get to know the players.

Hugh Goddard sits beside me and soon I understand why the Falcons forward is so highly regarded.

He may be the youngest player on the trip, but Goddard has leadership written across his face. As talented as he is on the field, he's as measured and sincere off it.

Pickess is another who impresses. He's been named the 23rd player, meaning he'll be a bystander on Sunday, but he hides his disappointment with a team-first attitude you can't help but admire.

### Saturday

After breakfast on Saturday morning it's back in the meeting room where each player is handed a GPS report from last week, giving individuals a chance to see how their measurements – such as ground covered, the amount of efforts at top speed, and their metres covered per minute – stack up against the rest of the team.



The group then heads outdoors for a lively session in a nearby park which begins with a quick game from assistant coach Glen Manton that gets everyone – including the support staff – sharing a laugh.

After some more games that have the players working hard on their skills, attention turns to the team's structures and the group works through how they'll set up for different scenarios; a ball up on the wing, a kick-in after a set shot from the opposition.

Ellis and assistant coach Darren Flanigan take a back seat, putting the responsibility on the players to get to the right spots.

Tsitras comes into his own and his standing among the group is obvious. A larrikin at heart, the inside midfielder helps his quieter teammates come out of their shells but for now he's all business, directing traffic and making sure everyone knows their roles.

Back in the meeting room, former Vic Country tough nut Andrew Hooper, who now plays his football with Glenelg after leaving the Western Bulldogs at the end of last season, stops in for a chat.

Harris introduces him as "pound for pound one of the best performers in the Vic Country jumper of the past 15 years." Hooper's insights in what it means to play in the Big V jumper and his time at the Bulldogs are invaluable to the players and when Bendigo Pioneers defender Isaiha Miller stands to thank him on behalf of the group, everyone is grateful for his time.

With all bases covered the players are given the afternoon to do as they please.

Some, like Falcons defender Fraser Fort, relax and watch the footy, while others head in to town. Tsitras and Willmore visit the hairdresser for a trim, while Darcy Lang (Falcons) and his roommates enjoy a bit of wrestling on TV.

Before long the boys are back in the meeting room where Ellis simplifies the plan into two words; "intent" and "effort". A big serve of lasagna and salad for dinner keeps everyone happy before an early night is called.

### Sunday

The skies are clear on Sunday morning and despite the obvious nerves at breakfast, it's got everyone up and about.

Music is a common theme among the players as most don the head





phones as the group gets packed to leave for City Mazda Stadium – the home of South Australian Football League club West Adelaide.

Despite the butterflies the group seems relatively relaxed and again Tsitas, still smiling and having a joke, is at the centre of it.

A lot will rest on his shoulders today without fellow Falcons star Lewis Taylor serving a one-match suspension.

Once we're at the ground it's down to business and physiotherapist Carli Harris and a team of sports trainers soon have the boys strapped and raring to go.

After Ellis reiterates the coaching staff's message, the warm-up begins under the watchful eye of Jamie Hepner (head of athlete management) who has already issued the boys with their GPS units.

The players attack the warm up and with the first bounce just minutes away it's over to Ellis for one last word.

The speech is short but stirring and you can't help but be swept up in the moment. It's time for another chapter in the rivalry between the two football loving states.

A lot goes to plan over the next two hours. Small forwards Impey, McCartney and Saunders are relentless with their pressure, while Gardiner, Zak Jones (Stingrays) and Fraser Fort are resolute in the defensive 50.

But the SA boys are a class above.

Vic Country starts well but can't convert and soon the hosts have the first three goals of the match.

Hartung manages to cut Aish completely out of the game and after the main break he puts the foot down to ignite the Vics.

Almost out of pure stubbornness the visitors claw back to within six points of SA, but today will not be their day.

They've run into a very good team and the 34-point final margin, while reflective of the difference, is hard to swallow for the Country boys.

Injuries to Gardiner, who was arguably best on ground to three quarter time, Goddard and Bushrangers utility Nathan Drummond have the team doctor Paul O'Dwyer busy in the rooms afterwards.

To make matters worse for Gardiner, he's been selected to submit a random drug sample with the ASADA officials and his journey to the airport is pushed back.

Time though is soon the least of our worries with the delayed flight adding a little more pain to the weary bodies of the players.

While disappointed with the result, Tsitas typifies the attitude of the group, determined to make amends when they take on Western Australia in Geelong in two weeks time.

And, judging by how close the entire group is, you get the feeling the best is yet to come.

# Vic Metro continues unbeaten run

**WHEN Tom Boyd limped from the ground 10 minutes into the first quarter of its match against Western Australia, Vic Metro coach Marty Allison could have been excused for thinking the football gods had conspired against the team.**

After all, Vic Metro was playing on a six day turnaround from its match against NSW/ACT, endured a trip to Perth and not only lost possibly the best player in the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships, but was down one player in their rotations.

And, Boyd had been in electrifying form, just as he had the previous week. Capitalizing on the industrious work of midfielders Mitch Honeychurch, Josh Kelly and Ben Cavarra, Boyd had literally booted Vic Metro to a lead they would never surrender.

Boyd kicked three goals and had taken a mark inside 50 metres for what would have been his fourth goal. Unfortunately, he landed awkwardly, was escorted from the ground and after the game was on crutches with his left ankle in a moon boot.

While it was a crushing loss, Vic Metro was not devastated. It maintained its early first quarter dominance of five goals through to the half time break.

Without Boyd, Northern Knights' Ben Lennon stepped up with four goals as he became the chief beneficiary of the work from Honeychurch, Kelly, Cavarra and co.

Allison praised the performance of all three, particularly Honeychurch, who showcased his talent in a best-on-ground performance.

The stats sheets reflected how telling Eastern Ranges midfielder was as he collected 33 disposals, including 17 contested possessions and won seven clearances.

And, to cap a stand-out match, Honeychurch kicked two goals.

Ranges' teammate Cavarra, returning to the Metro team after being rested against NSW/ACT, won the ball 26 times which complimented Honeychurch and Kelly who racked up 29 possessions.

Luke McDonald, playing this season with VFL club Werribee, underpinned his continued development with 25 possessions as he became the general in defence.

While Vic Metro was able to keep control of the match in the third quarter it was evident that the host State was mounting a final onslaught.

At three-quarter time, Metro's lead had been reduced to 26-points, but the quick turnaround in game time, the travel factor and down one in the rotations began to take effect.

Western Australia closed to within one goal

with about 10-minutes remaining. It appeared all the momentum was rolling its way.

Allison is not sure how Metro rallied, but that's what they did when it mattered most as they kicked the final two goals of the match to take a 15.10 (100) to 12.9 (81) victory.

"I'm just so proud of all the players," enthused Allison.

"It was a ripping game of football between two talented teams, but when the (Metro) boys were challenged they really rose to it."

Vic Metro, without Boyd, will play South Australia at Simonds Stadium on Friday, June 28.

# Vic Country suffers defeat to SA

Nathan Drummond rolled an ankle, Darcy Gardiner also injured his ankle and Hugh Goddard suffered a broken collarbone.

And, that was on top of Vic Country being unable to play star midfielder Lewis Taylor, who was suspended.

The tale of the injured tape painted an ugly picture for Vic Country, but coach Mark Ellis didn't point to the litany of injuries and the flow-on effect they had in the team's loss to South Australia.

Little doubt the loss of three key players hurt Vic Country as they fell to the host State 6.9 (45) to 11.13 (79).

It was a sorry postscript, but other signs loomed ominously before the injuries set in.

Ellis noted that South Australia set the standard for its win in the opening quarter when they took control.

He said Vic Country's delivery into its forward 50 was haphazard, which compounded the task of the forwards.

"They were very good. They got hold of us in the first quarter, which put us on the back foot. I think they were up by 20-points at quarter-time," Ellis said.

"They were a very skillful, very polished side. They beat us fairly convincingly around the middle of the ground.

"We knew they were pretty good in that area and that proved right, but our boys weren't disgraced - they had a real crack at it."

Ellis said after quarter-time Vic Country reproduced the football it displayed in its victories over Northern Territory and Tasmania.

Vic Country reeled in South Australia's lead to six-points in the third quarter, but several turnovers resulted in goals and the home team re-established its ascendancy.

"Our work rate lifted, but we spent a lot of petrol tickets getting there and that cost us in the end," Ellis said.

Dandenong Stingray Billy Hartung was outstanding as he not only subdued James Aish, but displayed his explosive speed and exquisite skill.

"Billy had a really good battle with Aish in the first half and then Aish played in another role and Billy went to a flank and a wing. It was one of the best games I've seen Billy play," Ellis said.

Stingrays' teammate Zac Jones again played well while Louis Herbert took his good TAC Cup form into the Championship series and Gardiner was strong in defence before he was injured.

Murray Bushranger Nick Holman continued his good

Championship while defender Fraser Fort played his role.

"We regroup and go again, that's what we do."

Vic Country will regain Taylor as well as Matt Crouch from a broken hand when it plays Western Australia at Simonds Stadium on Friday, June 28.

# Cunico grasps Country opportunity

**IT was only a cameo, but in just little more than half a game for Vic Country Jordan Cunico displayed the talent that excites many keen observers, including Gippsland Power coach Nick Stevens.**

During his 54-minute ground time Cunico collected 16 disposals and found his way in Vic Country's best.

It doesn't surprise Stevens who believes the just turned 17-year-old from Traralgon has untapped potential.

Stevens said Cunico, who represented Vic Country at the NAB AFL Under 16 Championships last year, has all the attributes to take his football as far as he wants.

He noted there is so much upside to the Year 11 student, who has made a seamless transition to the TAC Cup.

"Jordie is just a quality player, super quick, strong overhead, really agile. He is just a very good all-round player," enthused Stevens.

"He stands about 6'1" (184 cm) that can play on ball, forward, he's almost the impossible match-up.

"His top-end speed is enormous; when he goes you can't get near him."

Stevens added that Cunico, who was best-on-the-

ground against Northern Knights in his first game after representing Vic Country and kicked two goals in the Power's 86-point win against North Ballarat Rebels, is clean and neat with his disposal skills.

He said Cunico now needed to ramp up his intensity as throughout his junior days he'd been a cut above the other players.

For the quietly-spoken Cunico the trip to Darwin was a "new experience" in his ever-expanding football world.

Cunico said he found the intensity of the match something that he'd never experienced. "I found it pretty tough, but I didn't think I played too bad," he said.

He noted the bigger bodies of the opposition also took some adjusting as did the speed of the game.

"It was just so much quicker," Cunico said.

"I probably won't get another game as I'm a bottom age boy, but I've got something to work towards next year."

While he trained with Gippsland Power last season he wasn't able to break into the team that went to overtime in the Grand Final.

"I just worked a whole lot harder than I've ever worked before during the pre-season. I just concentrated on high intensity running and endurance," Cunico said.

Pre-season, Cunico said his goal was to play consistently so he could first make the Power team then hold his place in the team.

Initially, Cunico took time to find his feet, but as the season has progressed he's been able to showcase the ability that excites Stevens and the Vic Country selectors.

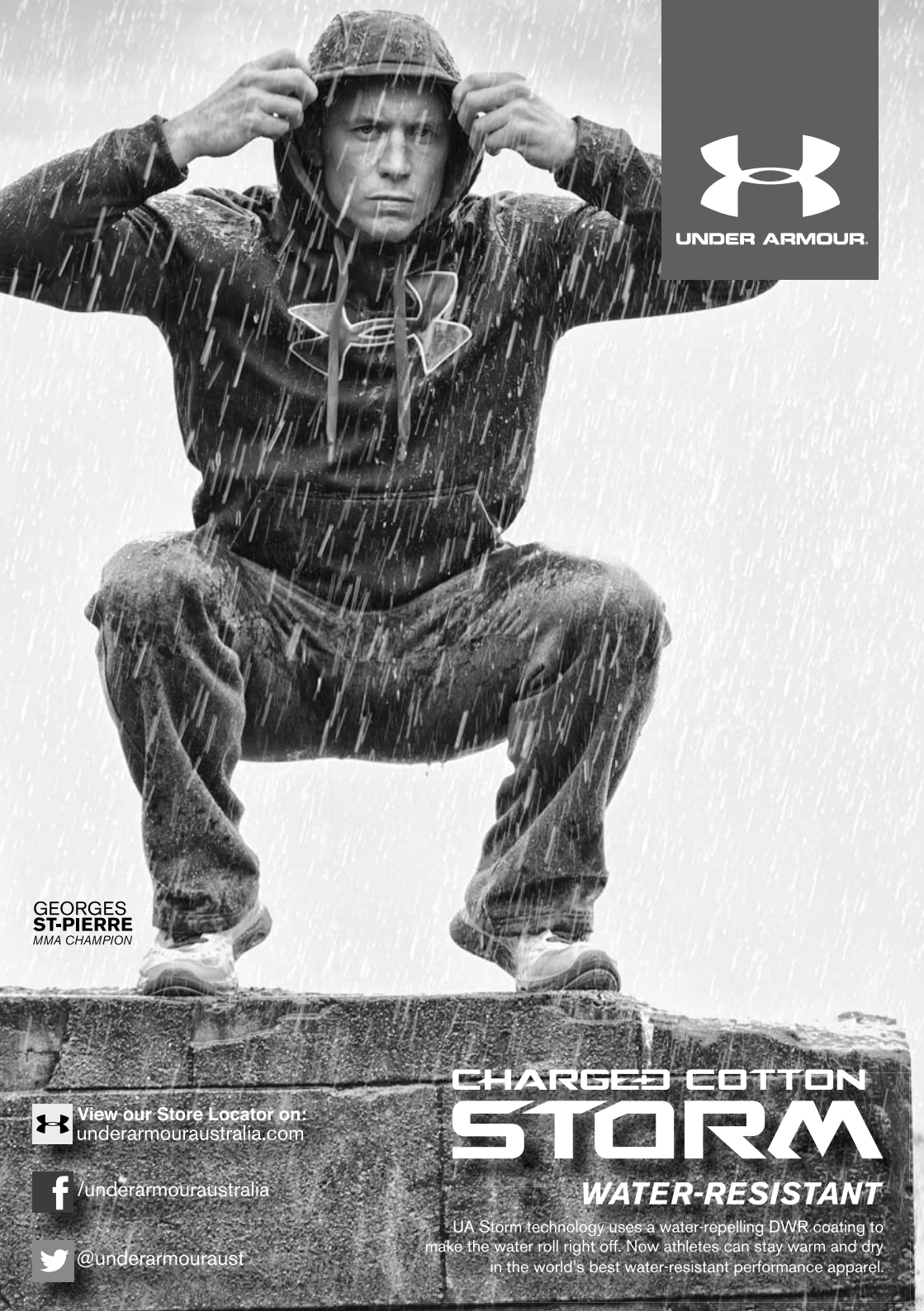

# Umpires thriving in V/Line Academy

Every weekend at country grounds across Victoria, the men and women with whistles and flags in hand play a pivotal role in making local football what it is.

Ensuring the development of the next generation of umpires is, at the very heart of keeping country football the great social and community event it is for everyone involved, from players, officials and of course the spectators.

Because of the key role umpires play, each year WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country's Umpiring Department invites a group of talented whistle blowers to participate in the V/Line Umpire Academy Program.

Invitations are sent to young developing field, boundary and goal umpires to participate in Junior Football Programs, as well to more experienced umpires from local associations that are then considered for selection in a wide-range of umpiring appointments.

In 2013 the V/Line Umpire Academies are located at

- Camperdown / Terang
- Ballarat / Geelong
- Morwell / Churchill
- Berwick / Dandenong
- Albury / Wangaratta
- Shepparton / Echuca
- Horsham
- Bendigo
- Mildura

The location for each academy was determined in the latter part of last year and at pre-Christmas sessions, summer training programs are distributed to the new members and the current fitness levels are determined.

Post-Christmas – usually in mid-February – the Academy Program resumes with fitness levels of all participants measured once again.

Coaching sessions at the Academy sessions include on-track coaching with discipline-specific coaching groups and also indoor-coaching sessions that range from umpiring

philosophies, personal goal-setting, the completion of self-development plans and an outline of what the year ahead will include.

Active participants of the AFL National Umpire-Coach Professional Development Program play an important role in the delivery of the Academy sessions and conduct skill-based coaching sessions where the participants are exposed to 'a different voice' where the expectations of the performances are extremely high.

This year members of the Academy have thrived in the opportunities the program offers, with all umpiring appointments for the 2013 V/Line Cup (U15 country representative carnival) and AFL Victoria's 2013 U16 Championships being active participants in the V/Line Umpire Academy Program.

The Academy Program also proved 230 of the 248 umpires for last month's WorkSafe Country Championships.

In addition to these achievements, 12 umpires have been invited to umpire at the three WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country versus Victorian Amateur Football Association games on Sunday July 7.

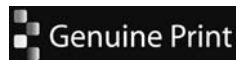

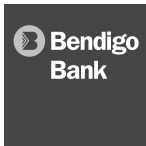

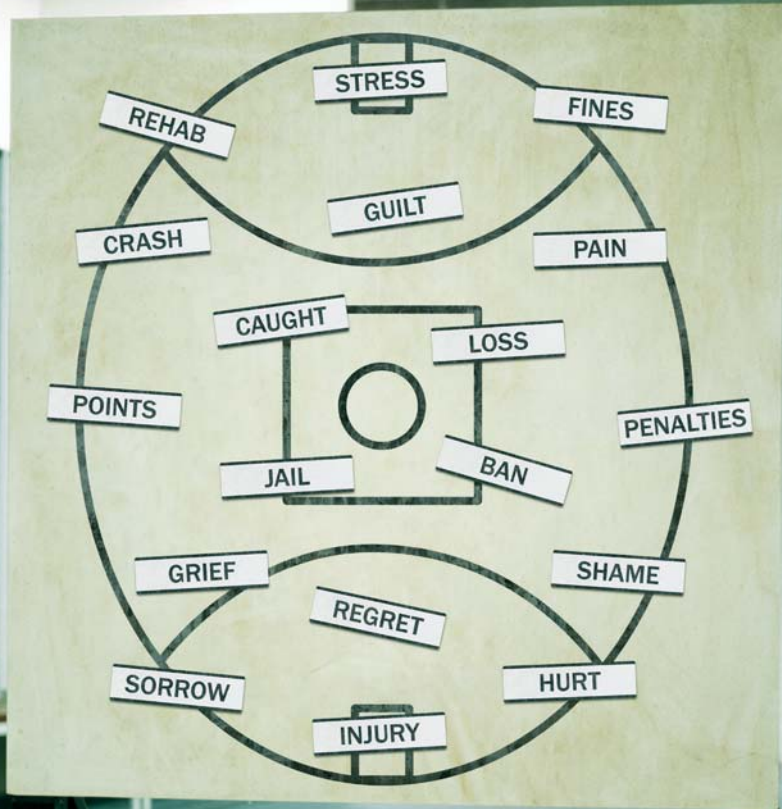
