FRED'S MID SE FOOTY WRAP

ROUND 14 PREVIEW

KALANGADOO players will be looking to record their second win against another round 13 loser at Tantanoola.

The Tigers have just been tipped out of the top four.

The home team will be keen to do well as their 1973 premiership coach Bill James and his team will be marking 40 years since they defeated Tarpeena in the grand final.

Speaking of season deciders, Hatherleigh has never played Port MacDonnell in a grand final and 2013 might be the year.

A preview of this fixture might be seen this afternoon as the teams meet at Hatherleigh.

Glencoe should have a comfortable win at home over Nangwarry while Robe will be hard-pressed to deny Mt Burr another victory at the seaside.

ROUND 13 REVIEW

HATHERLEIGH had one poor quarter but it was still enough to account for Nangwarry by 79 points.

The Eagles stitched up the game by quarter time when their lead had ballooned out to 41 points.

The remaining three quarters were more even with Saints holding sway in the third.

Kongorong's major round hopes were abruptly brought to a close at the Bay with an unimpressive effort against the powerhouse Port MacDonnell outfit.

The Hawks are now in the midst of a fortnight's break as they contemplate their July 27 match against Hatherleigh.

For the seaiders, the big victory over an arch-rival was a perfect way to prepare for today's top-of-the-table away clash against the Eagles.

The rivalry between

neighbouring clubs Glencoe and Kalangadoo dates back almost a century but the result was decided by quarter time.

Mt Burr footballers have finally overcome their sluggish start to the 2013 season as victory against Tantanoola at home on Saturday lifted them into the top four.

With the game in the balance at three-quarter time, the Mozzies worked hard, harnessed the scoring end advantage and played a smart brand of footy to lower the colours of the Tigers by 12 points.

This was the same margin as their meeting at Tigerland on April 27.

The Burr Boys also officially unveiled their new Can Hill but water-logging rendered the siren inoperable.

THE MID SE 2013 INTERLEAGUE CAMPAIGN

IT is a stark fact that the Mid SE suffered one of our worst losses at home in living memory when the Mallee Football League lowered our colours by 70 points at Kalangadoo on June 8.

The scoreboard was an accurate account of how we were taught a football lesson by a league with just six clubs.

How can we get back into winning form when we head north in 2014?

I have held off commentating on the result and I have spoken to quite a few league insiders to gauge their views.

Firstly, we did most things right.

We had the right coach in Jeff Medhurst who has played and coached in the Mid SE with distinction and was a handy player with his home club West Gambier in the other league.

Selector, Nangwarry president Shane "Pluggger" Ploenges, provided the continuity with past years while new chum John Richter has an impeccable footy pedigree with Sturt (SANFL), Mt Lofty (Hills Football League) and all three SE leagues.

The back-up crew in trainers Glen Johnson, Tracey Livingstone and Erica Hurley

handled all matters with aplomb, while team manager Bill Chapman, interleague director Eddie Fensom and runner David Kuhl could not be faulted.

The league executive backed up the off-field and on-field personnel with 100% support and it takes quite a bit of effort to field, clothe and feed a senior team and two underage teams.

Mid SE league president Peter Mitchell, league secretary Naomi Mitchell and their other executive members had to cope with a myriad of tasks ranging from sourcing sponsors, socks and umpires as well as liaising with the Mallee Football League, SA Community Football League, team photographer and the media.

The match day Budget was shorter-than-usual but it still had to be filled with material.

Speaking as the Mid SE secretary when we had to arrange our hosting of the Kowree Naracoorte Tatiara Football League at Hatherleigh in 1993, I reckon Peter and Naomi would have devoted a total of 100 hours to interleague.

I reckon the four training runs at Tantanoola, Glencoe, Mt Burr and Kalangadoo was about the right number and it has served

us well in the past.

Mind you, the Mallee had just one training run and yet their team work was superb.

No matter what some might say, it was certainly Kalangadoo's turn to host the interleague match.

It was 28 years ago since the Magpies had this opportunity. On average, Mid SE clubs have had to wait about 20 years in between such matches.

With hindsight, perhaps it might have helped the Mid SE if we had chosen to play the match on a boggy and muddy oval.

Despite an imperial inch of rain, the Kalangadoo oval was firm, well grassed and well drained.

Such playing surfaces are commonplace in the Mallee Football League.

I also reckon the selectors were right to choose a young side with an average age of 22.

They also chose players with good form in club games and only players who were 100% fit.

They avoided the temptation to pick ageing players who might have played at higher levels but carry battle-weary bodies.

So, there was much that

the Mid SE did correctly in our preparation for interleague.

I also think it was good to have one central umpire from each league to officiate on the day and they did a good job.

I liked the way our umpire "Ben" Young penalised players for holding the ball.

We don't see this rule applied enough in the Mid SE and we have lots of players who like to hatch the ball.

Receiving an interleague appointment is probably the next-best umpiring gig to getting a match on grand final day.

Back in 1988, I remember running the boundary in an interleague game at Robe against the Central District Football Association.

The sole central umpire was Rick Charlesworth and he was a bloke who took charge of more than 200 SANFL games.

We won't ever return to those days.

Speaking of umpires, how come the Mid SE did not have an umpire on duty at the SA Country Championships in Port Pirie a month ago?

It seems to be yet another situation where some leagues get a Gold Pass from the SA Community Football League and the Mid SE gets unfair treatment.

So, how are we going to turn around a 70 point margin when we head to the Mallee in just over 10 months from now?

Firstly, decide on the interleague coach and selectors well before the start of the home-and-away season.

The 2014 interleague coach and his off-siders should be able to view all nine clubs in action at our no name Pre-Season Cup as well as a few club trial games.

The selection panel should also be able to get to a few games in the Mallee Football League to suss out who is likely to cause us damage in the next meeting (going on the results of our June 8 match, there are about 22 Mallee players who would fill that category).

I have the solution to those players who rule themselves out of playing due to work, social or

other commitments.

It is simple.

I propose players who cannot commit to interleague for these reasons must advise the Mid SE secretary by April 30.

If they do not do so and are required players, they will be obliged to face the Mid SE panel of commissioners and explain why they should not be fined \$500.

It is a similar situation with required players who are injured and have to miss interleague.

In my scheme of things, they would be required to produce a statutory declaration stating the nature of their injury.

It would be signed by themselves and their club secretary or president.

I think all officials and players involved in interleague from the Mallee and the Mid SE should be paid a flat rate of \$200.

I reckon the Mid SE should do in 2014 what we did in 1991 when we played the Barossa, Light and Gawler Football Association at Nuriootpa.

On that occasion, we hired a bus and stayed for two nights at a seaside pub in Adelaide.

It was not any old hotel as it was the ritzy Largs Pier Hotel and owned by the legendary Mt Burr and Kongorong premiership coach John "Jackson" Roberts.

Next year, the bus should take our Mid SE squad northwards and we should stay at somewhere like Tailern Bend or Pinnaroo for two nights.

The payments for players and officials as well as the bus, meals and accommodation costs will go well into the five figures.

It should be coming directly out of the very deep pockets of the South Australian Community Football League.

Even if the interleague match cost the Mid SE about \$10,000-\$12,000, then this is still below the weekly match fee of most AFL players.

It is about time AFL boss Andrew Demetriou looked after the grass roots of footy as this is the breeding ground of the likes of the Murdoch brothers from the Bay.

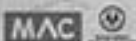
