Celebrating Multicultural Round



FOOTBALL is a game we share, a game for everyone.

It's a game that knows no political, cultural, language or religious boundaries.

It's a game that unites people, communities and cultures from the most unlikely places. And, that's another reason that broadens its appeal.

Inside the AFL Victoria Record editions across the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup this weekend, there are some truly inspirational, heart-warming and wrenching stories of how football has changed people's lives.

One of the common themes is how football has not only introduced people of multicultural backgrounds to play the game but how the game has become a regular part of their daily life and also drawn families together.

Omar Abdallah, a Lebanese teenager, reflects how he hopes his fledgling career at Coburg can instill a purpose, provide inspiration and leadership within his community.

Abdallah recalled how his father Mohammed wasn't a fan of Aussie Rules when he first began playing and didn't see him play for seven years, but after he made the Calder Cannons squad his interest grew and now he's a regular at all his games.

Werribee player Anthony Piva, a son of Italian and Samoan parents, speaks of the pride of being the first member of his family to play Australian Rules.

Young Turk Ozgur Uysal, also playing at Coburg, proudly notes how his father hasn't missed any of his games since Under 10s!

And, then there's emerging Sudanese star Duom Dawam whose family escaped political upheaval to migrate to Australia where Duom had never picked up a football until he was in his mid-teens.

Now he's the No 1 ruckman for Western Jets and along the way represented the World Team, gained selection in the AIS/AFL Academy and won the inaugural Jim Stynes scholarship.

During the lead-up to Multicultural Round we have witnessed many wonderful, insightful, rewarding and inspirational initiatives.

Earlier in the week the Australia Post Multicultural Team of Champions was announced, then there was the inaugural AFL Iftar Dinner celebrating Ramadan at Windy Hill with special guests Ahmed Saad and Bachar Houli.

It's worth noting some of the nationalities representing Victoria and the World Team at this week's NAB AFL U16 Championships in Sydney – Lebanese, Indian, New Zealand, Egyptian, Sudanese, Kenyan and Macedonian.

And, at Avalon Airport this weekend around the Werribee Tigers vs Casey Scorpions VFL game there will be a number of multicultural celebrations including pre-match entertainment, multicultural food stalls and a half time NAB AFL Auskick session and Cadbury AFL9s games.

It is worth noting also that many community Leagues around the State will activate and celebrate various multicultural events throughout the weekend.

While much progress has been made, much more work is needed to identify, embrace and encourage greater involvement of multicultural communities.

Remember "many cultures, one game".

Dawam proud of cultural background

DUOM Dawam has lived through what most of us only read or watch in trepidation in various media platforms.

Dawam spent several years living in fear as he and family members fled Sudan to Egypt before migrating to Australia when he was nine.

While he'd heard of Australia he knew nothing of Australian Rules. Basketball was more his bag and at 201 cm that was understandable.

Dawam's first introduction to Australian Rules was in the school yard at recess and lunch time. He remembers having little confidence or feel for the game, and didn't really know how to hold or kick the ball, but he went along with some friends to try out with local club Wyndham Vale. "From school to local level was a big step for me," Dawam recalled.

That was back in 2009. Over the past four years, Dawam has made spectacular progress.

He has represented the World Team in the AFL Under 16 Championships, gained selected in the AIS/AFL Academy, won the inaugural Jim Stynes scholarship and now carries the mantle as the No 1 ruckman for Western Jets.

Certainly, the AIS/AFL Academy proved an eye-opener. "That's where it all began for me," Dawam said

Jets' Talent Manager Shane Sexton marvels at the progress made by Dawam since he joined the club's Brad Johnson summer training squad in 2011-12.

Sexton said Dawam continues to impress with his ruck work as his knowledge of the game expands as well as taking advantage of the one-on-one strength, conditioning, skills and game situation scenarios with Dan Haberfield.

"We think that he is improving rapidly," Sexton said.

"He has a sense for the game. His ability to get the ball off the ground given the size he is and his capacity to handball the footy is really good. Marking and kicking are the two areas we're working on."

Dawam uses the space outside his home to teach his younger brothers what he's learned about the game.

"I go out the front yard and just kick with them,

train them a little bit," Dawam said.

"I want them to start young so when they become older they can follow that footstep.

"There's not many Sudanese players in the AFL ... I look to what Majak's done and that's what I want to do.

"I want other Sudanese kids and my brothers to follow on as well."

Dawam said Daw has made a significant impact in his life. Both came through the Wyndham Vale juniors, albeit four years apart.


Daw attends the Jets' training where the multicultural squad bearing his name train. "I have a chat to him, ask him how AFL is going, how do you manage it, how does he manage his time.

"I'm proud of him," Dawam said.

Duom Dawam is already filling with pride all those who know him and the journey he's taken.

Ong enjoys rise to VFL

KENNY Ong, the eldest son of Malaysian father and Chinese mother, found his love playing Australian Rules in the school yard.

Ong's parents migrated from their respective countries and met in Melbourne where Kenny and younger brother Cancho, 18, were born.

Interest in the game with his parents was limited to knowing the clubs, but little else.

It didn't stop Ong from pursuing his passion. "I basically started playing footy at school during lunch time," Ong recalled.

"I just got asked with some of the other guys to go down to play with the local club and it's gone on from there."

While he also played tennis throughout his school days, Australian Rules now consumes all Ong's sporting time.

It quickly became evident that the kid at Ormond Junior Football Club possessed talent and he gained an invitation to try out with Sandringham Dragons.

During his two seasons with the Dragons, Ong played in Sandringham's 2011 TAC Cup premiership and last year played every game.

He was invited to the State Draft Combine testing and when nothing happened at any of the NAB AFL Drafts, Ong headed to the Trevor Barker Oval to play for Sandringham.

While their interest may have been minimal beforehand, Ong's parents are now regulars and have watched him progress through to the VFL.

"Dad loves it, he's pretty keen now, but before I started they didn't really follow it," Ong said.

Expectations were measured when he started at Sandringham, but Ong has played eight games and is on track to play double digit games for the Zebras – an outstanding return for a teenager straight out of the TAC Cup.

"I think I have been a bit lucky with the team not travelling as well as we would have liked," Ong said.

"'Macca' (Sandringham coach Simon McPhee) has given me a fair bit of opportunity, which has been great."

The step up from playing against teenagers to AFL listed players with, in some cases, 100 plus games behind them took some adjusting.

As did the endurance running required over the course of a game. "Everyone on the ground knows where they're going, knows where to run.

Sandringham has endured a fluctuating season with a constant turnover of players each week, which has affected stability and consequently consistency.

Ong hopes he can build on the experience of his first VFL season to end the season playing more consistently and helping the Zebras put some more wins on the board.

Metro holds off Country

VIC Metro shrugged off Vic Country to finish the NAB AFL U18 Championships on a high, writes David O'Neill.

Metro always appeared to have the edge in a scrappy affair at Etihad Stadium to prevail 9.6 (60) to Vic Country 6.6 (42).

A midfield brimming with depth and talent, a stubborn defence and an early three-goal cameo from Jack Billings saw Metro eventually pull clear of Country in the final term.

Josh Kelly continued his stunning carnival with 24 disposals, while Mitch Honeychurch racked up 23 and bagged an important goal to stem Country's third quarter fight back.

Behind them came a host of other contributors with hard-nut Nathan Freeman, captain Luke McDonald and the rangy Marcus Bontempelli all finishing with 21 possessions each.

Lewis Taylor was the star for Country with 32 disposals that included 21 hand ball receives, while Dallas Willsmore (two goals) and Matt Crouch (27 possessions) were others to impress.

Jarman Impey was brilliant in patches and Hugh Goddard stoic in defence but ultimately a more polished Metro outfit prevailed.

In a frantic opening it was Metro who settled first with goals to Billings and Apeness ensuring a six-point quarter time lead.

Country lost the leg speed of Darcy Lang early in the game when he limped off with a leg injury and while Crouch was finding plenty of the ball, his teammates were struggling to find a target up forward.

It was a similar story for Metro without big man Tom Boyd, leaving Billings and Lennon to hit the scoreboard in another error-ridden quarter.

Country at last found some forward momentum in the third term to draw within a point of Metro, but the ascendancy was short lived.

First Honeychurch's opportunist snap out of the pack found its mark and then James Sicily capitalised on a

Country mistake to make the margin 13 points at the last change.

With Goddard and Zac Jones on top in defence, Country were never going to let Metro sprint away and it took until the nine-minute mark of the final term before the knockout blow came.

A clever goal from Jordan Walker and another just minutes later to Marcus Bontempelli made the difference 25 points and ended all hopes of an upset.

Taylor capped his stellar game with a dribbling goal from the boundary to reduce the final margin to 19 points, but it would be Metro's night.

VIC COUNTRY

VIC Country were competitive as predicted, but were unable to sustain their good football for long enough during the NAB AFL Under 18 Championship.

That was the candid assessment from coach Mark Ellis.

"I think we probably finished up where we were," Ellis said.

"We were competitive in every game we played, but the old story – we didn't play well enough for long enough.

"In our program we can't afford to have blokes get injured. I know all teams get injuries, but we had a couple of key players not play."

Darcy Gardiner, one of four Country players to be rewarded with All Australian honors, missed some games early in the Championships, Patrick McCartin missed the match against Metro while Matt Crouch missed games also early in the carnival.

And, to compound those injuries Geelong Falcons' Lewis Taylor was absent for one match through suspension.


Ellis said Country paid dearly for not being "clean enough around the ball".

"We just didn't have enough clean hands to get the ball out of the contested possession area and move it quickly into our forward line," he said.

Ellis praised Metro for the pressure they applied throughout the match, which resulted in countless turnovers and squandered opportunities.

"It was pretty ugly at times, but the boys certainly had a crack," he said.

Ellis said Holman grasped the opportunity "to jump up and become an inside midfielder", with untapped potential to continue to improve. He was surprised that Holman did not gain recognition in the All Australian team

"He took on the role of playing a 'Crouchy' (Matt Crouch) type role and he was really eager to learn. He's a very determined young fellow," Ellis said.

"Zac Jones is just a boy who loves the contest, he's very competitive. He works hard on his game and like all boys his age he has areas of his game to work on and he knows that.

"Both boys, apart from their footy ability, are just terrific young blokes".

Ellis also praised the performance of Geelong Falcon Fraser Fort, who he said would benefit from the experience as well as Billy Hartung and Taylor, the latter two gained All Australian selection.

He added that Crouch showcased his untapped potential in the two games he played.

"Taylor certainly has some spark about him," Ellis said.

VIC METRO

AS the curtain fell on the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships, Vic Metro was left to dwell on what if scenarios.

Vic Metro's title aspirations were effectively punctured when South Australia emerged victorious with a three-point win from the match at Simonds Stadium.

Coach Marty Allison lamented the lack of a line-breaker, someone to take the game on in the concluding stages of the last quarter against SA where Metro fell agonisingly short in a result that determined the Championship.

He described that period of the match as a "big arm wrestle", which Metro were not able to find a way to break free.

"It was a testament to the boys for not throwing the towel in, not giving in. To lose by only three points was quite amazing as I thought on the day they were probably a three goal better side.

"We had a pretty good campaign. South Australia played better than us on the day.

"We had our chances in the third quarter where we played much better footy and we were hitting the scoreboard, but we kicked too many behinds.

"We dominated the first 15-minutes of that quarter, but we didn't hit the scoreboard in the way we wanted too."

Then there was the absence of Tom Boyd, but as Allison noted 'what ifs' don't register on any scoreboard. "It's whoever is there on the day that you are judged by," he said.

Vic Metro had five players – Sandringham Dragons' Josh Kelly, Northern Knights' Ben Lennon, Oakleigh Chargers' Jack Billings, Eastern Ranges' Mitch Honeychurch and teammate Tom Boyd – selected in the All Australian team.

Boyd's selection underlined the enormous opinion of the power-forward who missed the last two games and only played 15-minutes against Western Australia.

But, Boyd showcased his undeniable talent during his cameo performance to have him touted as the No 1 selection at the NAB AFL Draft.

For Billings it was the second successive year that he earned All Australian recognition.


Allison was lavish in his praise for Honeychurch, voted by the coaching staff as Metro's most valuable player.

"He may be small in stature, but he's a real competitor," he said.

"He was a standout in WA, especially in the last quarter when they were coming at us. It took a really big effort after being exhausted to will himself forward and kept committing himself to physical collisions and ended up kicking a goal.

"And against South Australia after being down he along with Kelly really got us going and against Country he had 23 touches, six clearances and seven tackles he was really good."

Allison liked the performance also of Northern Knights Marcus Bontempelli as well as Eastern Ranges ruckman Michael Apnes and Oakleigh Chargers Darcy Byrne Jones.

NAB AFL Under-18 All Australian team

The NAB AFL U18 Championships All Australian team was last week announced, with nine TAC Cup players featuring in the side.

Vic Metro featured five representatives, while Vic Country had four players named in the side.

AFL National and International Talent Manager Kevin Sheehan said many of the names in the team would be known to thousands of football fans this time next year.

"The team represents the future of the game as these players will be very prominent at the 2013 NAB AFL Draft in November on the Gold Coast.

"Players like Ollie Wines, Nick Vlastuin, Jake Neade, Lachie Whitfield and Joe Daniher were named All-Australians this time last year and have now successfully made the transition to AFL football," he said.

Only two players, Liam Dawson and Clem Smith, are 'bottom-aged' and therefore ineligible for the 2013 NAB AFL Draft.

Jets snatch a last minute victory

A last minute running goal by David Iaccarino has steered the Western Jets to an amazing win over the Gippsland Power at the Preston City Oval.

A strong breeze was favouring the City end of the ground to which the Western Jets had first use of. Gippsland Power seized the initiative early doors by kicking 4 goals into the wind whilst Western Jets were only able to manage 2 goals 4 behinds with it.

Inaccurate kicking in the second term (3 goals 8 behinds) by the Power still enabled them to lead by 17 points going into half time however the Western Jets were able to stay in touch by matching their three goals for the quarter. For Gippsland, Jordan Cunico was doing well across half forward, Bohde Walker was good in the air and Liam Nash and Tom Muir down back were also playing well. Western Jets Brett Bewley looked classy while Iaccarino was winning plenty of the ball.

The persistent Jets came back in the third term kicking 4 goals to hold a shaky 1 point lead at the last change. Most people at the ground were expecting the experienced Power team to come home strong with the wind but the Western Jets boys had other ideas. Jets' Harley

Armstrong-Weston was doing a great job on TAC Cup leading goal kicker Josh Scott spoiling well and not allowing him to hit up with the lead. Pele Manivong was becoming a danger man up forward for the Jets and with a brilliant run through the middle of the ground he delivered it to a one on one contest where Matt Singleton marked and goaled. Jason Robinson was linking up well to provide drive from half back as the Jets were all prepared to run and carry the ball while Gippsland continued to kick poorly to that end of the ground finishing the last term with 1 goal 5 behinds.

In the dying moments of the game Iaccarino got on the end of a handball running inside 50 and goaled to help his side hit the front. The ball was in dispute on the half forward line for Western Jets when the siren sounded handing the Jets a thrilling 2 point win.

The Jets players and supporters were elated after the game as they all knew how important the win was to them.

Former Cannon a Rising Star

Former Calder Cannons player Michael Talia was the Round 15 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

The tall defender topped the Western Bulldogs' possession count with 32 touches (14 kicks and 18 handpasses) in their four-point win over the Greater Western Sydney Giants in Canberra last Saturday.

The 20-year-old played most of the 2012 season for Williamstown in the Peter Jackson VFL, but got his opportunity to make his AFL debut in Round 19 and played four of the last five rounds. He has played five matches in 2013, all since Round 10.

Western Bulldogs coach Brendan McCartney is pleased with Michael's development.

"Michael is progressing really well, and just keeps improving steadily as a genuine tall defender. He showed some good signs towards the end of last season with his appetite to compete and great capacity to run, and has continued that this year.

"There are still some things to work on in his game, but we are optimistic about where he is heading as a player," he said.

Michael is the second Bulldog to be nominated in 2013 following former Oakleigh Charger Jackson Macrae in Round Eight.

He was selection 39 in the 2011 NAB AFL Draft and was recruited from the Cannons and the Greenvale Junior Football Club.

Michael represented Vic Metro in the 2011 NAB AFL Under-18 Championships and was named an Under-18 All-Australian.

Michael's grandfather, Harvey Stevens, was the Bulldogs' 1953 premierships ruckman.

He is the younger brother of the 2012 NAB AFL Rising Star winner, Daniel Talia.

TF – What's one thing you think you can take away from this experience?

JN – Going 100%, 100% of the time, intensity has to be up, like, that would be with life as well, just to go flat out all the time.

TF – What do see as being your main strengths as a player?

JN – Trying to compete, kicking goals, just competing really

MURRAY BUSHRANGERS: This week the Bushrangers face the Nth Ballarat Rebels at Craigieburn; many thanks to the Rebels for their hospitality and for the Calder Cannons to allow us to play at their ground and 'meet in the middle' to avoid

a long travel for both teams. This week the Bushrangers and Rebels have taken part in their TAC Driver Education Program and had all players drive to the game. As a regional Club the Bushrangers players, families and staff are faced with long driving and as such, driver fatigue can become a dangerous reality. In fact, the TAC advises us that fatigue is suspected to be a primary cause in more than 20% of road fatalities. Most fatigue-related accidents occur during normal sleeping hours, and the more severe the crash, the more likely it is that the driver or drivers were fatigued. Fatigue is a likely factor in almost one third of single-vehicle crashes in rural areas. Further, the TAC have identified the following causes of fatigue: a lack of quality sleep; driving when you would normally be sleeping (overnight); sleep disorders such as sleep apnoea, a sleeping condition that causes tiredness throughout the day and that symptoms of fatigue can include: yawning, sore or heavy eyes, slower reaction times, finding you're daydreaming and not concentrating on your driving, driving speed creeps up or down, impatience, impaired driving performance such as poor gear changes, stiffness and cramps, loss of motivation. The TAC recognizes that fatigue has a huge impact on your driving and can affect your

ability to drive safely, similar to the effect of drink driving. Research shows that being awake for 17 hours has the same affect on your driving ability as a BAC (blood alcohol concentration) of 0.05. Going without sleep for 24 hours has the same effect as a BAC of 0.1, double the legal limit. Finally, here are some tips from the TAC on how to beat driver fatigue: get a good night's sleep before heading off on a long trip, don't travel for more than eight to ten hours a day, take regular breaks – at least every two hours, share the driving wherever possible, don't drink alcohol before your trip. Even a small amount can significantly contribute to driver fatigue, don't travel at times when you'd usually be sleeping, and take a 15 minute powernap if you feel yourself becoming drowsy. Top prospect making strong choices on field and behind the wheel

Arguably the hottest footballing property in Australia has endorsed Leading Teams as a strong influence on his burgeoning career to date.

Tom Boyd and his Eastern Ranges teammates took part in an insightful session during the week, learning of the impact choices and consequences can have in football and on the road.

"That might be deciding not to go out with your mates the night before a game," Boyd said.

"As teenagers, these are some of the challenges we face."

Boyd, a 199-centimetre, 104-kilogram key forward, is widely tipped to be taken with the first selection in November's NAB AFL Draft, despite injuring his left ankle while playing for Vic Metro in the recent NAB AFL Under-18 Championships.

The setback hasn't derailed his plans to finish the season strongly, or clock as many hours as possible as a learner driver, before turning 18 next month.

"Because the injury was to my left foot, it hasn't stopped me from using the right foot to drive," Boyd said.

Leading Teams program manager Dain Fay led the session with Ranges and sees TAC Cup clubs as a vital audience in promoting road safety.

"In most cases, you can be speaking to up to 60 people in a room. The tragic aspect is that road trauma isn't too far away for many of us," Fay said.

"A guy I went to school with was speeding one day, and because of that poor choice, is still affected by an incident today."

Following the Leading Teams session, Ranges starred in their own annual road safety advertisement, watched on by Boyd.

Captain Ben Cavarra kicks off the ad by calling in his teammates, asking what decisions they can make to improve their awareness as players and drivers.

Ads filmed by all 12 clubs will be screened on Channel Nine's TAC Cup Future Stars and posted on YouTube in the coming months.


