FIRST AID NEWS!



As we are coming towards the end of the season teams will be playing hard for a position on the ladder. We find ourselves experiencing some good opposition and very competitive play.

Last week our club had 2 players removed from the field via stretcher. Both injuries were sustained in the general course of competitive play. So now is a good time to inform and remind all parents of the correct procedure for removing an injured player from the field via stretcher.

- *The team's trainer will need time to assess the injured player on the field. At this point only the runner, opposition trainer and Level 1 Sports Trainer are permitted on the field.
- *There is NO hurry and the trainer should not be pressured to move the player before they have made a thorough assessment.
- *When they make the decision that a stretcher is needed they will alert the umpire to stop the game.
- *The correct symbol to indicate the need for a stretcher is for the trainer to stand and place both arms out straight but waving seems to do the same job!
- *The stretcher at McKinnon clubrooms is located behind change room No. 1 door. It is orange in colour.
- *ONLY when the game has been stopped by the umpire may the adults assisting with the stretcher enter the field.
- *The trainer will coordinate the transfer of the player onto the stretcher. If there is a suspected spinal injury call an ambulance and do not move the player.

Let's hope we don't have to bring out the orange thing for the rest of the season!




