Future stars shine at Championships



THE curtain dropped a fortnight ago on the NAB AFL U16 Championships in Sydney which ended another year for AFL Victoria's U16 and U18 Academy programs managed by our High Performance Managers, Anton Grbac and Leon Harris. These Academies are supported by AFL Victoria's twelve regional talent programs that operate under the direction of our TAC Cup Talent Managers.

Importantly, these Academies also receive fantastic support from our partner Dairy Australia and the many part time coaches, staff and volunteers prepared to devote their time and expertise to support our teams at the Championships. Everyone at AFL Victoria appreciates the input of these people.

Vic Country claimed the U16 title when they beat SA by 2 points, while Vic Metro bounced back from a significant loss to SA in their first game to beat Vic Country by 2 points later in the week. Vic Metro were gallant runners-up in the U18 Champs, while Vic Country were competitive in all their games.

Our Vic Metro and Vic Country Academies at these two age levels and the Championship match schedules are pivotal in the development of young talented players. About 150 young Victorians come together at the two Championships and are exposed to a level of expectation, preparation, standard, tempo and intensity of the game that is far greater than they have previously experienced.

Opportunities are everything and that's one of the key drivers of the Championships so these aspiring young players can challenge and test themselves against their peers on a national stage.

Every player will emerge better for the experience whether it be to build on for next season or return to the TAC Cup competition this season a better player.

Some will gain selection in the national AFL Academy program, a wonderful learning and development experience that has shaped the future of so many current AFL stars.

For others it has been an opportunity to showcase their talent before AFL recruiting scouts who'll make judgment on players in the various Drafts at the end of the year.

What also should not be overlooked is that the Championships also provides players with the marvellous opportunity to represent their State. For some it will be a career highlight where friendships become lasting legacies.

Individually, many excelled. Nine Victorians – the most of any State - featured in the All Australian team selected at the conclusion of the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

And, from the NAB AFL U16 Championships Sam Skinner was awarded Country MVP while the Metro MVP went to Nicholas Kearney.

Rhys Mathieson was awarded the Kevin Sheehan Medal for the U16 Division 1 best and fairest.

Congratulations also to U16 Vic Country coach Paul Henriksen and Vic Metro coach Mark Fisher and their respective coaching staff.

Coach lauds Vic Country spirit

It's back to reality for country Victoria's best U16 footballers.

After claiming the NAB AFL U16 Championship title in Sydney a fortnight ago, country Victoria's finest are likely to be found back at their local clubs, enjoying everything winter has to offer.

It's a world away from the action in Sydney, playing on pristine grounds like Skoda Stadium, home to the GWS Giants, and trying to make an early impression on AFL recruiters.

While Vic Country's campaign - proudly supported by Dairy Australia - wasn't all smooth sailing with two wins and one loss from three games, a final day victory over the highly fancied South Australians secured the coveted national title.

The men in white were given little hope against SA, after the Croweaters had demolished Vic Metro earlier in the week, who in turn had run over Vic Country in Round 2.

But relishing their underdog status, Country leapt out of the blocks before gallantly holding on for a memorable two-point triumph.

Geelong Falcons ace Rhys Mathieson capped a stunning carnival with a starring role in the win, ensuring he took home the Division 1 best-and-fairest trophy.

The midfielder-come-forward bagged two important goals in the victory after earlier helping Country gain the ascendancy with some powerful work in the centre square.

Key defender Sam Skinner (Gippsland Power) was awarded Vic Country's most valuable player after keeping Australia's premier forwards in check all week, while his fellow backman Keiran Collins (Dandenong Stingrays) won plaudits for his defensive efforts.

Midfielder Dylan Parish (Geelong Falcons) and forwards Josh Dunkley (Gippsland Power) and Josh Schache (Murray Bushrangers) were others to impress, while Sudanese born Gach Nyuon (Dandenong Stingrays) captured plenty of attention with his athleticism and ruck work.

Coach Paul Henriksen, who hails from Terang, said the resilience and character

shown by his players was immense.

"South Australia had easily defeated (Victoria) Metro and WA so we went with the mentality that if they were going to win it, then they were going to have to earn it," Henriksen said.

"We jumped them early and credit to them they came back. But our guys were able to withstand it and had probably had learnt a fair bit from a tight loss to (Victoria) Metro."

Vic Country had been cruising at half time in the Round 2 encounter before their traditional rivals powered home to win by two points.

While no one in the Country camp was pleased with the result, Henriksen said it did allow his chargers to take stock of where they are as players.

"The week is really about learning and teaching and that loss taught the kids that they need to look within themselves and think about what went wrong."

"For a lot of these kids they're used to a 100 pats on the back. But we tell it like it is and give them a good idea of where they're at."

Vic Country's successful campaign also included a two-day camp at the Australian Institute of sport, which Henriksen said was a real eye-opener for the players.

"It's was great for the kids get to see that professional environment and all the things that come with it like stats and analysis."

"We held up a champion data report (stats breakdown) and not many of the kids had seen one before but by the end of next season nearly all of them will be familiar with them."

"The week is all about preparing them the best we can for what will hopefully be TAC Cup football next year."

Salem kicks the sealer

DEEP into time on in its match against Eastern Ranges, Sandringham Dragons was desperately searching for someone to seize the moment.

The Dragons were five-points down as the seconds ticked menacingly by in a match that carried finals implications. There was a pack situation, a kick forward, a ricochet off a leg and the ball found its way in the direction of Christian Salem, who was about 40 metres from Sandringham's goal.

With little time to react, Salem instinctively put the ball on his boot. He was unsure of the outcome as a Ranges opponent fell across him and knocked him to the ground.

"I had my legs taken out from under me so I didn't really see where it went," Salem said.

"I just heard everyone start screaming and went along with it."

Salem had kicked a goal to put Sandringham in front and about 40 seconds later the siren sounded giving the Dragons a one-point win.

It was a much needed win given Sandringham currently sits seventh, percentage points ahead of Northern Knights and two points clear of Calder Cannons.

"It was massive as we lose all the private school guys for two games after the bye," Salem said.

For Salem it capped a great game, just his third this season for the Dragons given his school commitments with Brighton Grammar and then Vic Metro.

It was a game where Salem showcased all the talent that has him projected to be selected early in the NAB AFL Draft.

Sandringham coach Justin Plapp described Salem as a youngster with untapped potential who has the scope to take his game to the AFL level.

Plapp said Salem has all the attributes, particularly good finishing skills.

"He's a beauty; I think he's going to be a real draftable boy. His game against Eastern was the best I have seen him play," Plapp said.

"He's an elite kick. He can play as an inside mid, forward or on a wing. He's just a clean, hard type of player."

Salem collected 26 possessions, gathered five hand ball receives and effected seven tackles in a performance that saw him earn maximum points in the TAC Cup Coaches Award.

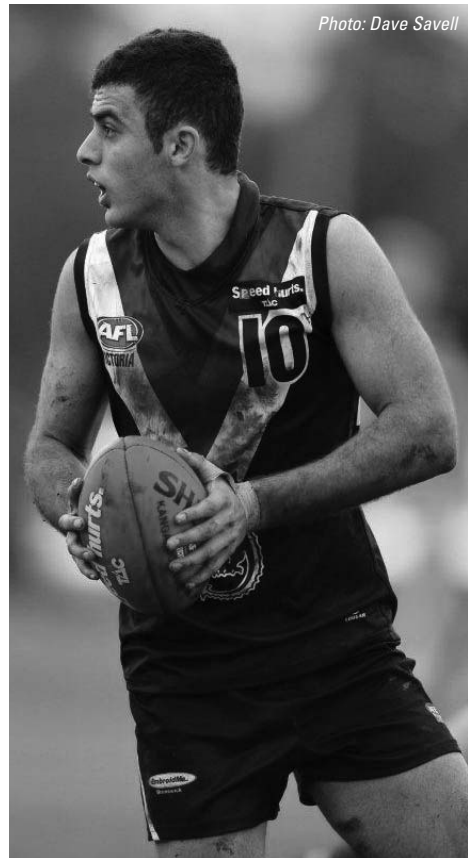
Salem held mixed views of the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships. He was disappointed that Vic Metro fell short of winning the title.

Personally, he thought his performances ebbed and flowed. "I was in an out of games, a bit patchy," Salem said.

"I took a few focused areas to work on out of the nationals. I tried to put it together against Eastern and it started to work well.

"I have to keep stringing those performances together."

The science behind football

There is no denying 2013 has been a tough year for sport scientists.

The peptides saga, and criticism from some corners over the growing influence of science in football, has dented the image of fitness experts.

But for Jamie Hepner, AFL Victoria's Head of Athlete Management, it's been business as usual as he strives to prepare Australia's best underage footballers for a career at the elite level.

Hepner's primary role is to monitor the physical performance and well-being of members of Victoria Country and Victoria Metro's High Performance Academies.

With a view of compiling comprehensive information on players for their own benefit, and for the benefit of recruiters, coaches and TAC Cup Talent Managers, Hepner relies on GPS data – a tool that has become increasingly important in evaluating footballers.

The demand for information on draft prospects is greater than ever and Hepner plays a critical role in not only compiling data on individuals but helping them understand the standards they need to reach.

From one tiny module that sits in a pocket on the back of a player's jumper, Hepner is able to measure during games

and training key physical outputs such as the distance an individual covers, the amount of high-intensity effort they produce, and the distance they cover per minute of time spent on the ground.

"They're all valuable measures and enable us to work with players on achieving specific goals," Hepner said.

"The total distance for example is a great indicator of the load of work a player has done, whereas the distance in relation to the time they're on the ground can be a better measure of performance."

Hepner said young players needed to become accustomed to this sort of analysis because of its prevalence at the elite level.

"The old fashioned footballer doesn't exist anymore.

"We still get guys coming in to the program that traditionally would have been the type of player that wouldn't pay much attention to GPS data or nutrition, but they don't survive.

"If you can't get your head around what is required at the next level and be able to prove you can handle it, be able to quantify it and buy into all this stuff, then you're not going to make it."

Hepner, who holds a Bachelor of Applied Science, said the



data also ensured players were accountable to the group.

“We make no apologies about putting a spread sheet up in front of the group and letting guys know that they didn’t work hard enough and they’ve let the team down.

“Hard work doesn’t take talent and with the reports we generate, guys have nowhere to hide.”

As well as measuring their performance, Hepner also looks after the well-being of players by monitoring sleeping habits, nutrition and workload, and passing this information on to the doctors, coaches and TAC Cup Talent Managers.

“In terms of recovery, nutrition and sleep are such important factors and far outweigh anything that can be achieved with things like ice baths.”

Part of this work also deals with ensuring the players are educated when it comes to what supplements are allowed and which are prohibited.

“The players all go through the drug education program which is run by the AFL, and we work closely with our academy doctor to make sure we strictly adhere to the rules.

“Our supplement program is extremely conservative and is basically the equivalent of muesli bars.

“The kids know that they can’t take anything without getting it checked by the doctor first.”

Another key part of Hepner’s role is to oversee the strength and conditioning coaches who are based at the 12 separate TAC Cup regions.

“It’s important we are implementing the same practices across the regions and part of my role is to evaluate their programs,” he said.

“I also look at helping facilitate development opportunities for them, such as spending time at AFL clubs.

“I worked with the Geelong Falcons when I was younger,

so I try to pass on any information that I have learnt since leaving that I wish I’d known at the time.”

Hepner’s busy season begins with a high performance testing day for all TAC Cup players in March and gets more hectic by the month.

The six-week long NAB AFL U18 Championships, where he doubles as the Vic Country runner, is quickly followed by the NAB AFL U16 Championships – this year held in Sydney.

If that wasn’t enough, the 28-year-old has just returned from China as part of an AFL initiative to help grow the game internationally.

For the second consecutive year, Hepner ran a combine to test young Chinese athletes and teach them more about Australian Rules Football.

“Last year we found a young guy by the name of Chen Xiao Liang, who hadn’t really played any organised sport (just basketball with mates), and he jumped 86cm. That’s higher than Nic Naitanu.

“Football exists within China with a fully fledged league (Southern China Football League). It started out with a lot of expats playing but more and more Chinese kids are getting involved.”

Christensen sets high standards

EXCUSES are always easier to find and deal with than solutions just as apportioning blame is an easier road than accepting responsibility.

Calder Cannons coach Andrew Jago notes that Aaron Christensen doesn't belong in the above mentioned categories.

Jago said Christensen deals with reality with brutal honesty and has little time for fiction and 'what if' scenarios. He also added that if anything the 17-year-old is too hard a marker on himself.

It could be easy for Christensen to point to the fact that because of injuries and school commitments he's had to be thrown around a bit like a rag doll to fill key position holes at either end of the ground.

He hasn't. He's dealt with the challenges he's been assigned as best he could. While Jago has been more than happy with how he's played, Christensen hasn't been as satisfied.

And, this from a teenager who has had to deal with an illness over pre-season.

"Aaron has been playing a stop gap for us," Jago said.

"We have used him as a key position tall and used him back and forward. We have used him as a half back flanker and a half forward flanker.

"We've had injuries and guys out with private school boy commitments. I've been very happy with his season, but Aaron hasn't been as happy as I've been."

Jago said Christensen set himself high standards for himself and chases them with plenty of endeavor.

"Aaron holds himself accountable to his own standards," Jago said.

"He never provides an excuse."

Against Western Jets in the Round 13 match, Jago asked Christensen where he'd like to play. Christensen asked if he could play on a wing, a request that was granted.

Christensen didn't disappoint as he racked up 27 possessions, laid four tackles and kicked one goal in a best-on-ground performance as the Cannons emerged with a one-point victory.



"I've probably put a bit more pressure on myself than I should have been, but against Western, I just freed myself up a bit and I had a bit of fun out there," Christensen said.

Jago described Christensen's defensive side of his game as "very good" in that he found a lot of the football working back into the club's defensive 50 metre arc and then found it in the offensive spread.

"I got a few kicks for a change" is how Christensen modestly assessed his game.

What was more pressing for Christensen is that Calder needed a win to stay in contention for the finals.

"All we've got to do is keep playing the way we have," Christensen said.

You can lock Aaron Christensen into that equation.

Egan over injuries

ONE thing or another, but mainly a frustrating run with injuries has conspired against Brady Egan in recent seasons.

The wretched run dates back to pre-season of the 2012 season where he tore both his quads.

The first – the right quad - happened pre-Christmas and then he tore the left warming up before Round 2.

As Egan discovered it's all related to lower back issues and effectively erased a large chunk of his season and when he was fit he had to play out the year with Rye.

During his time with Rye, Egan endured a medial strain behind his right knee, which restricted him to half a game.

"It's been a pretty rough time," Egan said.

For all his troubles, Dandenong Stingrays thought enough of Egan to bring him back this season as a 19-year-old.

But as they say in the steak knife commercials, 'but wait, there's more'.

Egan felt some hamstring tightness against North Ballarat in Round 6, but after doing all the rehab he emerged with a really stiff back.

"I just thought it was stiff through work," Egan said.

"I didn't think it was my 'hammy' as I was running at 90 per cent."

He had a week off and then when he played against Oakleigh Chargers, Egan felt the same sensation.

It required another three weeks cast as a spectator.

But, Egan highlighted the upside to his talent in the Stingrays' 70-point win against Bendigo Pioneers.

He was seemingly everywhere as he collected 19 possessions, took eight marks, laid six tackles, won 14 hit outs and kicked one goal.

"It's definitely my best game for the Stingrays," Egan said.

"My body feels as good as it's been in the past 18 months. I've been doing lots of recovery stuff and I've been doing a bit of surfing.

"Getting out in the water and paddling around is good for just moving the muscles around. The salt water has really helped."

Stingrays' coach Graeme Yeats said the club is really pleased that Egan has overcome his injury woes and embraced the challenge issued to him this season.

Yeats said the injury setbacks had masked the ability that Egan possesses.

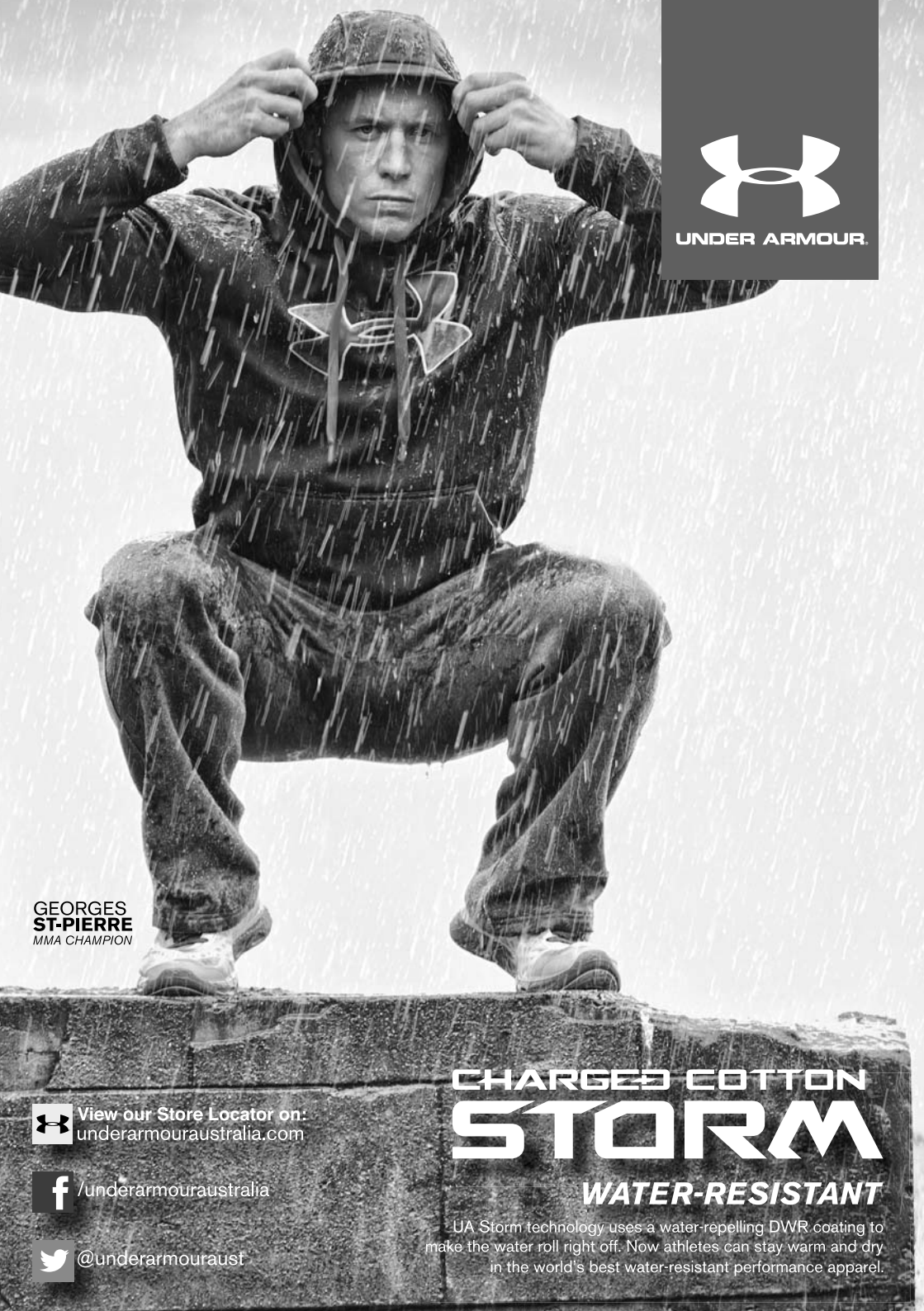
"Brady has had troubles getting himself out on the track. He's had a lot of problems," Yeats said.

"He's had one last crack and as he showed against Bendigo he's got talent. When he's fit he's a really good athlete.

"He's got a good motor, he's quick enough and against Bendigo we threw him in the ruck and he can jump over guys who are six foot six.

"He's got some really good qualities."

Nicholls Round 16 Rising Star

Former Sandringham Dragons player Tom Nicholls was the Round 16 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

The 201cm Gold Coast Suns ruckman played his best game to date holding his own against Richmond's ruckmen Ivan Maric and Ty Vickery at Cazalys Stadium in Cairns a fortnight ago.

He was named in the Suns' best after he gathered a career-high 18 possessions, six marks, five tackles and 25 hit outs.

Tom, 21, played one AFL game in 2011 before a knee injury ended his season. He then played the entire 2012 season playing for the Gold Coast Suns NEAFL team.

In 2013, he has played six AFL games after breaking back into the side in Round 10 following an injury to Zac Smith. Since then he has shouldered the responsibilities of being the Suns' sole ruckman and in doing so has averaged 24 hit outs and 14 possessions. He kicked two goals against Essendon in Round 12.

Suns coach Guy McKenna said the ruckman's time developing in the NEAFL is now starting to reap rewards.

"Tom has done an outstanding job in the absence of Charlie Dixon and Zac Smith, despite the pair missing with injury, Tom has well and truly deserved his spot in the

senior side and has continued to improve game after game.

"Over the past three seasons Tom has been developing his game to the point where he can now compete against some of the most seasoned AFL ruckman and that a credit to him and our development coaches," he said.

Tom is the second Gold Coast player to be nominated this season following Jaeger O'Meara in Round Five.

From Fijian heritage, Tom was recruited from the Cheltenham Panthers Junior Football Club and the

Sandringham Dragons. He arrived at the Gold Coast Suns as a 17-year-old access selection in 2010.

Tom represented Vic Metro in the 2009 NAB AFL Under-18 Championships and is an AFL-AIS Academy graduate.



Tomlinson takes Round 17 nomination

Former Oakleigh Charger Adam Tomlinson was the Round 17 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

Tomlinson was a standout in the GWS GIANTS' loss to Essendon at Skoda Stadium last Saturday, collecting 23 possessions, including a game high nine marks, four tackles and a goal.

The Round 17 match marked Tomlinson's best AFL game to date during a season that sees the 19-year-old averaging more than 15 disposals and seven marks per game.

GIANTS coach Kevin Sheedy said it was reward for the consistency Tomlinson had shown in his second year in AFL football.

"Last year Adam was in and out of the side but this year with another pre-season under his belt he has strung a number of games together and has taken 83 marks for the season, which puts him at number one for the club and three ahead of Jeremy Cameron," Sheedy said.

"We are pleased with his continued development and he is obviously enjoying being in Sydney and has re-signed until the end of 2015 along with a number of our young players."

After being selected by the GIANTS with pick number nine

in the 2011 NAB AFL Draft, Tomlinson made his AFL debut in Round 1, 2012 against the Sydney Swans.

He went on to play nine games for the club in his first year, averaging 11 disposals a game, and has continued to impress throughout his 11 matches in 2013.

The former Oakleigh Charger – one of seven players from the club selected at the 2011 NAB AFL Draft - is an AIS/AFL Academy graduate and was a standout performer at the 2011 NAB AFL Draft Combine, ranking in the top ten for both kicking and endurance running. He is the second NAB Rising Star nominee from Greater Western Sydney this year, following Lachie Whitfield's nomination in Round 10.

Golden Square's "Healthy Bulldog Burger"

Who has the best burger in the Bendigo Football Netball League?

More importantly who has the healthiest burger in the league?

Golden Square FNC has a serious contender for the title, a burger that has been developed as part of AFL Victoria's Healthy Club Pilot, which has been running at the club over the last 12 months.

The pilot has given the club a great opportunity to look closely at the healthy choices available, and how decisions made in the areas of food and alcohol can impact the club community/environment.

Over their time in the pilot, the club reassessed all aspects of their canteen and game day offerings, and the burgers underwent a major overhaul to ensure supporters were treated to an offering that was tasty as well as healthy.

Mandy Southcombe, part of the committee at Golden Square, says a complete food audit was completed as part of the clubs involvement in the program.

"Over the last two seasons we completed a food audit at the club which resulted amongst the many changes, in deep fried options being removed.

"We then focused more on fresh ingredients including ham/chicken/vegetarian rolls served with salads, a range of yoghurts, fresh fruits, muffins and a variety of waters," Southcombe said.

"Basically we have moved with the "foody" times as we

are aware that this generation of players and supporters are seeking healthier food options. Hence, we are trying to capture that market without charging outlandish prices."

Golden Square did plenty of work in preparing their new burger and menu, which they believe to be one of the best in the competition.

"The standard of a good burger is in using fresh ingredients that provide a balance in flavour, are filling and that are easy to eat and don't leave the eater with splodges of grease or food droppings down their blue and gold outfits.

"We actively sought a butcher who was happy to modify his hamburgers to suit our needs. To this end we found a boutique butcher, Meats on Mitchell owned by Brian and Amanda, and not only are the hamburgers made to our specifications - which means preservative free and all fresh ingredients - but we have also supplemented our menu with gluten free sausages."

AFL Victoria's Cultural Strategy Manager, John Strachan said Golden Square FNC made a bold step in changing their menu, but the positive results prove healthier options are viable and popular.

"Golden Square leads the way in always looking to improve as much off the field as on it.

"The review of their canteen menu is to be applauded," Strachan said. Strachan said that he can vouch for the "Healthy Bulldog Burger" as he sampled one (or two) at a recent visit to MYJET oval.
