# TAC Gup regions celebrate their history, 21 years on

One of Australia's premier sporting competitions' short but rich history has been rediscovered with the Sandringham Dragons and Geelong Falcons' 21 year celebrations over recent weeks.

Well over one hundred current and former Dragons players and staff filled Trevor Barker Oval's function room last Sunday night to celebrate the club's 'Best Team Ever' presentation.

Carlton champion Chris Judd was drafted from Sandringham with the third selection of the 2001 NAB AFL Draft and was named alongside Collingwood's Luke Ball as one of the Dragons' greatest on-ballers.

"My strongest memories are probably of pre-season. It was really good getting kids from different footy clubs together to play TAC Cup," Judd said.

Since 1992, when the TAC Cup competition started, road safety education of all clubs has been an integral component of the program, with the aim of creating champions on the field and safer drivers on the road.

Messages have evolved from the inaugural 'Live and Learn', to '120 hours of practice' and now 'Speed hurts', which began last year.

"(The TAC Cup) is an amazing program, it really is. For kids

that grow up in Victoria, to be exposed to a program that is not far from AFL level is great," Judd said.

At the Falcons' recent 1992 premiership reunion, ruckman and now Gold Coast Suns assistant coach

Matthew Primus also noted the TAC Cup's progression.

"The competition has evolved - TAC Cup clubs are doing a lot of the same things as AFL clubs, with the level of coaching, professionalism and fitness staff in place," Primus said.

"It's great to see that association (between the TAC and Victorian Under-18 representative football) strengthen over 21 years."

In that time, the competition has grown from six regions to 12, and produces around half of the players selected in the NAB AFL National, Rookie and Pre-Season drafts.

TAC CEO Janet Dore said the TAC was extremely proud of its partnership with AFL Victoria.

"It has been and remains one of the great sporting relationships in our country," she said.



"Young people continue to be over-represented in road trauma, and we see the TAC Cup as a vital platform in working to rectify this."

# Pour more into your performance

So you know the importance of eating before exercise, but did you know that what you eat after a game of footy or training can be just as important? The foods and drinks you consume after footy can affect how quickly your body recovers and how well you perform at your next game or training session. The nutrition goals of post-exercise recovery are to rehydrate, refuel carbohydrate stores, and repair muscle tissue. One drink can help achieve all these goals — and it's probably already in your fridge! A growing body of scientific research has identified milk as an effective exercise recovery solution — prompting athletes and sports nutrition experts to take notice.

### **REHYDRATE**

When you train hard, you sweat hard. Milk naturally provides both fluid and electrolytes (sodium and potassium) to assist with rehydration. The electrolyte concentration of milk is similar to conventional sports drinks and fluid retention is aided by other nutrients found naturally in milk. A number of studies have now shown that milk is an effective drink for rehydration. For example a 2007 study found low-fat milk helped dehydrated cyclists replace sweat loss better than water or a sports drink. In four separate trials, volunteers undertook a series of cycling exercises until they had lost about 1.8% of their body mass. They were then given low-fat milk, a sports drink or water to re-hydrate. The cyclists who drank milk were better hydrated by an average 600mL, compared with water and the sports drink four hours after exercise.

In fact, research has shown that people who drink milk straight after training are able to exercise longer in their next session than those who drink sports drinks or plain water. And the harder you train, the quicker you achieve your goals.

### REPAIR

High-intensity exercise such as footy leads to the breakdown of muscle tissue. Intake of 15-25g of high quality protein (about 2 glasses of milk), in the first hour after exercise can promote faster muscle rebuilding. Milk contains high quality proteins (whey and casein) that can help repair damaged muscle tissue and promote lean muscle growth.

A number of studies have now shown that consuming milk after resistance training promotes more muscle gain than other protein sources. For example a 2007 study compared how much muscle protein young men gained after completing a heavy weight workout followed by consumption of protein as either skim milk or a soy drink. Men who drank two cups of skim milk after each of their workouts gained almost twice as much muscle in 10 weeks than those who drank a soy drink.

### REFUEL

During your workout. vour muscles use carbohydrate stores (called glycogen) for energy. As glycogen becomes depleted, so does your ability to perform at your peak. Drinking flavoured milk immediately after working out replenishes your muscles' energy stores and sets you up to perform better at your next exercise session

# Rapid rise for Holman

# REWIND a little more than 12 months and you would have found Nick Holman playing seniors for Kyabram in the Goulburn Valley Football League.

On Tuesday, Holman is in the Vic Country squad to play against Vic Metro at Etihad Stadium in the final match of the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

The 18-year-old has been one of the most consistent players during the course of the carnival.

It's a quantum leap in anyone's language, but for Murray Bushrangers coach Darren Ogier it underlines the work ethic, attitude and discipline Holman has displayed in that period.

Ogier doesn't mask that Holman's zest wasn't where it should be for a player with aspirations to maximize his ability.

But, the Bushrangers' coach noted that Holman addressed his inadequacies and that's helped drive his game to its current level.

"Nick's transformation has been tremendous," enthused Ogier.

"He's obviously gone away and said 'I need to improve and he's put in the hard yards to do that.

"It's through work rate more than anything else. He hates being beaten and that has really lifted his output.

"He's realized that if he doesn't work harder than his opponent he's going to struggle. It's good to see a kid get rewards for their effort.

"And, that's what it has been with Nick. His effort has been continually improving."

Holman recalled he simply "couldn't get a game" for the Bushrangers until midway through last year.

When he did break in, Holman played well enough to feature in the club's best and he noted "that got my confidence up".

Apart from his mindset, what has impressed Ogier as well as Vic Country coach Mark Ellis is the high-quality ball use and decision making from Holman, who's been able to comfortably roll through the midfield rotations.

For all that, Holman doesn't shy away from the fact that the Championships have been extremely tough, far

different from anything he's previously experienced.

Holman candidly said that he didn't think he would make the Vic Country squad although it had been a pre-season goal.

Initially, Holman set himself the target to start in the Bushrangers team then push hard to gain an invite to play for Vic Country.

"I thought it was realistic, but I never thought it would happen," Holman said

He pounded the pavement and hit the gym and although Ogier still calls him 'muscles' he's in better knick than last season

While he's found all components different – quicker, greater intensity, more pressure – Holman said he's relished the opportunity to challenge himself.

"I've been pretty lucky. I've been helped by my teammates." Holman said.

And, more importantly Nick Holman has helped himself.

# Gonsistency the focus for Lennon

# IF season 2013 seems to have been like life in the fast lane for Ben Lennon it's easily explained. It has been.

Consider what the year has held so far for the Northern Knights forward.

For openers, there was the continuation of his AIS/AFL Academy scholarship, which saw him in the team that played Collingwood's VFL team in a curtain raiser to the Richmond/Carlton season opener, which drew 80,000.

Lennon then travelled to Europe with the Academy for what he described as a "life-time" experience.

Back home, Lennon has squeezed in playing for the Knights, Ivanhoe Grammar and Vic Metro in the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Phew. Time to take a collective deep breath, but if only he could.

Lennon still has much unfinished business in this remarkable journey, beginning on Wednesday when Vic Metro plays Vic Country in the defining Championship match at Etihad Stadium.

"It has all gone pretty quick so far, I haven't had much time to think about," Lennon said.



"The AIS component was a really good experience, especially going overseas with 30 of your best mates and getting to use the best facilities and coaching from Brad Johnson, Micky O (Michael O'Loughlin), Glen Jakovich.

"It really does help your footy. We all feel like we've got a lot of benefit from it. It was a great experience; it's something I'll remember forever."

For Lennon the highlight was playing against Collingwood at the 'G as well as playing against the European Legion at Surrey Sportspark.

The temperature may have hovered around 2C, but the playing experience was matched by the ambassadorial role in showcasing and explaining Australian Rules was also most rewarding.

"That was pretty cool," Lennon said.

While there was so much to savor there's been little time as Lennon has dived back into his studies as well as continuing to escalate his football.

Lennon has been pivotal for Vic Metro, especially when the team lost star forward Tom Boyd in the opening quarter against Western Australia.

It came on the back of a six day break, a four hour trip and the daunting realization that not only was the team minus its go-to-guy, but also one player in the rotations.

"It was a pretty gutsy win," Lennon said. "I'm sure it brought the group closer together."

Modesty forebodes Lennon to dwell on the fact that he stepped up to fill the Boyd-void to finish with four goals.

Lennon's goals for the Championship pretty much mirror his pre-season target – play consistent football and play his role for the team.

While last year there was quarters of play that defined him as an emerging talent, what was missing was being able to maintain that over the course of the game.

"Going into the season I just wanted to play consistent footy and to this point I feel like I've done that," he said.

It's just one of many things that Ben Lennon has accomplished and the book is not closed yet.

# Neade a Rising Star

Former North Ballarat Rebel Jake Neade is the Round 13 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

Now at the Port Adelaide Football Club, the 18-year-old midfielder gathered six kicks, six handpasses, five tackles and kicked a goal in Port Adelaide's 18-point upset win against the Sydney Swans last Saturday at AAMI Stadium.

Port Adelaide coach Ken Hinkley said Jake has been consistent in his debut AFL season, playing all but one match.

"Being nominated for the NAB AFL Rising Star is a great reward for the effort that Jake has put in ever since he arrived at the club during pre-season," Hinkley said.

"The thing we love about Jake is that he is never intimidated by the size of the opposition and that is important given his small physical stature.

"He enjoys the contested style of the game in that he loves tackling, loves chasing and loves doing all the things that we value so highly here at Port Adelaide. And when he does have the ball he uses it very well.

"Being a first-year player Jake has plenty of footy ahead of him. He knows that he needs to work as hard as possible to continually improve his game to give himself the best opportunity to have a great career." Jake was acquired by the Power as part of a trade with GWS, who pre-selected him as an NT zone selection.

He was recruited from the North Ballarat Rebels, with his original club being Elliot in the Northern Territory. He had an outstanding NAB AFL Under-18 Championships for NT last year averaging 18.4 disposals, winning the Harrison Medal (Division Two Best and Fairest) and was named an All-Australian.

Jake is also an AIS-AFL Academy graduate.

# Injury cuts short Boyd's Championships

# CRUSHING and devastating are just two of many words that could be used to describe the injury that ruled out Tom Boyd from the last two games of the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Whatever adjective or phrase you chose it does little to ease the stomach-churning disappointment that must have engulfed the Eastern Ranges power forward.

Boyd's injured ankle will keep out until the final few rounds of the TAC Cup home and away season.

"As these injuries go it was actually pretty good," Boyd said. "There is no structural damage, it is purely ligament damage."

While he's extremely upset at how a freak accident occurred following a marking contest in the Championship match against Western Australia occurred, don't expect Boyd to be looking or playing a sympathy card.

Boyd continues to display maturity beyond his 17-years.

"First and foremost you have to take a positive attitude to get anywhere. There's no point being down in the dumps," Boyd said.

"Yes, it is disappointing. The most disappointing thing is not being able to play for my State again, it's something I've learned to love over the past couple of years.

"Just missing playing is going to be the hardest thing. It's something I've always done."

Boyd noted that preparation for this year's Championships in effect started three years ago as virtually the same group of players have come through together, all with the same focus — win the title.

He said the talent, camaraderie, support and belief within Vic Metro has no ceiling as evidenced with the victory against Western Australia against all odds.

"There really in no bigger challenge than to beat them over there and to do so on a six day break, four hour travel and then to be one rotation down for three and a half quarters tells you a lot about the team," Boyd said.

"I couldn't be prouder about how the boys stuck it out. It was a credit to them how they stood up against the tide to get the win."


Boyd has tentatively earmarked the Round 16 TAC Cup match against Oakleigh Chargers for his return.

He's keen to get back to help the Ranges finish off what has been the club's best season so far in more than a decade

"We had a lot of guys play last year as bottom agers and in this competition depth is the key and now we have all these guys with a year's TAC Cup experience and they're playing consistent footy," Boyd said.

"Finals is what you play footy for regardless of all the other distractions. It's giving me the extra drive to put in the hard yards to get back and help the boys do well in the finals."

# WOMEN'S ROUND

# THROW a name, any name, from someone in the TAC Cup, Peter Jackson VFL or AFL Victoria Development League and it is short odds that Sophie Timms can give you the heads up about that person.

Yes, as AFL Victoria Talents Operations Coordinator, it's Timms job to know who's who, but it's more than a 9-5 position, it's become a passion, a way of life.

Timms came to AFL Victoria from Bowls Australia midway through 2008. In many ways, she has been the pulse of the office ever since

Initially, Timms was an assistant to Mick Danaher in Development, but a vacancy eventuated in Talent and she accepted that position.

"I don't think I knew what was really involved when I said 'yes'," Timms said.

"I remember the first time I called the VFL the reserves and I copped a whack across the knuckles from a girl who worked here at the time. It was the last time I ever did that."

As football around the country this weekend celebrates Women in Football, Timms is not flying solo. This year AFL Victoria appointed Lauren Bunting as Talent Operations Officer in the Football Operations department.

Bunting started at AFL Victoria in 2011 working as an assistant in the community football department.

At the end of last season, Bunting was the successful applicant for the Talent Operations Officer, vacated by Luke Gatti, who is now VFL GM at Collingwood.

"I was looking for a challenge. I'd done my role for two years and I'd always wanted to work in Operations, I believe that's where my skills set lie," Bunting said.

Bunting is an unashamed footy fan. "I'm a mad Richmond supporter.' Bunting said.

An active sportsperson, Bunting envisaged she would be involved in football after completing a University degree.

There was no family link. Her father is an accountant, her mother was a teacher. What drew her to the job was a genuine love of football.

"I thought footy is the best there is in terms of sport in Australia. I thought 'yes' I want to get involved in footy," Bunting said.

"Before getting involved I had no idea how much is involved in running the sport and the different areas and skill sets required."

Those views are echoed by Timms, who admitted the magnitude of what happens behind the scenes was all consuming.

When she first started Timms was thrown in the deep end as she had to assist coordinate Liston Trophy night as well as the finals.

"The amount of people involved that's needed to put a club on the field. There are a lot of people putting in a lot of hard work to get players through the development pathway," Timms said.

"Just having an understanding of the whole development program and the juggernaut that is Australian football takes some getting used to."

Timms can recite, for example, the fortunes of Jarryd Cachia who was rookie listed to Carlton then went back to the SANFI and now finds himself back on the Blues list

Yes, it comes with the job, but extends well beyond it.

"My first draft year was the Jack Watts and Steele Sidebottom year. It's been interesting to see those boys come through," Timms said.

"Don't talk to me about game plans, but the players themselves .... It's good to work in that environment and be working with real people.

"It's good to watch the players grow and develop and succeed on and off the field. There's been heaps of stories about boys who haven't been drafted, but have been better for the experience and better footballers because they have been involved in the talent program."

Timms likens herself to Switzerland in her dealing with the Championship teams. "I'm neutral," she said. "I float between all programs and help out where necessary."

Booking the flights, all the logistics of the interstate trips down to ensuring there's enough hydration for the players is something that's the domain of Timms.

Is it a challenge for women in football?

Bunting believes her skill sets are valued and she has brought those skill sets to both her AFL Victoria positions.

She oversees the operation of the VFL and TAC Cup Tribunal while sharing with Timms the admin work: fixturing, national Championships, awards nights and finals series.

This season Bunting was the team manager of the Vic Metro Under 17 Futures team, a role she hopes can expand to the NAB AFL Under 16 & 18 Championships next year.

"Actually being involved in the team, rooting for a team and wanting them to do well is something I really enjoyed," Bunting said.

Both women are confident that any person involved in football is chosen on their skill set not their gender.

Timms hopes that pathways and opportunities will continue to present themselves not just for herself, but for all women who choose football as a career.

### **Scott powers Gippsland to victory**

Last round, the TAC Cup Radio team ventured to a sunny Highgate Reserve to call the match between the Calder Cannons and the Gippsland Power. 


