In the event of scores being level at the elapsed time, the timekeepers are instructed to sound the siren. The field umpires shall then.

- a) Direct the goal umpires to consult with each other as to the correct score. Teams are required to stay on the ground until goal umpires confirm scores correct.
- b) On receiving confirmation that the scores are level instruct both captains that the match shall recommence with the teams kicking to the same end as in the final quarter and that two five minute periods (with time on) shall be played with teams exchanging ends after the first five minute period immediately after the siren sounds.
- c) Consult both captains as to their readiness to recommence the match.
- d) Hold the ball aloft to indicate to the timekeepers that the match is about to recommence.
- e) The timekeeper shall then sound the siren and the match will recommence.
- f) In the event of scores being level after the two five minute periods, a further two five minute periods (with time on) shall be played with clubs exchanging ends after the first five minute period.

This process shall continue until there is a result.

Coaches are not permitted to address players at any stage after the three-quarter time interval

AFL Vic Country

Fathers Day reminder to country footy fans to look up and live.

Energy Safe Victoria (ESV) is reminding country football fans to stay safe around electricity at the official Look Up and Live AFL Victoria Country round this weekend.

To coincide with Father's Day, ESV will be handing out look up and live re-usable coffee cups at country football matches in the hope that fathers, sons, brothers and everybody who works near electricity will keep the cups handy and remember this vital message.

A new TV commercial featuring Collingwood football star Dale Thomas will also be airing around this time, reinforcing the message that country workers should beware of overhead powerlines and know Victoria's 'no go zone' rules

Father's Day is an appropriate time to issue a reminder because workers continue to be injured in accidents caused by machinery and equipment contacting overhead powerlines and sometimes these accidents are fatal.

Time to Test

The E.J. Whitten Foundation is asking country footballers, administrators and supporters to get behind the 'Time to Test' campaign.

The foundation is urging males over 50 to make 2013 the time to test for prostrate cancer, by ditching their reservations about visiting their GP.

Early intervention can dramatically increase the chance of limiting the disease but still getting blokes to visit their doctor is proving challenging.

Check ups for men and women are very different as Dr Bernie Crimmins, author of Blokes Health 1, explains. "It can be difficult to get men to go to the doctor," Dr Crimmins said.

"In the clinic when I call my next male patient, two people often stand up – one is a female who will be first in the room and say something like – 'you don't mind if I come in Doctor. I want to make sure he tells you everything.' Then generally a sheepish male follows with his eyes rolling to the heavens.

"The divide between men and women in health is further highlighted when you ask the male what has been the problem.

"Males may supersize their junkfood but downsize their complaints."

Dr Crimmins said pain is felt the same by both sexes, however, it is all about interpreting different language used by men and women.

"A female describes pain as 'kills, worse than child birth, excruciating', while the male version is 'didn't tickle or hurt a bit'.

"Men are still hesitant for regular check ups and unfortunately fear the dreaded DRE (Digital Rectal Examination) and it may have scared some men away.

"Women however have been trained by government endorsed Pap smear programs and Breast screen to have regular check ups. These don't exist for men."

The E.J. Whitten Foundation is also gearing up for its annual Grand Final Luncheon on Thursday September 26. The event, now 15-years-old, has been a major fundraising initiative for the foundation and has become an annual tradition for many men and women who love to be part of Grand Final Week.

The event, which has raised more than \$7 million since 1996, funds prostate cancer research, medical equipment and facilities.

Support acts - or are they?

The Casey Cardinia League home-and-away season wrapped up nicely last week, with all attention now focusing on whether anything short of an apocalypse can change the likely final outcome in September.

From round one Narre Warren has been the Black Caviar of the league and is on track to break the long-standing MPNFL wins-in-a-row record of Carrum, should the Magpies win their next two games. Each the other four finalists are being touted by many as 'making up the numbers' so that should provide plenty of inspiration to their coaches this weekend.

With apologies to 100 goal-kicker Marc Holt, the highlight of round 18 was without doubt Hampton Park's first senior win for two years. Against ninth placed ROC, the Redbacks played like a team possessed and put the game to bed in the first term. Tears were privately shed by some hard men watching on late in the final term as it became apparent that the long-awaited anthem would again be sung at the Robert Booth Reserve – a sign of the future it is to be hoped.

The other surprise was Berwick's underwhelming performance against Tooradin, which set up an elimination final to be contested by two 'lucky losers' this Sunday. The results of the other games went to script and now we come to the business end of the season where no team will be taking prisoners.

Elimination Final

The mood at Pakenham and Berwick would have been subdued last weekend after both failed reality checks.

The difference was that only the most ardent and optimistic Pakenham fan would have expected the Lions to down undefeated top dogs Narre Warren.

On the other hand most Berwick followers walked away scratching their heads after Tooradin gave them a reminder that near enough is never good enough.

Pakenham coach Steve O'Bryan has endured a season of highs and lows with a side that he and his assistants have rebuilt from a low base in 2012. There has been a determination to maintain some consistency of selection at the Toomuc Reserve this year and younger players including Jake Kowarzik, Michael Taurua and Chris Cardona have taken their games to the next level. The return of Beau Wheeler, John Atwell and Nathan Brown, along with the inclusion of O'Bryan has also added class to the Lions line-up.

It has also been a season of change at the Edwin Flack Reserve with Berwick finally clawing back some pride under first season coach Rhys Nisbet. Nisbet already had the respect and friendship of most at the club and it was easy for stanch Wickers like Jason Kelly, Andrew Tuck, Paul VanSchilt and Brett Robinson to fall into step with their coach and lead by example on the field.

The goal kicking edge is clearly with Berwick and if it is s day that suits forwards the crowd can expect Nathan Waite, Jordy Andrews and Mitch Johnson to put on a show. That said, if it becomes tough in the clinches and a game of contested ball, the Lions look to have more players willing to get their hands dirty.

The unknown is what, if any, advantage the Toomuc Reserve will be to the Lions, but they have a mental edge

over the Wickers after downing their more fancied rival by one point in round 11. That was the start of a patch of really good form that almost saw them snatch a top three position. That was not to be, and the Lions must face up to a do-or-die contest just to stay in the finals race. Berwick will approach the game with a determined attitude but the class edge is with the Lions and it will be Pakenham that earns another week on the training track.

Qualifying Final

The challenge of the challengers will take place to decide which club has the first crack at undefeated minor premiers Narre Warren, and this game will be a corker if both sides bring their best to the Edwin Flack Reserve this Saturday. Cranbourne played inspired football last week and if they repeat that against an in-form Beaconsfield this weekend, the crowd will be the big winners. This game is crucial to the grand final aspirations of both sides.

Beaconsfield started the season under a new coach but an old face at the club in Clint Evans. The debut of new plush facilities along with the inclusion of new blood including Nar Nar Goon premiership coach Clint Williams, Ben Kerrigan and Scott Meyer created an expectation of improvement. That came to fruition but took more time than many predicted. Beaconsfield has maintained a running game style and that is the type of game that wins finals. Last week was a good tune up for what is to come this week.

Cranbourne coach Doug Koop would have hoped for top spot but accepted second place at the start of the year. He is coaching his last finals series after six seasons at Casey Fields and will be aiming to go out with a second pennant to his name. Maintaining the second chance and first crack at the Magpies will be his aim and his match winners in Marc Holt, Justin Berry, Ryan Davey and Curtis Barker love nothing more than turning on the lights on the big stage. The chance presents itself again this weekend.

The key to the game will be how quickly Beaconsfield can move the ball into attack and maintain possession because Cranbourne will be sweating on turnovers. Cranbourne's defence is their springboard of attack with Nick Barker and Matt Thompson providing the experience. Beaconsfield has ball magnets like Daniel Mislicki and Josh Dodsworth in top nick at the right time of year and the result may come down to which side uses the ball best when they have possession.

This will be a cracking game and the team that hits the ground running will have a significant advantage. Both sides defend a lead well but neither is big on clawing their way back after a bad start. Cranbourne loves playing on the big stage and Berwick has been a successful venue for the club over the last five years. Cranbourne is a seasoned finals combination and generally find a way to win games that matter. Both will want a crack at Narre Warren but it will be Cranny that gets first go.

Reserves

Berwick will enter this weekend's qualifying final against Cranbourne as favourites but if complacency creeps in to the Wickers' mindset they will lose. Cranbourne will not give two hoots that the game is at the Edwin Flack Reserve because they have already downed Berwick at the venue this year. The Eagles are a hard running side that likes to play in space, and their defence is one of the tightest units in the reserves competition. On paper it is Berwick, on the ground it will be Cranbourne.

Doveton will meet ROC at Pakenham in the elimination final on Sunday and neither coach has too many unexposed secrets given the pair played only a fortnight ago. The Doves won that encounter and should repeat that in a game with more on the line. The Kangaroos did a good job just to make the top five because the senior side continued to take players throughout the year to cover injuries. The Doves look too good around the middle and in attack and will keep the faith for one more week.

Under 18s

The qualifying final will be fought out between Berwick and Beaconsfield who come fresh off the Keysborough bye. The Wickers have continued to look the most danger to Narre Warren's premiership aspirations this year and it will take a super effort from the Eagles to cause an upset. Berwick looks too strong particularly in attack, and a win will set up a huge second semi final challenge for the talented Wickers.

The elimination final clash between Pakenham and Cranbourne will be a test of the Eagles will given the Lions have the home ground advantage. That, however, might be the only advantage that the Lions have because, excluding four premiership points, statistically Cranbourne has an edge on their rivals. The Eagles will need to expose Pakenham's lack of scoring power and take the game on early because, if they allow the Lions to shut it down, season 2013 will end very smartly.



Falcons defeat Stingrays in the last round of the TAC Cup.

The Dandenong Southern Stingrays recorded their a loss in the final game of the home and away season for the TAC Cup , losing to the Geelong Falcons by 41 points on Saturday after a very dominate display the week before. The Stingrays team were completely outplayed by a very well drilled and discipline team in the Falcons who were dominating the scoreboard in the opening term, leading by 20 points at the first break.

The Stingrays had plenty of the play and were dominating the inside 50 entries but could only manage points, a trend that last until the 3rd quarter where they finally

broke the drought.

This trend of dominance and wayward kicking continued in the second quarter with the Falcons lead growing to 28 points at half time, and from there the game looked like it was practically over as the Stingrays were held goalless for two quarters for the first time this year.

In his half-time address, Stingrays coach Graeme Yeats employed his team to lift their work rate after their poor first half on the scoreboard and pleaded for the forwards to catch something, stressing everyone needed to defend their area better to stop the free flowing running on the rebound. His final advice was when you had a chance to convert to nail it as there was plenty of hard work being done in the back half going without reward.

In the third term, through better conversion, the Stingrays managed to kick the first three goals and got within 2 goals, until a lack of concentration and a free kick straight after a Geelong goal to see the Falcons once again take control of the game.

A positive for the quarter was the Stingrays managed to outscore the Falcons with the margin 27 points at the siren.

"The score line is not always a true reflection of the state of play and at $\frac{3}{4}$ time, most of the stats would most likely been in our favour, "Yeats said.

The last quarter Geelong once again had the game on their terms with overlap running with the ability to kick

goals, whilst the Stingrays were more competitive in the second half the game was never in real reach.

"It was a hard day to assess the performance of the team as if we had kicked straight we could of easily of been in front at half time and the score...we just couldn't manage to close the gap on the day." Yeats said.

"I think there were a couple of positives in personnelwe're really raped with our underage players and a few of our top age players are starting to play consistent football at the right time of the year."

He went on to say "We defiantly were beaten by a better team who will be hard to beat though the finals campaign...they have set the benchmark all year for the TAC Cup and they continued that today."

In spite of the weighty defeat, Stingrays Talent Manager Mark Wheeler believed that the inexperienced group had learned some invaluable lessons from the game.

"If we learn to work together and harder, we will be in the game longer- you're then a chance to do what we did for the previous 5 games." Wheeler said.

"The Falcons have always liked to play football on their terms, they like to be a very attacking side and instil a lot of belief in each other- we once again allowed that to happen today and to make it worse we missed too many opportunities in front of goal."

The positive for the Dandenong Southern Stingrays is they have finished third on the AFL Victoria TAC Cup ladder with 10 wins, 7 losses and a healthy percentage of 121.94, giving them a valuable double chance in the AFL Victoria TAC CUP finals series.

This is the eighth consecutive year the Southern Stingrays will feature in the finals, a tribute to the very well structured coaching and support staff the Stingrays have in place.



Quality Communication.

Effective interpersonal skills are attributes which are common to successful umpires.

Earlier this year the AFL High Performance Umpiring Academy identified a set of key components of effective communication:

Listening

They identified that being a good listener and having empathy with players assisted in ensuring effective communication.

Remain calm

Players respect umpires who are able to remain calm and composed when delivering messages in emotive situations and use positive body language and eye contact to manage situations. Umpires do not need to have the last word - ignore players if you have responded to their query and they want to keep going.

Using tone & whistle - There will be times during a game where it is important to convey a sense of urgency and tone can be used to great effect. For example, if you're trying to quickly clear the protected area when a player is having a set shot from a tight angle it may be appropriate to use your tone to convey that players must quickly vacate the protected area.

Likewise, in loud situations an umpire can use the whistle to get the attention of players.

Law terminology - When delivering messages it is important to use appropriate language. This includes having a thorough understanding of the laws and using the terminology from the law book.

Be precise - Umpires should avoid rambling or speaking for the sake of it. Do not commentate games but say only what is necessary. For example, the umpire should not feel the need to tell players to knock the ball out during a scrimmage. Awarding a holding the ball sends the same message.

Avoid trying to be funny - Trying to be funny usually doesn't work. Players can misconstrue attempts at humour as a level of disrespect.

Encourage other umpires - Teamwork is important and encouragement has a place. However, don't fall into the trap of constantly pumping other umpires up.

There are many opportunities on match day to demonstrate effective communication. Whether it be on arrival, during the match or after the match communication is an important part of an umpire's role.

Developing a Game Plan - One of the most important aspects of pre-match preparation for an umpire at any level is the development of a game plan.

A game plan is a set of rules and guidelines that an umpire aims to implement into his/her match in order to optimise performance.

It is vital that a game plan is created as it defines how an umpire should approach a match and what they should be aiming to achieve throughout the course of the game. At the elite level, the AFL umpires game plan includes the following:

Game Plan

- Let them play football
- Pay all infringements
- Take control when appropriate Follow team rules
- Communicate effectively
- Bounce straight

Team Rules Character

- Integrity
- Honesty
- Professionalism
- Lifestyle

Knowledge - Understanding the laws of the game and their application

Teamwork - Support on and off the field

Zero Tolerance - Zero tolerance to demonstrative/verbal


Work Rate - 100% effort 100% of the time

A sound game plan will increase your umpiring performance and make the game more enjoyable to umpire.





Casey Scorpions News

Rd 19 Casey Rue Missed Goals at Box Hill - Paul Army



F OR the Casey Scorpions, the difference between the victor and the vanquished was vast.

They lost to Box Hill Hawks by two points in last Saturday's final VFL home-and-away round at City Oval, and they probably should have won after missing some easy chances in an engrossing final last quarter.

It sent them to fourth place on the ladder and they must travel to Simonds Stadium on Friday night to meet minor premier Geelong in a qualifying final. If they'd won, they would have finished second and hosted a final.

On such contrasting scenarios did hang a handful of stray shots late in the match, notably from left-footer Dom Barry, whose composure deserted him when he had the opportunity to put the Scorpions in front. They looked out of it when they fell 26 points behind in the third quarter.

At that stage they'd kicked only four goals in a match that coach Rohan Welsh thought bore the pressure of a final. But they kicked the last three goals of the term, two from Tom Gillies and one from James Magner. Then a Nathan Page snap cut Box Hill's lead to two points early in the final quarter.

Soon after, Jake Best was wide with a straightforward set shot, but Casey led by a point. The rest of the game was played at a pitch higher than anything before it. It had to be: these were high stakes.

The Hawks edged ahead through Sam Grimley and Mitch O'Donnell goals, but Gillies, more noted as a backman, but having an influence in a Jesse Hogan-less forward line, threaded his third from a tight angle.

It was back to six points. And from there the persisting Casey had its chances but couldn't take them, Mitch Gent missing on the run and Barry wide from close in. Box Hill held on, grimly (and with Grimley) and a touch fortunately, Hawks coach Damian Carroll thought. "Gutted" was Welsh's first word as he began his post-match talk with his players.

But he said he saw a "care factor" that would serve Casey well in the weeks ahead. He set down the challenge: the club hadn't won a final in six years and had gone out in straight-sets in the past three seasons. It wasn't good enough, he said.

Now was the time to put a stop to it. He asked if any players had appeared in a winning final at VFL level. There were few raised hands. But Gillies said quietly that he'd played in Geelong's VFL premiership last year and it was his greatest moment in football.

The words lingered like the smell of liniment. Welsh spoke of what it would take to defeat the Cats: unrelenting effort from every player.

It was stirring stuff.

If at that point he'd asked them to run through a brick wall, 23 players would have tried (and might have wound up in the adjoining Box Hill social club).

"There were times when we looked like we were going to be blown out of the water but we worked hard enough to get back into it and put ourselves in a position to win it," Welsh told Leader. "We had the majority of play in the last quarter but we didn't hit the scoreboard. "That was the disappointing part, the guys not getting the reward."

The Cats have won their past 11 matches and in the final round defeated Bendigo by 201 points. A formidable task awaits the Scorpions. But they were the last team to defeat Geelong and they may regain prolific Tom Couch from a hamstring injury.

And, like Welsh said, they have a "care factor" arguably missing in previous campaigns.




