Finals football begins

THERE'S nothing quite like finals football.

It's what drives every player who plays the game. It's the insatiable desire to be part of something quite special – a premiership.

And, that experience is forever celebrated in a person's life. The success of a player's career can often be built on the outcomes of the next month.

It's the culmination of months of toil and sweat during pre-season followed by the seemingly never ending demands of what can be a long, unforgiving home and away season.

Now, players, both in the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup, find themselves in an abbreviated four week season where the pressure and expectation increases.

For those clubs involved in this week's Elimination Finals it begins what is in effect a mini Grand Final each and every week. Win and survive, lose and the season is over.

Everything seemingly shifts up a gear: speed, tempo and, of course, pressure. Finals football can define a player.

It's about seizing the moment, taking your opportunity, making the extra effort to help the team and keep that premiership dream alive.

Intrinsic to finals football is the opportunity and exposure it offers players to showcase their talent on a stage where the spotlight shines more brightly than during the home and away season.

Discerning eyes of recruiting managers from every AFL club will scrutinize, dissect and analyse every aspect of the TAC Cup finals.

History tells us that players who perform well during the TAC Cup finals enhance their prospects of being selected in the various NAB AFL Drafts later in the year. It can also be the making of a VFL player.

Finals are also a time of celebration. It's not only confined

to the next four weeks when we witness clubs chase premiership glory.

It's a time when we also recognize the outstanding individual achievements. In the not too distant future we will toast the winners of the JJ Liston Trophy as well as the Morrish Medal for the fairest and best players respectively in the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup.

The VFL and TAC Cup Teams of the Year will also be unveiled, recognising those players whose play over the past five months has been exceptional.

Already, we have seen an extraordinary finish last week where Port Melbourne full forward Dean Galea kicked seven goals, including three in the last quarter, to oust Frankston's Michael Lourey by one goal for the honor of the Jim 'Frosty' Miller Medalist as the VFL's leading goal kicker.

All Victorian football fans are invited to join in the month-long celebration that comes with finals football.

All the best to all players and clubs involved in the finals over the next 4 weeks.

Finally, as you would be aware, the AFL Commission during the week imposed significant sanctions on the Essendon FC relating to its supplements program in 2011 and 2012. At the conclusion of discussions between all parties designed to bring the matter to a resolution in the overall interests of football, it was determined by the AFL that the Essendon VFL side would be permitted to play in the 2013 VFL Finals. I acknowledge this decision has created some debate, but it should be noted the AFL were in the best position to make this call given their role in the Essendon FC investigation and their access to all related information.

TAC Cup finals

The TAC Cup season is once again set for an entertaining finish as the 2013 finals begin with four tantalising matchups, as Justin Jenvey reports.

2013 sees the opportunity for a new premier after the last year's champions the Oakleigh Chargers failed to make the finals. Along with Oakleigh, the North Ballarat Rebels and Sandringham Dragons don't return to September and are replaced by Eastern Ranges, Northern Knights and the Western Jets.

At this stage Geelong would appear favourites to take the title after a fantastic home and away season. The Falcons have moved from the bottom of the eight in 2012 to the top of the eight in 2013 after recording 14 wins and are a very good chance to make their first Grand Final since 2000 when they claimed the premiership.

That year they took on the Eastern Ranges and there is every chance that this season's Grand Final could be contested by the same two teams. Eastern Ranges jumped 10 spots up the ladder to second to make their first finals appearance since the 2009 season. Darren Bewick's men will be looking to add another premiership to the teams 2002 triumph.

Dandenong Southern Stingrays have again had another successful campaign having made the top four for a sixth consecutive season. The Stingrays will be looking to make up for a straight sets exit from last season's finals. This year's team has a good opportunity to win the team's maiden premiership, something which has eluded them in the past.

The perennial powerhouse of the last decade, Calder starts another finals series looking to add to their already impressive trophy cabinet. Their first challenge will be trying to beat the top placed Falcons, who they knocked out of the finals in 2010. The Cannons have been extremely impressive of late having knocked of the Falcons and Eastern Ranges in the last two rounds.

The Western Jets return to finals action after missing

out last year and will take on Murray in what should be a good match. The Jets haven't made an extended run in the finals for a number of years and that's what they'll be aiming for.

Northern Knights are another team to return to finals play, ending a two year absence from September. The Knights last finals win was way back in 2007 so they will hope for at least one win this time round. They play the same opponent who knocked them out of the finals when they met in 2010.

Last year's grand finalists Gippsland again return for another shot at a premiership. In the last four years the Power have twice lost grand finals and twice been knocked out without winning a game after securing a double chance. It's going to be a tough task to go all the way from seventh but those returning from 2012 will be hungry after the disappointment of last year's one point loss.

Murray have had mixed results over the last five seasons, missing out on finals on two occasions, losing in the first week twice and of course winning the 2008 premiership. The Bushrangers play the Jets and will look to avenge a 10 goal loss from round eight and advance deeper in to September.

QUALIFYING FINAL I: GEELONG FALCONS V CALDER CANNONS

This Qualifying Final pairing has made a rapid rise up the ladder this season, with Geelong Falcons and Calder Cannons moving from seventh and eighth to the double chance.

NOT that it really needed to, but Geelong Falcons sent a timely reminder to its rivals last week.

And, in particular to Qualifying Final foe Calder Cannons, which jetted into the top four at the last moment thanks to a five game winning streak and Western Jets being shot down by Sandringham Dragons.

When naysayers – unsighted and unheard for virtually the entire season – began to appear in recent weeks to question whether Geelong was the real deal or a pretender, the Falcons set the record straight.

Pitted against Dandenong Stingrays, comfortably sitting third with its own five game winning streak, Geelong let the TAC Cup community know just why it has been the competition trendsetter.

Geelong kept the Stingrays goal-less in the first half – Dandenong's kicking was woeful, but the bottom line is it didn't kick its first goal until the third quarter.

And, by that stage the Falcons were on route to an emphatic 41-point victory.

It underscored Geelong's dominance and that really has been the story of the home and away season.

The Falcons won its first eight games – mostly by large margins – before it inexplicably lost against Eastern Ranges by 18 goals.

It managed two goals while Eastern kicked 20. It was so far off a true indication of the club's ability.

Call it an aberration, particularly given it fell during the heart of the NAB AFL Under 18 Championships.

Geelong embarked on another four game tear before Northern upset it by seven points in Round 14. And then followed a four point win against Bendigo and a one point loss against Calder.

All of a sudden, talk

switched to the Falcons being vulnerable. Ask Dandenong Stingrays players just how vulnerable they found Geelong last week.

So, for the third time this season, Geelong goes head to head with Calder, which has gained momentum in the second half of the season.

The Cannons owned just four wins after the first 10 rounds. Included in one of those losses was a 27-point defeat by Geelong.

But, Calder proved a far more formidable team in the second half of the season.

After Northern inflicted a 51-point defeat on them in Round 12, Calder has been on a roll winning its past five games to lift itself from sixth to fourth.

As mentioned earlier, included in that run was a one-point win against Geelong in Round 16 at Simonds Stadium.

And, to show that was no fluke, Calder last week beat second-placed Eastern by 47-points.

It sets up an enthralling Qualifying Final with a Preliminary Final spot for the victor.

Calder is in grand form, but Geelong didn't finish two games clear on top without good cause.

QUALIFYING FINAL 2: EASTERN RANGES v DANDENONG STINGGRAYS

In a large leap up the ladder from 2012, the Eastern Ranges face top four regulars Dandenong Southern Stingrays in a Qualifying Final.

CHANCES were always strong that Eastern Ranges and Dandenong Stingrays would go head-to-head in a Qualifying Final before the final home and away game in the TAC Cup played out.

And, that's exactly how it's played out although neither Eastern nor Dandenong could be happy with the circumstances that locks together the two clubs.

The Ranges and the Stingrays come into the Qualifying Final attempting to rectify poor performances last week.

Eastern has to put behind them a 47-point loss against Calder, a match where they were completely outplayed in the second half.

Dandenong has to rebound from a 41-point defeat by Geelong, a match where their poor conversion saw them have to wait until the third quarter to score their first goal.

While the strong seasons from both clubs have earned them a double chance, both know the importance and benefit of winning a Qualifying Final and advancing straight to a Preliminary Final.

Although missing its private school students as well as an injury to star Tom Boyd, Eastern had won five in a row before Calder unceremoniously ended that streak.

The Stingrays had put behind them a mid-season slump where they lost four in a row to get back into contention with a series of thumping wins.

They defeated Murray, Bendigo, Sandringham and North Ballarat by margins ranging from eight to 16 goals.

Twice this season Dandenong has gone on five game tears, but, it was dealt a reality check by Geelong. Big time.

The club that puts behind them last week's loss and gets back to

its previous good form will emerge with a win.

This is the third match up between the clubs this season.

Dandenong won the first, back in Round 3, when it posted an eight goal win at Bayswater then Eastern travelled to the Stingrays home and took away a 10-point win.

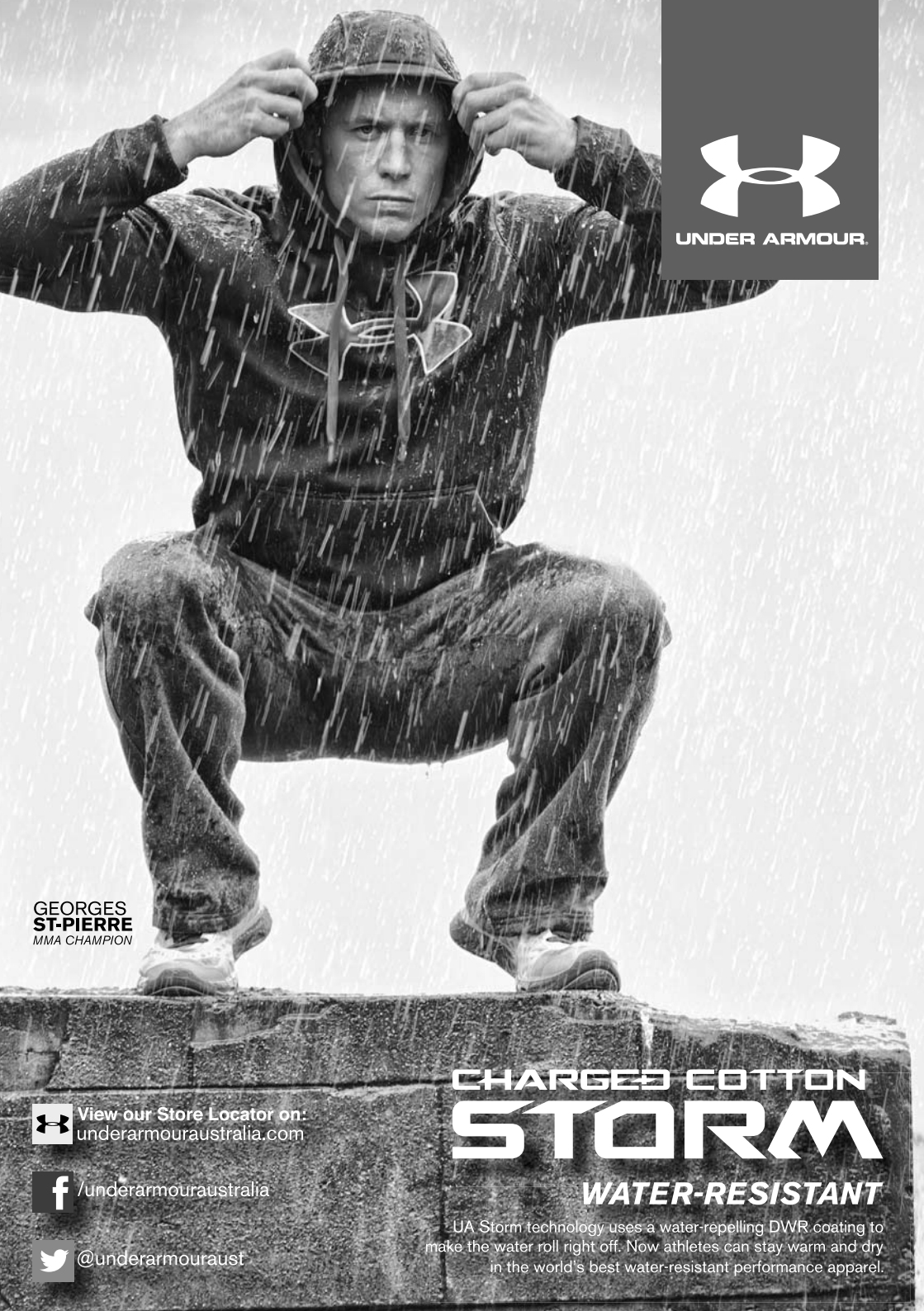
It could be said that neither team was at its full capacity in either match, but how often does that happen?

More than likely talented players will be missing from the Qualifying Final, but players can't get caught up in that peripheral stuff.

No doubt that good players can help, but nothing lifts a club more than all its players contributing to the cause not jumping on the coat tails of the more gifted players.

It will be the club that plays as a team not as individuals that will earn the week's rest and await a Preliminary Final berth.

ELIMINATION FINAL 1: WESTERN JETS v MURRAY BUSHRANGERS

The Western Jets and Murray Bushrangers meet this Sunday at Visy Park, with their season on the line.

WESTERN Jets didn't see the monster that was Sandringham Dragons coming that delivered it an Elimination Final against Murray Bushrangers.

And, by the time it did, the Dragons had well and truly slayed the Jets and its hopes of securing a top four finish, and with it the coveted double chance.

It came without warning as just five points separated Western and Sandringham at half time.

The Jets knew all about tight, contested, pressure football. After all, it had played in 11 games decided by 18-points or less during the season.

But, Western would have no answer to Sandringham, which restricted them to just two points in the second half while kicking 8.8.

Not only was it Western's biggest loss for the season, but coupled with Calder's victory it pushed the Jets down to fifth and into a showdown with the Bushrangers.

Ironically, the Bushrangers know exactly what the Jets endured. They suffered a similar loss against Sandringham just the week before.

To its credit, Murray rebounded from that shellacking to defeat Northern to retain eighth spot and, ironically, keep Sandringham out of the finals.

And, that stopped Western having to face the Dragon slayers in successive weeks.

Murray only had three points to spare from the surging Knights last week, but that's all they needed.

Not only did it arrest a three game skid, but gave Murray a shot of avenging a 63-point defeat Western inflicted at the club's only meeting back in Round 8.

The Jets held Murray to just four goals that game, its second smallest goal haul of the season.

Certainly, Murray's win against Northern will give it great confidence as it was only the second club in the finals they've beaten this season.

The Bushrangers defeated Gippsland by three points back in Round 3, an identical margin to the one that they prevailed against Northern.

Murray will need to find a reliable avenue to goal, something that has troubled it most of the season. No fewer than 11 times were Murray held to 10 goals or less

in a game.

At no stage did Murray post a century scoreline with its highest score – 15 goals – coming against wooden spooner North Ballarat.

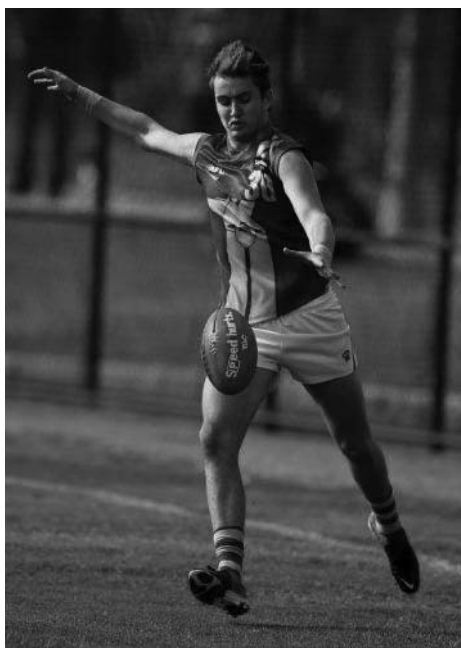
Conversely, Western kicked scores of 11 goals or more 12 times. That ability to apply constant scoreboard pressure could prove telling.

Western struggled considerably both times they played Sandringham this season. They'll be keen to erase that game from its memory banks and focus on the consistent form it displayed throughout the season.

It was a season where Western defeated Northern, Calder and Gippsland, albeit by single digit amounts, but it also thrashed Eastern by 17-goals.

How will Western respond to last week's loss? Just how much confidence will Murray gain from its win against Northern?

For the victor the premiership hope is alive. For the loser, the season is over.





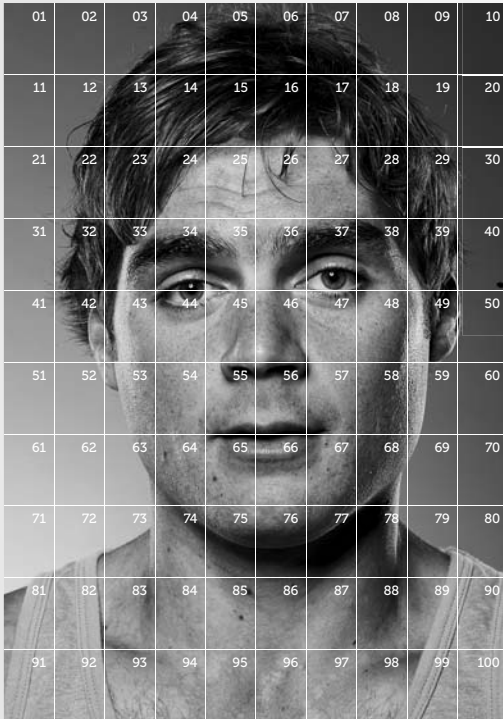

ELIMINATION FINAL 2: NORTHERN KNIGHTS V GIPPSLAND POWER

The Northern Knights make a triumphant return to the finals, and will confront a finals regular in the Dandenong Southern Stingrays.

GIPPSLAND and Northern are tales of differing seasons. And, after this weekend's Elimination Final the curtain will drop for the final time on one of their seasons.

After the Power won eight of its first 11 games with losses against Oakleigh and Murray by less than one goal, Gippsland always figured to play finals.

No such surety with Northern, which sat ninth with three and a half wins after the midway point.

The second half of the season produced starkly contrasting results.

Gippsland became mired in a slump that saw them not only drop from second to seventh, but having to snap its losing streak against Bendigo in the final home and away game to ensure a spot in the finals.

Admittedly, the Power lost three games by 10-points or less, but those narrow defeats can take its toll on player's confidence and self-doubt can become a constant companion

While there was little to no power in Gippsland's second half, Northern Knights burst to life. The Knights won six of its last eight games to climb into the eight and overhaul Gippsland.

During its rejuvenation, the Knights toppled Geelong, Dandenong and Calder, who all finished in the top four.

But, the Knights won't be entirely happy with how the season ended.

Northern's trip to Wangaratta last weekend proved costly. Not only did it lose by three points, but also the defeat ruined its chances of a top four finish.

Victory would have seen the Knights climb to third and with it gain the double chance.

Instead, it finds itself fighting for its existence this season against Gippsland, buoyed that it has kept alive its flickering season.

The clubs stand at 1-1 in its season's battles. They were territorial affairs.

Gippsland defeated Northern by 26-points back in Round 8 at Morwell when Josh Scott kicked five goals and Jordan Cunico provided another snapshot of his talent.

Northern repaid the favor in Round 15 at Cramer Street when they posted a 35-point victory built on Marcus Bontempelli's dominance and ably assisted by Ben Lennon.

So, now it comes down to a single game season, played out on a neutral venue.

Can Northern put behind them the agonizingly close defeat last week that took away a top four spot?

Can Gippsland surge on its confidence building win against Bendigo?

Really, players can't reflect on what might have been. That's gone. What is important is the task at hand.

Viney a Rising Star

Former Oakleigh Charger Jack Viney was the Round 21 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee.

Jack was Melbourne's best on ground against Fremantle at the MCG. His 28 possessions – 14 kicks, 14 handballs, five marks, five tackles and goal – was his best performance in his 12-game career.

Since his AFL debut in Round One, the 19-year-old midfielder has played with a desire for the contest. He has overcome a toe injury and since his return in Round 17 has averaged 22 possessions.

Jack is Melbourne's first NAB AFL Rising Star nominee this season.

Interim Melbourne Coach Neil Craig said Jack's last month had been very consistent.

"Jack has a fiercely competitive mindset, the only other player I've coached at such a young age with a similar mindset was Patrick Dangerfield. Jack has a thirst for wanting to be the best player he could possibly be.

"The element that has really impressed me about Jack is that he really cares about wearing the Melbourne jumper; playing for Melbourne is more than just playing AFL football and he has great passion to change the perceptions of the Melbourne Football Club. As he continues to develop, he will bring a lot of joy, pride, excitement and hope to Melbourne supporters," he said.

Jack was a second round selection in the 2012 NAB AFL Draft. He signed with Melbourne in October 2012 and was a father-son selection (selection 26 overall). Jack's father Todd is a former

Melbourne captain who played 233 AFL games.

He played for Vic Metro in the 2011 and 2012 NAB AFL Under-18 Championships, as well as with Casey Scorpions in the Peter Jackson VFL in 2012. He is a graduate of the AIS-AFL Academy.

Jack played junior football with Ashburton and the Oakleigh Chargers.



Falcons claim minor premiership

THE Geelong Falcons have claimed the TAC Cup minor premiership for the first time since 2009 following a dominating performance against premiership rival Dandenong in the final round of the season, as Brad Green reports.

The Falcons will now face the Calder Cannons – who beat them a fortnight ago with a goal after the siren – in the First Qualifying Final at Carlton’s Visy Park this Saturday afternoon for a spot in a Preliminary Final.

It’s the 11th straight season that the Falcons have been part of finals action and they’ll be keen to go at least one step better than their Semi-Final result from 2012.

The Falcons took advantage of the Stingrays’ inaccurate kicking to record a 13.5 (83) to 5.12 (42) at Victoria Park. Dandenong failed to score a goal in the first half, kicking 10 behinds to allow the Falcons to lead by 28 points at the main break.

Falcons coach Andy Allthorpe said the reason for the Stingrays inaccuracy was the pressure implied by their defenders.

“The (forward 50) entries for the game were pretty even (41-39 in Dandenong’s favor) so it wasn’t if they weren’t taking the ball in,” Allthorpe said.

“We just took our opportunities in front of goal. Our backs are certainly defending pretty well.

“We’ve kept two good teams to under 10 goals in our last two games.

“We focused this week on the contested ball and tackles and (forward 50 entries). We worked hard on what we wanted to do. There’s still a few areas we need to tidy up but we’re confident going into the finals.”

The Falcons’ goals came from a mix of tall and small forwards, with Scott Dixon booting three along with Marcus Thompson. Doug Bond, Aaron Christensen and Hugh Goddard each chipped in with two.

Jye Cross was excellent in defence supported by Sam Russell while Nic Bourke, James Tsitas and Joe Maishman won plenty of the ball in the midfield. Allthorpe had high praise for ruckman Luke Davis, who has played the position all season despite being only 195cm.

“It was probably his best game,” Allthorpe said of the Barwon Heads’ big man.

“He got back and supported the back half and

was involved in our transition, which was great. He just gets out there and works hard, does his bit for the team. He’s a bit unheralded.”

The Falcons are likely to regain key forward Patrick McCartin for the Qualifying Final but doubts hang over the fitness of gun rover and potential top 10 draft pick Lewis Taylor.

Allthorpe said everyone involved with the club is excited to be part of the finals.

“We feel really organised,” Allthorpe said. “Everyone knows their role and what’s expected of them and we’re ready to get out there and give it our best shot.”

The Falcons-Cannons match will be played at 2pm this Saturday at Visy Park, Carlton.

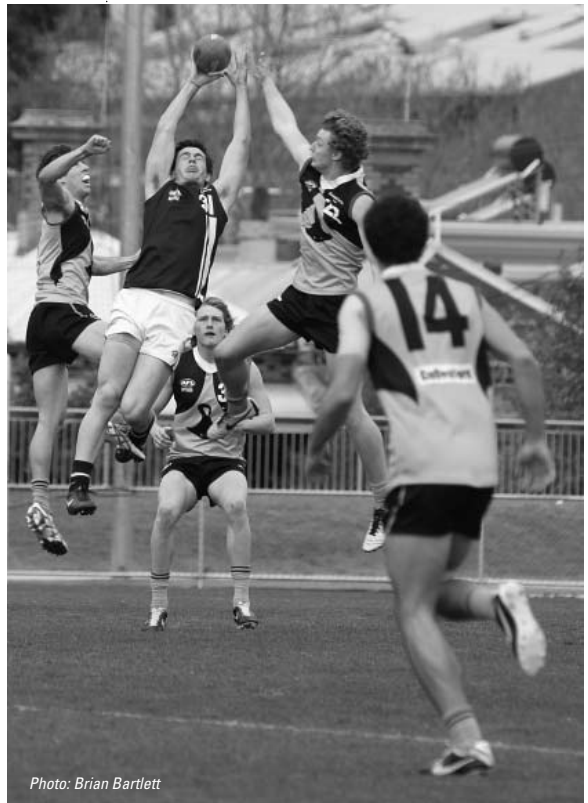

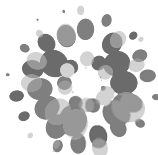

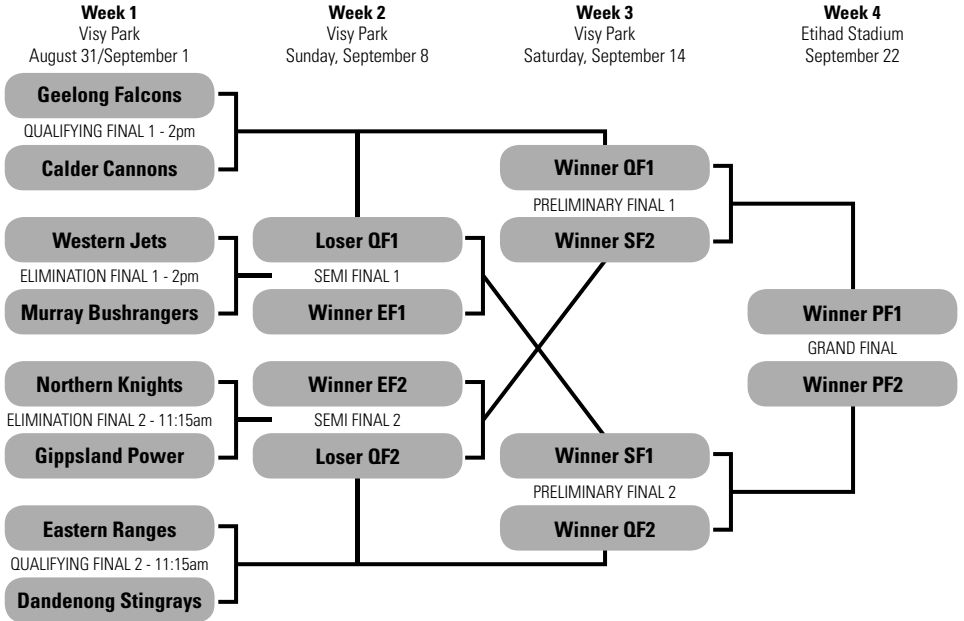

Senior metropolitan representative football returns

Senior metropolitan representative football will be back with a bang in 2014 as Melbourne's six senior leagues go head-to-head on the eve of the 2014 season.

The triple header, scheduled for late March, will see the six competitions in action on the same day in the first all-encompassing carnival since 1999.

A Metro senior team, to be coached by Hawthorn champion Peter Schwab, will be then selected and pitted against the Peter Knights-led WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country No.1 side in July.

The battle between the best of the bush and the best of the burbs will be the first match of its kind for more than 20 years.

Based on the results of one-off representative games over the past few years, metropolitan leagues have been seeded one-to-six by AFL Victoria.

The Victorian Amateur Football Association will start in the No.1 position, hoping to remain at the top in a mouth-watering clash with the second-placed Eastern FL.

Essendon District FL (3rd) will take on the Northern FL (4th), with the Western Region FL (5th) and Southern FL (6th) match set to determine who finishes in the last position on the rankings table.

Promotion and relegation will apply to all matches to avoid leagues playing against each other in consecutive years.

All three games will be played at the same venue (yet

to be finalised) on the same day in a triple header to determine bragging rights for the next 12 months.

AFL Victoria General Manager Grant Williams said reintroducing a metropolitan representative carnival to the Victorian football calendar would be a great showcase for community football.

"In recent years, leagues have played against each other in one off matches but not since 1999 have they played against each other as part of a structured program managed by AFL Victoria.

"We now manage the WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country Championships and consider the timing right to implement a senior metropolitan representative program."

Williams said a Metro vs Country showdown, planned for July, provided an added incentive for players to represent their league in the metropolitan carnival.

"The Metro team will be selected from the six sides competing in the initial carnival, and be pitted against WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country No.1 team, made-up of the best players from leagues that compete in WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country Championships."

The appointment of former Hawthorn player and senior coach Peter Schwab adds another layer to the contest with his former premiership teammate Peter Knights continuing as coach of the WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country No.1 team.

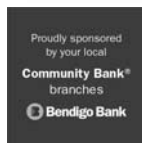

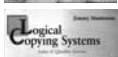

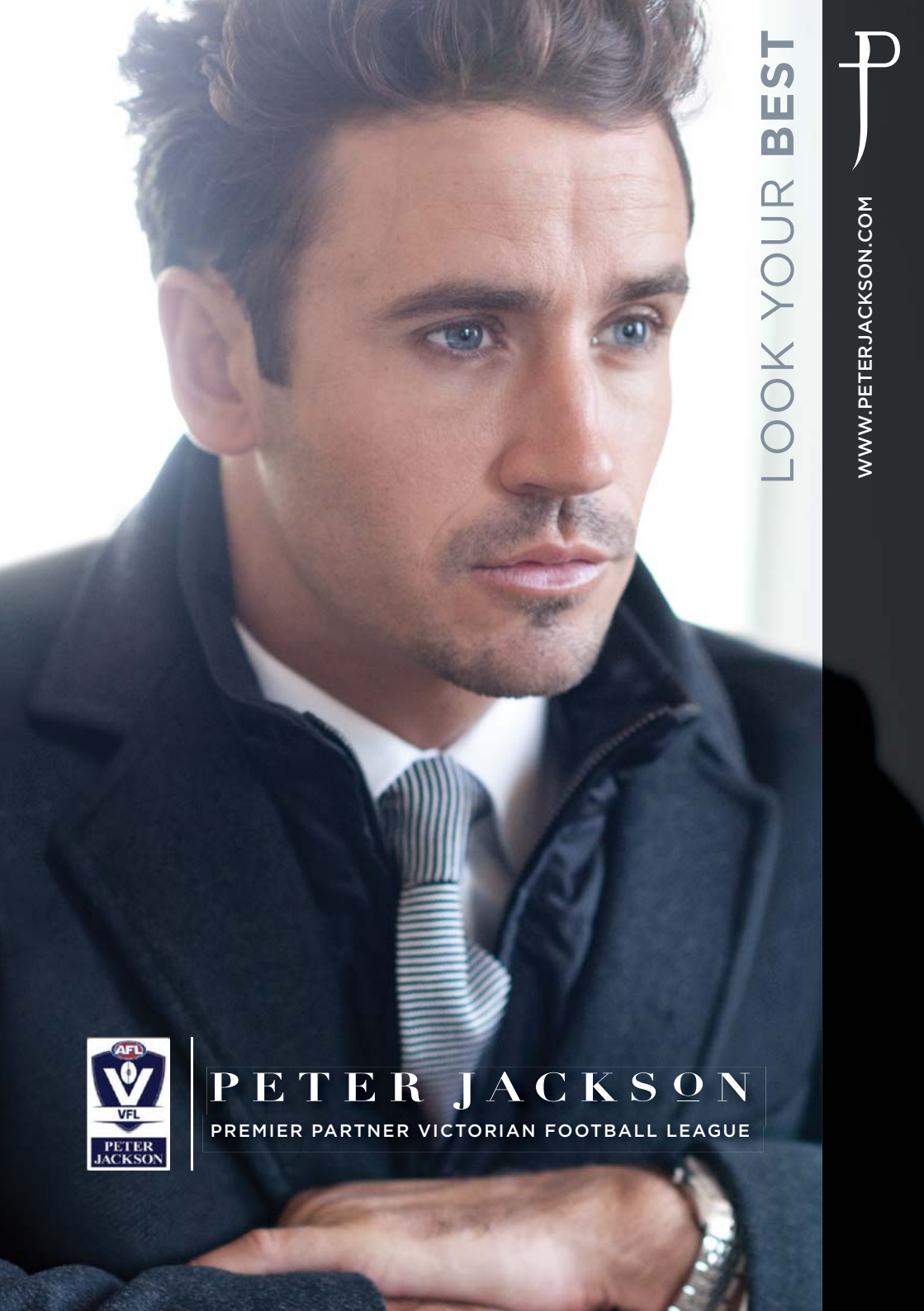
